TWO WINS YESTERDAY

The Express finished Tuesday's suspended game yesterday and earned a 2-1 win. Round Rock came back and won game two last night by a final of 2-1 as well. Yesterday's first game started in the fifth inning and Las Vegas led, 1-0. 1B Blaine Crim poked a two-RBI single in the sixth inning and Round Rock took a 2-1 lead that held final. RHP Dane Acker and RHP Matt Festa held Las Vegas hitless through the final four innings. Acker secured his first win of the season and Festa earned his first save. In game two, Las Vegas put two aboard in the first with base hits from RF Drew Avans and SS Darell Hernaiz. C Willie MacIver grounded a single up the middle and Avans came around for an Aviators 1-0 lead. Round Rock CF Sam Haggerty led off the bottom of the inning with a single of his own. Round Rock 1B Blaine Crim sent Haggerty home to tie the score at 1-1. Round Rock SS Ezequiel Duran broke the tie for the E-Train with a homer in the sixth off RHP Anthony Maldonado. Duran's homer became the deciding run for Round Rock's 2-1 victory.

DANE DUE UP ON THE BUMP

Round Rock RHP Dane Dunning is scheduled for his fifth start of the year on Thursday. After issuing six walks in his first 5.1 innings and two starts, the righty has handed out only one walk in his last 9.1 innings and two starts. He has issued seven walks and 15 strikeouts this year. Dunning has appeared in 124 games and 102 starts between the Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021-2024).

THE WINS KEEP COMING

The Express have won four consecutive games which is their longest winning streak of the season and eight of their last 11 games. They own the fourth worst run differential in the PCL (-18) but if you eliminate 16-3 and 15-0 losses to Oklahoma City, the Express have a +10 run differential.

SCORELESS STREAKS

RHP Cole Winn has the longest scoreless inning streak in Minor League Baseball (15.2 IP). E-Train RHP Matt Festa (11.2 IP) has the second longest streak at 11.2 innings. Winn has issued only four walks with 18 strikeouts and he owns a 0.77 WHIP while opponents are batting just .151 against him.

ANOTHER TIGHT ONE

The Express have played in three consecutive one-run games and seven for the season. They have played in four extra-inning games while 15 of their 23 games have been decided by three runs or less.

CARTER COMING ALONG

Express OF Evan Carter has a 13-game on-base streak. In his last six games he is 6-for-21 with two doubles, a homer, an RBI, five runs scored and five walks. All eight of his hits this season have come against right-handed pitching (8-34). He is 0-for-11 with three walks and five strikeouts against left-handed pitchers. The 22-year-old was a second round selection by Texas in 2020.

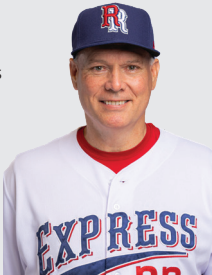

EXPRESS MANAGER DOUG DAVIS

The 2025 season marks Round Rock Express Manager Doug Davis's third season with the E-Train. In 2024, Davis secured his 800th win as a manager on July 12 at Reno. In his first season with the Express in 2023, he guided the E-Train to a PCL Second Half title and the club's first playoff appearance since 2019. The team's 89 total wins were the most regular-season wins in franchise history and just the seventh 80-win campaign in club history. Davis oversaw the longest winning streak in franchise history when the Express won 14 consecutive games from August 8-23.

Prior to Round Rock, Davis spent two seasons as the manager for the Scranton Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, the New York Yankees Triple-A affiliate. Davis brings over 25 years of coaching experience to the Express dugout. Since he began coaching in 1995, he has led a minor league team for 10 total seasons and has accumulated a career 744-665 record. He spent the 2003-2004 seasons as the bench coach for the Florida Marlins, where he won the 2003 World Series.



In two seasons as the manager for Scranton Wilkes-Barre, Davis led the RailRiders to a combined record of 158-119. Last season, he helped oversee a pitching staff that led all Triple-A teams with a 3.89 ERA. Prior to his time as skipper, Davis spent three years in three different roles with Scranton Wilkes-Barre from 2017-2019. In 2017, he was the defensive coach before moving over to bullpen coach in 2018. In 2019, Davis was named the bench coach.

Before joining the New York Yankees organization, Davis spent 11 years in the Toronto Blue Jays system in a variety of roles. Before he was named manager of the RailRiders in 2021, Davis hadn't held a manager title since 2008. He has also been a minor league field coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001) and Florida Marlins (2002, 2005). His coaching career began in the Yankees system in 1995.

A catcher and infielder in his playing days, Davis was a ninth-round selection by the California Angels in the 1984 MLB Draft. He played professionally for 11 seasons between the Angels, Rangers and Kansas City Royals organizations. He appeared in seven games in the big leagues and tallied six games in 1988 with the Angels, while appearing in one game for the Rangers in 1992. He is a native of Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania.
