LAST GAME: The Skeeters won their fourth straight game Friday night with a 5-1 win at Dell Diamond.

Miguelangel Sierra and CJ Hinojosa each hit their first homers of the year. It was also the first career home run at the Triple A level for both players. Brett Conine tossed five scoreless innings to pick up his second straight winning decision of the year

ARE YOU "SIRI"OUS: Skeeters outfielder Jose Siri drove in two runs Friday night and his 20 RBIs this season are the most in all of Minor League Baseball. Siri set the Skeeters single-game franchise record, including their time as an independent team, with seven RBIs in Thursday's win at Round Rock. He also ranks in a tie for first in Triple A West in hits (16), second in batting average (.471) tied for third in doubles (5) and fourth in OPS (1.382).

**BEAT THE STREAK: Ronnie Dawson, Lorenzo Quintana** and **Jose Siri** are each riding seven-game hitting streaks. They are each tied for the secondlongest active hitting streak in Triple A West.

**THE FIREMEN:** Skeeters relievers have posted a 2.34 ERA this season, which is the lowest ERA in Triple A West and third-lowest in all of Triple A. Opponents are hitting .157 against the Skeeters bullpen this season, which is the opponents batting average for a Triple A bullpen.

JAKE THE RAKE: Jake Meyers homered on Thursday night and has three home runs in his last two appearances. Meyers is tied for the Triple A West lead with four home runs. He became the first player in Skeeters Triple A history to record a multihomer game, hitting two home runs on Tuesday in Albuquerque.

**PLAY THE HITS:** The Skeeters have recorded double-digit hit totals in seven of eight games this season. They've recorded two 17-hit games so far, which are the second-most by a Triple A West team in a game season. The Skeeters' .346 team average is the highest of Triple A teams, Their 109 hits as a team also lead all Triple A teams.

**CJ2B: CJ Hinojosa** is tied for the Triple A West lead with six doubles this season. The Skeeters lead Triple A West with 26 doubles as a team.

**MOVING ON UP:** The Skeeters are in their first season in affiliated minor league baseball as the Triple A affiliate of the Houston Astros. The Skeeters are one of three independent teams rising to affiliated minor league ranks this offseason, along with the St. Paul Saints (AAA, MIN) and Somerset Patriots (AA, NYY).

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through their first nine seasons of existence, the Skeeters played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in 2016 and '18 and appeared in the postseason in five of nine seasons. The Skeeters still hold the Atlantic League single-season record for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from their 2013 season.

**CLOSE TO HOME:** Based on approximate mileage, the Skeeters are located second-closest to the stadium of their parent club out of Triple A teams. The St. Paul Saints are located approximately 11 miles from Minnesota's Target Field.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey is entering his third year as the manager of the Astros Triple A affiliate. He led Round Rock to the best record in Triple A in 2019 (84-56) and to the Pacific Coast League Finals. Storey got his first managerial job in the Astros system in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities, winning the Western Division of the Midwest League. Storey appeared at the MLB level with the Astros in 2012 and the Blue Jays in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. He still holds numerous career pitching records for Florida Atlantic University.

MAJOR TALENT: The Skeeters roster features eight players with Major League service time: OF Ronnie Dawson, IF Alex De Goti, IF Taylor Jones, RHP Nivaldo Rodriguez, RHP Peter Solomon, C Garrett Stubbs, IF Abraham Toro, RHP Hector Velazquez. All but Velazquez have appeared at the Majors with the Astros.

PROSPECT POWER: The Skeeters have nine players ranked as Astros top-30 prospects (per MLBPipeline): RHP Tyler Ivey (No. 9), RHP Shawn Dubin (No. 11), RHP Peter Solomon (No. 14), RHP Jojanse Torres (No. 20), IF Taylor Jones (No. 21), RHP Brett Conine (No. 23), RHP Austin Hansen (No. 24), RHP Nivaldo Rodriguez, (No. 25), OF Ronnie Dawson (No. 29)

PUT IT ON THE MANTEL: Ronnie Dawson, Alex De Goti and Peter Solomon each made their Major League debuts with the Astros this season. Dawson went 1x5 with a run through 3 G, De Goti went 2x6 with a run and RBI through 6 G and Solomon tossed a scoreless 2 IP in relief, allowing just one hit and striking out two.

**WELCOME TO RR:** The Skeeters are making their first trip to Round Rock in franchise history. The Skeeters and Express are scheduled to play each other 36 times this season and are both in the East Division of Triple-A West. The Express will visit Constellation Field in Sugar Land for the first time from June 10-June 15. By mileage, they are the closest Triple A opponent to the Skeeters.
