HARD WAY: Brewers no. 16-rated prospect Tyson Hardin will make his 11th Triple-A start to begin the three-game weekend series against the Norfolk Tides on Friday night. It'll be his 40th career start in the minors and he enters the game sitting at 194 career strikeouts and leads the farm system with 96 strikeouts this season in his 17 combined starts between Nashville and Double-A Biloxi.	games between earned runs in the sixth-longest active streak in the International League. He has a hit in 16 of the 21 games and at least one hit in 11 of his last 12 games.
