Dayton Dragons (28-28, 61-61) at Great Lakes Loons (27-29, 72-49)

RH Jose Acuña (7-3, 3.61) vs. LH Justin Wroblewski (4-4, 2.93)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Great Lakes Loons (affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers) in the third game of a six-game series.

Season Series: Dayton 10, Great Lakes 10 (at Dow Diamond: Dayton 6, Great Lakes 2).

Last Game: Wednesday: Great Lakes 11, Dayton 1. The Loons put together four multi-run innings on the way to evening the series. Dayton's Austin Hendrick blasted his third home run in the last two games, but the Dragons could collect only four hits in the game.

Current Series (August 29-Sept. 3 at Great Lakes): Dayton is 1-1 in the series.

Dayton team statistics in the series: .215 batting average; 3.5 runs/game; 5 home runs; 1 stolen base; 7.94 ERA; 2 errors.

Last Series (August 22-27 vs. Lansing): Dayton went 2-4 in the series.

Dayton team statistics in the series: .205 batting average; 3.0 runs/game; 3 home runs; 0 stolen bases; 3.33 ERA; 5 errors.

Team Notes

- The Dragons are in fourth place, four and one-half games behind first place West Michigan in the East Division with 10 games to play. To reach the playoffs, the Dragons must win the division title in the second half.
- Tuesday's 6-5 win, featuring a two-run home run by Carlos Jorge when trailing 5-4 in the ninth inning, and the win at Great Lakes on July 25 when Ruben Ibarra hit a three-run home run with two outs in the ninth to give the Dragons a lead and eventual win, mark the first two Dragons comebacks of their kind since at least 2007. These two games are the first two since at least 2007 in which the Dragons, while trailing in the ninth inning on the road, hit a home run that gave them the lead and eventual win.
- The Dragons have a chance to lead the Midwest League in team pitching for the first time since 2011 and the second time in franchise history. Entering Wednesday's game, the Dragons ranked first in team ERA, but they fell to fourth after last night's loss. Dayton stands at 3.84, .07 behind the league leaders (Great Lakes and Peoria).
- In 2022, the Dragons had six players reach double-figures in home runs for the first time in franchise history (Elly De La Cruz, Austin Hendrick, Allan Cerda, Jose Torres, Alex McGarry, Rece Hinds). In 2023, five Dragons players have reached double-figures (Mat Nelson, Ruben Ibarra, Jack Rogers, Edwin Arroyo, Austin Hendrick; Justice Thompson has eight).

Player Notes

- **Austin Hendrick** now ranks tied for second on the Dragons career home run list with 28. The club record is 30 by Chris Williamson, who played for the Dragons in 2000-02. Williamson's top season was 2002 when he hit 22. Hendrick has 14 home runs for the Dragons in 2023 after hitting 14 in 2022. Hendrick is tied with Randy Ruiz and Samone Peters with 28. No player who had played for the Dragons after 2002 had hit more than 26 in his Dragons career prior to Hendrick.
- **Ruben Ibarra** over his last 14 games is batting .321 with three home runs, three doubles, and 11 runs batted in.
- **Zach Maxwell** over his last four games: 7.1 IP, 0 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 11 SO.
- **Braxton Roxby** over his last 28 G (since May 14): 3-2, 1.54 ERA, 4 saves, 41 IP, 24 H, 16 BB, 47 SO, .166 opponent's average.

Prospecting: The Dragons roster includes three players currently ranked among the Reds top-10 prospects by *MLB.com*, headlined by **Edwin Arroyo**, a shortstop ranked as the Reds #3 prospect. Arroyo, age 20, is among the 10 youngest position players to have played in the MWL this season, and the youngest among players with at least 200 at-bats. Dragons third baseman **Sal Stewart** is ranked as the Reds #8 prospect by *MLB.com*. Dragons second baseman **Carlos Jorge** is ranked as the Reds #10 prospect by *MLB.com*. Additionally, outfielder **Hector Rodriguez** is ranked as the Reds #17 prospect by *MLB.com* while **Austin Hendrick** is ranked #29.

Basics for 2023: This is the third year in which the league is classified at the High-A level of Minor League Baseball. The Midwest League was a Low-A league prior to 2021. The 12-team Midwest League operates with two six-team divisions.

The Midwest League will continue to utilize a Pitch Timer to encourage a quicker pace of play. Pitchers are required to deliver each pitch within a 14-second time limit (or 18 seconds with a runner on base). Defensive positioning rules require at least two infielders on each side of second base, with at least four infielders positioned on the infield dirt. Pitchers are limited in the number of unsuccessful pick-off throws they can make to a base. The third pick-off throw must result in an out, or the runner will be awarded the next base.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Bryan LaHair is in his second season as Dragons manager and his sixth year in the Reds organization. Under LaHair's leadership last season, the Dragons posted a first half record of 39-27 to finish second in the Midwest League's East Division, one game out of first place. The 2022 Dragons broke the club record for home runs in a season, leading the league with 152. The Dragons also narrowly missed leading the league in stolen bases, finishing with five fewer than the league leader despite playing four fewer games. LaHair served as manager with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona Complex League in 2021 and was the manager at Billings in 2019. LaHair opened his coaching career as the Billings hitting coach in 2018. As a player, LaHair played professionally for 14 seasons from 2003-14 and 2016-17, appearing in more than 1,000 games. He was primarily a first baseman but also saw considerable time as a corner outfielder. He played in 195 major league games with the Seattle Mariners and Chicago Cubs. In 2012, he appeared in the MLB All-Star Game. LaHair played for TEAM USA's national team three times (2005 World Cup, 2006 regional Olympic qualifier, 2007 Olympic qualifier). LaHair led all of Minor League Baseball in home runs in 2011 with 38 with the Iowa Cubs and was selected as the Pacific Coast League Most Valuable Player. LaHair, 40, is a native of Worcester, Massachusetts and was chosen as the 2000 Massachusetts High School Player of the Year. He was selected by the Mariners in the 39th round of the 2002 draft out of St. Petersburg College in Florida.

Todd Naskedov (NASK-uh-duv) joins the Dragons as pitching coach in 2023, his second season in the Reds organization. The 2023 season is Naskedov's sixth year in professional baseball after more than 20 years as a coach at the high school or college levels. He was the pitching coach at Single-A Daytona in the Reds organization in 2022. Naskedov spent four years as a coach in the Houston Astros organization before joining the Reds. He was the pitching coach at Single-A Fayetteville in 2021 after three years as the Astros pitching rehab coordinator at their complex in West Palm Beach, Florida. Naskedov coached college or high school baseball in Arizona, Oregon, Texas, and Washington, has coached with USA Baseball's national team, and has coached abroad in the United Kingdom and the Netherlands as a Major League Baseball international envoy. Naskedov, 46, is originally from Kelso, Washington.

Eric Richardson joins the Dragons as hitting coach in 2023, his second season in the Reds organization and 10th year as a professional coach. He was the hitting coach at Double-A Chattanooga in 2022. Richardson began his coaching career in the Phillies organization with stints as hitting coach with Single-A Lakewood in 2004; the GCL Phillies in 2005; and Short-Season Batavia in 2006. He served as the hitting coach in the White Sox organization with Great Falls for three seasons from 2017-2019. Richardson played for seven seasons in the White Sox organization from 1991-97, spending two years in the Midwest League with South Bend. In 1994, Richardson played in the outfield with NBA legend Michael Jordan during spring training in Jordan's lone season as a professional baseball player. Richardson was a base stealing threat, leading the South Atlantic League in stolen bases in 1993. Richardson, 50, was drafted by the White Sox in the fifth round in 1991 out of Brenham High School in Texas.

Osmin Melendez joins the Dragons as a coach in 2023, his first year in the Reds organization and 21st year in coaching in professional baseball. Melendez served as a coach in the Chicago Cubs system for seven seasons from 2013-19 after coaching in the Pirates organization for 13 years. He spent the 2015 season in the Midwest League as the infield coach with South Bend. Melendez began coaching as the coordinator of the Pirates academy in Venezuela from 1999-2011. He was the manager of the Pirates affiliate in the Venezuelan Summer League for six seasons, 2006-2011. His teams posted a record of 272-142 (.657), earning the VSL's best regular season record all six years and winning the league championship in 2008 and 2010. He served as manager of the Cubs affiliate in the Venezuelan Summer League in 2013. He was the hitting coach for the AZL Cubs in 2014 and 2017. He was the hitting/infield coach at Double-A Tennessee in 2016; the hitting coach at Short-Season Eugene in 2018; and the hitting/infield coach with Single-A Myrtle Beach in 2019. Melendez is a former infielder who played for two seasons with the GCL Orioles in the Baltimore Orioles organization, 1993-94. Melendez, 47, was born in Barquisimeto, Venezuela and currently resides in Orlando, Florida.

2023 Memorable Moments

On April 26 vs. Lake County, the Dragons reached their highest run total in nearly eight years and their highest total at home in nearly 11 years, with a 17-8 victory. They last scored 17 runs in a game on June 5, 2015 at Clinton, and last scored 17 runs at home on July 4, 2012 against South Bend. The club record for most runs in a game is 21, in 2001. On April 26, Mat Nelson hit two home runs including the back end of back-to-back home runs in the third inning after Austin Callahan had hit a two-run homer. Jack Rogers hit a grand slam, the second of the year for the Dragons. Dayton was 8 for 12 with men in scoring position. Tyler Callihan added a double and triple.

In back-to-back games, the Dragons trailed with two outs and the bases empty in the ninth inning but rallied to win. On July 23 vs. Wisconsin, the Dragons trailed 5-4 with two outs and the bases empty in the bottom of the ninth inning when Hayden Jones belted a game-tying home run. Two batters later, after a pair of walks, Edwin Arroyo lined a single to center field to drive in Trey Faltine from second with the winning run. In the next game, on July 25 at Great Lakes, the Dragons trailed 2-0 with two outs and the bases empty in the top of the ninth inning when Arroyo doubled, Austin Callahan walked, and Ruben Ibarra blasted a 451' three-run home run to left field to give the Dragons a 3-2 lead. Braxton Roxby pitched a perfect bottom of the ninth to close out the win.

The win on July 25, and another win on August 29, marked the first two Dragons comebacks of their kind since at least 2007. On August 29, trailing 5-4 in the top of the ninth at Great Lakes, Carlos Jorge hit a two-run home run to give Dayton a 6-5 lead, which they held for the win. These two games marked the first two since at least 2007 in which the Dragons, while trailing in the ninth inning on the road, hit a home run that gave them the lead and went on to win the game.

The Dragons win on August 22 against Lansing, rallying back from a 4-0 deficit going to the bottom of the eighth inning, marked the first time since May 1, 2018, that the Dragons rallied from a deficit of at least four runs at the end of the seventh inning to win (they trailed Burlington 8-3 after 7; won 10-8 in 10 innings).
