YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels dropped their season opener in front of a sold-out crowd at The Diamond. David Villar put the Flying Squirrels ahead in the first with an RBI double, but Hartford answered with a three-run homer by Elehuris Montero in the third to take a 3-1 lead. The Yard Goats added three more runs in the sixth to pull ahead, 6-1. Andres Angulo cut the hole to three with a two-run double in the ninth. In his Double-A debut, Tristan Beck worked 4.0 innings and allowed two earned runs. Hartford starter Ryan Rolison struck out seven over 5.0 innings and allowed one run.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second game of the 2021 season and the second of six in this series against the Hartford Yard Goats, Double-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies. This series marks Hartford's only visit to The Diamond in 2021. The Flying Squirrels will visit Connecticut's capital city from June 22-27 for a six-game series.

A BUNCH OF SELLOUTS: Including last night, the Flying Squirrels have sold out all 11 of their home openers in the franchise's history. While adhering to guidelines set forth by the Commonwealth of Virginia and Major League Baseball, maximum capacity is currently capped at 30 percent, which is 2,943. Although a bit below the standard sellout of 9,845, last night's game marked the 51st sellout in franchise history. The Flying Squirrels are 33-21 all-time in sellouts (including double-headers).

STREAK SNAPPED: Last night's home-opening loss snapped a streak of five consecutive wins in the season's first game at The Diamond, which dated back to 2015. The Flying Squirrels are now 8-3 all time in home openers, with last night's defeat joining the 2013 and 2014 games as the only losses.

WELCOME BACK, AUGGIE: José Alguacil returns to manage the Flying Squirrels after leading the team to a 72-68 record in 2015, the most recent season the team has posted a winning record. Alguacil is in his 15th overall season with the Giants organization and worked at the Alternate Training Site in 2020. He previously served as the first base coach and oversaw bunting instruction while assisting with infield defense and baserunning in San Francisco from 2017-2019 on Bruce Bochy's major league staff.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS finished the 2019 season with a 55-84 record, the worst in the franchise's history, and finished in last place in the Eastern League's Western Division for the second consecutive year. Seven players from the 2019 team are back in Richmond to start the 2021 season, including **Jacob Heyward, Sean Hjelle, Ryan Howard, Peter Maris, Heliot Ramos, Frank Rubio and Raffi Vizcaino.** Reliever **Patrick Ruotolo** did not appear with the Flying Squirrels in 2019, but he did pitch in Richmond in 2018. Outfielder **Vince Fernandez** played in the Eastern League with Hartford in 2019.

THE YARD GOATS return four players from their 2019 team and welcome 24 newcomers. Six players from the 2019 Yard Goats have gone on to reach the majors. The 2021 Hartford roster includes four players ranked by MLB.com in the Rockies' Top-30 prospects, including RHP **Ryan Rolison** (2), 3B **Elehuris Montero** (9), OF **Jameson Hannah** (13) and RHP **Tommy Doyle** (22). The Yard Goats went 73-66 in 2019 and finished in third place in the Eastern League's Eastern Division.

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Sam Long makes his Double-A debut and his first start as a member of the Giants organization. He signed with San Francisco as a free agent on November 17, 2020. He was originally drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in the 18th round in 2016 out of Sacramento State, where he was the Preseason WAC Pitcher of the Year. He climbed high as the Single-A level with Tampa before being released at the beginning of spring training in 2018. In 2019, Long signed as a free agent with the Chicago White Sox and spent the season with the Single-A Kannapolis Intimidators, where he split time between the starting rotation and the bullpen. Long signed with the Giants on November 17, 2020. For more on Long, see page two.

FOR HARTFORD: Right-hander Garrett Schilling takes the mound for his Double-A debut. In 2019, Schilling made 25 starts for the Lancaster JetHawks, where he went 9-8 with a 5.11 ERA in the hitter-friendly California League. He was originally selected by the Rockies in the 18th round of the 2017 MLB Draft out of Xavier, where he was selected Second-Team All-BIG East in 2016 and 2017.

ALL OVER THE MAP: The Flying Squirrels roster contains 18 players from 11 different states across the United States: California (5), Georgia (3), Florida (2) and one player from North Carolina, Minnesota, Illinois, Massachusetts, New York, Missouri, Washington and Ohio. Nine players grew up in four countries and territories outside of the 50 states, including the Dominican Republic (4), Puerto Rico (2), Venezuela (2) and Colombia (1).

THE MORE THE MERRIER: Under the new Player Development License structure, Double-A active rosters include 28 players, up from 25 in the previous system. The Flying Squirrels initial roster includes 15 pitchers and 13 position players.

PROSPECT WATCH: The Flying Squirrels have three players included in *Baseball America*'s Top-30 Giants prospects: **Heliot Ramos** (3), **Tristan Beck** (12) and **Sean Hjelle** (13). Ramos is also rated by *Baseball America* as the No. 83 overall prospect. Ramos (3), Hjelle (11) and Beck (20) are also ranked in MLB.com's Top-30 Giants prospects.

BULLS REUNITED: Richmond's **David Villar** and Hartford's Coco Montes were teammates while at University of South Florida during the 2016-2018 seasons. As a junior, Villar was an 11th round selection by the Giants in the 2018 MLB Draft while Montes was selected in the 15th round by the Rockies. This season marks the first time the pair have been in the same league/level in the minors with one another as professionals.

BACK IN ACTION: In yesterday's season-opener, it was the first time that **Joey Marciano** had appeared in a game in 657 days. He sat down all three batters he faced in the fifth inning, including a swinging strikeout to begin his outing. Marciano retired from baseball on July 17, 2019. He was reinstated in the Giants system on January 12, 2021.

THE PEN IS MIGHTY: The Flying Squirrels pitching staff struck out nine total yard Goats, six of them coming from Richmond's relievers. **Trenton Toplikar** led the bullpen with two strikeouts while **Joey Marciano, Luis Amaya, Mac Marshall** and **Patrick Ruotolo** all had one strikeout. Marciano, Marshall and Ruotolo each turned in scoreless outings in Tuesday's season opener.

QUIET IN THE MIDDLE: Yesterday, Hartford's pitching staff held the Squirrels scoreless through seven consecutive innings from the second to the eighth. Richmond had a stretch of 13 straight batters retired while facing starter Ryan Rolison. The scoring drought ended for the Squirrels in the bottom of the ninth thanks to a two-RBI single from **Andres Angulo**.

THE SAME BUT DIFFERENT: Prior to the 2021 season, Major League Baseball realigned its player development structure, eliminating the Eastern League, which was the home of the Flying Squirrels for ten seasons. Under the new alignment, the Flying Squirrels play in the 12-team Double-A Northeast, which includes 11 of the former E.L. teams. The Somerset Patriots are the only new opponent on Richmond's schedule this year. The Flying Squrrels are in the Double-A Northeast Southwest Division, which includes its former foes from the E.L. Western Division, including Akron, Altoona, Bowie, Erie and Harrisburg. The Northeast Division includes Binghamton, Hartford, New Hampshire, Portland, Reading and Somerset.
