Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Matt Koch to the mound tonight, looking to avoid the first six game losing streak since 4/19-4/25/17 (last time six below .500: 5/31/17, 23-29). Nashville will counter with LHP Aaron Ashby. The Clippers are 1-2 (.333) against left handers this year. Ashby has never pitched against the Clippers in his career.

vs. the Sounds

Columbus has not played Nashville in the regular season since 1991, when the Sounds played in the American Association. From 1988-91, the two leagues played crossover games with the Clippers winning 11 of 21 against Nasvhille (also went 11-10 against Omaha and 11-10 against lowa), including six of 10 in Columbus (2-0-2 series record in Columbus).

Get What You Pay For

The Clippers are the only team in the IL that has seen every game played to completion in nine innings, as they are one of two (Toledo) that has not experienced extra innings this year. Detracting from the drama is the fact that the Clippers have played in an IL-low four games decided by a single run (1-3). Tonight's opponent, Nashville, is tied for 3rd in the IL with nine 1-run games (8-1).

Quite a Slide

Since starting the season 5-1, the Clippers have been beaten down to the tune of a 3-12 record, getting outscored 106-66 in that time. The last time the Clippers had a 15 game stretch with only three wins was 5/20-6/2/15, going from 23-16 to 26-28 (outscored 69-51). The 2015 Clippers righted the ship to go 57-33 (.633) over the remainder of the season, clinching the IL West and the Governors' Cup.

Pummeled Pitching

Huntington Park has zoomed back to the top three in the IL in homers per game (3rd, 3.00), following last night's 6HR barrage Unfortunatley, all bombs last night were surrendered by Columbus (129HR allowed in last 63G in the regular season at HP). Over 23% of hits allowed at home have left the yard, the highest rate in the IL (led the league in 2019, as 20.4% of hits allowed at HP were homers).

Back to the Top

Daniel Johnson returned to the leadoff spot last night and promptly went 0x4 (.177, 11x62, 4HR over last 15G). Johnson has been sharing leadoff duties with Oscar Mercado over the last two weeks, but Mercado has also fallen on hard times, batting just .128/.226/.128 over 47AB since 5/15. Clipper leadoff hitters have the worst average in the IL (.213) and have scored the fewest runs (8).

Arias Also in a Funk

Gabriel Arias started the season by reaching base in each of his first 12G (.429OBP), while cranking the batting average up to .282, but has hit just .100 (3x30) with a .1560BP in 8G since. He has drawn only a pair of walks over his last 8G, compared to 8BB in his first 12G (walked in six straight from 5/5-5/12). Arias has no extra base hits since homering on 5/14 vs. Omaha (42AB).

The Rock

Bobby Bradley will man the cleanup spot for the 21st time in 22G (through 19G, had been the only player in the IL to start every game at cleanup). After a solid Toledo series that saw his average climb to .200 (6x24, 2HR, 4RBI), he is 0x10 with a BB and HBP against Nashville, dropping back to .173. When playing first base this year, Bradley has 2HR in 64AB, compared to 4HR in 11AB as a DH.

Swinging Hard

Heading into today, the Clippers have four players among the top six in the IL in strikeouts, as Nolan Jones leads the league (37K), Bobby Bradley ranks 5th (27K) and Bradley Zimmer is tied with Daniel Johnson for 6th (26K). Jones has seen 45% of his plate appearances end with a strikeout. Remarkably, Columbus is only tied for 5th in the IL as a team (215K in 21G).

But Still.

Despite the heavy strikeout numbers, Nolan Jones enters tonight with a 13G on base streak (.415OBP), tied with Bradley Zimmer (still active) and Daniel Johnson (5/8-5/23) for the team lead. Jones paces the Clippers with 13BB (tied for 7th in the IL) and has a three true outcome rate of 61.4% (ranks 1st among 86 qualified IL hitters; Johnson ranks 10th at 50.0%, Zimmer is 11th at 49.3%).

This Date in Clipper History 5/29/2017

Eric Stamets homered in both of his at bats (3RBI) to lead the Clippers to a 12-4 victory over Norfolk, while Adam Moore added a grand slam. Stamets was a man among boys in the Memorial Day Weekend series vs. Norfolk, collecting multi-hit games in all four (.846, 11x13), including nine extra-base hits (four doubles, 5HR). He also had 12RBI, including three straight with at least 3RBI.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (944 to 903).

Record Destruction

The Clippers broke the established mark for homers in a season (182 in 1983) on 8/7/19 and finished with a total of 213 (most in the IL). From 5/14-6/2, they homered in 20 straight games (44HR total) and they had seven straight multi-HR games from 6/14-6/21 (22HR). On the mound, they broke the record for homers allowed (156 in 1998) on 7/31/19, giving up 198 for the year (2nd most in the IL).

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

Since the start of the 2014 season, no team has had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus (35 last season) and no team has produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB ranks 2nd in win percentage at .338 and wins, 192).

Walk-Off Magic

Columbus was 5-2 in walk-off games last season, winning four thanks to the courtesy runner in extra innings (Columbus pitching did not allow a run through first 9.0IP in extras last year). On 6/29/19 at Louisville, they suffered their first walk-off loss of the year, snapping an 81 game streak without (previous loss was 5/31/18 at Buffalo). Additionally, the Clippers ranked 1st in the IL with a 16-8 (.667) record in games decided in the last at bat.

Trending Downward

While ranking in the top three of the IL with a 4.71ERA (3rd), the 2019 Clippers registered their worst mark since the 1998 season (4.85ERA). In 2018, they ranked dead last in the IL with a 4.34ERA, marking the third straight (now fourth) season that the team ERA had gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 30 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016).

Doing Damage

In 2019, the Clippers ranked tied for 5th in the IL with 112RBI with the bases loaded, while carrying a .252 average (10th, 36x143, 4HR). In both 2017 and 2018, the Clippers led the IL in RBI with the bases loaded (243RBI total) and paced the circuit in grand slams (16 total, no other team had more than eight).

Free Swingers

After two straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup was atop the IL again in 2019 (1,392K, 60 more than 2nd place). They obliterated the franchise record (1,297, set in 2017; 2018's total of 1,290 was 2nd worst in franchise history), passing it on 8/22/19 (reduced strikeout rate to 8.3 per game after setting record, 10.1 prior). On the season a Clipper was punched out at least four times in a game on 15 occasions (**Eric Haase** led the team with three golden sombreros).

That's More Like It

In 2019, the Clippers were 50-30 (.625) when playing errorless baseball, while turning in a 31-29 (.517) mark with at least one error. Contrary to logic, in 2018 they actually had a worse winning percentage when playing mistake free (.514), than when committing at least one error (.530). The Clipper defense finished 1st in 2019 (.983) after falling to 6th in the IL in 2018, ending a run of three consecutive seasons ranked among the top three (2015-17 resulted in the three best seasons in franchise history).

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). From 4/13-4/20/19, the Clippers hit 16 leadoff doubles over 72 innings, including four straight innings in a win at Louisville on 4/15/19.

Good Baseball

Ernie Clement advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 5/8 at Louisville and the runner came around to score in the win. During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department (12 successes), but when the advanced runners did score, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt (54 successes; won 17 in a row from 4/12-7/31/18).

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes, Eric Haase, Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 38-59 (.392), 8-13 with Columbus (.381).
