Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Logan Allen** to the mound tonight, needing a win to stay in the race for the first half championship (9-1 when Allen starts). Indianapolis will counter with RHP **Khristian Curtis**. Columbus is 31-15 (.674) versus right handers this year. Curtis has never pitched against the Clippers in his career, with tonight being his Triple-A debut (58th career game).

vs. the Indians

Columbus is 5-4 against Indianapolis this year, posting a -6 run margin (9-9, +13 in 2025; 12-5, +45 in 2024; 10-8, -23 in 2023; 12-8, +53 in 2022). Since the start of the 2022 season, the Clippers are 17-9 (.654) in games against Indianapolis that are decided by at least five. Individually, **Bo Naylor** is 20x66 (.303) with 4HR, 17RBI in 19G against Indy and **Cooper Ingle** is 12x37 (.324) with 3HR, 8RBI in 12G.

Dang It

During the 6G road win streak that was snapped Thursday, Columbus led after 47 of 51 innings played (92%, tied after three innings and trailed after one: 1st inning on Tuesday). In the last 2G, both losses, the Clippers were tied after the 1st on Thursday, led 1-0 after the 2nd (scored in 1st and/or 2nd of last 8G on the road) and have trailed after each of the last 16 innings (outscored 22-6 in those innings).

Double Trouble

Back to back 11-run games allowed marks the second time this season the pitching staff has surrendered double digits in the run column in consecutive games (back to back 13s at Iowa, 5/8-5/9). On the season, Columbus has allowed at least 10 runs in 10G (3rd most, trailing St. Paul's 12G and Iowa's 13G), including three times in the last week (outscored 47-30 in last 6G, +9 to -8 in season run margin).

Juan Up, Juan Down

Juan Brito is 1x16 in his last 4G after hitting .400 (12x30) in the previous 8G (5/28-6/5; was hitless in each of 5G prior to that, 18AB).

Brito is coming up on 1,000PA in his Clipper career (975, would be 53rd player to reach the plateau after **George Valera** did earlier this year). Brito's 58 doubles (three in last 24G) are three short of the franchise top 25 (8BB from top 25, Valera is 22nd).

Getting There

Cooper Ingle finally reached the qualification level for rate statistics in the IL and his current .444OBP ranks 2nd in the IL. Ingle has slumped to a .292OBP over the last 14G (11x56, .196, 8BB, 17K), but since his Triple-A debut on 8/13/25, he has the best OBP in the IL (.421, +18 points on 2nd place) and the 4th most walks (58). As a catcher, Ingle has a 1.214OPS in 29G (.478OPS in 12G elsewhere).

Nayled It

The Clippers are 9-4 with **Bo Naylor** in the lineup, averaging 6.2 runs per game (4.2 per in previous 10G). Following Thursday's 0x4 (snapped 11G on base streak, .479OBP, 10BB in 25PA from 6/2-6/9), Naylor was 2x4 with a double, HR and 2RBI last night. Columbus catchers are hitting .307/.455/.555, leading the IL in all three categories by a wide margin (2nd in all is Memphis: .273/.384/.479).

Watch Out for Watson

Kahlii Watson is hitting .299/.396/.604 with 24XBH and 33RBI in his last 41G (1XBH in first 12G), including 8HR and 21RBI since 5/10. Watson has 6BB in his last 7G, following a streak of 15G without (5/10-5/29; was 2nd in the IL with 30BB in 31G through 5/9, now tied for 16th). He has scored in each of his last 9G (11 runs total), giving him 43 runs on the year (t-8th most, 10 off the lead).

Tough Way to Go

George Valera saw his 21G on base streak snapped with a pinch-hit strikeout last night (5/5-6/10, .418OBP). Over the first 8G of the streak, Valera had a .250OBP (36PA; hit .182, 6x33 with 3BB and 11K), but reached over half the time in the last 13G (.527OBP in 55PA; hit .366, 15x41 with 14BB and 6K). Valera's K-rate is down considerably this year (16.5% from 26.5% with Columbus from '22-25).

Half Season, Full Huff

Kody Huff is just over halfway to his career high of 101G in 2025 (52G), while also being over halfway to a high of 407PA in 2025 (215PA, 52.8%). With 9HR already, Huff has a new personal best, while his 45RBI are almost there (47RBI in 2025). His 39 runs are 87% to his career best (has scored in 5G this month), his 53 hits are 65% of the way there and his 35K are 34% to a high.

This Date in Clipper History

6/12/2005

Columbus erased a 7-2 deficit, scoring six times over the final three innings, including a pair in the 9th to beat Pawtucket 8-7.

Kevin Reese, the 2005 Clipper of the Year, had four hits to lead the way, starting the comeback with a 3-run HR in the 7th and then scoring the tying run after a double in the 9th. Reese made his Major League debut two weeks later, starting in left field for the Yankees.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,438 to 1,386).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 91-85 (.517) in pitch reviews, with batters going 49-58 (.458) and pitchers/catchers going 42-27 (.609). They have run out of challenges in 33G and have not challenged in 3G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 1-3 in extra innings this season, after having gone 5-5 in 2025 and 9-9 in 2024 (most losses since 2013, 12). Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 51-36 when playing past regulation (.586, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 26-17 at home (.605, but 4-7 in last 11G). Of the 87G to require extra play, 69 have been resolved after one frame (including eight DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 innings on 9/20/22 at Toledo). From 7/31/19-6/26/21, Columbus played 85 straight within the allotted innings.

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to easily top 800 again, with an outside chance to establish a new team high (on pace for 844, would rank as 4th most all-time; 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 90 through the first 65G (on pace for 206SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 21CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 3rd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (48; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,938RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

Hits the Spot

When turning in as many or fewer hits than their opponents last season, the Clippers went 18-64 (.220), coming in 13th out of 20 in the IL. The 2024 season saw them post an IL-worst .185 (12-53) winning percentage in such games. When allowing at least 10 hits last year, Columbus was 7-41 (.146, 20th in the IL; started the season 1-20).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.51 through the first 65G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 170HR (over 10HR under the average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 10th in the IL this year (.979), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 35G this season (23-12, .657), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Key to Victory

From 2022-23, Columbus owned the best record in the IL when holding opponents to three runs or fewer, going 95-8 (.922, no other team was above .880). The Clippers were 43-10 in such games in 2024 (.811, 13th in the IL), accumulating four losses by 4/14, and were just 47-10 (.825, 9th) last year, collecting four losses over 14G from 4/23-5/9 (had four losses total in both 2022 and 2023).

Good Baseball

Kody Huff bunted a run in, while moving another to scoring position in a 5/24 win vs. Louisville. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 87-23 (.791) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 4-2 mark this season (.667, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers had the 6th most last at bat losses last season (17), after pacing the circuit with 23 in 2024 (tied with Toledo). They also suffered the 4th most walk-off losses (8), watching three in a row slip away at Rochester from 5/29-5/31. The 2024 season saw 41G decided in the last at bat (tied for 2nd most in the IL, one off lead), with Columbus going 18-23 in those contests (-17th, .439).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 422-435 (.492), 392-389 with Columbus (.502).

Workhorse

Allen is the only Clipper averaging over 80 pitches a start this season, at 87.2 (along with **Ryan Webb**, only pitchers to throw more than 90 in a game multiple times). Averaging almost 93 pitches per outing in the Majors last season, Allen hit triple digits six times (Columbus has not had a pitcher reach 100 since **Peyton Battenfield** on 9/2/22, 529G ago)

On Guard(ians):

In two stints in the Majors this season (27th man in a DH on 4/5 and a two day excursion from 5/24-5/25), Allen has appeared once for Cleveland, closing out the game on 5/25 vs. Washington (4.0IP, 5H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 7K). The game was his second in relief at the Major League level (once last season) and he has just 4G out of the bullpen in the minors (all on starter's rest, three piggybacking rehabbing Major Leaguers).

Stellar Support:

Through 10GS, the bullpen has graced Allen with a 1.63ERA in relief (38.2IP, 7ER), stranding two of four runners inherited. The defense has committed only 7E in Allen's starts, while the offense has put forward 5.7 runs per game. That all adds up to a 9-1 record for Columbus when he takes the hill.

Tough Split:

In his first 5GS (103BF), Allen recorded 32K (31%) against only 10BB (10%), while painting the zone with strikes on 63% of his pitches. Since the calendar flipped to May, however, he has made 5GS (110BF), watching his strikeout rate dip to 22% (24K; including 10K on 6/6 vs. Omaha, fifth career game of at least 10K) and his walk rate inflate (13%; strikes on 59% of pitches).

Cleaning Up:

Opposing cleanup hitters have just one hit off Allen in 22AB this season, though the hit went over the wall (**Charles McAdoo**, 4/26 at Buffalo). Looking at the lineup as a whole, the top five in the order have slashed .223/.326/.384 with 3HR in 112AB against Allen, while batters 6-9 have hit .370/.434/.644 with 4HR in 73AB.
