Today: The Lansing Lugnuts, High-A affiliate of the A's, play the fourth of a six-game series against the Cedar Rapids Kernels, High-A affiliate of the Minnesota Twins. These are the only meetings of the year between the two squads; the Kernels lost the opener but have won the last two games.

Yesterday: Kernels 7, Lugnuts 4. Cedar Rapids spoiled the A's organizational debut of Leo De Vries, thanks to 3-RBI nights from Caden Kendle and Billy Amick helping the Kernels overcome a 2-1 deficit with two runs in the 5th and four runs in the 6th.

Off the Field: Tonight is Knights of Columbus Night plus a Lawrence Butler Bobblehead Giveaway to the first 1,000 fans, followed by a LAFCU Fireworks Spectacular! Tomorrow is Harry Potter Night with a special Hogwarts House Hat Giveaway and postgamen LAFCU Fireworks.

Prospecting: The Lugnuts' current roster boasts six of MLB Pipeline's Top 30 Athletics prospects in No. 1 Leo De Vries, No. 14 Steven Echavarria, No. 19 Ryan Lasko, No. 23 Wei-En Lin, No. 27 Kenya Huggins and No. 30 Tzu-Chen Sha.

200 to The Show: 2023-24 Lugnut Luis Morales, it was reported yesterday, will be receiving a call-up to the Major Leagues by the Athletics. When Morales makes his MLB debut, he will become the 200th all-time Lugnut to reach the Majors.

Roster Movement: Earlier today, the Athletics promoted Sahid Valenzuela and Jared Dickey to Double-A Midland, replaced in Lansing by pitcher Kyle Robinson (from Midland) and infielder/outfielder C.J. Pittaro (from Single-A Stockton). This is Dickey's first trip to the Double-A level, while Valenzuela played in Midland earlier this season.

At the Deadline: Yesterday, the Athletics traded 2022 Lugnut Mason Miller with starter JP Sears to the San Diego Padres in exchange for Fort Wayne TinCaps shortstop Leo De Vries and a trio of pitchers. De Vries, the No. 3 prospect in Minor League Baseball, was immediately ranked by MLB Pipeline as the Athletics' new No. 1 prospect. The A's also traded Miguel Andújar to the Cincinnati Reds in exchange for Dayton Dragons pitcher Kenya Huggins, the A's new No. 27 prospect, who is scheduled to start for the Lugnuts on Sunday.

The Mutant Cycle: The best individual performance of the season belongs to the newest Lugnut, Leo De Vries, who went 5-for-5 on April 22nd against the Lugnuts with a single, a double, two home runs, a sacrifice fly, and - in the top of the ninth inning, a go-ahead two-run triple to both give the TinCaps the win and culminate the third cycle in Fort Wayne franchise history. De Vries finished the game with eight RBIs.

Wild Times Against the West: This series vs. Cedar Rapids marks the Lugnuts' final meetings with a West Division team this season. The results: 1-2 vs. Cedar Rapids, 5-1 at Wisconsin, 5-1 vs. South Bend, 3-3 vs. Beloit and 3-3 at Quad Cities, giving the Nuts a 17-10 record for the year against the West compared to 32-40 vs. the East. In that series at Quad Cities, the Nuts won two of the first three games to help the Cedar Rapids Kernels win the first half West Division title.

We Have Contact: No team in Minor League Baseball strikes out fewer times than the Lansing Lugnuts, whose total of 680 whiffs is the best in MiLB by 26 over the next closest team, Erie. The Nuts average a scant 6.87 strikeouts per game. Toledo, in contrast, has struck out 1050 times this year and averages 10 K's per game.

Mark it Down: Lansing closer Mark Adamiak notched his 16th save Friday night, putting him one save back of Colorado Rockies Futures Game representative Welinton Herrera (Hartford Yard Goats) for the Minor League Baseball saves lead. Adamiak entered this season with just two saves in all of his baseball career, comprising high school, college, summer ball and MiLB action.

Black and Blue: T.J. Schofield-Sam has been hit by 25 pitches this year to put him three behind MiLB leader Michael Arroyo of the Arkansas Travelers. The Midwest League record is held by Luke Adams, who was hit by 40 pitches last year with Wisconsin.

League Leaderboard: T.J. Schofield-Sam is 1st in the Midwest League in batting average (.313), 6th in on-base percentage (.397) and 6th in OPS (.853). Grant Judkins leads the Midwest League in innings pitched (102 2/3) and is tied for 1st in starts (20) and complete games (1). Blaze Pontes leads the league with 33 appearances.

History vs. Cedar Rapids

The Lugnuts are 77-92 all-time vs. the Kernels, 47-42 at home and 30-50 in Cedar Rapids.

The Nuts have made only one trip to the City of Five Seasons in the last four years: 2023 with new shortstop Jacob Wilson (a 2025 A.L. All-Star), when they went 1-5.

Last year, the Lugnuts lost four of six home games to the Kernels, fitting an uncomfortable pattern: for three consecutive seasons entering 2025, the Nuts have gone 2-4 vs. Cedar Rapids at home.

AUGUST 1ST IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2013: How does a 21-hit barrage sound? Leadoff hitter Dwight Smith Jr. went 4-for-4, 3 runs, 2 RBIs, 1 walk; Christian Lopes 3-for-5, 2B, HR, 5 RBIs, and the Lugnuts squashed Kyle Schepel (who had no-hit them earlier in the year) and South Bend, 12-6, at Stanley Coveleski Regional Stadium.

2024: Ryan Lasko launched an eighth-inning, three-run, game-tying homer over the batter's eye, but the Dayton Dragons battled back to outlast the Lansing Lugnuts 13-9 in 11 innings on a rainy night at Jackson® Field™. The Dragons brought a 7-4 lead to the bottom of the eighth with rehabbing former Major Leaguer Connor Overton on the mound. But Overton hit T.J. Schofield-Sam with a pitch, gave up a single to Jonny Butler and then allowed Lasko's first High-A home run, a majestic 435-foot clout to straightaway center.

Personal: Tzu-Chen initially gained notice as a soccer star, earning a spot on the Taiwanese National Team before reaching high school... undrafted out of high school, debuted in college in 2022 with four perfect innings / nine strikeouts at National Taiwan Sport University (the same university attended by former Lugnut Chen Zhong-Ao Zhuang)... named Best Pitcher at the 2022 MeiHuaQi College National Tournament... signed with the Athletics a few months later for \$370,000 plus \$30,000 to be put toward scholarship... part of the same A's international signing class as former Lugnut Luis Morales.

Pro Ball: Debuted with the Arizona Complex League A's in 2023 (June 6, 3 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 4 K at ACL Reds), earning way to Stockton for a July 26 Calfornia League debut (4 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 3 K vs. Lake Elsinore)... spent all of 2024 with Stockton, piggybacking Will Johnston on the second day of the season... returned to Stockton to open this season and debuted as part of a combined no-hitter at Fresno, following Jefferson Jean's five hitless innings with three perfect innings/six strikeouts before yielding to Wilfrid Alvaradio for a perfect ninth in a 2-0 win... promoted to Lansing to replace Nathan Dettmer in the starting rotation on June 23.

Players from Taiwan in MLB: The only Taiwanese player to see time in the Majors this season is Tsung-Che Cheng of the Pittsburgh Pirates/Triple-A Indianapolis Indians... there have been 18 Major Leaguers all-time from Taiwan, the first being Chin-Feng Chen of the Dodgers, who played from 2002-2005... the Yankees' Chien-Ming Wang (2005-09, 2011-13, 2016) has the most career wins (68), the Orioles/Marlins' Wei-Yin Chen (2012-19) has the most career innings pitched (1,064 2/3), and Cleveland's Yu Chang (2019-23) has the most offensive records, from games played (235) to runs (72) to hits (121) to homers (20).

Players from Taiwan in Lansing: The first Taiwanese Lugnuts are franchise record-holders - Po-Hsuan Keng, who pitched primarily out of the bullpen for the Nuts from 2005-2007, and Chi-Hung Chen, who served as a starting pitcher in 2005-06 and 2008... in 2024, Brock Whittlesey broke Keng's franchise record of most career appearances; Whittlesey pitched in 103 games from 2021-23, while Keng appeared in 94... Cheng owns the Lugnuts' franchise record for most career innings pitched (374), with Keng ranking second (202); Cheng also ranks first in games started (67), career wins (23), losses (20), starts (67), strikeouts (367), runs (188), hits (360), and walks (189). Last season, the Lugnuts had Chen Zhong-Ao Zhuang, who sparkled with a 2.56 ERA in nine appearances, six starts, spanning 31 2/3 innings, posting a 3:29 BB:K ratio.

Additional Lug•Notes

DK at the Helm: The 19th manager in Lugnuts history is **Darryl Kennedy**, entering his second year in the A's organization. Kennedy distinguished himself as a catcher at Manatee Community College before starring at the University of North Florida and was named an NCAA All-American in 1991 en route to North Florida's Hall of Fame, inducted in 2017. Kennedy played in the Minor Leagues for seven seasons, including parts of four seasons in Triple-A. Following his 1997 retirement, he immediately began managing, leading the Gulf Coast League Rangers to the 1998 GCL Championship. Kennedy won a second title with the GCL Rangers in 2000, moving on to stops in the Florida State League, Northwest League and Texas League through 2006. Upon joining the Royals' organization, Kennedy managed in the Appalachian League, Carolina League, Pioneer League, Arizona League and Texas League through 2020. He served as bench coach for the KBO's Hanwha Eagles from 2021 through 2023 before joining the A's as Double-A Midland's assistant hitting coach in 2024.

Filling Out the Staff: Dave Burba, the Lugnuts' pitching coach, walked on at Ohio State, pitched in the Big Ten Championship game as a freshman, was drafted by the Mariners one round after Ken Griffey, Jr. in 1987, and won 115 games in 15 MLB seasons before spending 13 seasons as a pitching coach in the Colorado Rockies' organization. Rubén Escalera is in his second year as hitting coach and his 30th season in the A's organization; he simultaneously serves as a scout for the A's in Puerto Rico. And the pride of Yuba City, Calif., Cooper Goldby comes to the Lugnuts after two seasons serving as the Dominican Summer League A's manager. The catcher/utilityman was drafted out of Lewis-Clark State in the 35th round in 2017.

Get to Know These Names: If the past is any indication, the Athletics' draft picks will be making a Midwest League impact sooner rather than later. Last year, third-rounder Joshua Kuroda-Grauer finished the season in Lansing before starring for the Nuts thus far this year. In 2023, the Lugnuts received first-rounder Jacob Wilson for 23 games in August; two years later, Wilson started the All-Star Game for the American League at shortstop. This year, the A's selected Florida State southpaw Jamie Arnold, Pipeline's No. 4 prospect entering the draft, with the 11th overall pick, following up with a pair of impact slugging outfielders: Indiana Hoosier Devin Taylor (the No. 30 prospect) at pick 48 and Oregon State Beaver Gavin Turley (the No. 78 prospect) at pick 110.

Roll Call: The 2025 Lugnuts have featured 39 different players, 17 position players and 22 pitchers (plus one position player pitching). 14 different players have hit a home run, 13 different players have stolen a base, 10 different pitchers have started a game and five different pitchers have recorded a save.

Walk-Off Wonders: The Nuts have walked off with a win on four different occasions this year:

- Jared Dickey's two-run single in the 12th inning to beat Great Lakes, 12-11, April 13th
- Sahid Valenzuela's RBI single in the 10th inning to beat Lake County, 1-0, May 4th
- Rodney Green, Jr.'s RBI single in the 10th inning to beat South Bend, 7-6, May 13th
- Jared Dickey's RBI fielder's choice in the bottom of the 9th to beat West Michigan, 4-3, June 11th

From The 517 to The Show: Six former Lugnuts players have made the Major Leagues this season, most recently Colby Thomas on June 29, bringing the total to 199 Lugnuts all-time who've reach the Majors. Thomas joined Max Muncy, Gunnar Hoglund, Jack Winkler, Denzel Clarke, Jack Perkins and broadcaster Adam Jaksa to debut this season in MLB.

All-Star Representation, Futures Edition: Tommy White and 2025 Opening Day starter Gage Jump epresented the Athletics' organization at the 2025 All-Star Futures Game on July 12th at Truist Park. White went 0-for-1 with a strikeout while Jump needed only four pitches to strike out Padres No. 1 prospect Leo De Vries and induce a groundout from Cubs No. 1 prospect Owen Caissie – coincidentally to White at third. White, the A's No. 6 prospect, joined Luis Morales (2024), Denzel Clarke (2022), Vladimir Guerrero Jr. and Bo Bichette (2017) and Angel Perdomo (2016) as active Lugnuts to play in the Futures Game.

All-Star Representation, Present Tense: Four Lugnuts were named Major League All-Stars – American League starting shortstop Jacob Wilson (2023), A.L. starting first baseman Vladimir Guerrero, Jr. (2017), A.L. reserve catcher Alejandro Kirk (2019), and N.L. starting pitcher Matthew Boyd (2013). It was Vladdy's fifth All-Star appearance, Kirk's second, and the first apiece for Wilson and Boyd. Wilson was the first A's starting shortstop in an All-Star Game since Bert Campaneris (1974) and the first rookie starting shortstop in an All-Star Game since Ron Hansen in 1960.

Still Shoving: 45-year-old Rich Hill pitched for the Lugnuts in 2003 (0-1, 2.76, 15 G, 4 GS, 29 1/3 innings, 14 H, 36 walks, 50 strikeouts, 9 wild pitches). On July 13, Hill struck out 10 Toledo Mud Hens in five innings, becoming the first 45-year-old to strike out at least 10 batters in a game since the Texas Rangers' Nolan Ryan whiffed double-digit Athletics on August 6, 1992. Hill is in his 20th professional season and with his 14th different MLB organization.

The Butler Did What?!: 2021-2022 Lugnut Lawrence Butler led off July 8th's game for the A's vs. Atlanta with an inside-the-park home run, the Athletics' first inside-the-park homer since Mark Kotsay achieved the feat on October 4, 2006; the first leadoff inside-the-park home run for the A's since Elmer Valo in 1943; and the first A's player to have both an inside-the-park home run and an over-the-fence home run in the same game since Billy Williams on August 23, 1975. When the Giants' Patrick Bailey delivered a walk-off inside-the-park home run to end the night in baseball, it was the first time in Major League Baseball history that a leadoff inside-the-parker and a walk-off inside-the-parker were hit on the same day.

Dubious History: 2018 Lugnut **Vinny Capra** was former Great Lakes Loon Clayton Kershaw's 3,000th strikeout victim on July 2. Capra, a 20th-rounder from Richmond in 2018, had been claimed off waivers by the White Sox from the Milwaukee Brewers on May 15.

Simply Electric: 2022 Lugnut Denzel Clarke won the MLB Chevrolet Electric Play of the Week each of his first four weeks in the Majors.

Happy Trails: 2012 Nut Kevin Pillar announced his retirement on July 2 following a 13-year playing career with 10 different teams. A 32nd-round selection in 2011, Pillar went 6-for-6 with a grand slam in a 6-RBI night at the Dayton Dragons on May 13, 2012, and found a fire extinguisher in his locker after the game. He went on to be the 2012 Midwest League Most Valuable Player.

What a Crowd, Part II: The Nuts drew 8,863 for Grand Slam School Day III on May 28 vs. Beloit, an attendance that ranks the 31st largest crowd in Minor League Baseball this year. If Lansing's July 4 crowd is excluded, the May 28 attendance would rank larger than any crowd in High-A this season except for a West Michigan Whitecaps gate of 9,049 on June 7.
