LHP Ty Blach (0-1, 4.63) vs. LHP Jackson Wolf (0-1, 11.81)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque evened the series yesterday afternoon with a 7-4 triumph over El Paso ... The club has won two of its last three games and looking to win back-to-back contests for the first time this year ... Lefty Ty Blach is scheduled to take the hill for the Isotopes while Jackson Wolf is expected to start for El Paso.

WIRE-TO-WIRE: Albuquerque claimed its first wire-to-wire win of the season yesterday. The 7-2 lead tallied in the fifth is tied for largest advantage in a game in 2024 (6-1, 3/30 vs. El Paso).

TWO DINGERS: Hunter Goodman connected on two dingers yesterday, the first Isotope to do so since he accomplished the feat in Oklahoma City Aug. 25, 2023.

FIRST FRAME: The Isotopes have plated at least one run in the top of the first inning in six of their last eight road games.

VS. EL PASO: The Isotopes have won 10 of their last 14 games at El Paso, dating back to the start of the 2023 season.

THREE-BAGGERS: Julio Carreras swatted his third triple on the year and the Isotopes Triple-A-leading 12th of 2024 Tuesday. The club has a three-bagger in eight of 17 games.

DINGERS: The Isotopes pitching staff has allowed a dinger in seven-straight contests (16 during span). It's the longest such streak since relenting a clout in nine-straight from Sept. 1-10, 2023 ... The club has relented 26 home runs on the year, the third-most in Triple-A (most: Charlotte, 39).

ERROR 404: Albuquerque committed three errors in yesterday's contest, the club's fourth game with three miscues in a contest. The Isotopes' 22 errors on the season are the most in Triple-A.

SWIPES: The Isotopes have allowed a stolen base in eight-straight contests (15 during stretch). It's tied for the longest streak since at least 2005 (MLB Database), done so four times (last: 4/9-18, 2023)

TAKE YOUR BASE: The Isotopes drew seven walks yesterday, second-most in a contest in 2024 (most: eight, April 3 at OKC).

XBH: El Paso was to just one extra-base hit (Graham Pauley homer), tied for the fewest surrendered by Albuquerque in a game this season (March 29 vs. El Paso).

LOB: The Isotopes left eight men on-base vesterday, the 12th time the club has left at least eight on in a contest. The club's 138 LOB is third-most in all of Triple-A (most: Nashville, 146)

MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck tallied a single yesterday and has a hit nine of his last 11 games (11x42) with a .360 OBP during stretch ... In the Pacific Coast League, T-3rd in runs (14), 5th in XBH (10), T-6th in total bases (36) and 9th in slugging (.643) and OPS (1.034).

BECK EXIT VELO: Out of Beck's 42 batted balls in play, 17 have left the bat over 100-MPH. Highest EV: 108.6 MPH, 1B (3/29 vs. ELP).

IT'S ALL GOOD, MAN: Hunter Goodman produced his ninth career-multi homer game (first since Aug. 25, 2023 at Oklahoma City) and fourth in just 30 contests at the Triple-A level ... The three RBI yesterday are a season-high ... Has six multi-nit games in 2024 Reached base in 23 of the 30 Triple-A games he's played while tallying a hit in 21 ... Of Goodman's 45 batted balls hit into play this year, 18 have an exit velocity over 100-MPH.

TONY: Drew Romo extended his hitting streak to eight games, the longest for any Isotope in 2024. During the span, he is slashing .387/.406/.419 with a double and four RBI.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk notched two doubles in a game yesterday for the eighth time in his pro career and second this season (also: April 10 vs. Sugar Land) ... Also extended his hitting streak to six games. Over the streak, he is slashing .333/.407/.500 with four doubles, seven RBI and two walks

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes is T-6th in OBP (.438) while tallying the 5th-most walks (13) in the Pacific Coast League ... Has a walk in four-straight contests (six during span).

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron has a hit in all seven games played in 2024 ... Tallied a season-high three RBI Sunday, most since a career-high five Sept. 17, 2023. at ELP.

BOUCHIE THE BRUIN: Sean Bouchard became the first Isotope to get promoted the Big Leagues in 2024.

EXIT VELO: Of the 12 batted balls registered at 100 MPH-plus yesterday, the Isotopes recorded nine of them, including the top seven. Hunter Goodman's blasts registered exit velocities of 106.2 MPH (fourth-highest) and 108.2 MPH (game-high). Greg Jones and Aaron Schunk also had two exit velocities over 100-

TRIPLE-A LEADERBOARD: Hunter Goodman is 4th in doubles (7) and T-5th in XBH (11) ... Jordan Beck is T-9th in XBH (10) ... Greg Jones is T-6th in stolen bases (8) ... Julio Carreras is T-3rd in triples (3).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
