SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Portland Sea Dogs, 8-7, in 10 innings to snap a season-high four-game losing streak. **Lisbel Diaz** hit a three-run homer in the first. After a Portland run in the top of the second, Richmond scored on a stolen base attempt and **Trevor Cohen** hit a solo homer in the bottom of the inning for a 5-1 lead. **Johanfran Garcia** hit a solo homer in the third and **Nelly Taylor** hit an RBI single in the fourth to close the score to 5-3. In the top of the ninth, **Tyler McDonough** tied the score with a two-run homer and **Yoelin Cespedes** gave the Sea Dogs a 6-5 lead with a double. Richmond tied the score, 6-6, in the bottom of the ninth with a run-scoring fielder's choice by **Diaz**. Portland took a 7-6 lead with a groundout in the top of the 10th. In the bottom of the inning, **Zane Zielinski** tied the score with a bases-loaded walk and **Cohen** hit a walk-off single.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians, in the first of a six-game series. This is the final road series of the 2026 regular season for Richmond. The Flying Squirrels won five-of-six at CarMax Park from May 5-10 against the RubberDucks. They split a six-game set in Akron from May 26-31 before Richmond won five-of-six at CarMax Park from June 23-28.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 72-52 record is the best in team history through 124 games, ahead of a 70-54 record in 2014. Richmond has won eight series, split 10 and lost four so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 45-45 in their last 90 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 72 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 36 of them. In 25 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 12 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in all but one home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has four wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels are batting .277 in the ninth inning this year, which leads the EL and is eighth in MiLB. The Flying Squirrels have won 30 one-run decisions this year, the most in the EL, a franchise record. They are 11-1 in extra innings.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie. For the year, Richmond is second among all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.266), first in sacrifice flies (51), fifth in hits (1099), fifth in doubles (217) and tied for fifth in triples (30). The team has combined for 119 homers this year, surpassing 12 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. On Aug. 18 at Chesapeake, the Flying Squirrels set new single-season record for stolen bases, passing 168 in 2014. On August 26, the Flying Squirrels recorded their 50th sacrifice fly of the season off the bat of **Lisbel Diaz**, passing 49 in 2012 for a new team record. With an RBI single by **Zane Zielinski** in the seventh inning on August 29, the Flying Squirrels set the single-season RBIs record (previously 604, 2023). **Diaz** hit a three-run homer in the first inning on August 30 to pass the single-season team runs record (previously 538, 2023). The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, total bases, OBP, SLG and OPS. Richmond's No. 9 batters have combined to hit .308 this year, which leads the minors. The Flying Squirrels have scored 10-or-more runs 12 times this year, passing 2023 (11) for the most in a season in franchise history. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown 10 shutouts this season, which is first in the Eastern League, second in Double-A and tied for sixth in MiLB.

THE RUBBERDUCKS went 3-3 in last week's series at Somerset. Akron leads the EL in triples (32). Akron's roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects, including RHP Braylon Doughty (No. 3), OF Jaison Chourio (No. 5), SS Dean Curley (No. 9), OF Aaron Walton (No. 12), OF Jace LaViolette (No. 13) and OF Nolan Schubart (No. 23). Nine Akron players are featured in MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects, including Doughty (No. 3), Chourio (No. 6), Curley (No. 8), Walton (No. 9), LaViolette (No. 14), INF Luke Hill (No. 17), Schubart (No. 24), LHP Rafe Schlesinger (No. 28) and LHP Caden Favors (No. 29).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Shane Rademacher** makes his second start of the 2026 season. Last Wednesday, he made his first start since his last appearance of the 2025 season last September against Hartford and threw 3.2 scoreless innings against the Sea Dogs. In his last nine outings since July 3, Rademacher has gone 1-0 with a 2.29 ERA (5 ER/19.2 IP), posting a .121 BAA and a 0.97 WHIP. Rademacher signed with the Giants as a non-drafted free agent out of Chowan University in 2023. He made five starts and five relief appearances with the Flying Squirrels last year. **For more on Rademacher, see page two.**

FOR AKRON: Right-hander **Ryan Degges** makes his fifth Double-A start and his ninth appearance with the Guardians organization. He last pitched on Wednesday at Somerset and allowed three runs (two earned) over 4.2 innings in a no-decision. Degges was selected by the Philadelphia Phillies in the 17th round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of UNC Charlotte. He split the first half of his season between High-A Jersey Shore and Low-A Clearwater before being traded to Cleveland on July 4. After four games split between the ACL Guardians and High-A Lake County, Degges was promoted to Akron on August 4 and combined for 8.2 scoreless innings in his first two Double-A starts.

CROES CONTROL: **Dayson Croes** is batting .359 (23-for-64) with 20 singles, two doubles, a homer, six RBIs and four walks over his last 15 games since August 13, raising his season batting average at Double-A from .237 to .270. He went 3-for-3 in the first game of last week's series on Tuesday with two walks and a sacrifice. He combined for three hits and two walks in his first five plate appearances last Wednesday, reaching base in eight consecutive plate appearances. Croes has picked up multiple hits five times in his last nine games since August 21, including three three-hit games.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 332 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, Dave Machemer won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Sabin Ceballos** is tied for sixth in walks (65). **Maui Ahuna** is tied for eighth in stolen bases (29). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for third in triples (4), tied for eighth in hits (109) and ninth in total bases (180). **Jonah Cox** is tied for first in triples (5) and tied for 10th in stolen bases (27). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (15), tied for third in wins (9) and tied for fifth in games pitched (41). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1) and fifth in ERA (4.23).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Jacob Bresnahan** (No. 6), **Dakota Jordan** (No. 9), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 10), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 12) and RHP **Miguel Mendez** (No. 20). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features seven Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 6), Jordan (No. 7), Bresnahan (No. 9), Cohen (No. 14), Mendez (No. 16), **Jancel Villarroel** (No. 18) and **Lisbel Diaz** (No. 29).

MISC NOTES: **Tyler Vogel** is the first Eastern League reliever to reach 15 saves in a season since Portland's Luis Guerrero (18) in 2023. He now has the fifth-most saves in a season in franchise history, with Heath Hembre's 17 saves in 2011 next on the list. Vogel is also seventh in franchise history in career saves with 21, trailing Josh Osich (2013-2016) and Tyler Myrick (2023-2025) for a tie for fifth with 22. His nine wins this season are the second-most as a reliever in team history, trailing Edwin Quirarte (11, 2014). // **Lisbel Diaz** hit his second Double-A homer on Sunday and his 26th overall this season between Low-A San Jose, High-A Eugene and Richmond, which is tied with Bo Davidson, who also homered on Sunday, for the most in the Giants organization this year. // **Ryan Vanderhel** is 2-0 with a 1.05 ERA (3 ER/25.2 IP) in his last 18 outings since June 20, allowing three earned runs and five total runs in that stretch with 27 strikeouts and a .186 BAA. // **Sabin Ceballos** has 65 walks this season, the fourth-most in a season in franchise history. He is one walk behind Hayden Cantrelle (66, 2023) for third place on the list. In his career, Ceballos has worked 112 walks, which is tied for fourth-most in Flying Squirrels franchise history with Ricky Oropesa (112, 2013-16). He is 11 walks behind Diego Velasquez (123, 2024-26) for a tie for third on the all-time franchise list. // **Maui Ahuna** has 29 stolen bases this season, sixth-most in a season in franchise history behind Gary Brown (33, 2012). He also has the highest (min. 25 att.) stolen base percentage (.902, 29-for-32) in a season in team history. // There have been 50 Flying Squirrels alumni who have played in the majors this year (plus Donovan Walton, who had previous MLB experience before playing in Richmond), including 28 with the Giants.

ROAD TO THE SHOW: Three Flying Squirrels alumni made their MLB debuts for the San Francisco Giants against the Arizona Diamondbacks last weekend. On Friday night, **Braxton Roxby** (2025) threw a 1-2-3 inning and recorded a strikeout in his debut out of the bullpen. **Seth Lonsway** (2024-26) pitched two relief innings and recorded two strikeouts in the first game of Saturday's doubleheader in his debut. **Yunior Marte** (2026) started the second game of Saturday's doubleheader and allowed one run over 4.2 innings with three strikeouts. There have been 14 Flying Squirrels alumni who have debuted in the majors this season, tying the franchise's single-season record (2024). Six players from this year's Richmond roster, including Lonsway, Marte, **Jonah Cox**, **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Turner Hill** and **Matt Wilkinson**, have debuted this year, setting a new franchise record for players earning their MLB debuts in a season where they also appeared with Richmond (passing five in 2023).

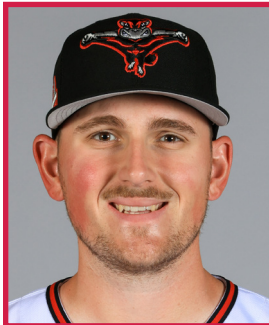
THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1967: The Richmond Braves beat the Columbus Jets, 2-1. In the ninth, **Tommie Aaron** hit a walk-off, solo homer. The game drew a crowd of 17,184, a new record at Parker Field. **1982:** The Richmond Braves beat the Columbus Clippers, 7-0, at Parker Field to clinch the International League pennant, their first in 15 years. **Tony Brizzolara** threw a four-hit shutout. **Craig Landis** homered and **Paul Runge** hit a grand slam in the eighth. **Don Mattingly** had two of the Clippers' four hits. **1986:** The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 1-0, at The Diamond on a walk-off single in the 16th inning by **Andres Thomas**. **2008:** The Richmond Braves beat the Norfolk Tides, 9-3, in the franchise's final game at The Diamond. The Atlanta Braves had announced they would be moving the team to Gwinnett County, Ga., the next year. **2013:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 7-3, at The Diamond. **Jack Snodgrass** threw eight innings and allowed two runs to improve to 12-4 on the year, a franchise record for wins in a season. **Ryan Lolis**, **Adam Duvall** and **Angel Villalona** homered.
