YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels were handed their third straight loss, falling to the Baysox, 5-3. The Flying Squirrels took a three-run lead in the first inning to snap a 21-inning scoreless streak. Turner Hill hit a two-run, ground-rule double and later scored on an RBI single by Sabin Ceballos. The Baysox closed the score to 3-2 in the second with a sacrifice fly by Brandon Butterworth and a single by Tavian Josenberger. Reed Trimble gave Chesapeake a 4-3 lead in the fifth with a two-run triple. Douglas Hodo III hit an RBI double in the eighth to extend the Baysox lead to 5-3.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the fifth of a six-game series against the Chesapeake Baysox, Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles. This series is the final between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels dropped four-of-six at The Diamond against the Baysox from April 15-20. Chesapeake won two-of-three from July 1-3 at The Diamond before the Flying Squirrels swept three games in Bowie from July 4-6 in their last head-to-head series before this week.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,585 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance was the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are in fourth place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 3.5 games behind first-place Altoona. They dropped four-of-six in last week's series against the Curve in Richmond. After going 10-2 from July 4-20, they dropped six-of-seven from July 22-30 before going 9-11 in their last 20 games dating back to August 1. Of Richmond's 71 losses this season, 40 of them have been by two runs or less (24 by one, 16 by two). Their 24 one-run losses are tied for the most in the EL, even with Reading.

THE BAYSOX are in last place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 8.0 games behind first-place Altoona. Last week, the Baysox split a six-game series at home against the SeaWolves. They lost 10 consecutive games from July 30-August 9 before going 3-5 in their last eight games since August 10. Chesapeake's roster features seven players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Orioles prospects list, including OF Enrique Bradfield (No. 6), RHP Juaron Watts-Brown (No. 9), RHP Michael Forret (No. 11), RHP Nestor German (No. 17), RHP Tyson Neighbors (No. 24), RHP Levi Wells (No. 26) and INF Aron Estrada (No. 27). MLB.com's top-30 Orioles prospects list features seven Chesapeake players, including Bradfield (No. 4), Forret (No. 11), Watts-Brown (No. 13), German (No. 14), Wells (No. 22), Estrada (No. 25) and OF Austin Overn (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander Trystan Vrieling makes his 14th Double-A start of the season and his fourth with the Flying Squirrels. It his also his fourth career start against the Baysox. He last pitched against Altoona on Sunday night and allowed two runs on one hit over five innings in a no-decision, striking out five. He made three starts against the Baysox last season as a member of the Somerset Patriots and went 2-0 with a 5.63 ERA (10 ER/16.0 IP). On August 1, he was traded to the Giants from the Yankees as part of the package for reliever Camilo Doval. In July, he went 1-0 with a 2.41 ERA (5 ER/18.2 IP) in five starts. Last season, he made his professional debut against the Flying Squirrels on April 7 at TD Bank Ballpark to close opening weekend and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with six strikeouts. He was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Month last April after starting his professional career 2-1 with a 1.88 ERA (5 ER/24.0 iP) in four starts. He finished the 2024 season leading the Eastern League in wins (13) and ranked second in innings pitched (147.1) and sixth in strikeouts (132). Vrieling was selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga. *For more on Vrieling, see page two.*

FOR CHESAPEAKE: Right-hander Juaron Watts-Brown makes his 15th Double-A start and his fourth for the Baysox, Last time out, he allowed four runs over 5.2 innings with seven strikeouts in a win over the SeaWolves last Saturday. Watts-Brown was selected in the third round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Blue Jays out of Oklahoma State. He began this season with High-A Vancouver and went 0-3 with a 3.62 ERA in eight starts. He was promoted to Double-A New Hampshire on May 20 and went 2-2 with a 3.48 ERA in 11 starts. On July 29, he was traded from the Blue Jays to the Orioles for RHP Seranthony Dominguez. Watts-Brown is rated by Baseball America as the No. 9 Orioles prospect and No. 13 by MLB.com.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan, Onil Perez and Drew Cavahave combined to catch 64 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 44 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing **Jackson Williams'** mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 57 runners caught stealing for his career is second-most in franchise history. He is two behind the Flying Squirrels career record of 59, set by Williams (2010-11, '15).

BERI BOMBS: Victor Bericoto hit his 10th homer of the season last Friday night, which leads active Richmond players for the year. It was the 32nd homer of his Flying Squirrels career, which is third-most in team history. He is now one homer behind **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) for second place on the list and six behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. Bericoto now has 127 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In 18 August games, Bericoto is batting .279 (17-for-61) with two homers, two doubles and 10 RBIs.

KING OF THE HILL: In his last 18 games since July 30, Turner Hill is batting .345 (20-for-58) with four doubles, seven walks, a homer, six RBIs and 11 runs scored. On August 9 at Erie, he tied his Double-A career high with four hits and set a Double-A career high with three runs scored. Last Tuesday night, he hit a three-run homer, his second this season. He had three hits in the series ner at Chesapeake on Tuesday.

CROES CONTROL: Since joining the Flying Squirrels on August 5, Dayson Croes is batting .340 (16-for-47) with a homer, two On Thursday against the Curve, he picked up three hits, including his first Double-A homer. He played four seasons at NCAA DII Quincy before spending two seasons with the Winnipeg Goldeyes of the independent American Association, where he hit .347 in 187 games. Croes signed with the Giants on April and played nine games in the Arizona Complex League before spending 47 games with High-A Eugene.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is ranked fifth in walks (60), tied for fifth in hits (103) and ninth in OBP (.362). Turner Hill is tied for fifth in triples (5). John Michael Bertrand is third in innings pitched (114.2), third in ERA (2.98), seventh in BAA (.247) and eighth in WHIP (1.33). Jack Choate is fifth in strikeouts (111). Joe Whitman is sixth in strikeouts (109). Tyler Myrick is tied for first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 245 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Bo Davidson (No. 3), Diego Velasquez (No. 10), Joe Whitman (No. 11) and Jack Choate (No. 30). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. Adrian Sugastey is ranked as the top defensive catcher. Aeverson Arteaga is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND

1958: The Richmond Virginians beat the Miami Marlins, 7-1, on the road. Miami committed four errors, including three by Jerry Snyder, in the first inning to post four runs against starter 51-year-old Satchel Paige. The four unearned runs were the only runs allowed by Paige over five innings. 1961: The Richmond Virginians beat the Jersey City Jerseys, 9-8, at Parker Field. Richmond's Sam Miley hit a two-run single in a four-run bottom of the seventh to give Richmond an 8-6 lead. The Jerseys rallied to tie the score, 8-8, in the ninth with a two-run single by Yoyo Davalillo, pinch-hitting for his brother Victor. With two outs in the bottom of the 10th, George Risley drove a pinch-hit triple and came in to score on a game-winning single seys failled to the file Scole, 8-6, in the limitin win a two-disingle by Yoyo Davalillo, pinch-hitting for his brother Victor. With two outs in the bottom of the 10th, George Risley drove a pinch-hit triple and came in to score on a game-winning single to left by Jake Gibbs, 1976: The Richmond Braves lost to the Charleston Charlies, 6-2, at Parker Field. Charleston manager Tim Murtaugh asked pitcher Rick Langford if he would like to pitch one day earlier than scheduled so he could throw in his hometown, Langford, a Varina high school alum, said yes. He allowed four hits in a complete game. After a first-inning single, Langford did not allow another hit until the eighth. The streak was broken on a triple by Dale Murphy, who scored on a Chico Ruiz single to break the shutout. Jim Breazeale followed with a an RBI double. Langford went on to spend 11 seasons in the majors, including 10 with the Oakland Athletics. 1977: The Richmond Braves lost to the Pawtucket Red Sox, 12-4, at Parker Field. The game was aired on WXEX (present-day WRIC), the first televised game in Richmond Braves history. Randy Blair provided the play-by-play. He was joined by a rotation of color commentators including Eddie Kasko, Bobby Bragan and Hank Aaron. 1979: The Richmond Braves beat the Pawtucket Red Sox, 3-2, at Parker Field. Jerry Keller broke a scoreless tie in the seventh with a sool homer, his 20th of the season. Dave Denton tied the game with a sacrifice fly and Dave Stapleton hit a single to give Pawtucket a 2-1 lead. In the bottom of the ninth, Ed Miller singled and stole second, his 73rd steal of the season. After a single by Bob Beall, Glenn Hubbard won the game with a walk-off, two-run triple, to cap a four-game Richmond sweep. 2019: The Flying Squirries lost to the Akron RubberDucks, 4-3, in 10 innings. It was the team's fifth-straight game to go to extra innings, including a 7-3 win over Frie in 10 with a walk-off grand slam by Jacob Heyward, a 7-3 loss in 10 to Erie, an 11-10 win against Erie with a walk-off hit by Peter Mar
