In the loss, Lugnuts DH **Jared McDonald** went 3-for-4 with three doubles.

LUG•NOTES: HEADLINES AND POINTS OF INTEREST

Transaction: Before today's game, the Athletics promoted infielder **Elvis Peralta, Jr.** to Triple-A Las Vegas, placed outfielder **Michael Guldborg** on the Injured List and received outfielder **D.J. Lee** from the Arizona Complex League Athletics. Lee was signed as an undrafted free agent in June 2020 from the University of Richmond. His father, Derek Lee, Sr., played in the Majors for the Minnesota Twins in 1993 and serves as a territorial scout for the Oakland Athletics, signing Lee's fellow Lugnuts **Reid Birlingmair**, **Charlie Cerny** and **Garrett Acton**.

Major League Transaction: Earlier today, the Oakland A's traded **Jesús Luzardo** to the Miami Marlins for outfielder **Starling Marte**.

Welcome to the Show: 2015 Lugnuts pitcher **Conner Greene** made his MLB debut last night, tossing two innings of relief and allowing one run for the Baltimore Orioles. Greene is the 158th Nut all-time to reach MLB, the fourth this year, and the 17th member of the 2015 Lansing Lugnuts to reach the Major Leagues.

Historical Lugnuts Roster Index: **D.J. Lee** becomes the 848th Lugnuts player all-time and the 44th player used this year. The 2021 Lugnuts have thus surpassed the total number of players used in the 1996 (40), 1997 (42), 1999 (38), 2000 (42), 2001 (40) 2004 (42), 2006 (43), 2007 (43), 2008 (43), 2009 (38) and 2013 (41) seasons. The franchise record for most players used in a single year is 54, set in 2017. Currently, 18.6% of all Lugnuts have reached the Major Leagues (158 of 848). If that percentage continues to hold true, at least eight of the 44 Lugnuts players this year will eventually reach the Majors.

Alumni Report: **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.**, who played for the 2017 Lugnuts, is second in the Majors in batting average (.327), second in home runs (32), second in RBIs (80), first in on-base percentage (.424), second in slugging (.656), second in total bases (231), first in OPS (1.080) and third in runs scored (77) behind fellow 2017 Lugnut **Bo Bichette** (78). 2019 Lugs outfielder **Griffin Conine** is tied for Minor League lead with 24 home runs.

No Place Like Close to Home: The Lugnuts are in the midst of a period of easy travel. Between June 28 and August 1, the Nuts don't leave the state of Michigan, with their only road trips to Midland (Great Lakes) and Comstock Park (West Michigan).

Hoya Saxa: Right-hander **Jack Cushing**, a product of Georgetown, has been brilliant since joining the Lugnuts from Low-A Stockton. Cushing's appearances: six innings, one run vs. Dayton; a seven-inning complete game, one run at Great Lakes; five shutout innings of relief vs. Lake County; and Thursday night's six innings, two runs at West Michigan. All told, Cushing has 25 strikeouts and five walks in 24 innings with a 1.50 ERA, allowing an OBA of .157.

Whoa, Stockton! A level below the Lugnuts on the Athletics' ladder, the Stockton Ports rallied from a 9-0 deficit in the bottom of the 8th yesterday, scoring six runs in the eighth and four in the ninth to force extra-innings, and then plating two more runs in the 10th for one last comeback, stunning Visalia, 12-11, in an incredible baseball game.

TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2015: Nuts starter Jesus Tinoco was traded along with Jose Reyes, Jeff Hoffman and 2014 Nut Miguel Castro to the Colorado Rockies for Troy Tulowitzki and LaTroy Hawkins. Tinoco was 2-6, 3.54, 81 1/3 innings, 68 strikeouts for the Lugnuts. In the game itself, played at Lake County, the Lugnuts won a weird one – they walked ten Lake County Captains but stranded 16 Captains on base (nine in scoring position!) en route to a 5-3 victory.

Root, Root, Root for the Home Team: July 4th's Lugnuts/Dragons series finale drew a season-high attendance of 10,109. That's higher than the average attendance in MLB for the Baltimore Orioles, Pittsburgh Pirates, Tampa Bay Rays, Oakland Athletics, Miami Marlins and Toronto/Buffalo/Dunedin Blue Jays. Only eight of the 119 other Minor League teams have drawn a larger crowd to a game this season: Albuquerque, Nashville, Charlotte, Fresno, Indianapolis, Round Rock, Durham and Las Vegas.

Pitching is an Art... and So is Sculpting: Blake McFarland, who pitched for the 2012 Lansing Lugnuts, is now a professional sculptor who competed on NBC's reality show "Making It," hosted by Nick Offerman and Amy Poehler, but was eliminated in the fifth episode.

Major League Lugnuts: Three former Nuts have made their Major League debuts this season, bringing the total to 157 all-time - pitcher **Ty Tice** '18, outfielder **Josh Palacios** '16-'17, and pitcher **Taylor Saucedo** '16-'17. Tice and Palacios made their first MLB appearance in the same game for the Toronto Blue Jays on April 9th. It was the seventh time in team history that two Lugnuts made their MLB debut in the same game, with the first occurring on September 14, 1998: **Carlos Febles** and **Carlos Beltrán** for the Kansas City Royals. Saucedo most recently debuted, tossing a scoreless inning for the Blue Jays on June 17.

Star of Stars: The 2021 MLB All-Star Game MVP Award was won by 2017 Lugnut **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.**, who went 1-for-3 with two RBIs, including a 468-foot home run, in the American League's 5-2 victory. Fellow 2017 Lugnut **Bo Bichette** came off the bench for the A.L. as reserve shortstop.

Record-Setting, Single Game, Stolen Bases: On June 15, **Max Schuemann** broke **Samad Taylor's** franchise single-game record of four steals in a game (set July 1, 2018) with five stolen bases against the Great Lakes Loons.

Record-Setting, Single Game, Home Runs Allowed: On June 20, **Stevie Emanuels** broke the franchise single game record, tied many times before, of three homers served up in a game, giving up four HRs to the Loons - two apiece by Deacon Liput and Andy Pages.

Record-Setting, Single Game, HBPs: On July 14, Lansing Lugnuts pitchers hit seven Lake County Captains, breaking the franchise single game record, and the second-highest single game HBP total for a team plunked by one pitching staff behind the 1993 Gulf Coast League Braves, who were hit eight times on June 18, 1993.

Representing His Country: 1B/3B **Jordan Diaz** played for Colombia in Olympic Baseball Qualifying play, blasting a game-tying home run in the 9th against Venezuela, but Colombia lost all three games in opening pool play and was eliminated. Team USA won the tournament, punching a ticket to Japan.

Front Office Connections: Lugnuts pitching coach **Don Schulze** was drafted 11th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 1980, 12 picks before Oakland Executive Vice President of Baseball Operations **Billy Beane** was drafted by the New York Mets. Lugnuts first baseman **Patrick McColl** set a new Harvard baseball single season record with 70 hits in 2019, breaking the previous record held by Athletics General Manager David Forst.

Clubhouse of Higher Learning: The Ivy League is well represented on the Lansing roster. First baseman **Patrick McColl** played for Harvard University, reliever **Michael Danielak** was drafted from Dartmouth College and catcher **William Simoneit** spent four years at Cornell University before grad-transferring to Wake Forest. Speaking of outstanding academic institutions, starter **Jack Cushing** spent four years at Georgetown University.

International Appeal: Seven nations are represented on the Lugnuts' roster: USA, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Japan, South Africa (**Anthony Phillips**) and Venezuela (**Javier Godard**).

Finally: Pitchers **Jeff Criswell**, **Stevie Emanuels** and **Shohei Tomioka**, catchers **Jared McDonald**, **Drew Millas** and **William Simoneit**, first baseman **Patrick McColl**, and outfielder **Michael Guldborg** have all made their pro debut this season with the Lugnuts.

So Many Starters: The Lugnuts have used 14 different starting pitchers this season, namely **Brady Basso**, **Raid Birlingmair**, **Jeff Criswell**, **Jack Cushing**, **David Leal**, **Stevie Emanuels**, **Richard Guasch**, **Rafael Kelly**, **Bryce Nightengale**, **Colin Peluse**, **Leudeny Pineda**, **Seth Shuman**, **Shohei Tomioka** and **Brock Whittlesey**.

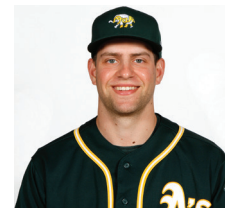

Personal: The first letter of Richard's last name is pronounced with an "h" sound, as in "hwahtsh"... rated Baseball America's No. 35 Oakland prospect, with his slider rated as the best in the organization.

Last Outing: July 21 at West Michigan, relieved Shohei Tomioka: 4 1/3 IP, 4 H, 3 R, 1 HR, 1 HBP, 3 BB, 5 K... first three passed scorelessly before allowing one run in the 7th on a Jimmy Kerr leadoff homer... unraveled in the 8th, replaced by Brandon Withers with one run in and the bases loaded; Withers allowed one inherited runner to score before ending the jam... Lugnuts lost, 5-1.

2021 in the High-A Central:

- Opened the season as the No. 3 starter in the Lugnuts' rotation, working 2 1/3 scoreless innings on May 6th vs. Lake County... struggled with command, working around a one-out walk in the 1st inning with a strikeout of top prospect George Valera... hit a batter and walked a batter in the 2nd inning but stranded runners at the corners... gave up a double and a walk in the 3rd inning, but responded by striking out Valera and cleanup hitter Jonathan Engelmann before he was relieved in favor of Bryce Nightengale, who escaped the jam... departed with the Lugnuts leading, 3-0, only to see bullpen relinquish the lead in a 7-6 loss.

- Relieved Shohei Tomioka in a piggyback assignment on Thursday, May 13th, at Dayton... struck out six Dragons in four innings, allowing two runs (one earned) on four hits and a walk in a no-decision... relieved Tomioka starting the 3rd inning, allowing a home run to Jose Tello, the second batter faced; Victor Ruiz followed with a single, but was erased on a strike 'im out, throw 'im out double play... pitched around singles by James Free and Jonathan Williams in a scoreless 4th... whiffed Quincy McAfee and Ruiz in a perfect 5th... in frustrating 6th, walked Quin Cotton on a 3-2 pitch, Cotton stole 2nd and then stole 3rd on a strikeout of James Free, coming home on a throwing error by catcher Jared McDonald, giving Dayton an enormous insurance run, on their way to a 4-2 win over the Lugnuts.

- Pitched brilliantly in a start Thursday, May 20, at Fort Wayne, tossing five scoreless innings while allowing two hits, two walks, and striking out seven... pitched around an Agustin Ruiz single in the 1st inning... allowed a leadoff double to Justin Lopez in the 2nd inning and wild-pitched him to third, then struck out the side to strand him... walked Adam Kerner and Reinaldo Illaraza to open the 3rd and wild-pitched them to scoring position, but stranded them there... struck out two in a perfect 4th... struck out his seventh batter in a perfect 5th... Lugnuts went on to win, 12-1.

- Disaster on May 27: Richard relieved Seth Shuman with two outs in the 3rd inning, held the Great Lakes Loons scoreless in the 4th and 5th innings, and then was charged with eight unearned runs in the 6th on three walks, three errors behind him, an HBP, a fielder's choice, a dropped sacrifice fly, and zero hits... Charles Hall relieved him and gave up a pair of two-run singles in a nine-run inning, and the Loons went on to win, 10-1.

- Dominance on June 3: Richard mesmerized the South Bend Cubs, posting six scoreless three-hit innings, walking one and striking out eight... departed with the Lugnuts leading 4-0, only to see the Cubs rally for three runs in the 7th and two in the 9th for a 5-4 comeback win... eight strikeouts tied career high for most in an appearance.

- After allowing 1 ER in his first 20 1/3 innings, Richard gave up four runs on nine hits in four innings at West Michigan on June 10, jumping his ERA from 0.44 to 1.85... removed after facing three batters in the 5th and not recording an out; lefty Dalton Sawyer allowed a run on a sacrifice fly but stranded the other two runners... Guasch was charged with the loss as the Lugnuts fell, 10-0.

- Started June 17 vs. Great Lakes, receiving no-decision... whiffed eight batters in five innings, allowing two runs on four hits, three walks and three HBPs... Lugnuts won, 4-3, scoring four unearned runs thanks to four Loons errors... stranded bases loaded in the 1st, stranded two in the 2nd... stranded one in the 3rd... stranded two in the 4th... finished with a perfect 5th.
