NEWS AND NOTES

MC GEE-BER: Easton McGee will be making his third straight start, and fourth overall this season on Friday night against the Durham Bulls. McGee appeared in 28 games (23 GS) for the Bulls between 2021-22, going 6-9 with a 5.19 ERA. McGee has posted a 4-1 record with a 4.18 ERA in 17 appearances for the Sounds this year. The four wins ranks second on the team behind Reiss Knehr (5). McGee has a 11-3 career record with a 4.59 ERA in 60 appearances (6 GS) since 2024 with Nashville.

HOW YOU BADD00: Akil Baddoo continues to punish Bulls pitching after going 2-for-4 with a season-high 4 RBI on Thursday night. In seven games vs. the Bulls this year, Baddoo is hitting .346 (9-for-26) with six XBH and 12 RBI. Thursday's game was his third straight of the series with 3+ RBI after not recording more than two RBI in any of his first 16 games with the Sounds. For the series he is hitting .500 (5-for-10) with two homers, a triple, double, 10 RBI, and has five walks. The longest RBI-streak of his professional career sits at four consecutive games with the Detroit Tigers on April 4-7 during the 2021 season. He is the only Sounds hitter that has earned 3+ RBI in three straight games this season and the first to do it since Jaycob Brugman did so August 20-22, 2016. He is one of four Triple-A players to have a 3-RBI streak of at least three games this season and one of just seven overall in the minors.

LUIS QUATROS: Luis Matos went 2-for-5 Thursday night and finished with a season-high 4 RBI. Matos has earned 15 RBI for the Sounds this season to go along with a .273 AVG (21-for-77) and four extra-base hits. The four RBI matched the team-high alongside Akil Baddoo as the pair added the seventh and eighth 4-RBI game of the season for the Sounds. Thursday night was the 15th game with 4+ RBI of his professional career and **first since recording back-to-back games with 4+ RBI on June 11 (4), and June 12 (5), 2024 with Triple-A Sacramento. Of his 15 career 4+ RBI games, three have now come on June 11. He also had four RBI on June 11, 2023 with Sacramento.**

BREAKOUT NIGHT: The Sounds scored a season-high 16 runs Thursday night highlighted by a six-run fifth that put the game out of reach. The 16 runs marks the most runs for the Sounds this season, surpassing the previous-high of 12 runs which they scored two different times against Charlotte and Iowa earlier in the year. The last time the Sounds scored at least 16 runs in a game was on July 21, 2023, against the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp when they put together 17 runs on 16 hits. Thursday's win marks the second time the Sounds have put together 15 hits in a game, with the first one coming at Charlotte on April 25. The most runs the Sounds have scored in a single game since 2005 was 19 runs at El Paso on July 16, 2016.

I'M DIFFERENT, YEAH, I'M (RUN) DIFFERENT(IAL): Following the 16-run outburst, Nashville has outscored its opponents 336 to 268 this season. The +68 run differential ranks as the second-best in the International League, the fourth-best in Triple-A and the 11th-best among full-season minor league teams. The 11-run win on Thursday night matched the largest margin of victory for the Sounds this year after also beating Iowa by 11 runs on May 16 at First Horizon Park. During the current five-game winning streak, the Sounds have outscored their opponents 37-14 (+23).

HOME COOKIN: The Sounds continue to lead the minors for the most wins at home this season after picking up their 26th win at First Horizon Park Thursday night. Double-A Richmond has the second-most wins at home this year with 24. Salt Lake and Syracuse are tied for the second-most wins at home in Triple-A behind Nashville with 22. Through 32 home games last season, the Sounds had a 21-11 record with a 2.87 ERA. Nashville has guaranteed themselves they will finish the first half of the season with fewer than 10+ home losses. The 26 wins at home are the most the Sounds have had through June 11 since posting 23 wins through their first 35 games in 2014.
