Today: After a rainout last night, the Lugnuts and Dragons play the fifth and sixth games in their six-game series in Dayton, their second doubleheader of the series, concluding the season series between the two ballclubs. The Lugnuts have dropped three straight games to the Dragons after opening with a win and are now 4-6 this season at Day Air Ballpark and 9-13 overall this year against the Dragons.

Last Game, Friday: Dragons 3, Lugnuts 2. Dayton overcame five errors with a one-hitter -- a Jonny Butler infield single in the fifth inning -- as the Lugnuts struck out 16 times in defeat. William Simoneit drew two walks for a second straight day, and Brock Whittlesey (two innings, two strikeouts) and Garrett Acton (one perfect inning, three strikeouts) supplied scoreless relief in the loss.

On Deck: After a day off tomorrow, the Lugnuts continue their 12-game, 13-day road trip with a six-game set at Fort Wayne before wrapping up 2021 at home vs. West Michigan.

What's New in 2021: Entering this season, the Lugnuts' stadium name changed from Cooley Law School Stadium to Jackson® Field™, Lansing moved up to the High-A Central and the ballclub accepted an invitation to affiliate with the A's, the Nuts' fourth MLB partner, following the Royals (1996-98), Cubs (1999-2004) and Blue Jays (2005-2020).

A Smashing Debut: Right-hander Colin Peluse made his first Double-A appearance last night and impressed, leading the Midland RockHounds past the Frisco RoughRiders, 3-1, with five scoreless one-hit innings, striking out eight.

Transaction: First baseman/outfielder Lawrence Butler was activated from the Injured List yesterday, with corner infielder/left fielder Jordan Diaz placed on the Injured List. Butler, the Athletics' 2018 sixth-round selection from Westlake High School (Atlanta, Ga.) and MLB.com's No. 1 A's first base prospect and No. 22 overall A's prospect, joined the Lugnuts on August 24 from Low-A Stockton, though he was placed on the Injured List on August 25. Butler becomes the 54th Nut to suit up this season, tying the team record for most players used in a year, and the 858th Lugnuts player all-time. In 88 games with the Ports, he slashed .263/.364/.499 with 20 doubles, four triples and 17 homers, plus 26 stolen bases in 30 attempts. He delivered two walk-offs for Stockton, including a game-winning RBI single on July 4th. On August 20th, Butler crushed a 482-foot homer vs. Modesto.

On the Mound: Today marks the third appearance in the professional career for Jeff Criswell, MLB.com's No. 3 pitching prospect in the Athletics' organization and No. 14 overall prospect. Criswell made his pro debut with two scoreless innings vs Lake County on May 8, was placed on the Injured List on May 12 (shoulder), and returned on August 28 with two scoreless innings against West Michigan. A native of Portage, Mich., Criswell was rated Perfect Game's No. 1 high school right-hander in the state of Michigan in 2017. Drafted out of high school in the 35th round by the Detroit Tigers, he opted instead to attend the University of Michigan, where he was named All-Big Ten First Team as a sophomore before being drafted by Oakland following his junior year in the 2nd round in 2020, 58th overall.

Patience is a Virtue: Shortstop Drew Swift drew another walk Friday, giving him seven walks in four games of this series, ten walks in his last six games, and 16 walks in 19 games with the Lugnuts overall. Though Swift is hitting .236, his on-base percentage rests at .425 entering tonight. The 22-year-old shortstop, rated the A's No. 6 shortstop in the system and No. 30 prospect in the organization, was drafted in 2021 in the eighth round from Arizona State University, winning the Gold Glove as the best defensive shortstop in college baseball.

Closing the Door: Reliever Charles Hall struck out the Dragons' 1-2-3 hitters, Michael Siani, Matt McLain and Juan Martinez, to close out Game 1 on Wednesday night with the potential game-tying run in scoring position. In the process, the man nicknamed Captain Hook notched his 10th save of the year, one behind Lake County's Jerson Ramirez and West Michigan's Zack Hess for the league lead. Hall has not allowed a run in his last 12 appearances (13 1/3 scoreless innings, 5 hits in 42 at-bats/.119 avg., 7 walks, 21 strikeouts), with his last run allowed coming on July 25.

Tough Actin' Acton: Reliever Garrett Acton had not appeared in a game since August 22 due to dental reasons, but did not miss a beat in his return to the mound Friday, striking out the side in the eighth inning. Acton has now whiffed 26 batters (while walking just three) in 13 2/3 innings with the Lugnuts after a call-up from Low-A Stockton. In his last 33 1/3 innings, spanning two levels and beginning on June 4, Acton has allowed just 14 hits and five runs (1.35 ERA), with 54 strikeouts against only nine walks. Acton was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020 after serving as a record-breaking closer at the University of Illinois, where he set the school record for saves.

TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2010: In Game 1 of a doubleheader, Lake County SS Casey Frawley became the first player to homer off the Classic Park lighthouse – the prize: \$1,000 split between Frawley and a Captains fan – and the Caps beat the Lugnuts, 8-6. In Game 2, the Lugnuts' Daniel Webb came one out from throwing a seven-inning no-hitter before Chase Burnette broke it up with a single to center field. Casey Beck relieved Webb and finished off a 3-1 Lugnuts win.

2011: Billy Hamilton stole three bases, finishing the regular season with 103 steals, and Dayton edged the Lugnuts, 3-2, at Fifth Third Field. Jake Marisnick went 0-for-2 before exiting, ending his MWL-best 30-game road on-base streak. The Nuts closed the regular season with a 77-60 record.

New Talent Infusion: The Lugnuts have five 2021 Athletics acquisitions on their roster in infielders **Brett Harris** (drafted in the 7th round, Gonzaga) and **Drew Swift** (8th round, Arizona State), outfielder **Jonny Butler** (14th round, North Carolina State), and pitchers **Kyle Virbitsky** (17th round, Penn State) and **Jack Owen** (undrafted free agent, Auburn).

Root, Root, Root for the Home Team: July 4th's Lugnuts/Dragons series finale drew a season-high attendance of 10,109. That's higher than the average attendance in MLB for the Baltimore Orioles, Pittsburgh Pirates, Tampa Bay Rays, Miami Marlins and Oakland Athletics. Only nine of the 119 other Minor League teams have drawn a larger crowd to a game this season: Albuquerque, Nashville, Salt Lake, Charlotte, Fresno, Indianapolis, Round Rock, Durham and Las Vegas.

Pitching is an Art... and So is Sculpting: **Blake McFarland**, who pitched for the 2012 Lansing Lugnuts, is now a professional sculptor who competed on NBC's reality show "Making It," hosted by Nick Offerman and Amy Poehler, but was eliminated in the fifth episode.

Major League Lugnuts: Six former Nuts have made their Major League debuts this season - pitcher **Ty Tice** '18 (Toronto, now with Arizona), outfielder **Josh Palacios** '16-'17 (Toronto), pitcher **Taylor Saucedo** '16-'17 (Toronto), pitcher **Conner Greene** '15 (Baltimore), pitcher **Kirby Sneed** '16-'17 (Toronto) and infielder **Otto Lopez** '19 (Toronto). Tice and Palacios made their first MLB appearance in the same game for the Toronto Blue Jays on April 9th. It was the seventh time in team history that two Lugnuts made their MLB debut in the same game, with the first occurring on September 14, 1998: **Carlos Febles** and **Carlos Beltrán** for the Kansas City Royals. Sneed most recently debuted, appearing in relief for the Blue Jays on July 28.

Star of Stars: The 2021 MLB All-Star Game MVP Award was won by 2017 Lugnut **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.**, who went 1-for-3 with two RBIs, including a 468-foot home run, in the American League's 5-2 victory. Fellow 2017 Lugnut **Bo Bichette** came off the bench for the A.L. as reserve shortstop.

Record-Setting, Single Game, Stolen Bases: On June 15, **Max Schuemann** broke **Samad Taylor's** franchise single-game record of four steals in a game (set July 1, 2018) with five stolen bases against the Great Lakes Loons.

Record-Setting, Single Game, Home Runs Allowed: On June 20, **Stevie Emanuels** broke the franchise single game record, tied many times before, of three homers served up in a game, giving up four HRs to the Loons - two apiece by Deacon Liput and Andy Pages.

Record-Setting, Single Game, HBPs: On July 14, Lansing Lugnuts pitchers hit seven Lake County Captains, breaking the franchise single game record, and the second-highest single game HBP total for a team plunked by one pitching staff behind the 1993 Gulf Coast League Braves, who were hit eight times on June 18, 1993.

Representing His Country: 1B/3B **Jordan Diaz** played for Colombia in Olympic Baseball Qualifying play, blasting a game-tying home run in the 9th against Venezuela, but Colombia lost all three games in opening pool play and was eliminated. Team USA won the tournament, punching a ticket to Japan.

Front Office Connections: Lugnuts pitching coach **Don Schulze** was drafted 11th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 1980, 12 picks before Oakland Executive Vice President of Baseball Operations **Billy Beane** was drafted by the New York Mets. Lugnuts first baseman **Patrick McColl** set a new Harvard baseball single season record with 70 hits in 2019, breaking the previous record held by Athletics General Manager David Forst.

International Appeal: Seven nations are represented on the Lugnuts' roster: USA, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Japan, South Africa (**Anthony Phillips**) and Venezuela (**Javier Godard**).

Welcome to the Pros: Pitchers **Jeff Criswell**, **Stevie Emanuels**, **Jack Owen**, **Kyle Virbitsky** and **Shohei Tomioka**, catchers **Jared McDonald**, **Drew Millas** and **William Simoneit**, infielder **Patrick McColl**, and outfielder **Michael Guldberg** have all made their professional debut with the Lugnuts this season.

So Many Starters: The Lugnuts have used 19 different starting pitchers this season, namely **Brady Basso**, **Osvaldo Berrios**, **Reid Birlingmair**, **Charlie Cerny**, **Jeff Criswell**, **Jack Cushing**, **David Leal**, **Stevie Emanuels**, **Richard Guasch**, **Jorge Juan**, **Rafael Kelly**, **Bryce Nightengale**, **Jack Owen**, **Colin Peluse**, **Leudeny Pineda**, **Seth Shuman**, **Shohei Tomioka**, **Kyle Virbitsky** and **Brock Whitlesey**.

Three Nuts Go to Washington: On July 30, catcher **Drew Millas** and pitchers **Richard Guasch** and **Seth Shuman** were traded by the Athletics to the Washington Nationals in exchange for catcher **Yan Gomes** and utilityman **Josh Harrison**.

This young man came into our program and changed his body, overcame a significant foot injury and absolutely attacked the game with a relentless work ethic. He found a way to get better every day, and is one of the best I've ever seen at commanding the baseball. He is what our program is all about. Tremendous character and makeup, great student, selfless and just a wonderful teammate. He is the ultimate competitor and undoubtedly will go down as one of the best to ever step foot on the mound for the Bulldogs."

Pro Debut 2019: Debut in A's system on June 27 in AZL... did not walk his first batter until 10th appearance, 20 innings in... promoted to Stockton for final appearance of the year, August 31 at San Jose... base stealers went just 2-for-4 in attempts against him... left-handed batters hit 3-for-44 (.068) with 0 walks and 19 K's... right-handers batted 22-for-102 (.216) with 4 walks and 32 K.

Last Outing: Leal started Game 2 of Wednesday's doubleheader vs. Dayton, allowing seven hits in three innings but only one run, a Victor Ruiz solo home run leading off the 2nd inning... departed with the Lugnuts leading 2-1, only to see Shohei Tomioka allow three runs in the 4th, leading to a Lugnuts 5-3 loss to the Dragons... 52 pitches, 37 strikes.

Command Artist: Of 393 total batters faced in his Minor League career, Leal has walked just ten -- two intentionally (both on June 23, 2021, at Cedar Rapids) -- while striking out 121.

2021:

- Began the season with Stockton, tossing three scoreless innings in relief on Opening Day, May 4 at Modesto.
- First three appearances with the Ports were all in relief, totaling 7 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 12 K.
- Received first start in series opener at Visalia, May 18: 4 IP, 4 H, 3 R (2 ER), 0 BB, 4 K.
- Worked six innings apiece in final two starts with Stockton, June 1 vs. Lake Elsinore (3 H, 0 R, 1 HBP, 0 BB, 5 K) and June 8 vs. San Jose (8 H, 3 R, 2 HR, 0 BB, 3 K).
- In all, walked just 1 batter of 106 total batters faced in the High-A West, spanning 26 2/3 innings.
- Joined the Lugnuts on June 15 with relief ace Jack Weisenburger's promotion to Double-A Midland... made Lugnuts debut that same day, starting the series opener vs. Great Lakes... gave up a second-inning two-run double to Justin Yurchak but that was it: 4 1/3 IP, 7 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 5 K... removed after walking James Outman, yielding to Brady Basso with runners at 1st and 2nd and one out... Basso stranded the runners... Lugnuts went on to win, 9-7, with two runs in the bottom of the 7th.
- Originally slated to start opener on June 22 at Cedar Rapids, but game was postponed due to rain... moved into piggy-backing on opener Bryce Nightengale's start in Game 1 of June 23 doubleheader... held the Kernels to only one hit (Trey Cabbage double) and no walks in first four innings of relief... in bottom of the 7th inning with the game tied 0-0, allowed a second double to Cabbage, who moved to third on a Jair Camargo flyout to right... issued a pair of intentional walks to load the bases, then struck out Michael Helman for the second out... got in front of No. 9 batter Gabriel Maciel 1-and-2, but served up walk-off grand slam in 4-0 Lugnuts loss... struck out seven batters in 4 2/3 innings in defeat.
- Started June 29 vs. Dayton and suffered the loss: 4 2/3 IP, 9 H, 6 R, 1 BB, 6 K, allowing two home runs in Lugnuts' 10-8 series-opening defeat... gave up two-run homer to Eric Yang in the 2nd inning and two-run homer to Juan Martinez in the 3rd inning... departed with bases loaded in the 5th and watched reliever Sam Romero allow two of the inherited runners to score.

The Crux of the Matter: Today marks Jeff Criswell's third professional appearance, following a two-inning start on the fifth game of the season, a stint on the Injured List (shoulder) from May 12-August 27, and a successful return on August 29.

Last Time Out: Jeff struck out two West Michigan Whitecaps in each of his two innings of work, allowing a base runner in each frame (a walk and an HBP)... needed only 25 pitches, 17 strikes, to record two scoreless innings... departed in a scoreless game... Lugnuts lost, 5-4, in ten innings.

Prospecting: Criswell is the highest ranked prospect on the Lugnuts' roster and is considered one of the best lower-level pitching prospects in the Athletics' organization, rated Keith Law's No. 5 overall A's prospect, MLB.com's No. 3 A's pitching prospect and No. 14 overall prospect, and Baseball America's No. 14 A's prospect. Wrote Law, "Criswell was mostly a two-pitch guy up to 95 mph at Michigan, but was showing four pitches and hitting 97 mph in instructs, with a cleaner delivery than the violent one he'd had before the shutdown. Criswell's slider was a swing-and-miss pitch in college and it's gotten sharper now, while his changeup, which he barely used in school, was flashing plus in instructs too." ... listed as one of two pitchers to watch, in addition to Colin Peluse, by farm director Ed Sprague in a pre-season interview with The Mercury News' Shayna Rubin, with Sprague saying, "He looked really good in instructional league. High velocity, starter mix."

Personal: Criswell played the trombone, cello and guitar while growing up "but I didn't have any serious musical talent, that's probably why I took the career path I did"... his father, Brian, was drafted by the A's in the 17th round in 1984 from Western Michigan and pitched in the Midwest League for the Madison Muskies, today's West Michigan Whitecaps, eventually reaching Double-A Huntsville, where he was teammates in 1986 with Mark McGwire... Jeff's mother, Patti, has written books for the American Girl company... Jeff's sister, Natalie, was a record-setting swimmer at Bowling Green State University.

Hail to the Victors: Rated Perfect Game's No. 1 high school right-hander in Michigan in 2017 while at Portage Central, Criswell was drafted by the Tigers in the 35th round in 2017... turned them down and went to Ann Arbor... named All-Big Ten First Team as a sophomore (2.72, 116 K in 106 IP) and was a key contributor in leading the Wolverines on their run to College World Series Runner-Up to national champion Vanderbilt... in all, went 10-4, 2.88, 50 G, 162 1/3 IP, 174 K at Michigan.

The Run to Omaha: A look at how important Jeff was to the Wolverines in their 2019 path to the College World Series National Championship:

NCAA Regional: Struck out nine in 7 2/3 innings in a 10-4 comeback victory over Cincinnati. Michigan went on to eliminate No. 22 Creighton to advance.

NCAA Super Regional: Facing No. 1 UCLA, relieved Karl Kauffman with the potential tying and game-winning runs aboard in the bottom of the ninth and dispatched Jake Pries with a pop-up and Jack Stronach with a strikeout to secure a thrilling 3-2 win. Started the very next day and allowed one earned run in 5 1/3 innings, departing with a 3-2 lead, only to see the Bruins win 5-4 in 12 innings. Michigan went on to eliminate UCLA in Game 3, advancing.

College World Series: Pitched the final two innings scorelessly, earning the save, in a 5-3 CWS-opening win over No. 8 Texas Tech, striking out Brian Klein with the tying runs aboard to end the game. Earned another save in a rematch with Texas Tech six days later, firing the final three innings scorelessly with six strikeouts to complete a 15-3 romp, sending the Wolverines into the CWS Finals against No. 2 Vanderbilt. Secured the final two outs in Game 1 against the Commodores, a 7-4 UM win. Worked the final five innings in relief, striking out seven, in Michigan's Game 3 series-clinching 8-2 loss to Vandy.

National Pride: Following the 2019 college baseball season, Jeff was invited to pitch for the Team USA Collegiate National Team, where he recorded yet another crucial save, firing the final three innings against Taiwan in Game 2 of their three-game series. In all, he limited opposing batters to a .120 average, best of all pitchers on the team.
