## NEWS AND NOTES

**PLAYOFF PUSH:** After Friday's loss, the Sounds enter the final eight games of the first half 1.0 GB behind Memphis, who the Sounds will face for six games next week at AutoZone Park. Rochester sits between the Sounds and Memphis 0.5 GB after having game two of their doubleheader on Thursday night cancelled and will not be made up. Rochester finishes the first half with a home series against Toledo.

**14 GARRETT GOLD:** Right-hander Garrett Stallings will make his 14th overall appearance and 10th start as he takes the ball for the Sounds on Saturday night. Stallings worked 5.0 scoreless innings last Saturday night in Jacksonville and allowed five hits and struck out five. It was his third scoreless start of at least 5.0 IP this season and the fifth of his Triple-A career. Saturday night will be the 10th appearance of his career against Durham and he enters the game 2-0 with a 5.56 ERA (21 ER/34.0 IP) with 32 strikeouts, 16 walks, five home runs allowed.

**NUKE NO FLUKE:** Luke Adams crushed his sixth homer of the season for the Sounds with a two-run blast to left field in the bottom of the sixth inning to cap off a three-run inning. It marked his second two-run shot with the Sounds to go along with his fourth off right-handers and the third home run of his career at First Horizon Park. Adams is third on the team in home runs, trailing Luis Lara (7) and Eddys Leonard (9). The

Brewers no. 11-rated prospect is hitting .300 AVG (12-for-40), added two doubles, seven homers and 11 RBI in 12 games since his return from injury (5/26-6/12). He recorded his third multi-hit and the fourth multi-RBI game this season for the Sounds, going 2-for-4, 2B, HR and 2 RBI on Friday night.

**ALL ABOUT THAT BASE:** Brewers no. 5-rated prospect Luis Lara extended his on-base streak to 14 straight games with a 1-for-4 night that included a RBI and run scored. His 14-game on-base streak is the second-longest on the team behind Luke Adams (16). Lara ranks first in the International League and ranks second in Triple-A in OBP (.445). His 53 runs scored are tied for first in the International League in runs and rank T-4th in Triple-A. Adams' 16-game on-base streak is tied for the 11th longest-active on-base streak in the International League.

**TAKE A BOW:** Kaleb Bowman worked a career-high 4.0 IP Friday night surpassing his previous career-high of 3.1 IP which he had done twice, with his last coming on May 23, 2024, with Double-A Biloxi. It was the second of back-to-back 3.1 hitless appearances for the Shuckers during the 2024 season. The right-hander also tied his career-high with five strikeouts earlier this season on May 14 vs. Iowa. Friday night was the 12th appearance with one or fewer runs allowed out of the 16 games out of the Sounds bullpen for Bowman.

**HAM AND 'GEES START:** Easton McGee made the start for the Sounds Friday night and allowed six runs on six hits, including a grand slam off the bat of Tatum Levins. It marked the ninth time in his 11-year-career he has allowed 6+ runs with the last one coming on August 27, 2024, at Charlotte in his first year with the Sounds. It's just the fifth time a Nashville starter has allowed 6+ runs in a start this season and first since Carlos Rodriguez allowed seven runs on eight hits in 3.1 IP on May 9 on the road in Louisville.

**HOW YOU BADD00:** Akil Baddoo continues to punish Bulls pitching after going 2-for-4 with a season-high 4 RBI on Thursday night. In seven games vs. the Bulls this year, Baddoo is hitting .346 (9-for-26) with six XBH and 12 RBI. Thursday's game was his third straight of the series with 3+ RBI after not recording more than two RBI in any of his first 16 games with the Sounds. For the series he is hitting .500 (5-for-10) with two homers, a triple, double, 10 RBI, and has five walks. The longest RBI-streak of his professional career sits at four consecutive games with the Detroit Tigers on April 4-7 during the 2021 season. He is the only Sounds hitter that has earned 3+ RBI in three straight games this season and the first to do it since Jaycob Brugman did so August 20-22, 2016. He is one of four Triple-A players to have a 3-RBI streak of at least three games this season and one of just seven overall in the minors.
