LAST NIGHT: The TinCaps topped Lake County, 3-2, in a rain-shortened game that was called at the end of the  $6^{th}$  inning due to rain.

WHAT'S AT STAKE: A victory would put the TinCaps above .500 for the first time since entering May 3 last year at 11-10... Fort Wayne last had an overall winning record this late in the season when entering July 7, 2018, with a 43-42 mark.

BIG CROWDS ON THE 4<sup>TH</sup>: The 5 largest crowds in Parkview Field's history have all come on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, including a record of 9,508 in 2019 against Lake County... The TinCaps hosted a crowd of 8.350 last Independence Day. A similarly-sized gathering is expected tomorrow.

HOT CAPS: The TinCaps have won 8 of their last 12 games and are 4-0-2 in their last 6 series... Since falling to 10-22, the TinCaps are 27-15 since May 14.

BETTER THAN THEIR RECORD: Based off their +33 run differential for the year, the TinCaps project to have a 40-34 record (3 games better than their actual mark)... Fort Wayne is 13-19 in games decided by 1 or 2 runs this season.

POWER PERSPECTIVE: As a team, the TinCaps are on pace to hit 123 homers in this 132-game season... The franchise record is 127, set in 2017... If the season was still 140 games long, this year's team would be on track for 130 homers... The TinCaps have homered 21 times in 11 games at Lake County this season.

HOME RUN HISTORY: With Fort Wayne's franchise history dating back to 1993, the record for most home runs in a game is 6 (Aug. 6, 1997 @ Rockford; July 7, 2002 @ Quad City). Prior to Thursday, Fort Wayne last hit 5 homers in a game on Aug. 3, 2005 @ Dayton. Of those, a pair were hit by future big leaguers: Sean Kazmar Jr. and Mike Baxter... The franchise record for grand slams in a season is 6 (2006). This year's team has hit 5 so far.

STARTING PITCHING: TinCaps starters have the  $5^{th}$  lowest ERA in the Midwest League (3.33). Fort Wayne relievers have a 4.62 ERA,  $3^{rd}$  highest.

JACKSON MERRILL: MLB.com's highest-ranked prospect in the MWL (No. 11 on Top 100 list)... Selected for the MLB All-Star Futures Game... Since May 5, over 45 games, 5<sup>th</sup> in the MWL in average (.304)... For year, ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in R (45), 5<sup>th</sup> in H (71), 6<sup>th</sup> lowest K% (13%) & 7<sup>th</sup> in HR (10).

JAKOB MARSEE: 22<sup>nd</sup> birthday Wednesday... Only player in the MWL to appear in all 74 games so far this year... Ranks 1<sup>st</sup> in runs (59), 2<sup>nd</sup> in walks (56; 17% BB%) and OBP (.399), 3<sup>rd</sup> in SB (27)... 2<sup>nd</sup> best BB/K (1.04) and 4<sup>th</sup> lowest SwStr% (6%)... 1 of only 2 qualified players in the MWL that has more walks than strikeouts.

NATHAN MARTORELLA: In the MWL, ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in HR (12), G (73) and R (47), 3<sup>rd</sup> in RBIs (50), 4<sup>th</sup> in BB (48; 15% BB%), SLG (.465), and wRC+ (140), 5<sup>th</sup> in OPS (.840) & BB/K (0.9) & 8<sup>th</sup> in H (68).

MORE ON MARTORELLA: He's on pace to hit 22 home runs in this 132-game season. Fort Wayne's franchise record for home runs in a season is 21, set by Fernando Tatis Jr. in 2017. Tatis played in 117 games as a TinCap before a promotion to Double-A San Antonio... The schedule was 140-games long through 2019... Martorella's current .844 OPS would rank 6th highest in franchise history for a season. The record is .956, set by Jaff Decker in 2009, followed by Jason Hagerty (2010, .917)... Fernando Tatis Jr. (2017, .910)... Rymer Liriano (2011, .882)... Will Venable (2006, .865)... Over the last 2 seasons at the High-A level, the highest OPS posted by a Fort Wayne player was Agustín Ruiz in 2021 (2020).

MARCOS CASTAÑON: In the MWL, ranks 6<sup>th</sup> in H (70) and RBIs (45), 7<sup>th</sup> in HR (10), and 8<sup>th</sup> in G (70)... had a 10-game on-base streak end Sunday.

ROSTER MOVES: Through the first 69 games of the season, the TinCaps used a total of 40 players (16 position players and 24 pitchers). On June 27, the Padres promoted 7 players from the Single-A Lake Elsinore to Fort Wayne, including left-handed starting pitcher Robby Snelling (San Diego's top lefty pitching prospect).

**NEW GUYS: Albert Fabian** was leading the Cal League with 58 RBIs and 31 XBH...  $2^{nd}$  in 2B (18),  $4^{th}$  in HR (12) and  $6^{th}$  in SL6 (.504)... **Graham Pauley** ranked  $2^{nd}$  in OBP (.422) and 3B (5),  $3^{rd}$  in H (71) and R (50),  $6^{th}$  in BB (40),  $8^{th}$  in TB (107),  $9^{th}$  in OPS (.887) and  $10^{th}$  in AVG (.309).

## More News, Notes & Season Storylines

INTERIM MANAGER: Manager Jonathan Mathews is off this week. Lukas Ray, manager for the Arizona Complex League Padres, is filling in.

BACK AT PARKVIEW FIELD: While on this 12-game road trip, the ballpark hosted "Bert Kreischer's Fully Loaded Comedy Festival" on June 23 and "Ripple: A Middle Waves Music Festival Hype Event" on June 24... the Fort Wayne Philharmonic Pops was Saturday night.

FIRST HALF REVIEW: The TinCaps (32-34) finished 4th in the 6-team Midwest League East Division, which was won by the Dodgers-affiliated Great Lakes Loons (45-20)... Out of the 12 teams in the league, the 'Caps actually tied for the 3rd best run differential (+20)... Fort Wayne pitchers allowed the fewest home runs (34) out of all 30 High-A teams... The TinCaps began the season with an 0-5 record and were as many as 12 games below .500 through May 13 (10-22)... They ended the half going 22-12.

5,000,000 FANS: With a sellout crowd of 7,440 fans at Parkview Field on June 16, the TinCaps welcomed their 5 millionth fan since the ballpark opened in 2009.

FORT WAYNE FAITHFUL: The TinCaps have averaged 4,696 fans per game so far this year across 33 openings, including 5 sellouts. Fort Wayne's average attendance ranks 4th out of 60 High-A and Single-A clubs, and is greater than 19 Double-A teams and 7 in Triple-A.

260 TO THE SHOW: Since Fort Wayne's franchise was established in 1993, there've been 213 alumni who've gone on to appear in the majors, including 52 so far this season. That list is headlined by All-Stars like Fernando Tatis Jr. (2017) and Trea Turner (2014).

PACE OF PLAY: The average time for a 9-inning game at Parkview Field has been about 2 hours and 38 minutes. The Midwest League average has been 2:32... The average in Fort Wayne last year was 2:34.. In 2021, it was 3:14.

NO-HITTER: On May 16 @ Dayton, Jairo Iriarte (6 innings), Alan Mundo (1.2 IP), and Adam Smith (1.1 IP) combined to no-hit the Dragons in a 6-0 victory. It was just the 3<sup>rd</sup> no-hitter in Fort Wayne's 30-year franchise history and the first in more than a decade... Center fielder Jakob Marsee, who made a spectacular diving catch as he sprinted in from center field for the first out in the bottom of the 9<sup>th</sup> inning, also caught the final out. While he had been aware of the no-hitter late in the game, in the moment, it evaded his mind and he tossed the ball to a teenage fan sitting in right-center field. After the game, the teen named Wyatt, offered to return the ball. The TinCaps invited Wyatt and his family and friends out to the game on May 21, as Marsee exchanged the momentous ball for one signed by Iriarte, Mundo, and Smith, plus a signed bat and an autographed copy of their historic lineup card.

FRANCHISE RECORD: The TinCaps set a franchise record by homering in 10 consecutive games from April 29-May 10. Dating back to the franchise's founding in 1993, Fort Wayne had never before homered in more than 8 consecutive games (that happened 3 times, and not since 1998, according to club records).

SHUTOUT STREAK: TinCaps pitchers threw 27 consecutive scoreless innings during their series against Lansing in May. The TinCaps' record for consecutive scoreless innings is 35 – set in July 2009. Along the way then, Fort Wayne pitched 3 consecutive shutouts. That year's team went on to win the Midwest League title... The TinCaps had last pitched consecutive shutouts July 3-4, 2018, against the Great Lakes Loons. The latter of those games was started by MacKenzie Gore, who's now a starter with the Washington Nationals.

BABY ON BOARD: Congrats to hitting coach Aaron Bray and his wife on the birth of their 3rd child, a girl, on June 13.

CAPS IN THE COMMUNITY: On June 14, TinCaps players and coaches volunteered with The Rescue Mission, a local non-profit organization that provides restorative care to those experiencing a homelessness crisis. One group served lunch at Life House downtown, while others went to Charis House, a shelter for women and children, to help beautify their grounds and playground, and another group went to Treasure House, a thrift store.

HAYDEN'S HOMECOMING: Dayton catcher Hayden Jones grew up in Fort Wayne and graduated from Carroll High School in 2018. Playing under coach Dave Ginder, was a 4-year letterwinner, 3-time all-state selection, and 2-time team captain. The Chargers won a sectional title his senior season, as he was also MVP of Indiana's North/South All-Star Game... Went to Mississippi State for a season and then spent 2 years at Illinois State before signing with the Reds in August 2021... His dad (Ken) was drafted by the Padres in 1995 and that year played in the Midwest League with the Clinton LumberKings... 260 TO A PRO: Jones is 1 of 11 guys from the Fort Wayne area currently playing professional baseball. The list also includes Blue Jays outfielder Kevin Kiermaier (Bishop Luers, 2008) and Tigers infielder Zach McKinstry (North Side, 2014), who last played here in 2018.

CELEBRATION OF WOMEN IN SPORTS: On June 3, in partnership with Fort Wayne Parks, the TinCaps unveiled 2 new monuments at Memorial Park (about 2 miles east of Parkview Field) to honor the Fort Wayne Daisies of the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League. The monuments feature the names of all 144 team members over the course of the squad's run from 1945-54. The Daisies won 3 regular season titles and reached the championship series 4 times. Former Daisies pitcher Dolly Vanderlip Ozburn was in attendance. She also pitched for the South Bend Blue Sox. Meanwhile, Jeneane DesCombes Lesko (pitcher/outfielder for Grand Rapids) and Mary Moore (second base for Springfield and Battle Creek) were also here. The women were honored on the field pregame. They also signed autographs and took photos with fans on the concourse during the night... Former Daisies bat girl Bobbie Snyder Hill said, "Play ball!" After the game, descendants of several formers Daisies were recognized before the fireworks... The TinCaps wore Daisies replica jerseys that were auctioned off, with proceeds supporting projects to honor the Daisies' legacy.

KIDS CLUB CLINIC: Also on June 3, 8 TinCaps players (Colton Bender, Marcos Castañon, Keegan Collett, Justin Farmer, Jared Kollar, Carlos Luis, Jakob Marsee, and Kervín Pichardo) conducted a clinic for 55 members of the team's Kids Club. They held stations for hitting, pitching, fielding, and baserunning. The TinCaps Kids Club is free for children 12 and under.

LOU GEHRIG DAY: On June 2, 1925, Lou Gehrig became the starting first baseman for the Yankees. Exactly 16 years later, he passed away from complications of ALS disease, which then became known as "Lou Gehrig's disease." Today, Baseball raises awareness about this terrible disease and celebrates the fighting spirit that Gehrig continues to instill in ALS patients 82 years after his death. This cause hits close to home for the TinCaps. Kathy Winter, the wife of the team's longtime head groundskeeper, Keith Winter, was diagnosed with ALS in 2021. WANE 15, the local CBS affiliate, shared the Winters' <u>story of faith, hope, and love in a feature last week... Lou Gehrig: The Lost Memoir</u> was published by Fort Wayne native and resident Alan Gaff in 2020. The book includes columns Gehrig wrote for *The Oakland Tribune* in 1927... Gehrig played in Fort Wayne twice in 1927 (a year when he won the AL MVP, leading the Yankees to a World Series title). On May 6 that year, the Yankees played an exhibition against the semi-pro Lincoln Lifers at League Park (present day Headwaters Park – approximately 1.5 miles northeast of Parkview Field). New York won, 5-3, in 10 innings as Babe Ruth broke a tie in the 10th with a two-run homer. Ruth and Gehrig returned in the fall as part of a barnstorming tour pitting the Bustin' Babes vs. the Larrupin' Lous.

PROSPECT PUBLICITY: Jackson Merrill is ranked as ESPN.com's No. 9 overall. Jairo Iriarte, Nathan Martorella, and Jakob Marsee were included on a list of top "risers."

YOUNG ARMS: The TinCaps have the youngest pitching staff in the Midwest League. Fort Wayne's pitchers on average are 22 years old (the average age for a pitcher in the MWL is 23). Starting pitcher Victor Lizarraga, who's 19 and won't turn 20 until Nov. 30, is the youngest player in the league.

CHAMPION MINDSET: The core of this year's team won the Single-A California League title last year with the Lake Elsinore Storm after going 77-55 in the regular season.

DAILY PROMOTIONS: Tuesdays are Family Feast Nights (US Foods) featuring \$2 concession items... Wednesdays are Paws & Claws Nights (Law's Country Kennel) as fans can purchase a "paw pass" for pets and save on White Claw... Thirsty Thursdays (Rudy's) offer \$2 domestic draft beers and other drink specials... Sundays feature a Postgame Autograph-signing session (Midwest Box Breaks).

2022 IN REVIEW: On the field, Fort Wayne posted a 50-80 record, worst in franchise history... Off the field, Team President Mike Nutter won Minor League Baseball's Executive of the Year Award... The TinCaps also earned the Midwest League's Visiting Clubhouse of the Year honor for hospitality... The team was a finalist for best Hispanic fan-engagement and the club's Fort Wayne Daisies Throwback Night was a finalist for best promotion.
