TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints jumped out to another lead that would slip away in a 5-2 loss in their final road game of the season. Payton Eeles started the game with a bang, homering on the first pitch of the game. The first three batters of the second inning reached, plating a run on a Jair Camargo RBI single. Columbus then scored three runs in the fourth to take the lead with a three-run home run from Johnathan Rodriguez. The Saints had just two hits over the final seven innings in the loss. The Saints finished the season going 35-41 away from CHS Field.

FIRST PITCH CRUSHING: Payton Eeles got the Saints going with a leadoff home run on Sunday, the Saints' fourth of the season and first since June 16 at Louisville. It was the Saints' second first-pitch home run of the season, replicating Edouard Julien's first-pitch home run on June 5 against Syracuse. It marks the sixth first-pitch home run in franchise history and the fourth on the very first pitch of the game (when the Saints are on the road). The last player to accomplish the feat on the road was Michael Helman on September 7, 2022 at Toledo.

DOUBLE-DIGIT DUB CLUB: Caleb Boushley will look to become the Saints' second 10-game winner in franchise history tonight, joining Randy Dobnak, who now has 11 wins this season. Boushley previously won double-digit games in 2022, going 12-2 with Nashville. No Triple-A pitcher has had multiple 10+ win seasons since 2021. Only 16 IL pitchers have posted multiple 10+ win seasons in the Statcast Era (2015). The last time the Twins' AAA affiliate had two 10-game winners was Aaron Slegers (15) and David Hurlbut (10) for the 2017 Rochester Red Wings, who were also the affiliate's last 10-game winners.

INDY ISSUES: Indianapolis has proved to be a challenging foe for the Saints this year, going 1-11 in Circle City, with this series the only trip to St. Paul this year. Their .083 win percentage is the lowest against any team in a single season since joining the International League in 2021. Over the course of a season series (minimum six games), the Saints have been held to two-or-fewer wins on three previous occasions: vs Toledo, 2021 (2-9), vs Buffalo, 2022 (2-4) and vs Syracuse, 2024 (2-4). The Saints' .083 winning percentage against Indy is the tied for the lowest for any Triple-A team against any opponent in 2024 (minimum two series) (Salt Lake, 1-11 vs. Las Vegas).

SAVE-LESS SAINTS: The Saints have not had many save situations over the month of September, but have not been able to lock down the ones they had. The Saints have gone 12 games without a save, tying for their longest streak of the season from August 8-21. The Saints have had three save opportunities in that timeframe. The 12-game streak is tied for the second-longest in franchise history, trailing the 15-game skid from May 22-June 7, 2022. The Saints' last save came on September 1, courtesy of Hobie Harris in a 4-3 victory at Omaha.

NOT-SO-FREE PASSES: Saints pitchers have been able to limit walks as of late, issuing 42 walks in September, the tied for the fourth-fewest in the IL. They have not walked more than four batters in each of their last nine games. The Saints have issued the 504 walks this year, the fewest in the International League. Saints starters have walked just 206 hitters this year, the fewest in Triple-A. Meanwhile relievers have walked 298, ranking seventh in the league.

SUMMERTIME SEVERINO: Yunior Severino has had an incredible turnaround this season and now finds himself in position to set several franchise single-season records. He has set a new single-season RBI record with 76 and collected 119 hits on the season, the fourth-most in a single season. He also ranks second in the single-season home run charts with 20, trailing the 21 long balls that Jair Camargo and Chris Williams hit last season.

TWINS UPDATE: The Minnesota Twins dropped their series opener in Cleveland 4-3. Carlos Correa scored on a passed ball and Byron Buxton hit a two-run single, plating all three runs in the third inning. Pablo López allowed two runs over 6.1 innings, striking out eight in the loss.

LAST APPEARANCE: 9/11 @ COL...made 24th start of the season, allowed three runs on four hits, one home run, one walk and four strikeouts...allowed two baserunners over the first four innings: a one-out walk in the first and a two-out double in the fourth...with two outs in the fifth inning, allowed a RBI single and a two-run home run, giving up three runs in the frame...did not receive a decision for the fourth straight start in a 7-6 walkoff loss.

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 9/5 v IOWA...made 23rd start of the season, allowing two runs on six hits, walking three and striking out five...retired the side after walking leadoff batter in the first inning...faced seven men in the second inning, allowing three singles and a walk...stranded two in the third inning...eight of the 21 batters faced saw at least six pitches, facing four three-ball counts...did not factor into the decision in a 7-6 Saints victory.

WORLD SERIES RUNNER-UP: Caleb spent his college years not far from home at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. As a freshman, he got to experience something that not many players get the opportunity to experience: a trip to the College World Series. His DIII squad reached the championship after beating Salisbury, 7-3, Emory, 3-2 in 12, losing the first game of the semifinals to Trinity(TX), 16-7, but bouncing back to win the second game, 10-7. Unfortunately, they met their match in the championship dropping the best-of-three to Cortland, getting swept 11-3 and 6-2. He would get back to the DIII World Series in 2016, but this was less successful losing 8-0 to Trinity, beating Emory, 12-3 before being eliminated by the team they lost to in the 2015 DIII Championship Game, Cortland, 8-3.

SOMETHINGS BREWING: One can't help where they grow up which can determine who you root for growing up. Caleb was born in Neenah, WI and resides in Madison, WI, so naturally he rooted for the Milwaukee Brewers. His hometown team came calling in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 Draft in 2021, taking Caleb with the 22nd pick overall from the San Diego Padres. The storybook had an incredible ending when he was called up to the Brewers on September 29, 2023. He pitched 2.1 innings of relief vs. Chicago Cubs and allowed one run on one hit while walking two and striking out five. He earned the win in his lone Major League appearance.

GIVE BACK: Each of the Major League teams usually choose a player or players within their organization for the hard work they put towards the community. In 2023, the Brewers selected Caleb as the Nashville Sounds Community Player of the Year.
