TODAY'S GAME

The Texas Rangers and Houston Astros Alternate Training Site squads continue their three-game exhibition series on Tuesday afternoon at Whataburger Field in Corpus Christi. Texas RHP Jason Bahr is scheduled to make his second start of the spring while Houston plans to send RHP Tyler Ivey to the mound. First pitch is set for 4:05 p.m.

RAISING THE BAHR

Texas Rangers RHP Jason Bahr looked sharp in his first Alternate Training Site start back on April 8 against the Houston Astros at Dell Diamond. The righty scattered three hits over 3.0 scoreless innings, striking out five Astros hitters in the process. The righty went 0-1 with a 5.79 ERA (6 ER/9.1 IP) in five relief appearances at Major League Spring Training last month.

OUT OF THE 'PEN

Rangers starter RHP Jason Bahr is scheduled to pitch approximately four innings in today's contest. Following Bahr out of the Texas bullpen, in no particular order, is expected to be RHP Blake Bass, RHP Michael Matuella, LHP Joely Rodríguez and RHP Colin Wiles.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT

The Houston Astros defeated the Texas Rangers by a final score of 9-3 in Monday night's Alternate Training Site exhibition game at Whataburger Field in Corpus Christi. Offensively for Texas, SS Yonny Hernandez finished the game 4-5 with a double and two RBI. LF Jason Martin and DH Curtis Terry each collected a pair of singles as the Rangers posted 10 total hits on the night. On the mound, Texas starter RHP Drew Anderson suffered the loss after allowing a run on two hits in 2.0 innings of work. LHP Joely Rodríguez recorded his first Major League rehab assignment with the team, allowing a hit and recording a strikeout in a scoreless sixth inning of relief. The lefty hurled 13 pitches, including eight strikes.

YONNY ON THE SPOT

Rangers SS Yonny Hernandez tallied his first Alternate Training Site hits of the season thanks to a red-hot 4-5 performance at the plate in Monday night's defeat. The infielder collected three singles and a two-run double. He also came around to score on an ensuing Curtis Terry single, helping to produce all three of Texas' runs on the evening.

SHUT IT DOWN

The backend of the bullpen quartet of LHP Joely Rodríguez, RHP Jimmy Herget, RHP Joe Barlow and RHP Jake Lemoine combined to allow just three hits and three walks while striking out five in 4.0 scoreless innings.

IT'S BASEBALL TIME IN ROUND ROCK

On February 9, the Round Rock Express officially accepted their invitation to become the new Triple-A affiliate of the Texas Rangers. The 10-year agreement will keep Rangers Triple-A baseball in Round Rock through the 2030 season. Kicking off with the Alternate Training Site, the Express are reuniting with the Rangers after spending eight seasons as the club's top affiliate from 2011-2018. Round Rock was previously a member of the Houston Astros organization from 2019-2020.

WELCOME TO THE ALTERNATE TRAINING SITE

Created during the cancelled 2020 Minor League Baseball season, the Alternate Training Site concept provides a secondary location within close geographic proximity to each Major League Baseball club for players to train and be ready to quickly and safely be called up if necessary. At MLB's request, the Alternate Training Site model will be implemented for the month of April after the start of the Triple-A baseball season was postponed until early May.
