TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints rallied once again to score a 9-7 victory over Iowa on Wednesday afternoon. After Iowa took a 1-0 lead in the second, the Saints took a 2-1 lead from a Matt Wallner RBI groundout and a Yunior Severino RBI single. After Iowa jumped back in front 5-2, the Saints score the next six runs over the fifth and sixth innings. Brooks Lee homered for the second straight game, hitting a solo shot in the fifth, followed by another Severino RBI single. Four more runs scored in the sixth, capped by a two-run double from DaShawn Keirsej Jr. Meanwhile, Scott Blewett threw 3.2 innings, allowing one earned run and striking out four to earn his fourth win of the season. The Saints scored one more in the ninth on a wild pitch to add an insurance run at 9-7. Josh Winder threw 2.1 innings to get his third save of the season.

ROAD WARRIORS: By beating Iowa 9-7 on Wednesday, the Saints have won nine consecutive road games, dating back to June 2 at Rochester. Their nine-game road win streak is the longest in Triple-A this season and tied for the second-longest among all full-season minor league teams. Only the Great Lakes Loons (High-A, LAD) have a longer streak, winning 11 straight road games from April 13-May 1. The Saints are tied with Mississippi (Double-A, ATL) with their nine game streak from May 12-June 5 for the second longest among full-season teams.

SUMMERTIME SEVERINO: In Yunior Severino's 28 games since May 21, he has hit .469 (41-for-99), with eight home runs, drawing 25 walks to 27 strikeouts, owning a 1.223 OPS. His average exit velocity over that stretch is 93.1 mph, up from his season average of 89.7 mph. In June, Severino leads the IL in batting average (.469), on-base percentage, sporting a .600 clip and OPS, at 1.350. His 20 June walks are the second-most in the league.

Severino is having one of the best months a for a Saints hitter in franchise history. Severino's .469 June batting average is the highest for any Saints player (min. 20 PAs) in any month dating back to 2021. His .600 on-base percentage is also the highest and his 1.350 OPS is the second-highest, trailing Alex Kirilloff's 1.488 OPS in June of 2022. He's also just the eighth player to register a 30-hit month in franchise history. Severino is also looking to become the 20th IL player to register a .600 OBP in a single month since 2021.

JUNE JOLT: June has been a major turning point for the Saints in 2024. They lead all full-season clubs with a .303/.399/.533 slash line and .932 OPS in June. Their 41 runs scored this month are the second-most, trailing Lehigh Valley's 44 long balls. The 115 walks drawn are the third-most and 143 runs are the fifth most.

LET'S TAKE A WALK: Since June 18, the Saints have been patient at the plate, drawing 52 walks, the most in Triple-A in that span. The Saints have drawn 367 walks this season, the second-most in the International League.

The 10 walks the Saints drew on Wednesday marks the fourth time this season and the 16th time in franchise history the club has drawn 10-or-more free passes. The Saints are 14-2 in games they draw at least 10 walks.

SAINTS AND I-CUBS: This week marks the seventh six-game series that the Saints and Iowa Cubs have played in Principal Park, the most the Saints have played at any road venue since 2021. The Saints are 21-17 all-time in Des Moines, their second-best record of any road venue they have played at least two series (Louisville Slugger Field: 23-13).

WALLNER WARMING UP: In his 19 June games, Matt Wallner has hit .330/.396/.747 sporting a 1.143 OPS. He's hit a league-high 11 home runs in his this month, averaging a 93.8 mph exit velocity and owns a .418 ISO in that span. He's also the league leader in June in RBI (26), total bases (68) and extra-base hits (16) and runs (23).

Wallner's 11 home runs in June are the most for any Triple-A player in any month this season and tied for the most of any minor league player in any month in 2024. Wallner is the 18th IL batter since 2021 to hit 10 home runs in a month and just the second Saint to accomplish the feat, joining Chris Williams, who hit 10 home runs in June of 2023.

LEE'S LOCKED IN: Brooks Lee has made his presence known in a hurry since returning to the Saints lineup. Over his last 12 games, Lee is hitting .370 (20-for-54), collecting hits in 11 of those 12 games, hitting four doubles, six home runs, owning a 1.211 OPS. Below are Lee's splits from each side of the plate this season:

GO, DIEGO, GO! Diego A. Castillo has surged again over his last 20 games, hitting .348 (23-66) with six doubles and three home runs with a 1.045 OPS. Over that 20-game span, Castillo has walked 15 times and struck out only eight times.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins cruised their way to an 8-3 win over Arizona on Wednesday. Carlos Correa, Jose Miranda and Carlos Santana each registered three-hit efforts. Simeon Woods Richardson picked up his third MLB win this year, allowing three runs over 5.1 innings, allowing just four hits.
