**BUBBA BLASTS:** The Omaha Storm Chasers finished a series win over the Columbus Clippers on Sunday with an 8-3 win, led by two home runs from outfielder **Bubba Starling**. Starling's first home run—a 7th-inning solo shot—game Omaha a 4-3 lead while his second home run—a two-run blast the following inning—extended the Chasers lead to 7-3. Outfielder **Edward Olivares** also homered as part of a 2-for-4 game to extend his on-base streak to 12 games. After **RHP Carlos Hernández** struck out seven across 5.0 innings, the Storm Chasers bullpen combined to retire 12 of the final 14 batters of the game. RHPs **Collin Snider**, **Jesse Hahn**, **Eddie Butler**, and **Jace Vines** each tossed a scoreless inning.

**LEADING THE PACK:** The Omaha Storm Chasers entered the third week of the 2021 season in first place in the Triple-A East Midwest Division standings with an 8-4 record. After Tuesday's postponement, they are now tied for first place with the Indianapolis Indians (8-4) and remain 1.5 games ahead of the Iowa Cubs (6-5).

**OLIVARES ON BASE: OF Edward Olivares** continued his season-opening on-base streak to 12 games by going 2-for-4 with a home run on Sunday. The 25-year-old began the season with a nine-game hitting streak and has hit safely in 11 of the 12 games, only failing to record a hit on 5/14 at Columbus when he went 0-for-3 with two walks. Olivares is batting .354/.446/.625 with two doubles, a triple, three home runs, 11 RBIs, 11 runs scored, seven walks, and four stolen bases. He hit in the leadoff spot in each of the first 12 games of the season.

**MEIBRYS MOJO: C Meibrys Vilorio** has reached safely in nine of his last 12 plate appearances after going 3-for-4 with an RBI on Saturday. Vilorio, who is seeing his first Triple-A action in 2021, is tied for eighth in Triple-A East in average (.379) and is 11th in on-base percentage (.455).

**PROSPECT-STUDDUED ROTATION:** With **LHP Daniel Lynch** joining the Storm Chasers after being optioned on Saturday, each member of the team's starting rotation is one of the Kansas City Royals top 30 prospects according to *Baseball America*. Lynch, who makes his Omaha debut on Wednesday, is the No. 2 prospect in the Royals organization, while **RHP Jackson Kowar** is No. 4, **RHP Carlos Hernández** is No. 15, **RHP Ronald Bolaños** is No. 18, and **RHP Scott Blewett** is No. 25. Overall, the Storm Chasers roster boasts eight of the Royals' top 30 prospects with the inclusion of position players **OF Kyle Isbel** (6), **OF Edward Olivares** (19), and **INF Lucius Fox** (22).

**ON THE MEND: SS Adalberto Mondesi** (strained right oblique) continues his rehab assignment by joining the Storm Chasers after playing four games with Double-A Northwest Arkansas from May 13-16, where he went 3-for-12 (.250) with one home run, three RBIs, one walk, and four strikeouts. Mondesi hit a three-run home run on Sunday as a left-handed hitter. Mondesi last played for Omaha from Aug. 20-30, 2019, when he played nine games on a rehab assignment. Additionally, **RHP Jesse Hahn** (right shoulder impingement) continues his rehab assignment with Omaha.

**FOR OMAHA: LHP Daniel Lynch** makes his Triple-A debut and Omaha debut on Wednesday following three appearances with Kansas City. Lynch was on the Storm Chasers' preliminary roster before being called up on May 3, when he allowed three runs on four hits in 4.2 innings vs. Cleveland. Lynch, the No. 21 prospect in baseball according to *Baseball America*, was optioned to Omaha after posting a 15.75 ERA across 8.0 innings in three appearances with the Royals. Lynch spent most of the 2019 season with High-A Wilmington, where he posted a 3.10 ERA in 78.1 innings (15 starts) with 77 strikeouts and 23 walks.

**FOR IOWA: RHP Cory Abbott** makes his third start of the season for the I-Cubs after allowing two runs on four hits in 5.0 innings at St. Paul on Thursday, May 13. A former second round pick (67th overall) in 2017 out of Loyola Marymount, Abbot has collected eight strikeouts in each of his first two Triple-A starts. This is his first season at the Triple-A level after spending the entire 2019 season with Double-A Tennessee.

**OPEN UP THE HISTORY BOOKS:** The Omaha Storm Chasers and Iowa Cubs meet for the 967th time in the history of their franchises on Wednesday, with Omaha holding a 499-469 (.518) all-time edge. Omaha claims bragging rights from the American Association years (1969-1997) with a 340-294 (.536) record, but the I-Cubs went 175-159 (.524) against Omaha during the Pacific Coast League era (1998-2019). Omaha's next win over Iowa will be the franchise's 500th all-time win over Iowa. Omaha has more wins (and games played) against Iowa than any other opponent in franchise history.
