YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Sea Dogs, 6-5, in 10 innings, their second straight extra-innings loss. The Sea Dogs took a 3-0 lead in the top of the second with a two-out, three-run homer by Ahbram Liendo. In the bottom of the fourth, **Adrian Sugastey** scored on a wild pitch and **Aeversion Arteaga** hit a two-run single to tie the score, 3-3. The score stayed tied until the top of the 10th inning. Zach Ehrhard and Drew Ehrhard hit back-to-back RBI singles. Drew Ehrhard scored on a wild pitch for a 6-3 Portland lead. In the bottom of the 10th, **Turner Hill** hit a two-out, RBI triple and **Justin Wishkoski** scored on a wild pitch to cut the score to 6-5, but Noah Song recorded a strikeout to end the game.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the third of a six-game series against the Portland Sea Dogs, Double-A affiliate of the Boston Red Sox. This is the only series between the two teams this year. Last year in their only head-to-head series, the Flying Squirrels won four of six in Portland. The Flying Squirrels have not lost back-to-back games since July 2-3 against the Baysox at The Diamond.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,504 fans per home game, which ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are 11-6 in their last 17 games and tied for first place in the Southwest Division Second-Half standings. They have won three consecutive series, sweeping a three-game road series against the Baysox from July 4-6, winning five-of-six in Akron from July 8-13 and taking two-of-three at The Diamond against the Senators last weekend. Their six-game win streak from July 4-10 was their longest winning streak since picking up seven consecutive wins from Sept. 2-9, 2023. In the last 16 games since July 1, the Flying Squirrels lead the Eastern League in triples (7), walks (76) and OBP (.343). Of Richmond's 56 losses this season, 31 of them have been by two runs or less (21 by one, 10 by two). Their 21 one-run losses are the most in the EL, one more than Reading. Richmond's +24 run differential in the second half is second-best in the league.

THE SEA DOGS dropped two-of-three at Reading last weekend, winning the finale in 12 innings. They won, 3-2, in 11 innings on Tuesday and took Wednesday's game, 6-5, in 10 innings. Portland has played three consecutive extra-inning games. They have gone 6-2 in their last eight games dating back to July 11 after going 3-11 in their previous 14 games from June 25-July 10. Portland's roster features seven of Baseball America's top-30 Red Sox prospects, including LHP Payton Tolle (No. 3), OF James Tibbs III (No. 10), LHP Connelly Early (No. 11), RHP David Sandlin (No. 12), SS Mikey Romero (No. 14), OF Allan Castro (No. 25) and OF Zach Ehrhard (No. 29). MLB.com's top-30 Red Sox prospects list features nine Portland players, including Tolle (No. 3), Tibbs (No. 6), Sandlin (No. 9), Early (No. 10), Romero (No. 12), Castro (No. 20), RHP Blake Wehunt (No. 24), LHP Hayden Mullins (No. 29) and Zach Erhard (No. 30).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.09 ERA (83 ER/243.0 IP) in 28 games, which is the second-best in the Eastern League. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 2.26 ERA (30 ER/119.1 IP) in that stretch. In their last 12 road games since June 17, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 2.29 ERA (28 ER/110.0 IP).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Nick Sinacola** makes his first Double-A appearance since Game 1 of the Southwest Division Series on Sept. 19, 2023 against Erie. It is his first regular-season Richmond appearance since Sept. 13, 2023 at Erie. Zwack missed all of last year and the beginning of this season with an elbow injury. He began rehab work with the ACL Giants on May 20 and pitched six scoreless starts, spanning 12.1 innings. He made four starts with High-A Eugene before being assigned to Richmond on July 19. Zwack was selected by the New York Mets in the 17th round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Xavier. He was traded to the Giants along with J.D. Davis, Carson Seymour and Thomas Szapucki for Darin Ruf on August 2, 2022. Zwack spent the 2023 season with the Flying Squirrels and went 5-7 with a 6.56 ERA in 24 outings, including 16 starts. **For more on Zwack, see page two.**

FOR PORTLAND: Left-hander Dalton Rogers makes his eighth Double-A start and 11th appearance for the Sea Dogs. He last pitched on Friday at Reading and allowed four runs over 3.2 innings in a loss. Rogers spent last season with High-A Greenville and returned to the South Atlantic League to begin this season, going 2-1 with a 1.31 ERA in five outings (one start). He was promoted to Double-A on May 13. Rogers was selected by the Red Sox in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of the University of Southern Mississippi.

NEW FACES: Outfielders **Bo Davidson** and **Scott Bandura** were assigned to the Flying Squirrels last week from High-A Eugene. With the Emeralds this season, Davidson was ranked second in the Northwest League in batting average (.309), second in RBIs (56), second in triples (6), third in SLG (.507), fourth in OBP (.412), fourth in OPS (.919), fourth in hits (87), tied for fourth in total bases (143), tied for fifth in runs (53), seventh in walks (49) and seventh in extra-base hits (30). He was also second in the Northwest League in wRC+ (.148). Davidson is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 4 Giants prospect and No. 8 by MLB.com. Bandura was leading the Northwest League in runs (65) and ranked second in hits (98), second in stolen bases (30), third in batting average (.307), fifth in OBP (.399) and seventh in total bases (140). Bandura made his Double-A debut in the first game of Saturday's doubleheader and collected three hits, including a solo homer. Davidson hit his first Double-A homer on Sunday.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 47 stolen base attempts this season, which second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 34 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has the second-most runners caught stealing by a catcher in a single season in franchise history, trailing **Jackson Williams** (35 - 2013). For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 47 runners caught stealing for his career is fourth-most in franchise history, two behind **Brandon Martorano** (49).

SECOND-HALF SABIN: **Sabin Ceballos** is batting .333 (17-for-51) in his last 15 games since July 3 with two homers, four doubles, nine RBIs, 10 walks and 10 runs scored. The stretch has raised his season batting average from .176 to .207. He reached base four times on Tuesday night against the Sea Dogs, going 3-for-3 with a double and a walk. He repeated on Wednesday, going 3-for-3 with a double and a walk. He has reached base in eight consecutive plate appearances. Last year, Ceballos hit .295 with seven homers and 30 RBIs in his last 32 games of the season, all with High-A Eugene after being traded from the Braves to the Giants.

KING OF THE HILL: **Turner Hill** has reached base in 13 consecutive games since July 3, batting .356 (16-for-45) with three doubles, two triples, a homer, 10 walks and nine RBIs. The streak is tied for the second-longest by a Richmond player this season, one behind a 14-game on-base streak by Diego Velasquez from June 10-27. He also has a six-game hitting streak dating back to July 11. Despite not starting his season until May 27, Hill is tied for second in the Eastern League with five triples this year.

SAVING THE DAY: **Tyler Myrick** recorded his seventh save of the season on July 12 in Akron. It was the 19th save of his Richmond career, which sits seventh on the franchise's all-time list, one behind sixth-place Cody Hall (20). Myrick has converted all three of his save attempts since July 1 over five appearances.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked fifth in walks (47), sixth in hits (84) and seventh in OBP (.363). **Turner Hill** is tied for second in triples (5). **Seth Lonsway** is fifth in innings pitched (88.0), sixth in ERA (3.48) and eighth in strikeouts (83). **John Michael Bertrand** is second in innings pitched (95.2), third in ERA (3.10) and 10th in WHIP (1.30). **Jack Choate** is sixth in strikeouts (88), eighth in BAA (.229) and 10th in ERA (3.70). **Joe Whitman** is ninth in strikeouts (82). **Tyler Myrick** is tied for fifth in saves (7).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 238 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 4), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 7), **Joe Whitman** (No. 8), **Jack Choate** (No. 24) and **Sabin Ceballos** (No. 29). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeversion Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features four Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 12), Velasquez (No. 18) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1931: The Richmond Byrds (Colts) of the Class-A Eastern League beat the Springfield Ponies, 5-0, at Tate Field. Jimmy Pattison threw a nine-inning no-hitter. The 21-year-old had asked for his release from Hartford earlier in the year after not pitching frequently and signed with Bridgeport before being optioned to Richmond. Pattison retired the first 15 batters in order. Pattison had briefly pitched for the Brooklyn Robins in the majors in 1929. **1967:** The Atlanta Braves beat the Richmond Braves, 7-6, in an exhibition game at Parker Field in front of a crowd of 6,849. Six weeks removed from being drafted by the Braves out of USC, Tom House was called up from Kingston to start for Richmond and allowed five runs over 6.1 innings. He hit two RBI singles at the plate. Bobby Cox had a hit and scored two runs. Tito Francona went 4-for-5 for Atlanta. Joe Torre started at catcher for the A-Braves. **1971:** The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 5-3, at Parker Field. Curt Moore won the game with a walk-off, two-run homer in the bottom of the ninth inning for his first Triple-A hit. **1994:** The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 4-3, at The Diamond. Bobby Moore brought in a run with a groundout in the first before Toledo scored a run on an error in the third. In the bottom of the third, Moore hit an RBI single to take the lead. Luis Lopez singled in a run in the seventh for a 3-1 lead. Toledo tied the score in the ninth with a single by Alan Zinter and an RBI groundout by Ivan Cruz. In the bottom of the 12th, Eddie Perez hit a groundball that was bobbled by the Toledo short-stop. Luis Lopez, who was in a hurry because he had to get his wife to the airport after the game for a flight to New York, beat the throw to second to avoid the force out, allowing Pat Kelly to score the winning run. **2022:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 7-6, at The Diamond. The Baysox scored six runs in the first two innings to take a 6-0 lead. Ricardo Genoves hit a three-run homer to close the score to 6-3 in the third. In the sixth, Brett Auerbach hit a solo homer and Jacob Heyward drove a two-run shot to tie the game, 6-6. Diego Rincones hit a go-ahead single in the seventh. The six-run deficit tied the team record for the largest come-from-behind win in team history.
