### GAME INFORMATION

**MAY 17 RECAP BINGHAMTON 10, SOMERSET 7:** The Binghamton Rumble Ponies took the series finale from Somerset behind a monster performance from Jacob Reimer (3-for-3, 2 R, 2 2B HR, 4 RBI, BB). The Mets' No. 4 prospect hit his second home run of the series which was the go-ahead home run in the top of the sixth inning. The Ponies trailed 6-1 entering the top of the third inning marking their largest comeback win of the season. Last came against Somerset on April 11, as they trailed 4-1 into the fourth inning against the Patriots and won 7-6. Douglas Orellana, Dan Hammer, Saul Garcia and Ben Simon combined to throw the final 5.0 innings and surrendered just three hits and one run.

**ROAD THROUGH BINGHAMTON:** OF A.J. Ewing, Mets' No. 2 prospect made his MLB debut last Tuesday Night at Citi Field, LHP Zach Thornton Mets' No. 13 prospect and No. 2 LHP prospect is set to make his MLB debut on Wednesday along with OF Nick Morabito Mets' No. 11 prospect against Washington. Ewing is the first Met ever to record a triple and a home run in any order as his first two major league hits. Over his first seven games he has 7-for-23 (.304 AVG) with four RBIs one 3B and one HR. The 21-year old played 251 games in the minors hitting .290 across all four levels with 101 stolen bases. Thornton has pitched to a 3.16 ERA in seven minor league starts this year. The 24-year old threw 6.0 shutout innings with Triple-A Syracuse on Friday with nine strikeouts. In his MiLB career he has struck out 172 batters while just walking 41. Morabito hit .279 with 59 RBIs for Binghamton last year and hit .253 over 41 games for Triple-A Syracuse this year. Thornton and Morabito are now the 20th and 21st former Rumble Pony to debut since 2025, and are the ninth and 10th Binghamton players from the 2025 roster to debut (RHP Cameron Foster, RHP Anthony Nunez, OF Carson Benge, RHP Jonah Tong, RHP Nolan McLean, RHP Alex Carrillo, RHP Jonathan Pintaro).

**SLUGGING SUERO:** C/1B/LF Chris Suero, the Mets' No. 14 prospect has kicked off May on the right foot hitting .286 with 3 HR and 6 RBIs and 7 SBs. Suero recorded three straight multi hit games and has blasted two home runs last Thursday-Saturday. In the month of May he is slugging .629. This year, Suero is slashing .204/.380/.480/.860 with 18 RBIs, 7 HR and 10 stolen bases. Suero's home run and stolen base totals rank him 16th in the Eastern League. In 2025 Suero played in 115 games with High-A Brooklyn (74) and Double-A Binghamton (41) hitting .233 with 16 homers and 68 RBIs. Suero has 167 RBIs and 36 homers in his 315 games played in the minors. He was signed by the Mets' on March, 8 2022 and grew up in Bronx, NY.

**REIMER REASON:** INF Jacob Reimer, the Mets' No. 4 prospect is 14-for-47 (.297 AVG) with a 3 HR, and 5 2B over his last 13 games. After his (3-for-3, 2 R, 2 2B, HR, 4 RBI) performance on Sunday Reimer he has five multi hit games over his last 13 appearances. Reimer hit his fourth home of the season on Sunday which was the go-ahead home run in the top of the fifth inning that later secured Binghamton the 10-7 win. Reimer ranks T-5th in the Eastern League with 10 2Bs. Reimer is hitting .221 through his first 113 at bats (10 RBIs, 10 2Bs, 4 HR). Last season, Reimer hit .282 with 17 HR and 77 RBIs across 122 games with High-A Brooklyn and Binghamton.

**THE RUMBLE PEN:** Binghamton's bullpen has allowed 14 runs over the last 11 games even though Binghamton is 3-8 in that stretch. Rumble Ponies relievers are 10-5 on the season with a 4.07 ERA across 163.2 innings and have combined for 215 strikeouts, while the starters are 3-21, with a 5.71 ERA and have struck out 169 batters in 6.0 less innings pitched. In the win over Somerset on Sunday the bullpen allowed two hits and one earned run over the final 5.0 innings to secure a 10-7 win. Left-hander Felipe De La Cruz holds a 2.38 ERA over 11.1 innings pitched and left-hander Gabby Rodriguez has a 2.63 ERA across 13.2 innings.

**HIGH FLYING:** The Richmond Flying Squirrels are off to an Eastern League lead 28-10 record and a 16-2 mark from their new stadium, CarMax Park. The 28-10 record .737 PCT is the second base in MiLB behind Eugene Emeralds High-A San Francisco Giants who are 30-9 .769 PCT. Richmond leads the EL in AVG (.295), H (383), 2B (89), 3B (14), RBI (244), OBP (.376) and OPS (.861). Bo Davidson, Giants No. 7 prospect is slashing .290/.339/.496/.825 for Richmond with six 2B five HR and 23 RBIs. 3B/1B Parks Haber, Giants No. 14 prospect is slashing .321/.352/.607/.959 with five HR and 16 RBI. Their pitching staff holds a 4.69 ERA (5th), 378 SO (4th), but 186 BB (10th).

# 2026 COACHING STAFF



## 18 MICHAEL COLLINS MANAGER

**YEAR WITH BNG:** 1st      **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st      **HOMETOWN:** Canberra, Australia

-Michael Collins, Binghamton's 19th manager all-time, is in his first season managing the Rumble Ponies and his first season in the Mets organization.

-Collins spent the last eight seasons (2018-25) with the Houston Astros, as a bullpen catcher in 2018 and serving as the Astros' major league catching coach for the last seven seasons (2019-25), including the 2022 World Series championship.

-Collins worked in the San Diego Padres organization as a manager for the DSL Padres (2012), AZL Padres (2013, 2016-17), High-A Fort Wayne (2014), and Single-A Lake Elsinore (2015) for six seasons between 2012-17.

-He also managed the Canberra Cavalry in the Australian Baseball League in 2012-14, right after his playing career ended. He led the Cavalry to the Claxton Shield as national champions for the first time.

-Collins debuted as a player in the minor leagues in 2001 at the age of 16 with the AZL Angels. He spent 10 seasons in the minor leagues with the Angels and Padres, and reached as high as Triple-A in 2009 and 2010. Collins also played in the ABL and was an All-Star catcher.

-Collins has coached for Team Australia in the World Baseball Classic in 2026, 2017, and 2013. He played for Team Australia in the WBC in 2009 and 2006. Born July 18, 1984 in Canberra, Australia. On May 3, 2024, he became a United States citizen.



## 25 MARIANO DUNCAN BENCH COACH

**YEAR WITH BNG:** 5th      **YEAR WITH NYM:** 8th      **HOMETOWN:** San Pedro de Macoris, DR

-Mariano Duncan begins his fifth year as bench coach with the Rumble Ponies and eighth year in the Mets organization. He previously served as the bench coach for the Brooklyn Cyclones in 2021 & in the same role with Kingsport in 2019.

-Duncan has Major League coaching experience, after serving as the first base coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers for five seasons from 2006-2010. He has spent time on various minor league staffs affiliated with the Dodgers and Chicago Cubs, before joining the Mets organization in 2019.

-The former infielder played 12 major league seasons with the Dodgers, Cincinnati Reds, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Toronto Blue Jays. He is a two-time World Series champion ('90 Reds and '96 Yankees), one-time All-Star (with Philadelphia in 1994), and was part of the 1993 Phillies team that won the National League pennant. He was inducted into the Dominican Republic Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. He made his MLB debut for the Dodgers on April 9, 1975, at the age of 22. Duncan finished third for the N.L. Rookie of the Year.



## 32 MATT CARASITI PITCHING COACH

**YEAR WITH BNG:** 1st      **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st      **HOMETOWN:** Berlin, Conn.

-Matt Carasiti is in his first season as the pitching coach for the Rumble Ponies and with the Mets organization.

-Carasiti spent the 2025 season as the pitching coach for the High-A Everett AquaSox in the Seattle Mariners' organization.

-Carasiti pitched in the major leagues for parts of four seasons with the Colorado Rockies (2016, 2023-24) and the Seattle Mariners (2019). He made his MLB debut for the Rockies on August 12, 2016, at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia. In his MLB career, Carasiti made 53 appearances (48 in relief) and went 2-2 with 50 strikeouts in 58.1 innings.

-Pitched for parts of 10 seasons in affiliated baseball. Underwent Tommy John surgery prior to the 2020 season and missed all of 2020 and 2021 seasons. Returned and pitched for the Long Island Ducks of the Atlantic League in 2022 and also pitched professionally in Japan in 2018. Last appeared in MLB on June 7, 2024 for the Rockies.

-Was a Double-A Eastern League All-Star for the Hartford Yard Goats (Colorado Rockies) in 2016.

-Drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the sixth round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of St. John's University (N.Y.). Originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the 36th round of the 2009 draft, but did not sign.

-Pitched for three seasons (2010-12) at St. John's and made 66 appearances and 22 starts, and went 16-11 with a 4.19 ERA and recorded 137 strikeouts in 180.1 innings. He recorded eight saves in 2011, which ranked fifth in the Big East.

-Grew up in Berlin, Connecticut, and attended Berlin HS and was the 2009 Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year.



## 5 RACHEL FOLDEN HITTING COACH

**YEAR WITH BNG:** 1st      **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st      **HOMETOWN:** Baldwin Park, Calif.

-Rachel Folden begins her first season as the hitting coach for Binghamton and with the Mets organization.

-Folden spent the previous five seasons as a coach in the Chicago Cubs organization in various roles: Arizona Complex League hitting coach (2021-22), Minor League hitting coordinator (2023), Double-A Tennessee hitting coach (2024), and Triple-A Iowa hitting coach (2025). Was the first female coach in the history of the Chicago Cubs organization.

-Folden played professional softball with the Chicago Bandits (2008-12) and Carolina Diamonds (2012) in the National Pro Fastpitch league.

-She began her coaching career in softball at Encinal High School (2009) while working as a GA at Holy Names University. Folden was also an assistant softball coach at Valparaiso University for two seasons (2010-11).

-Folden was a four-time All-American in softball at Marshall University (2005-08) and was inducted in the Marshall Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019. Folden was a two-time Conference USA Player of the Year, four-time All-Conference First Team selection, and won the triple crown (.386 AVG, 18 HR, 56 RBI) in CUSA as a sophomore in 2006. She was the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year in 2005, before moving to CUSA.



## 9 JAKE HAGER ASSISTANT HITTING COACH / INFIELD COACH

**YEAR WITH BNG:** 1st      **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st      **HOMETOWN:** Sierra Vista, Nev.

-Jake Hager begins his first season with the Rumble Ponies and first as a coach in the Mets organization.

-Hager played infield for parts of two seasons in the major leagues with the New York Mets (2021) and the Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22). Hager made his MLB debut for the Mets on May 15, 2021, at Tropicana Field against the Rays. He played in five games for the Mets and totaled 42 games in his MLB career.

-Played for parts of 12 seasons in affiliated baseball, including 1,037 games in the minor leagues for six different organizations. Retired from playing in 2024 and last played for Triple-A Iowa in the Chicago Cubs organization.

-Drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (32nd overall) in the 2011 MLB Draft out of Sierra Vista HS (Nevada). Was the Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior and was committed to play at Arizona State University, before the draft.

-Played on the same 12U Southern Nevada Bulldogs travel team with Bryce Harper and Joey Gallo.
