YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the SeaWolves, 1-0, to open the series. **Nick Zwack** started and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits. **Chris Wright** recorded two outs in the sixth before being replaced by **Will Bednar**, who stranded the runner and followed with a scoreless seventh. **Tyler Vogel** pitched the eighth and picked up his first MLB win. **Tyler Myrick** closed out the save with a 1-2-3 ninth inning. **Scott Bandura** broke a scoreless tie with one out in the top of the ninth inning with a solo home run.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second as a six-game series against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. This is the third and final series between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels went 2-4 against the SeaWolves at The Diamond from May 13-18. They also went 2-4 at UPMC Park from June 3-8.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,556 fans per home game, which ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are in second place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 2.5 games behind Altoona. Last week, they dropped four of six at Somerset. It was their second straight series loss after winning their previous three series. After going 10-2 from July 4-20, they are 4-8 in their last 12 games since July 22. Of Richmond's 62 losses this season, 35 of them have been by two runs or less (22 by one, 13 by two). Their 22 one-run losses are second-most in the EL, one behind Reading. Richmond's +11 run differential in the second half is fourth-best in the league. In their last 12 games, the Flying Squirrels have hit .176 (19-for-108) with runners in scoring position and left 91 on base.

THE SEAWOLVES won the Southwest Division first-half title to clinch their fourth consecutive postseason appearance. They are in third place in the division's second-half standings. Erie split last week's series at Akron, winning three straight from Thursday through Saturday before dropping the finale on Sunday. The Erie offense leads the Eastern League in batting average (.259), runs (531), hits (876), total bases (1394), doubles, (199), RBIs (488), OBP (.348), SLG (.413) and OPS (.761). The Erie pitching staff is second in the EL in ERA (3.24). Erie's roster features seven of Baseball America's top-30 Tigers prospects, including SS/2B Kevin McGonigle (No. 1), OF Max Clark (No. 2), C Thayron Liranzo (No. 4), C Josue Briceño (No. 5), RHP Jaden Hamm (No. 7), 2B Max Anderson (No. 13) and OF Justice Bigbie (No. 27). There are also four players on Baseball America's top-100 prospects list, including McGonigle (No. 2), Clark (No. 9), Liranzo (No. 69) and Briceño (No. 75). MLB.com's top 30 Tigers prospects list features nine Erie players, including McGonigle (No. 1), Clark (No. 2), Briceño (No. 4), Liranzo (No. 5), Anderson (No. 9), Hamm (No. 10), OF Roberto Campos (No. 20), Bigbie (No. 26) and RHP Yosber Sanchez (No. 30). MLB.com's top-100 prospects list features four Erie players, including McGonigle (No. 6), Clark (No. 10), Briceño (No. 51) and Liranzo (No. 76).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.14 ERA (113 ER/324.0 IP) in 38 games, which is fourth in the Eastern League. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 2.82 ERA (49 ER/156.2 IP) in that stretch. In their last 19 road games since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 2.73 ERA (50 ER/165.0 IP).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Trystan Vrieling** makes his 11th Double-A start of the season and his Giants organization debut. He last pitched with Somerset against Richmond last Wednesday and allowed three runs over five innings. The following day, he was traded to the Giants from the Yankees as part of the package for reliever Camilo Doval. In July, he went 1-0 with a 2.41 ERA (5 ER/18.2 IP) in five starts. Vrieling faced the SeaWolves in his previous start on July 25 at UPMC Park and threw 4.2 scoreless innings, matching his career high with seven strikeouts. In his six career starts against Erie, Vrieling is 1-3 with a 5.46 ERA (17 ER/28.0 IP). Last season, he made his professional debut against the Flying Squirrels on April 7 at TD Bank Ballpark to close opening weekend and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with six strikeouts. He was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Month last April after starting his professional career 2-1 with a 1.88 ERA (5 ER/24.0 IP) in four starts. He finished the 2024 season leading the Eastern League in wins (13) and ranked second in innings pitched (1471) and sixth in strikeouts (132). Vrieling was selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga. **For more on Vrieling, see page two.**

FOR ERIE: Right-hander Max Alba makes his third Double-A start and his first against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched on Thursday at Akron and allowed five runs (four earned) over 4.2 innings. He made his debut on July 25 against the Patriots and allowed four runs in five innings. Alba began the year with High-A West Michigan and went 2-4 with a 4.00 ERA in 18 outings (12 starts). He was named Midwest League Pitcher of the Week last month after throwing six scoreless, two-hit innings on July 11 against Lake County. He also spent all of last season with the Whitecaps. Alba was selected by the Angels in the 39th round of the 2018 MLB Draft but opted to instead attend the University of North Carolina. After pitching two seasons for the Tar Heels, he transferred to Liberty University in Virginia for the 2022 season. After pitching for West Virginia in the MLB Draft League that summer, he signed with the Tigers on July 26, 2022.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 54 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 39 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing **Jackson Williams'** mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 52 runners caught stealing for his career is third-most in franchise history, trailing **Eliezer Zambrano** (53, 2010-2017).

BERI BOMBS: **Victor Bericoto** hit his ninth homer of the season in the second game of Friday's doubleheader, which leads active Richmond players for the year. It was the 31st homer of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into third place on the franchise's all-time home run list, passing **Jarrett Parker** (2013-14). He is now two homers behind **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) for second place on the list and six behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. He also drove the 118th RBI of his Richmond career in the first game of Friday's doubleheader, moving him ahead of **Hunter Cole** (2015-17) for second place on the franchise's all-time RBI list. Bericoto now has 121 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In his last four games since Friday, Bericoto has six hits, four walks, two doubles, a homer and four RBIs.

UNLUCK: **Tyler Myrick** recorded his ninth save of the season in Tuesday's win to open the series at Erie. It was the 21st save of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him ahead of **Cody Hall** (2013-14, '17) for sixth-most in franchise history. He is one save behind **Josh Osich** (2013-16) for a tie for fifth on the franchise's all-time saves list. Myrick has converted five of his six save attempts since July 1 over 10 appearances. He picked up his first win of the season on July 25 against the Sea Dogs, working the final four outs. Since June 28, Myrick has posted a 1.39 ERA (2 ER/13.0 IP) in 11 appearances.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked sixth in walks (51) and sixth in hits (89). **Turner Hill** is tied for fourth in triples (5). **Seth Lonsway** is ninth in innings pitched (92.0), seventh in ERA (3.52) and 10th in strikeouts (84). **John Michael Bertrand** is third in innings pitched (100.0), tied for third in ERA (3.06), ninth in WHIP (1.28) and 10th in BAA (.246). **Jack Choate** is third in strikeouts (102) and, fifth in ERA (3.38) and tied for seventh in BAA (.227). **Joe Whitman** is seventh in strikeouts (95). **Tyler Myrick** is tied for first in saves (9).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 242 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 4), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 8), **Joe Whitman** (No. 9) and **Jack Choate** (No. 28). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1954: The Richmond Virginians beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 11-10, at Parker Field. Allen Barbee hit a two-run homer in the eighth against Jim "The Bear" Owens to pull the score to 10-9. Ed Mierkowicz tied the score with a double in the bottom of the ninth and Damon Phillips on the game with a walk-off single off the left-field fence. **1966:** The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 1-0, at Parker Field. With two outs in the bottom of the ninth, Gil Garrido hit a solo homer off Leo Marenette to win the game. Ron Reed threw a complete-game shutout for Richmond. After working out of a bases-loaded jam in the fifth, he did not allow a hit the rest of the game. **1971:** The Richmond Braves beat the Charleston Charlies, 7-6, at Parker Field. In the seventh, Charleston turned a triple play in the game that resulted in the ejection of Richmond's Jim Breazeale, who was ruled to have left third too soon. His argument with plate umpire Harvey Odom lasted five minutes. Fred Velasquez won the game with a two-out, walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth to score Jack Crist from third. After being held to one run over their last 24 innings before the game, manager Clyde King brought the R-Braves out for extra batting practice, lasting an hour longer than normal. Richmond responded with seven runs on 13 hits. **2016:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 8-2, in the second game of a doubleheader. Steven Duggar singled in his last at-bat to extend his hit to 19 games, a franchise record that still stands today. During the streak, Duggar hit .430. **2024:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Hartford Yard Goats, 10-7, at The Diamond. Sterlin Thompson gave Hartford a 1-0 lead in the first inning. In the bottom of the first, Victor Bericoto tied the game with a single and Carter Howell scored on an error for a 2-1 lead. Hartford tied the game in the top of the second on an error, but Bericoto hit a two-run single in the bottom of the inning for a 4-2 lead. Justin Wishkoski hit his first Double-A homer in the third, a two-run shot. Carter Howell hit an RBI double and three runs scored on a double by Jairo Pomares for a 10-2 lead. Hartford scored two in the fifth on a single by Warming Bernabeu and a sacrifice fly by Thompson. Braxton Fulford added a solo homer and Adael Amador hit a two-run single in the eighth to cap the scoring. Mat Olsen closed his fifth save of the year recording the final four outs.

- Born in Lewiston, Idaho and lived there a few years before his family moved to Coeur d'Alene, Idaho and later to Kennewick, Wash.
- Attended Kamiakin HS in Kennewick, where he was named MCC Pitcher of the Year and also played outfield
- Played basketball (shooting guard) in high school and played football (wide receiver) growing up
- Attended Gonzaga University, where he was teammates with former Flying Squirrels pitcher William Kempner
- Selected by the Yankees in the third round (100th overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga
