Today: The Lansing Lugnuts, High-A affiliate of the A's, play the fifth of a six-game series at the Great Lakes Loons, High-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers. The Lugnuts are 9-7 this season vs. the Loons, including 6-4 in Midland – winning five in a row from July 11 through August 6 before dropping the last two meetings.

Last Night: Loons 8, Lugnuts 6 (10 innings). Elijah Hainline capped a three-run game-tying rally in the 8th with a two-run homer, and Jake Gelof finished off a four-run rally in the bottom of the 10th with a walk-off two-run homer, rallying Great Lakes to victory in front of a sold-out Dow Diamond crowd.

On Deck: The Lugnuts conclude their 18-game season series with Great Lakes tomorrow, then return home from Tuesday, August 12, through Sunday, August 17, welcoming in the Dayton Dragons for the penultimate homestand of the year.

Prospecting: The Lugnuts' roster has six of MLB Pipeline's Top 30 Athletics prospects in No. 1 Leo De Vries, rated the No. 3 prospect in all of Minor League Baseball, plus No. 13 Steven Echavarria, No. 17 Ryan Lasko, No. 20 Carlos Pacheco, No. 21 Wei-En Lin, No. 25 Kenya Huggins and No. 28 Tzu-Chen Sha.

Roll Call: The 2025 Lugnuts have featured 49 different players, 25 position players and 24 pitchers (plus one position player pitching). 18 players have stolen a base, 15 players have hit a home run, 12 pitchers have started a game and five pitchers have recorded a save.

Adventures on the Bases: The Loons had four runners caught stealing on Tuesday, but have had more success since then: two steals on Wednesday, two steals on Thursday, and five steals in six attempts last night. In four games total, Great Lakes is 9-for-14 in stolen base attempts... while the Lugnuts have gone 10-for-11 in steals against Great Lakes.

Power Failure: Lansing has gone the last 11 games without hitting a home run. The last time a Nut homered, it was 369 at-bats ago: July 26 at Lake County, a **Ryan Lasko** solo shot at Lake County. The Nuts only have four home runs in their last 20 games while allowing a league high 20 home runs.

HBL - **Hit By Loons**: No Midwest League team has plunked more batters than Great Lakes (88), with another Lugnut hit last night and eight in the last three games. In contrast, Lansing pitchers have hit a league low 44 batters. (The Nuts have now been plunked 95 times this season, tied for 2nd in the MWL; Great Lakes batters have been hit only 43 times, 11th in the league.)

The Whiff: The Lugnuts entered the week as the most difficult team to strike out in the Minors, but have fanned a league high 50 times in the first four games of this series.

ERA Unaffected: Of the 19 runs Nuts pitchers have allowed in this series, only 11 are earned. And of the 21 runs allowed by Loons pitchers in the series, only 14 are earned. *And yet...* Great Lakes has been charged for eight errors in the series while Lansing has been charged with only one.

200 to The Show: Seven former Lugnuts players have made it to the Majors this season, most recently 2023-24 Lugnuts right-hander Luis Morales on August 1st for the A's, bringing the total to 200 Lugnuts all-time who've reach the Majors. Morales joined Max Muncy, Gunnar Hoglund, Jack Winkler, Denzel Clarke, Jack Perkins, Colby Thomas and broadcaster Adam Jaksa to debut in MLB this season.

Black and Blue: T.J. Schofield-Sam has been hit by 27 pitches this year to put him in second place in Minor League Baseball, three behind Arkansas's Michael Arroyo. The Midwest League record is held by Luke Adams, who was hit by 40 pitches last year with Wisconsin.

League Leaderboard: T.J. Schofield-Sam is 2nd in the Midwest League in batting average (.299), 7th in on-base percentage (.384) and tied for 8th in base hits (96). Grant Judkins leads the Midwest League in innings pitched (108 2/3) and is tied for 1st in starts (21) and complete games (1), tied for 5th in strikeouts (93), 6th in batting average allowed (.250), 7th in WHIP (1.33) and 7th in ERA (4.14) among qualified pitchers. Mark Adamiak leads the league with 36 appearances and 17 saves.

2009: Tony Brown hit a grand slam in a seven-run 3rd inning, helping the Dayton Dragons turn a 4-1 deficit into an 8-4 lead. The Lugnuts narrowed the deficit to 8-7 with three runs in the home 3rd, and then narrowed a 10-7 deficit to 10-9 with solo tallies in the 7th and the 9th, but with the tying run at third base and the winning run at first base, pinch-hitter Jon Talley lined out and Chris Emanuele struck out looking to end a thrilling 10-9 loss at Oldsmobile Park. Each team collected 15 hits in the slugfest.

2013: The Lugnuts blew a 5-0 lead at home, with West Michigan scoring two in the 8th and three in the 9th, but DH Kevin Patterson's two-run homer in the 12th inning gave the Nuts a walkoff win, 7-5, in four hours and seven minutes before 11,166 at Cooley Law School Stadium. It was Patterson's 18th home run of the year.

Starting Out: Avant's first start of the season came due to unusual circumstances: April 25 vs. Fort Wayne, the start time was pushed back an hour due to worry of inclement weather, so Avant's number was called instead of the scheduled starter, Gage Jump. Avant pitched two innings, allowing one run, before yielding to Jump, who struck out 13 batters in 6 2/3 scoreless innings in a 3-1 Lugnuts win... fully joined the rotation on May 13 vs. South Bend... set career highs for most innings (7.0) and most strikeouts (8) in a terrific start at Quad Cities on June 21, allowing four hits, three walks and one run.

Additional Lug•Notes

DK at the Helm: The 19th manager in Lugnuts history is **Darryl Kennedy**, entering his second year in the A's organization. Kennedy distinguished himself as a catcher at Manatee Community College before starring at the University of North Florida and was named an NCAA All-American in 1991 en route to North Florida's Hall of Fame, inducted in 2017. Kennedy played in the Minor Leagues for seven seasons, including parts of four seasons in Triple-A. Following his 1997 retirement, he immediately began managing, leading the Gulf Coast League Rangers to the 1998 GCL Championship. Kennedy won a second title with the GCL Rangers in 2000, moving on to stops in the Florida State League, Northwest League and Texas League through 2006. Upon joining the Royals' organization, Kennedy managed in the Appalachian League, Carolina League, Pioneer League, Arizona League and Texas League through 2020. He served as bench coach for the KBO's Hanwha Eagles from 2021 through 2023 before joining the A's as Double-A Midland's assistant hitting coach in 2024.

Filling Out the Staff: Dave Burba, the Lugnuts' pitching coach, walked on at Ohio State, pitched in the Big Ten Championship game as a freshman, was drafted by the Mariners one round after Ken Griffey, Jr. in 1987, and won 115 games in 15 MLB seasons before spending 13 seasons as a pitching coach in the Colorado Rockies' organization. Rubén Escalera is in his second year as hitting coach and his 30th season in the A's organization; he simultaneously serves as a scout for the A's in Puerto Rico. And the pride of Yuba City, Calif., Cooper Goldby comes to the Lugnuts after two seasons serving as the Dominican Summer League A's manager. The catcher/utilityman was drafted out of Lewis-Clark State in the 35th round in 2017.

Get to Know These Names: If the past is any indication, the Athletics' 2025 draft picks will be making a Midwest League impact sooner rather than later. Last year, third-rounder **Joshua Kuroda-Grauer** finished the season in Lansing before starring for the Nuts thus far this year. In 2023, the Lugnuts received first-rounder **Jacob Wilson** for 23 games in August; two years later, Wilson started the All-Star Game for the American League at shortstop. This year, the A's selected Florida State southpaw **Jamie Arnold** with the 11th overall pick, following up with a pair of impact slugging outfielders: Indiana Hoosier **Devin Taylor** (the No. 30 prospect) at pick 48 and Oregon State Beaver **Gavin Turley** (the No. 78 prospect) at pick 110.

The Mutant Cycle: The best individual performance of the season was achieved *against* the Lugnuts by **Leo De Vries**, who went 5-for-5 on April 22nd for Fort Wayne, with a single, a double, two home runs, a sacrifice fly, and - in the top of the ninth inning – a go-ahead two-run triple to both give the TinCaps the win and culminate the third cycle in Fort Wayne franchise history. De Vries finished the game with eight RBIs, tying the Fort Wayne single game franchise record. De Vries also is the only player in Fort Wayne history to have two four-walk games.

Walk-Off Wonders: The Nuts have walked off with a win on four different occasions this year:

- Jared Dickey's two-run single in the 12th inning to beat Great Lakes, 12-11, April 13th
- Sahid Valenzuela's RBI single in the 10th inning to beat Lake County, 1-0, May 4th
- Rodney Green, Jr.'s RBI single in the 10th inning to beat South Bend, 7-6, May 13th
- Jared Dickey's RBI fielder's choice in the bottom of the 9th to beat West Michigan, 4-3, June 11th

All-Star Representation, Futures Edition: Tommy White and 2025 Opening Day starter Gage Jump epresented the Athletics' organization at the 2025 All-Star Futures Game on July 12th at Truist Park. White went 0-for-1 with a strikeout while Jump needed only four pitches to strike out Padres No. 1 prospect Leo De Vries and induce a groundout from Cubs No. 1 prospect Owen Caissie – coincidentally to White at third. White, the A's No. 6 prospect, joined Luis Morales (2024), Denzel Clarke (2022), Vladimir Guerrero Jr. and Bo Bichette (2017) and Angel Perdomo (2016) as active Lugnuts to play in the Futures Game.

All-Star Representation, Present Tense: Four Lugnuts were named Major League All-Stars – American League starting shortstop Jacob Wilson (2023), A.L. starting first baseman Vladimir Guerrero, Jr. (2017), A.L. reserve catcher Alejandro Kirk (2019), and N.L. starting pitcher Matthew Boyd (2013). It was Vladdy's fifth All-Star appearance, Kirk's second, and the first apiece for Wilson and Boyd. Wilson was the first A's starting shortstop in an All-Star Game since Bert Campaneris (1974) and the first rookie starting shortstop in an All-Star Game since Ron Hansen in 1960.

Still Shoving: 45-year-old Rich Hill pitched for the Lugnuts in 2003 (0-1, 2.76, 15 G, 4 GS, 29 1/3 innings, 14 H, 36 walks, 50 strikeouts, 9 wild pitches). On July 13, Hill struck out 10 Toledo Mud Hens in five innings, becoming the first 45-year-old to strike out at least 10 batters in a game since the Texas Rangers' Nolan Ryan whiffed double-digit Athletics on August 6, 1992. Hill is in his 20th professional season and with his 14th different MLB organization.

The Butler Did What: 2021-2022 Lugnut Lawrence Butler led off July 8th's game for the A's vs. Atlanta with an inside-the-park home run, the Athletics' first inside-the-park homer since Mark Kotsay achieved the feat on October 4, 2006; the first leadoff inside-the-park home run for the A's since Elmer Valo in 1943; and the first A's player to have both an inside-the-park home run and an over-the-fence home run in the same game since Billy Williams on August 23, 1975. When the Giants' Patrick Bailey delivered a walk-off inside-the-park home run to end the night in baseball, it was the first time in Major League Baseball history that a leadoff inside-the-parker and a walk-off inside-the-parker were hit on the same day.

Dubious History: 2018 Lugnut **Vinny Capra** was former Great Lakes Loon Clayton Kershaw's 3,000th strikeout victim on July 2. Capra, a 20th-rounder from Richmond in 2018, had been claimed off waivers by the White Sox from the Milwaukee Brewers on May 15.

Simply Electric: 2022 Lugnut Denzel Clarke won the MLB Chevrolet Electric Play of the Week each of his first four weeks in the Majors.

Happy Trails: 2012 Nut **Kevin Pillar** announced his retirement on July 2 following a 13-year playing career with 10 different teams. A 32nd-round selection in 2011, Pillar went 6-for-6 with a grand slam in a 6-RBI night at the Dayton Dragons on May 13, 2012, and found a fire extinguisher in his locker after the game. He went on to be the 2012 Midwest League Most Valuable Player.

If Lansing's July 4 crowd is excluded, the May 28 attendance would rank larger than any crowd in High-A this season except for a West Michigan Whitecaps gate of 9,049 on June 7.
