### GARCIA, LONG BALLS LEAD RIDERS TO VICTORY:

The Frisco RoughRiders clobbered three homers and **Ryan Garcia** fired seven strong innings in a 9-4 win over the Corpus Christi Hooks on Saturday night from Whataburger Field. The Riders (25-30) fell behind 1-0 early on a sacrifice fly from Corpus Christi (27-29) in the first inning, but that was the only run Garcia (2-4) allowed on the night. The righty went seven innings, allowing just the one run on four hits while striking out four and walking two. Frisco struck back in the third when **Aaron Zavala** cracked a two-run single down the first baseline to make it 2-1. They scored in four-straight innings from the third to the sixth. In the fourth, **Thomas Saggese** hammered a solo home run in the third for his sixth of the season and **Nick Tanielu** lifted a two-run shot in the fourth inning, his team-best seventh of the year. **Kellen Strahm** then led the sixth inning off with a solo homer, **Liam Hicks** scored on an error, **Luisangel Acuña** contributed an RBI double and Zavala capped the four-run inning with a sacrifice fly to make it 9-1. The Hooks put up three on a pair of homers in the ninth, but the Riders ended the game with a 6-4-3 double play. Peyton Plumlee (0-5) took the loss for the Hooks, allowing three runs, two earned, over his four-inning start. Saggese had the only two-hit day for the Riders on the offensive side while **Jax Biggers** collected three hits.

### BRING IN THE MAY AWARDS:

The Texas Rangers announced on Thursday that three RoughRiders players won May honors for the Rangers Minor League system. **Jack Leiter** captured Starting Pitcher of the Month honors while **Alex Speas** was named the Relief Pitcher of the Month and **Jax Biggers** the Defender of the Month. Leiter was brilliant in the month of May, going 2-1 with a 1.67 ERA over his five starts. The Summit, N.J. native struck out 33 over 27.0 innings while walking 13 and holding opponents to a .148 batting average against. The righty was fourth in the league in ERA in the month while ranking seventh in innings pitched, sixth in strikeouts, seventh in WHIP (0.96) and fourth in average against. Speas, who was a member of the 2021 RoughRiders, was dominant on the mound in May. The righty owned a 1.93 ERA in the month, allowing just two earned runs over his 9.1 innings while striking out 16 to four walks in his nine outings. The Georgia native has been one of the best relievers for Frisco all season, going 1-0 with a 0.89 ERA in 18 games, striking out 35 over 20.1 innings while holding opponents to a .151 average. Among those with at least 20 innings pitched, Speas' 40.2 percent strikeout rate is the second-best in the Texas League this season. Biggers dazzled defensively in the infield in May. Biggers split his time between third base and second base, not committing an error in the month while turning eight double plays.

### THE SPEAS THAT PLEASES:

With his appearance on Tuesday, reliever **Alex Speas** now has an ERA under 1.00 at 0.89 over 18 appearances. In 20.1 innings, he has struck out 35 to 10 walks. Opponents are hitting just .151 against him and he has not allowed an earned run over his last nine outings. During that span, he has struck out 20 to three walks over 10 innings. On the season, righties are just hitting .123 (7-for-57) against him on the season with a .383 OPS.

### POWER SURGE:

After only hitting two home runs over a two-week span, the RoughRiders have hit six long balls in Corpus Christi through the first five games of the series. In the five games, Frisco is hitting .238/.345/.407/.752 with 11 doubles, six home runs and 6.2 runs per game. **Luisangel Acuña** has led the way, hitting .318/.375/.455/.830 in the set while both **Trevor Hauver** and **Thomas Saggese** have two home runs.

### AMBUSH EARLY AND OFTEN:

**Thomas Saggese** has been fantastic on first pitches this season, tied for first in the Texas League with a .600 average (12-for-20) when he puts the first pitch of an at-bat in play. He has a 1.619 OPS on the first pitch after homering on the first pitch on Saturday. **Luisangel Acuña** has also been great, hitting .472 (17-for-36) on the initial offering while his 17 hits on the first pitch lead the league.

### DUSTIN' THEM AND LEAVING THEM BEHIND:

**Dustin Harris** has been running wild for the RoughRiders this season. After stealing 19 bases in 85 games in 2022, Harris has already swiped 23 bags in 53 games this season to lead the Texas League and the entire Rangers organization. If Harris plays 110 games this season, he is on pace for 48 steals, which would be far be a career high. **Luisangel Acuña** leads the league in steals with 25. The RoughRiders are second in Texas League swipes with 83 bases in 97 attempts (86 percent).

### ONE HOME RUN, PLEASE. AND MAKE IT GRAND:

The RoughRiders have had a knack for grand slams this year with **Thomas Saggese** hitting Frisco's seventh grand slam of the season on last Friday. They are one of two teams with seven grand slams in all of Minor League Baseball. Six different players have accounted for the grand slams (**Hicks**, **Luisangel Acuña**, **Jax Biggers**, **Dustin Harris**, **Trevor Hauver**, **Thomas Saggese** (2)). Frisco also has a 1.184 OPS with the bags full, which is third in the minors (Low-A Myrtle Beach, 1.262 and Triple-A Saint Paul, 1.226).

### ACUÑA MATATA:

RoughRiders infielder **Luisangel Acuña** has been on fire to start his 2023 season. The Rangers No. 3 prospect is hitting .298 (61-for-205)/.367/.420/.787 through the first 48 games. Over his last 44 games, he is batting .310/.384/.444/.828. When the 21-year-old arrived in Frisco in 2022, he had a wRC+ of 68 while it has nearly doubled this season (112).

### WALK THIS WAY:

On the season, Frisco's 276 walks are tied for first among Texas League teams while their .352 team OBP is fourth in the Texas League. **Dustin Harris** is first in the league with 40 walks.

### ABOUT JACK

-Leiter was drafted in the first round (No. 2 overall) in 2021 by the Rangers out of Vanderbilt University. With the Commodores, Leiter was a unanimous First Team All-American and a finalist for both the Golden Spikes Award and the Dick Howser Trophy.

-Threw first regular-season, complete-game no-hitter to start SEC play since 1971 against No. 16 South Carolina on March 20th, 2021. He walked the first batter of the game before retiring the last 27 he saw with 16 strikeouts on 124 pitches. Followed up that no-hitter with 7.0 no-hit innings in his next start (20.2 consecutive no-hit innings over three starts from March 20th - April 2nd).

-Drafted in 20th round in 2019 by NYY out of Delbarton School (NJ). Named 2019 New Jersey Gatorade POY, striking out 95 in 57 innings as a senior.

-The family lineage is strong with Jack. His father, Al, pitched in 19 MLB seasons (1987-2005), making two All-Star teams and winning both the 1993 and 1997 World Series. His uncle, Mark, played 11 seasons in the majors (1990-99; 2001) and his cousin, Mark Jr., pitched two seasons (2017-2018) with Philadelphia and Toronto. Al now works as an analyst for MLB Network.

### 2023 SEASON

-Leiter entered the 2023 season as the No. 78 prospect in baseball according to MLB.com and the No. 5 prospect in the Rangers system.

-Over three starts on May 5th, May 11th and May 17th, Leiter allowed just three earned runs over 17.0 IP (1.59 ERA) while striking out 25 and walking five.

### 2022 SEASON

-Leiter entered the 2022 season as the No. 17 prospect in baseball according to MLB.com and the No. 1 prospect in the Rangers system.

-Leiter dazzled in his professional debut, striking out seven over his three innings against the Arkansas Travelers on April 9th. The righty helped draw the largest crowd since 2019 at Riders Field for the debut (9,322).

-Threw the Riders first quality start of the season on May 7th against Arkansas. Leiter retired the last 15 batters he saw, allowing just two hits (one in the first and one in the second inning).

-Leiter came out of the bullpen as a "start" to finish a suspended game on May 31st (game was finished on June 1st) and recorded a career-best eight strikeouts against Wichita over 5.2 innings. The game resulted in a 3-0 win for Frisco, the Riders second shutout win of the season to that point.

-The righty allowed just one home run over his first nine outings before allowing two against Amarillo on June 7th. The two home runs were a grand slam and a two-run shot in a 7-4 loss to the Sod Poodles.

-Leiter was placed on the Development List on June 28th and was activated on July 10th before his start against San Antonio.

-Pitched a 1-2-3 inning on nine pitches in The SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game from Dodger Stadium on July 16th.

### 2021 SEASON

-After being drafted second overall in the 2021 draft, Leiter did not pitch in the minor leagues. Instead, he returned to Vanderbilt to workout, continue college and prepare for 2022. Did not finish degree, but got closer.

-Leiter was high school teammates with Yankees No. 1 prospect (No. 8 in baseball) Anthony Volpe at Delbarton School (NJ).
