FOUR-RUN NINTH BURIES CARDS IN 7-2 LOSS: The Arkansas Travelers scored four times in the top of the ninth inning to break open a one-run game as the Cardinals dropped a 7-2 decision on Thursday night at Hammons Field. RJ Yeager had two hits for Springfield and Dakota Harris went 1-for-2 with an RBI in his Double-A debut. Reliever Brandon Komar shined in relief for the Cardinals, striking out 3 over 3.0 scoreless innings after Trent Baker's 5.0 frames of 3-run ball. Although they did not allow an unearned run, the Cardinals were done in by a season-high 4 errors.



OPPOSING STARTER: Right-hander **Jimmy Joyce** makes his 9th start of the season for Arkansas...Took the loss in his last start on Saturday, June 22 against Wichita surrendering 8 ER on 7 H in just 2.0 IP at Dickey-Stephens Park...In his two starts prior had allowed just 1 R on 5 H over 8.0 IP...Started against the Cardinals on June 5 in North Little Rock and took the loss allowing 4 R (2 ER) on 4 H with 3 BB in just 1.2 IP...The Cardinals won the game 6-1...Made his first appearance of the season on May 6 in the ACL after rehabbing an elbow injury...Made 7 starts for the Travs at the end of last season and went 0-3 with a 3.62 ERA...Began 2023 with High-A Everett going 2-0 with a 1.60 ERA in 9 starts...2023 was considered a breakout/turnaround season catapulting him onto prospect lists thanks to an improvement in command (lowered his walk rate from 10% to 7%) and a funky delivery and a fastball with good life despite below average velo...Spent most of the 2022 season with Everett going 7-11 with a 5.74 ERA in 23 starts...Selected by the Mariners in the 16th round of the 2021 draft out of Hofstra and signed for just \$25,000...Went 3-4 with a 3.71 ERA in 11 starts in final year with the Pride, earning 2nd team all-CAA...Served as a twoway player in his first two collegiate seasons, batting .209 with a HR in 20 games in 2019...25 years old

CARDS BEGIN 2ND HALF WITH FINAL REGULAR SEASON MATCHUP WITH TRAVS: After clinching a postseason berth on the final day of the first half, the Cardinals kick off the 2nd half with a six-game series against the Arkansas Travelers (Double-A, Seattle Mariners) at Hammons Field. The Cards and Travs will not meet again in the regular season. The two clubs met in the division series last season.



CARDINALS CELEBRATE 20 YEARS IN SPRINGFIELD

The 2024 season is a special one at Hammons Field, as it represents the 20th anniversary of the return of Cardinals baseball to Springfield. The franchise moved to Southwest Missouri from El Paso in 2005 and boast one Texas League title in 2012 and two North Division championships (2007 & 2012) since. The first iteration of the Springfield Cardinals spanned from 1931-46, an era that saw the Redbirds bring home five league titles.

For the second straight season all 138 Cardinals games can be found across the FM airwaves of Southwest Missouri all season long on Classic Rock 106.7, the radio home of the Springfield Cardinals!

FIRST HALF CHAMPS: For the first time since 2016, the Springfield Cardinals clinched a postseason berth with a first half title. The race came down to the wire, with the Cards needing a win on the last day of the first half to clinch. Springfield trailed the Arkansas Travelers by 2.5 games with 5 to play and by 1.5 games with 2 to play, but the Travs lost their final two games of the first half to the Wichita Wind Surge and the Cards defeated Corpus Christi on back-to-back nights to clinch the title. The Cardinals will be playing in the postseason in back-to-back seasons for just the 2nd time in franchise history (2009, 2010).

NDDDDDDDDT: For the 2nd time during the 2024 season, Cardinals OF **Lars Nootbaar** is expected to make a rehab appearance in Springfield. He has been on the IL with St. Louis since May 31 with an oblique strain. **Nootbaar** appeared in one game for Springfield on April 9 rehabbing from fractured ribs, going 1-for-4 with an RBI and 2 runs scored before being activated by St. Louis on April 11. In 5 games with Memphis at the start of the season, he went 3-for-17 with a 2B. In 39 games in the big leagues this season, **Nootbaar** is batting .234 with 5 HR and 19 RBI to go along with 7 2B and a .741 OPS.

HOME STRUGGLES: After winning their first 8 games at home this season, the Cards have dropped 20 of their last 26 games at Hammons Field. Overall the Cardinals are a league-worst 14-20 at home with a 5.89 ERA, the highest home mark in the Texas League. Wednesday's win was the first time the Cardinals have allowed less than four runs at home since a 1-0 win over Tulsa on May 24, a stretch that covers 9 games.

Road games, however, have been a much different story. The Cardinals have the best road mark in the Texas League at 24-14, and sport a 3.62 ERA which is the 2nd best in the circuit behind Frisco and tops in the North Division.

GRINDIN': Simply put, the Cardinals don't strike out very much. The Cards have struck out the 2nd-fewest times in all of full-season Minor League Baseball with 507 whiffs in 72 games. The only team with fewer strikeouts than Springfield is the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers (483 K in 72 games). The Cards are averaging just 7.04 K's per game.

THE [EXTRA BASE] JUICE IS LOOSE: With just 11 extra base hits over their previous 11, and 25 over the first 18 games of the month, the Cardinals have knocked 13 extra base hits (6 2B, 7 HR) over their last 5 games. The power surge has been a welcome sight; teh Cardinals hit just 3 HR during a 23 game stretch from May 26-June 21.

For the season Springfield has 144 extra base hits this season, still fewest in the Texas League. San Antonio has the 2nd-fewest with 115. Despite having the most hits and highest OBP (.349) in the league, the Cardinals are 7th in SLG at .360 and 5th in OPS (.709). The Cardinals are on pace to hit 77 HR, which would be the fewest in the Texas League since the Travelers hit 71 in 2016.

LLOYD ON A TEAR: Despite an 0-for-4 outing on Thursday, **Matt Lloyd** has been one of the hottest hitters in the Texas League of late. Going into Thursday, **Lloyd** had homered in 4 straight games for the first time in his career and the longest HR streak in the league this season. Over his last 11 games since June 14, **Lloyd** is batting .310 with 5 HR and a league-high 1.110 OPS. The former Indiana Hoosier hit a home run in 3 straight games in his first pro season from June 18-July 2, 2019. **Lloyd** now leads active Texas Leaguers with 44 RBIs, and is also in the top 5 in HR, SLG, OPS and total bases.

RUNNING WILD: After swiping a season-high 5 bags on Wednesday night, the Cardinals are 20-for their last-23 in stolen base attempts over their last 9 games. **Jeremy Rivas** leads the Cards with 4 SB during that time, while 4 other Birds have 3 bags each. The Cardinals are 3rd in the Texas League with 93 SB as a team, while **Rivas** and **Bryan Torres** are tied for the team lead with 19 SB.

REDMOND ON DOORSTEP OF SPRINGFIELD HISTORY: With his go-ahead two-run homer in the 8th inning on April 23 against Arkansas, Cardinals slugger **Chandler Redmond** tied the franchise record for most home runs. His 59 career home runs in a Springfield uniform bring him even with **Xavier Scruggs** (2010-13). **Redmond** already holds the Springfield record for career RBIs with 215.

Since tying the record, however, **Redmond** has gone 37 straight games without a home run.
