RHP BLAIR HENLEY (0-1, 5.40) vs. RHP NOAH DAVIS (0-2, 7.71)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes need a win in today's contest to avoid a six-game sweep, which would be the club's third and the 11th in the Pacific Coast League since the circuit moved to six-game sets in 2021 ... Noah Davis is set to make his second-straight start against the Space Cowboys while Blair Henley is expected to take the hill for Sugar Land.

LOSING STREAK: Albuquerque has dropped a season-high eight-straight and 11 of 12. The club hasn't lost nine-plus games in-a-row since losing a franchise record 13-straight from June 17-30, 2016.

LEAD: Albuquerque has not held a lead in a game since a 2-1 advantage in the of top 8th inning April 6 vs. Oklahoma City (55 innings).

LEADOFF DINGER: Jordan Beck belted a leadoff homer on a 1-0 count in the first yesterday, the club's first game-opening clout since Yonathan Daza May 16, 2023, vs. Tacoma.

RUNS IN A FRAME: The Isotopes allowed four runs in the second, fourth and ninth innings last night. On the year, the club has relented at least four runs in a frame 13 times in 121 innings in 2024.

AIN'T LIFE GRAND?: Pedro Leon swatted a grand slam in the ninth inning, the fourth slam allowed by the Isotopes this season and second of the series (last: Joey Loperfido, April 12). It's also the 10th overall slam surrendered to Sugar Land.

HOMERS: The Isotopes pitching staff has allowed 13 homers in the last three games.

RUNS: Albuquerque has allowed double-digit runs in four of the five games (64 runs relented in the series) and in six contests on the year.

OUT THE GATE: Overall, the Isotopes are 2-12—the worst start to a season through 14 games in franchise history.

SPACE COWBOYS: Since Sugar Land joined the PCL in 2021, the Skeeters/Space Cowboys have outscored Albuquerque 401-285 across 44 meetings at Isotopes Park ...Albuquerque has lost 14 of its last 16 meetings against the Space Cowboys and 19 of 24 at home.

ISOTOPES PARK: Albuquerque has lost 10-straight home games to Sugar Land, their most consecutive defeats against a single opponent at home (previous worst: seven, Las Vegas, Sept. 1, 2014 - May 7, 2015; El Paso, June 8 - Sept. 10, 2022).

MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck collected his second three-hit game of the year yesterday (also: March 31 vs. El Paso) while belting his fourth homer, swiping his first stolen base in 2024 and driving in three runs. He has reached base in all 12 games in 2024 and extended his overall on-base streak to 33 games (since Aug. 18, 2023, with Double-A Hartford).

BECK EXIT VELO: Out of the 31 batted balls in play, 13 have been over 100-MPH.

IT'S ALL GOOD, MAN: Hunter Goodman ended an 0-for-8 slump with two singles last night, his fourth multi-hit game of the season. ... Reached base in 21 of the 27 Triple-A games he's played while tallying a hit in 19 (five hitless games in 2024) ... Of Goodman's 34 batted balls hit into play this year, 14 have an exit velocity over 100-MPH.

TRIPLE-A LEADERBOARD: Goodman's seven doubles on the year are the second-most in Triple-A.

BOUCHIE THE BRUIN: Sean Bouchard drew two walks Friday (fourth time in 2024) and has reached base in 11 of 12 games in 2024 ... His four triples on the year are the second-most in Triple-A while his nine extra-base hits are tied for ninth-most.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk drove in two runs for the second time this season yesterday (also: April 10 vs. Sugar Land). He has a hit in three-straight games (4x11).

GOLDEN SOMBRERO: Willie MacIver struck out four times last night, most by an Isotope hitter this year. It also matched a career-high set once before (last: July 4, 2022, Double-A Hartford).

EXIT VELO: Of the 17 batted balls registered at 100 MPH-plus last night, the Isotopes recorded seven. Hunter Goodman's sixth-inning single was third-hardest hit ball of the night: 106.9 MPH. Goodman and Beck each tallied two batted balls over 100-MPH.

XBH: Jordan Beck connected on the Isotopes Triple-A-leading 10th triple of the year Wednesday. They have a three-bagger in six of the 14 games played this year ... Also, the club's 34 doubles are the second-most in Triple-A (leader: Omaha, 35).

BY WAY OF THE K: At the plate, the Isotopes fanned 12 times, their 11th occurrence of reaching double figures; The club's 158 punchouts on the year are the most in Triple-A.

ERROR 404: The Isotopes 17 miscues for the season are tied for the most in Triple-A (also: Norfolk Tides, 17). Have an error in nine of 14 games.
