**Tonight:** The Lugnuts play the penultimate contest in a six-game series against the Dayton Dragons, with LAFCU Fireworks following tonight's game. Lansing is 5-5 against Dayton this year, splitting a six-game set at Day Air Ballpark in Dayton in mid May and splitting the first four games of the current series. Right-hander **Reid Birlingmair**, drafted by Oakland in the 28th round in 2018 from the University of Illinois, Chicago, makes his team-leading ninth start against Dragons right-hander **Eduardo Salazar**, a native of Cumana, Venezuela, making his team-leading 11th start this year for Dayton.

**On Deck:** Tomorrow night's series finale will feature a special 6:35 p.m. start on Independence Day with a postgame LAFCU Fireworks Spectacular!

**On the Air:** Tonight's game is on [MilB.TV](http://MilB.TV) and streaming online at <http://milb.streamguys1.com/lansing>, with **Jesse Goldberg-Strassler** and **Adam Jaksa** on the call.

**Last Night: Lugnuts 10, Dragons 3.** Georgetown product **Jack Cushing** debuted with six masterful innings, striking out six and holding Dayton to three hits, one walk and one sixth-inning run, and the Nuts knocked out Dragons starter **Lyon Richardson** early en route to an easy victory in front of 5,855. **Drew Millas** hit a two-run homer and **Lester Madden, Jr.**, supplied a three-run double in a six-run first inning for the Lugnuts, with Madden, Jr., adding a third-inning solo home run and Millas adding an eighth-inning sacrifice fly. Between the two of them, they drove in seven of the ten runs.

**What's New in 2021:** Entering this season, the Lugnuts' stadium name changed from Cooley Law School Stadium to Jackson® Field™, Lansing moved up to the High-A Central and the ballclub accepted an invitation to affiliate with the Oakland A's, the Nuts' fourth MLB partner, following the Kansas City Royals (1996-98), Chicago Cubs (1999-2004) and Blue Jays (2005-2020).

### LUG•NOTES: HEADLINES AND POINTS OF INTEREST

**Meet the Boss: Scott Steinmann** is the 16th manager in Lugnuts team history. Born in Dayton, Steinmann joins the Lugnuts after three straight seasons assigned to manage Double-A Midland (though the 2020 season was canceled). Steinmann previously managed against the Lugnuts with Wisconsin (2005), Clinton (2009, 2014-15) and Beloit (2017). More info about the skipper can be found on the next page of these notes.

**Recent Roster Moves:** On Tuesday, pitcher **Stevie Emanuels** was placed on the Injured List retroactive to June 26 and the Lugnuts received a pair of pitchers in **Sam Romero**, who came from Extended and joined the bullpen, and **Jack Cushing**, who joined from Low-A Stockton and starts tonight in his Lugnuts debut.

**Alumni Report:** On Thursday, 2017 Lugnut **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.**, became the youngest player ever to lead Major League Baseball in All-Star voting, elected by the fans to start at first base for the American League All-Star team, his first All-Star nod. Vladdy Jr. currently leads the Majors in OBP (.442), OPS (1.118) and total bases (196); and ranks 2nd in home runs (27), RBIs (69) and in runs scored (65); 3rd in slugging percentage (.676) and batting average (.338); and 5th in walks (51) and hits (98). Fellow 2017 Lugnut **Bo Bichette** finished runner-up for A.L. starting shortstop; Bichette leads the Majors in runs scored (68).

**Breaking Out:** After scoring only 12 runs in six games at Cedar Rapids coming into this series, the Lugnuts have plated 29 runs in the first four games of this series against Dayton, including a pivotal five-run sixth inning on Wednesday night and last night's six-run first inning.

**No Place Like Home:** A number of important Lugnuts have significant home/road splits. Consider outfielder **Shane Selman**, who has hit all seven of his team-leading home runs in Lansing and is slashing .291/.365/.605 at home compared to .164/.325/.197 on the road. Shortstop **Max Schuemann** is slashing .299/.431/.448 at home with 20 of 31 stolen bases compared to .195/.309/.378 on the road.

**Boom! Tough-Actin' Tinactin!:** Last night's solo roundtripper in the third inning was **Lester Madden, Jr.**'s first four-bagger since August 11, 2019, at Cedar Rapids, and his third professional home run of his career.

**Man of Steal:** Infielder **Max Schuemann** (Portage Northern H.S. / Eastern Michigan University) is tied for first in Minor League Baseball with 31 stolen bases, nine more than the Major League leader, Kansas City's Whit Merrifield. Schuemann is tied for second in the Minors with 13 HBPs and is tied for third in the High-A Central with 40 runs scored.

**Hail to Arms:** The Lugnuts' pitching staff ranks first in the High-A Central with a 3.72 earned run average, pitching the third most innings in the league (456 2/3), recording the second best WHIP (1.28), issuing the second fewest walks (165) and recording the fourth most strikeouts (520).

**Heavy Workload:** Lugs lefty **Dalton Sawyer**, who missed the 2018-2019 seasons due to Tommy John and so did not pitch in a game between the 2017-2018 offseason this year, is making up for lost time. Thursday night's 1 2/3 perfect innings was Sawyer's league-leading 20th relief appearance of the season. He has struck out 36 batters compared to just eight walks in 24 1/3 innings overall.

## TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

**2009:** In front of a sellout crowd of 6,057, the Loons rallied to force extra innings with two runs in the 9th, and then walked off in the 12th on a Dee Gordon (Devaris Strange-Gordon) two-run homer off Dustin Antolin, 5-3. Nathan Eovaldi pitched five scoreless innings, striking out seven.

**2013:** The end for Roberto Osuna: 1 2/3 innings, 10 hits, 7 runs allowed at Lake County, and then off to undergo Tommy John. The Captains won, 10-5, behind 21 hits: Logan Vick, Joseph Sever and Anthony Santander each collected four hits.

**2017:** Jason Heyward played the second game of a rehab assignment, going 2-for-3 with two singles and a run scored, but Bo Bichette broke out of a 2-for-16 slump with a single, double and two-run HR, lifting his average to .392 in an 8-2 win.

**Major League Lugnuts:** Three former Nuts have made their Major League debuts this season, bringing the total to 157 all-time - pitcher **Ty Tice** '18, outfielder **Josh Palacios** '16-'17, and pitcher **Tayler Saucedo** '16-'17. Tice and Palacios made their first MLB appearance in the same game for the Toronto Blue Jays on April 9th. It was the seventh time in team history that two Lugnuts made their MLB debut in the same game, with the first occurring on September 14, 1998: **Carlos Febles** and **Carlos Beltrán** for the Kansas City Royals. Saucedo most recently debuted, tossing a scoreless inning for the Blue Jays on June 17.

**Record-Setting, For Better:** On June 15, **Max Schuemann** broke **Samad Taylor's** franchise single-game record of four steals in a game (set July 1, 2018) with five stolen bases against the Great Lakes Loons.

**Record-Setting, For Worse:** On June 20, **Stevie Emanuels** broke the franchise single game record, tied many times before, of three homers served up in a game, giving up four HRs to the Loons - two apiece by Deacon Liput and Andy Pages.

**So Many Starters:** The Lugnuts have used 14 different starting pitchers this season, namely **Brady Basso**, **Kelly Biringmair**, **Jeff Criswell**, **Jack Cushing**, **David Leal**, **Stevie Emanuels**, **Richard Guasch**, **Rafael Reid**, **Bryce Nightengale**, **Colin Peluse**, **Leudeny Pineda**, **Seth Shuman**, **Shohei Tomioka** and **Brock Whittlesey**.

**Roster Index:** With his appearance on July 2, **Jack Cushing** became the 843rd Lugnut all-time and the 39th player used this year, as well as the 26th different pitcher this season. With that, the 2021 Lugnuts have already surpassed the total number of players used in the 1999 and 2008 seasons (38 apiece). The franchise record for most players used in a single year is 54, set in 2017. Currently, about 18.6% of all Lugnuts are reaching the Major Leagues (157 of 843). If that percentage continues to hold true, at least seven of the 39 players to see time this year with the Nuts will reach MLB.

**A Pleasant Peninsula Surrounds You:** **Max Schuemann** (Portage Northern H.S.) is the first Lugnut to hail from Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti. Earlier this season, the Nuts featured two Michigan Wolverines in **Jeff Criswell** (injured) and **Jack Weisenburger** (promoted).

**Finally:** Pitchers **Jeff Criswell**, **Stevie Emanuels** and **Shohei Tomioka**, catchers **Jared McDonald**, **Drew Millas** and **William Simoneit**, first baseman **Patrick McColl**, and outfielder **Michael Guldborg** have all made their pro debut this season with the Lugnuts

**Front Office Connections:** Lugnuts pitching coach **Don Schulze** was drafted 11th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 1980, 12 picks before Oakland Executive Vice President of Baseball Operations **Billy Beane** was drafted by the New York Mets. Lugnuts first baseman **Patrick McColl** set a new Harvard baseball single season record with 70 hits in 2019, breaking the previous record held by Athletics General Manager David Forst.

**Clubhouse of Higher Learning:** The Ivy League is well represented on the Lansing roster. First baseman **Patrick McColl** played for Harvard University, reliever **Michael Danielak** was drafted from Dartmouth College and catcher **William Simoneit** spent four years at Cornell University before grad-transferring to Wake Forest. Speaking of outstanding academic institutions, starter **Jack Cushing** spent four years at Georgetown University.

**Power Five Baseball:** The Lugnuts also represent the ACC (**Michael Guldborg**, Georgia Tech); Big 12 (**Brady Basso**, Oklahoma State); Big Ten (**Dalton Sawyer**, Minnesota); the SEC (**Cobie Vance**, Alabama); and the Pac-12 (**Stevie Emanuels**, Washington).

**International Appeal:** In addition to 17 different states (Arizona, California, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Nevada, North Carolina, Ohio, Texas, Virginia, Washington) represented by Lugnuts players and coaching staff, seven nations are represented: USA, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Japan, South Africa and Venezuela.

**Representing His Country:** 1B/3B **Jordan Diaz** played for Colombia in Olympic Baseball Qualifying play, blasting a game-tying home run in the 9th against Venezuela, but Colombia lost all three games in opening pool play and was eliminated. Team USA won the tournament, punching a ticket to Japan.

**Personal:** Reid's last name is pronounced "BIR-ling-MY-er"... instructor at the K's Training Academy in the offseason, located in Normal, as is college/Lugnugs teammate and best friend Charlie Cerny (pronounced "Cher-nee"), currently on Injured List.

**Last Outing:** Started Friday, June 25 at Cedar Rapids, receiving no-decision: 4 2/3 IP, 4 hits, 2 runs, 1 walk, 3 strikeouts... gave up solo home run to Jair Camargo in the 2nd inning... departed in the 5th with the bases loaded, and reliever Dalton Sawyer balked an inherited runner home before stranding the other two runners... Lugnuts scored three runs in the 8th to break a 2-2 tie, winning 5-2.

### 2021 with Lansing:

- Posted an 8.80 ERA in June (15 ER allowed in 15 1/3 IP, 10 BB, 13 K) after 3.54 ERA in May (8 ER, 20 1/3, 8 BB, 15 K).  
 - Allowing .307 / .395 / .533 w/ 3 HR to left-handed hitters compared to .237 / .352 / .356 w/ 1 HR to right-handers.  
 - Started the fourth game of the season, Friday, May 7th vs. Lake County, tossing five innings and allowing three runs on six hits and a walk, including a solo home run to Austen Wade... picked off Joe Naranjo from first base in the 4th inning... departed with Nuts trailing 3-0... Lugnuts lost, 6-2.  
 - Started Friday, May 14th at Dayton... charged with one run in four-plus innings, walking four and striking out three... allowed leadoff single to Brian Rey in 1st inning but coaxed double play from Quincy McAfee in facing the minimum in a scoreless frame... pitched around a two-out walk to Michael Siani in a scoreless 2nd... with one out in the 3rd, walked Jacob Hurtubise and gave up a single to Rey; catcher Drew Millas caught Hurtubise stealing third base; Quincy McAfee walked, but got Jose Tello on a pop-out to escape... worked around a leadoff walk to Eric Yang and a Micael Siani single in a scoreless 4th... departed after allowing leadoff single to Miguel Hernandez in the 5th inning... Hernandez scored against reliever Charles Hall on a sacrifice bunt by Hurtubise and a sacrifice fly by Rey... Lugnuts went on to lose, 3-1.  
 - Started Friday, May 21 at Fort Wayne... pitched brilliantly, shutting down TinCaps through six scoreless innings, allowing only one hit, one HBP and one walk, striking out five... Lugnuts won, 7-1.  
 - Started Friday, May 28 vs. Great Lakes... tossed 5 1/3 innings, allowing seven hits, two walks and four runs, striking out three in Lugnuts' 4-2 loss... all four runs allowed came in the 3rd inning, thanks to five straight hits... set down final seven batters.  
 - Started June 4 vs. South Bend, walking six and allowing two hits and three runs in 2 2/3 innings, with one HBP and three strikeouts... unraveled in the 3rd, allowing a leadoff single, walking three consecutive Cubs, an RBI single, a double-play ball, and then departing after hitting Caleb Knight with a pitch... the Nuts erased the 3-0 deficit with 17 unanswered runs in a 17-3 laughter.  
 - Started June 11 at West Michigan, receiving no-decision in Lugnuts' 9-4 loss... pitched five innings, giving up three runs on six hits and one walk, striking out five... Lugnuts built leads of 3-0 and 4-1, but Birlingmair allowed one run in the 4th (Torkelson triple/Dingler RBI groundout) and two runs in the 5th (Packard RBI fielder's choice, Torkelson SF)... Whitecaps then scored six runs in the 6th against Charles Hall and Aiden McIntyre, capped by a three-run Torkelson HR and Dingler solo HR.  
 - Started against the Great Lakes Loons on June 18 and gave up three-run homers to Ryan Ward in both the 1st and 2nd innings... pitched three innings in all, allowing seven runs on six hits and two walks with two strikeouts, as Lugnuts fell, 9-3... had only allowed one home run in 122 batters faced before Ward took him deep -- and then took him deep again... has an ERA of 10.97 in June (13 ER in 10 2/3 IP).



**Professional Career:** Made his professional debut in the AZL in 2018 (1.45 ERA, 18 2/3 IP, 5 R, 6 BB, 25 K) before moving up to Vermont on August 8 (2.25 ERA, 5 G, 3 GS, 16.0 IP, 10 BB, 8 K)... spent full 2019 in Beloit (4.02 ERA, 123 IP, 108 H, 50 BB, 120 K), pitching at least six innings in nine games, topping out at 7-IP, 1-R, 8-K on July 24th... faced the Lugnuts once (3 IP, 0 R) on May 4th... had overall numbers skewed by one bad month: 1.46 ERA in 24.2 IP in May, 10.72 ERA in 22.2 IP in June, 2.78 in 35.2 IP in July, 2.36 in 34.1 IP in August.

**Draft Day:** Selected 833rd overall in the 28th round from the University of Illinois at Chicago (the "Flames") in 2018, signed for \$50,000 (one round in front of Lugnuts teammate Drew Millas)... signed by Derek Lee... drafted 21 rounds after Charlie Cerny... the 2018 draft was fruitful for the Lugnuts roster, also producing Bryce Nightengale (16th round), Cobie Vance (18th round), Max Schuemann (20th round), Aiden McIntyre (22nd round).

**Life as a Flame:** Reid struggled as a freshman at the University of Illinois, Chicago (8.81 ERA, 17 G, 3 GS, 31 2/3 IP, 33 R, 24 BB, 27 K, 11 HBP) but bounced back to have a strong sophomore season (3.10, 15 GS, 1 ShO, 93.0 IP, 34 R, 25 BB, 81 K, 5 HBP) and an even better junior season (2.12, 10 G, 8 GS, 51.0 IP, 12 R, 21 BB, 57 K, 5 HBP), though he missed time from March 23-April 24 with an injury.

**Baseball Over Nursing:** In an interview with White Cleat Beat, Reid shared that nursing had been his first pursuit, starting with volunteering at OSF St. Joseph Medical Center, Carle BroMenn Medical Center, and Camp Quality (serving children with cancer and their families). He applied to the nursing school at UIC as a sophomore before turning his attention fully toward baseball, majoring in liberal arts with a minor in psychology.

**Major League Standouts:** Only three UIC Flames have ever made the Majors, but each one is notable: Pete Mackanin (1973-1981), who managed the Pirates in 2005, the Reds in 2007 and the Phillies in 2015-2017; Ken Holtzman (1965-1979), who threw no-hitters for the Chicago Cubs in 1969 (despite not striking out a batter) and 1971 and was an American League All-Star with the Oakland Athletics' World Series champions in 1972 and 1973; and three-time All-Star Curtis Granderson (2004-2019), who was taken by Detroit in the third round in 2002 and collected exactly 1800 hits in his 16-year MLB career.

**High School Success, On and Off the Field...** Pitched and played shortstop at Normal West High School, where he was named 3x 1st Team All-Big 12 and the Big 12 Conference Pitcher of the year as a Senior... in the 2015 Illinois Coaches Association (ICA) All-Star Game, he played second base... he was also a member of the National Honor Society and Spanish Honor Society.

**A Normal Background Check:** Birlingmair's hometown, Normal, was originally named North Bloomington in 1854. The name changed in 1865 to reflect its place as the home of Illinois State Normal University, a teaching school, now called simply Illinois State University. (Teaching schools were known as "normal schools" because their purpose was to instruct the students, future teachers, in properly understanding and instilling the societal norms at the time. Many state schools began as normal schools, like UCLA, which was originally named the Los Angeles California State Normal School.) Normal is the home of the Normal Cornbelters, a member of the Frontier League from 2010-2018 and now a member of the Prospect League, playing their home games at The Corn Crib.
