GAME INFORMATION

LAST TIME OUT - READING 7, BINGHAMTON 6: The Rumble Ponies surrendered a two-run lead over the final three innings and got walked-off by the Fightin Phils. Binghamton recorded at least 10 hits for the third consecutive game and have 36 hits over their last three games. **1B Corey Collins** hammered a lead-off home run in the second inning to give Binghamton a 2-0 lead and **INF Nick Lorusso** tallied his 19th multi-hit game with RBI singles in the first and the sixth inning to make it 6-4. **INF Mitch Voit** in his Double-A debut tallied three extra-base hits and two runs scored, with a triple in the eighth inning. Reading trailed 6-5 in the ninth inning before Raylin Heredia scored the tying and winning run on a ground ball to **RHP Garrett Stratton** that he threw over Collins at first base into right field.

MITCHS STICH: **INF Mitch Voit** has been promoted to Double-A Binghamton on July 26 and made his debut last night going 3-for-5, 2 R, 2 B, 3B, BB. The 2025 1st round pick out of the University of Michigan played in 76 games with High-A Brooklyn this year and slashed .242/.349/.396/.745 with 11 HR, 41 RBI and 36 SB. Voit ranked T-5th in all of High-A in stolen bases and 3rd in the South Atlantic League. The 21-year old had 16 multi hit games in High-A and hit .305 in the month of June. At Michigan, Voit was a First Team All-Big Ten selection, All-Big Ten Defensive Team honoree, and Perfect Game Second Team All-American, he slashed .346/.471/.668 to lead his team in both slugging percentage and OPS. Over his sophomore and junior seasons, he also pitched 98 innings, posting a 4.67 ERA with 66 strikeouts and 28 walks.

CARDIAC COLLINS: **INF Corey Collins** was promoted to Double-A Binghamton on July 21 from High-A Brooklyn. Over his first seven games Collins has reached base in every contest and is 9-for-24 with 2 HR, 6 RBI and a 1.111 OPS. On Wednesday against Reading he tallied his third multi-hit game (2-for-4, R, HR, 2 RBI, BB). Against Portland on July 23 he delivered a pinch-hit two-run home run in the ninth inning for his first Double-A homer. Collins played in 68 games with High-A Brooklyn and produced a .231 AVG/.391 OBP/.400 SLG/.791 OPS with 8 HR, 33 RBI and 55 BB. He ranked among the High-A South Atlantic League: 55 BB (8th) & .391 OBP (9th) before promotion.

POWER SURGE: This year, the Rumble Ponies have been live or die by the home run, going 28-28 when they hit a homer and 8-33 when they do not. Over Binghamton's last 11 they are 3-8 with five home runs in that stretch and tallied their 28th win with a homer on Sunday against Portland.

LO KNOWS: **INF Nick Lorusso** chalked up his team-leading 19th multi-hit game on Wednesday against Reading (2-for-5, 2 RBI). On Saturday against Portland he tallied his 36th extra-base hit (2-for-5, 2B) which is a team-lead. He now ranks 9th in the Eastern League in XBH. Over his last 20 games, Lorusso is slashing .276/.378/.474/.852 with 3 HR, 14 RBI, 6 2B, 12 R, and 13 BB. He has recorded at least one hit in 23 of his last 29 games He added to his home run total on July 18 hitting a two-run home run in the seventh inning against Akron. Lorusso now has 16 HR on the year which ties Ryan Clifford NYM No. 2 prospect) for the Mets Minor League lead in home runs. He had his hit streak snapped at seven games and his on-base streak stopped at 11 games on July 17.

BY THE BAY: **OF John Bay** was promoted to Double-A Binghamton on July 21 from High-A Brooklyn and is 6-for-19 (.316) 2 2B, 2 RBI, 6 BB over his first six games. Bay has reached base in every game after going 1-for-3 on Wednesday night against Reading. On July 26 against Portland, Bay tallied his first multi-hit game with Binghamton. (2-for-4, 2 R, 2B, 2 BB). With High-A Brooklyn he played in 77 games and produced a .232 AVG/.360 OBP/.458 SLG/.818 OPS with 13 HR, 44 RBI, 62 R and 32 XBH. He ranked T-2nd in runs and T-10th in XBH in the High-A South Atlantic League at the time of his promotion. Bay signed as an UDFA in 2025 out of Austin Peay State University.

JT'S JULY: **1B JT Schwartz** chalked up 15th multi-hit game of the season on Saturday and had two multi-hit games in the series against Portland. On Thursday July 23 Schwartz tallied his 5th three-hit game which is tied with Jose Ramos for the team lead. In this series against Portland Schwartz was 5-for-14 (.357) BB, SB. In July through 16 games, he has produced a .304 AVG (17-for-56), .412 OBP, .482 SLG, .894 OPS, 2 HR, 7 RBI, 10 R, 4 2B, 6 XBH. Schwartz has recorded at least one hit in nine of his last 16 games in July and has three three-hit games this month.

VAMOS RAMOS: **OF Jose Ramos** cashed in his team-leading 54th RBI on Wednesday night against Reading going 1-for-2, R, RBI, 2 BB). Last weekend against Portland, Ramos belted back-to-back two-run home runs over the final two games of the series. The 15 HR for Ramos rank second on the team. On Sunday Ramos led the way for Binghamton as he chalked up a four-hit effort for the fourth time in his career, and for the first time since June 8, 2023, with Double-A Tulsa (LAD). Over the final two games of the series Ramos went 5-for-9 (.555) 4 R, 1 2B, 2 HR, 5 RBI. Ramos hit 18 home runs across Double-A Tulsa and Triple-A Oklahoma City with the Los Angeles Dodgers last year.

THE ARM OF BRUESTER: **RHP Justin Armbruster** holds a 0.71 ERA through 11 appearances that have spanned 12.2 IP, allowing just one run and five hits in that stretch. He has tallied 16 SO and just 2 BB with no walks over his last seven appearances with 12 SO. A 12th round pick to Baltimore in 2021, Armbruster was selected by the Mets in the Triple-A phase of the Rule-5 Draft in 2025.

HOMETOWN: Canberra, Australia

-Michael Collins, Binghamton's 19th manager all-time, is in his first season managing the Rumble Ponies and his first season in the Mets organization.
-Collins spent the last eight seasons (2018-25) with the Houston Astros, as a bullpen catcher in 2018 and serving as the Astros' major league catching coach for the last seven seasons (2019-25), including the 2022 World Series championship.
-Collins worked in the San Diego Padres organization as a manager for the DSL Padres (2012), AZL Padres (2013, 2016-17), High-A Fort Wayne (2014), and Single-A Lake Elsinore (2015) for six seasons between 2012-17.
-He also managed the Canberra Cavalry in the Australian Baseball League in 2012-14, right after his playing career ended. He led the Cavalry to the Claxton Shield as national champions for the first time.
-Collins debuted as a player in the minor leagues in 2001 at the age of 16 with the AZL Angels. He spent 10 seasons in the minor leagues with the Angels and Padres, and reached as high as Triple-A in 2009 and 2010. Collins also played in the ABL and was an All-Star catcher.
-Collins has coached for Team Australia in the World Baseball Classic in 2026, 2017, and 2013. He played for Team Australia in the WBC in 2009 and 2006. Born July 18, 1984 in Canberra, Australia. On May 3, 2024, he became a United States citizen.

-Mariano Duncan begins his fifth year as bench coach with the Rumble Ponies and eighth year in the Mets organization. He previously served as the bench coach for the Brooklyn Cyclones in 2021 & in the same role with Kingsport in 2019.
-Duncan has Major League coaching experience, after serving as the first base coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers for five seasons from 2006-2010. He has spent time on various minor league staffs affiliated with the Dodgers and Chicago Cubs, before joining the Mets organization in 2019.
-The former infielder played 12 major league seasons with the Dodgers, Cincinnati Reds, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Toronto Blue Jays. He is a two-time World Series champion ('90 Reds and '96 Yankees), one-time All-Star (with Philadelphia in 1994), and was part of the 1993 Phillies team that won the National League pennant. He was inducted into the Dominican Republic Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. He made his MLB debut for the Dodgers on April 9, 1975, at the age of 22. Duncan finished third for the N.L. Rookie of the Year.



32 MATT CARASITI

-Matt Carasiti is in his first season as the pitching coach for the Rumble Ponies and with the Mets organization.
-Carasiti spent the 2025 season as the pitching coach for the High-A Everett AquaSox in the Seattle Mariners' organization.
-Carasiti pitched in the major leagues for parts of four seasons with the Colorado Rockies (2016, 2023-24) and the Seattle Mariners (2019). He made his MLB debut for the Rockies on August 12, 2016, at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia. In his MLB career, Carasiti made 53 appearances (48 in relief) and went 2-2 with 50 strikeouts in 58.1 innings.
-Pitched for parts of 10 seasons in affiliated baseball. Underwent Tommy John surgery prior to the 2020 season and missed all of 2020 and 2021 seasons. Returned and pitched for the Long Island Ducks of the Atlantic League in 2022 and also pitched professionally in Japan in 2018. Last appeared in MLB on June 7, 2024 for the Rockies.
-Was a Double-A Eastern League All-Star for the Hartford Yard Goats (Colorado Rockies) in 2016.
-Drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the sixth round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of St. John's University (N.Y.). Originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the 36th round of the 2009 draft, but did not sign.
-Pitched for three seasons (2010-12) at St. John's and made 66 appearances and 22 starts, and went 16-11 with a 4.19 ERA and recorded 137 strikeouts in 180.1 innings. He recorded eight saves in 2011, which ranked fifth in the Big East.
-Grew up in Berlin, Connecticut, and attended Berlin HS and was the 2009 Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year.

-Rachel Folden begins her first season as the hitting coach for Binghamton and with the Mets organization.
-Folden spent the previous five seasons as a coach in the Chicago Cubs organization in various roles: Arizona Complex League hitting coach (2021-22), Minor League hitting coordinator (2023), Double-A Tennessee hitting coach (2024), and Triple-A Iowa hitting coach (2025). Was the first female coach in the history of the Chicago Cubs organization.
-Folden played professional softball with the Chicago Bandits (2008-12) and Carolina Diamonds (2012) in the National Pro Fastpitch league.
-She began her coaching career in softball at Encinal High School (2009) while working as a GA at Holy Names University. Folden was also an assistant softball coach at Valparaiso University for two seasons (2010-11).
-Folden was a four-time All-American in softball at Marshall University (2005-08) and was inducted in the Marshall Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019. Folden was a two-time Conference USA Player of the Year, four-time All-Conference First Team selection, and won the triple crown (.386 AVG, 18 HR, 56 RBI) in CUSA as a sophomore in 2006. She was the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year in 2005, before moving to CUSA.

-Jake Hager begins his first season with the Rumble Ponies and first as a coach in the Mets organization.
-Hager played infield for parts of two seasons in the major leagues with the New York Mets (2021) and the Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22). Hager made his MLB debut for the Mets on May 15, 2021, at Tropicana Field against the Rays. He played in five games for the Mets and totaled 42 games in his MLB career.
-Played for parts of 12 seasons in affiliated baseball, including 1,037 games in the minor leagues for six different organizations. Retired from playing in 2024 and last played for Triple-A Iowa in the Chicago Cubs organization.
-Drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (32nd overall) in the 2011 MLB Draft out of Sierra Vista HS (Nevada). Was the Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior and was committed to play at Arizona State University, before the draft.
-Played on the same 12U Southern Nevada Bulldogs travel team with Bryce Harper and Joey Gallo.

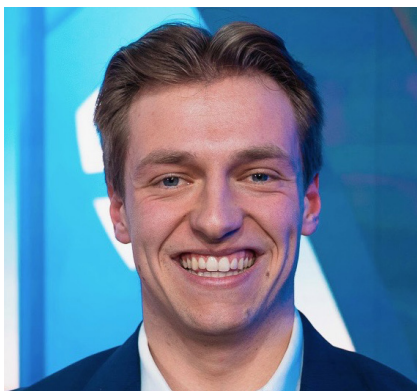


MATT LEVINE *Director of Broadcasting & Media Relations*

The SNY Direct-To-Consumer (DTC) streaming service, in partnership with MLB is available to purchase for \$24.99 a month, \$124.99 for the MLB season or \$149.99 annually via the MLB App. SNY can also be bundled with MLB.TV for \$44.99 a month or \$219.99 for the MLB season. The MLB App is available on a variety of devices and platforms, including iOS, Android, Amazon Fire TV, Roku, Apple TV, Google TV and Samsung connected TVs. Regular season games exclusively broadcast by national networks (Fox, ESPN, Apple) or WPIX are not included in this offering.
