YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the RubberDucks, 5-2, to open the series. Richmond struck first with back-to-back doubles by **Adrian Sugastey** and **Ty Hanchey** in the top of the second, Akron tied the score, 1-1, in the bottom of the second with an RBI single by Jake Fox. Jacob Cozart broke a 1-1 tie with a solo homer in the seventh. Akron scored three in the eighth to push the lead to 5-1. In the top of the ninth, **Maui Ahuna** plated a run with a sacrifice fly.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second of a six-game series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. This series features a match-up of the top two teams in the Southwest Division this season. The Flying Squirrels won five-of-six against the RubberDucks at CarMax Park from May 5-10. The Flying Squirrels have lost consecutive games for the third time this season.

STRONG START: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 31-14 start is the best in team history through 45 games, passing a 25-20 start in 2010. Richmond has won five series and split three so far this year. Seven-of-14 Richmond losses have been by one run.

RELENTLESS: In their 31 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 15 of them. In 10 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday against Akron, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double. On Friday, the Flying Squirrels tied their largest come-from-behind win in franchise history, overcoming a 6-0 deficit to win, 9-6, over Akron. On May 20 against Binghamton, **Ty Hanchey** hit a game-tying homer in the bottom of the ninth and Harber won the game with a walk-off single.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are 4-7 in their last 11 games after opening the season 27-7 through May 13, hitting 20 games over .500 for the first time since 2014. They have the best record in Double-A. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Richmond offense ranks tied for second in batting average (.289) and third in doubles (103). Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average, runs (298), hits (439) and doubles, are tied for first in triples (15) and rank second in OBP (.371), SLG (.471) and OPS (.842).

THE RUBBERDUCKS have surged to second place in the Southwest Division standings. After dropping five-of-six in Richmond from May 5-10, Akron has gone 9-4, including being swept in Sunday's doubleheader at Harrisburg. Akron's roster features five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects list, including RHP Khal Stephen (No. 8), OF Jaison Chourio (No. 9), C Jacob Cozart (No. 14), OF Alfonso Rosario (No. 24) and LHP Josh Hartle (No. 25). MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects list includes six Akron players, including Stephen (No. 5), Chourio (No. 10), Rosario (No. 14), Cozart (No. 18), RHP Justin Campbell (No. 22) and Hartle (No. 26).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Matt Wilkinson** makes his first start against his former team and his third with the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched last Wednesday and allowed a season-high five runs (four earned) over three innings in a no-decision. In his Giants organization debut on May 13, he threw five scoreless innings and allowed two hits with six strikeouts in a win at Erie. He was acquired by San Francisco on May 9 along with the 29th pick in this year's MLB Draft in exchange for former Flying Squirrels catcher Patrick Bailey. Among full-season MiLB pitchers this year, Wilkinson ranks third in ERA (1.35), seventh in WHIP (0.84) and tied for eighth in BAA (.165). He leads the Eastern League in ERA and WHIP and ranks tied for first in BAA and tied for sixth in strikeouts (42). Wilkinson is in his first Double-A season and began the year with Akron, going 1-2 with a 1.59 ERA in six starts before the trade. On April 19 against Binghamton, he threw five perfect innings with six strikeouts in a combined no-hitter. Wilkinson was selected by Cleveland in the 10th round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of Central Arizona College, where he was the NJCAA Division I Pitcher of the Year. This spring, he made two scoreless appearances for Canada in the World Baseball Classic. **For more on Wilkinson, see page two.**

FOR AKRON: Right-hander Khal Stephen makes his 10th start of the season and his second against the Flying Squirrels. In his last start last Thursday at Harrisburg, he threw five scoreless innings in a win. He pitched in Richmond on May 9 and allowed a season-high five runs over 5.1 innings but picked up a winning decision. On the year, Stephen is fifth in the Eastern League in ERA (3.12) and 10th in innings pitched (43.1). Stephen was selected by the Toronto Blue Jays in the second round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of Mississippi State. He was traded to the Guardians at the deadline on July 31, 2025, for RHP Shane Bieber. Stephen pitched against the Flying Squirrels at The Diamond on August 31, 2025, and recorded one out with a career-high six runs scoring on six hits in a loss. The five and six earned runs allowed in his two career starts against Richmond are the two highest in his professional career.

COX ROCKS: **Jonah Cox** leads MiLB in batting average (.414) and OPS (1.139), ranks second in SLG (.669), tied for second in triples (5), eighth in OBP (.470) and tied for fifth stolen bases (26). His 26 steals are first in the Eastern League after swiping 58 bases each of the last two seasons. The 26 steals are seventh-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history. Cox reached base in the first 23 games he played this season to begin his Double-A career before an 0-for-3 outing on May 5. He opened the season on a 12-game hit streak and has at least one hit in 38-of-41 games he has played, adding a 10-game hit streak that was also snapped on May 5. He had an 11-game hit streak since May 6-19. On May 1 (G1) at Altoona, he became the fifth player in Flying Squirrels history to hit three triples in a single game. Saturday night, he reached base five times, going 4-for-4 with three steals.

PARKS & WRECK: **Parks Harber** has homered six times and picked up 18 RBIs in his last 16 games since May 7. Last week, he hit a solo home run on Wednesday night before driving a game-winning single in the bottom of the ninth, his second walk-off hit for the Flying Squirrels this year. On Thursday, Harber drove in both Richmond runs with a two-out, two-run double in the eighth. Among Eastern League batters (min. 100 PA), Harber ranks seventh in SLG (.574), ninth in batting average (.315) and 10th in OPS (.952).

IT'S BO TIME: After batting .200 (11-for-55) in his first 15 games of the season through April 28, **Bo Davidson** is hitting .306 (22-for-72) with six doubles, two homers and 15 RBIs in his last 18 games since April 30, adding seven multi-hit games in that stretch. He has struck out 13 times in his last 78 plate appearances. His 14-game on-base streak was snapped last Thursday night.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 291 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank second among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,131).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.414), first in OBP (.470), first in SLG (.669), first in OPS (1.139), first in hits (60), first in triples (5), first in stolen bases (26), second in total bases (97), fourth in RBIs (34) and tied for sixth in extra-base hits (20). **Scott Bandura** is third in OBP (.430), tied for fourth in runs (33), tied for sixth in RBIs (32), sixth in batting average (.324), tied for seventh in hits (46) and 10th in OPS (.909). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for fifth in doubles (12). **Matt Wilkinson** is first in WHIP (0.94), second in ERA (2.23), second in BAA (.172) and tied for sixth in strikeouts (46). **Darrien Smith** is tied for sixth in wins (4). **Joe Whitman** is tied for second in strikeouts (56), tied for second in wins (5), second in WHIP (0.97), third in ERA (3.05), second in BAA (.190) and seventh in innings pitched (44.1). **Jack Choate** is tied for second in wins (5). **Tyler Vogel** is second in saves (6). **Mitch White** is tied for fifth in saves (4). **Cesar Perdomo** is fifth in BAA (.203) and sixth in WHIP (1.15). **Trystan Vrieling** is eighth in BAA (.230) and ninth in ERA (3.63).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features six players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 13), **Joe Whitman** (No. 18), **Jonah Cox** (No. 21), **Matt Wilkinson** (No. 25) and **Diego Velasquez** (No. 29). **Adrian Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and Cox is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), Harber (No. 14), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20) and Whitman (No. 26).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1982: The Richmond Braves beat the Atlanta Braves, 7-6, in an exhibition at Parker Field. Terry Harper, who had been called up to Atlanta before the game and had to swap uniforms before first pitch, hit a two-run homer in the fourth to give the A-Braves the lead. Richmond scored five in the bottom of the inning, including an RBI single by Brook Jacoby and a two-run triple by Larry Owen. Atlanta's Bob Horner tied the game, 5-5, with a three-run homer in the fifth. Richmond moved back ahead with a run scoring on a wild pitch in the sixth and a sacrifice fly in the seventh. Jerry Royster homered for Atlanta in the ninth. **1983:** The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 3-0, at Parker Field. Bob Walk, who entered 0-6 with a 10.59 ERA, started and threw a one-hit shutout and struck out nine. **1991:** The Richmond Braves lost to the Omaha Royals, 4-0. Deion Sanders, optioned from Atlanta a few days prior, made his Richmond Braves debut and went 1-for-4 with a single and a walk. **2022:** The Flying Squirrels lost to the Hartford Yard Goats, 7-3. Kyle Harrison made his Double-A debut, becoming the youngest pitcher in franchise history.
