YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the RubberDucks, 9-3, snapping their season-high six-game win streak. Akron took a 3-0 lead in the first with an RBI single by Kahlil Watson and a two-run single by Alex Mooney. In the top of the second, Justin Wishkoski and Aeverson Arteaga hit RBI singles to close the score to 3-2. The RubberDucks scored six runs in the second to open a 9-2 lead. Watson hit a two-run double, Jorge Burgos hit a three-run home and Michael Turconi brought in a run with a groundout. In the top of the third, Victor Bericoto plated Carter Howell with a groundout. Richmond relievers Ian Villers, Will Bednar and Michael Stryffeler each pitched two scoreless innings.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Flying Squirrels play the fifth of a six-game road series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. This is Richmond's final trip to Akron this year. The RubberDucks swept a three-game series at The Diamond to open the season from April 4-6 and took five-of-six at Canal Park from April 22-27. The Flying Squirrels host the RubberDucks from August 26-31. The Flying Squirrels need a win for their second consecutive series victory.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,622 fans per home game, which ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

was the highest April attendance in nancinos mass), ak **THE FLYING SQUIRRELS** are 7-3 in their last 10 games and tied for first place in the Southwest Division Second-Half standings. Their six-game win streak from July 4-10 was their longest winning streak since picking up seven consecutive wins from Sept. 2-9, 2023. It was the 17th time in franchise history the Flying Squirrels have won six-or-more straight games. In the last seven games since July 1, the Flying Squirrels lead the Eastern League in batting average (.271), hits (64), walks (34) and OBP (.367). Of Richmond's 53 losses this season, 29 of them have been by two runs or less (19 by one, 10 by two). Their 19 one-run losses are tied for the most in the FL with Reading. are tied for the most in the EL with Reading.

**THE RUBBERDUCKS** have lost six straight games after winning their previous five straight. Over the weekend, they dropped all three games at home against the SeaWolves. They swept their three games in Erie to begin last week. The RubberDucks finished the first half in second place in the Southwest Division, two games behind Erie. Akron's roster features three players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects, including SS Angel Genao (No. 2), C Cooper Ingle (No. 8) and OF Kahlil Watson (No. 22). There are three Akron players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects, including Genao (No. 2), Ingle (No. 8) and Watson (No. 29).

**STRONG ARMS:** Since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 305 ERA (61 ER/180.0 IP) in 21 games, which is second-best in the Eastern League. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 1.70 ERA (16 ER/84.2 IP) in that stretch. In their last 10 road games since June 17, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 2.35 ERA (24 ER/92.0 IP).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Jack Choate makes his 17th start of the season and his fourth against the RubberDucks. He last pitched on Sunday afternoon in Bowie and allowed one run over five innings with six strikeouts in a win. It was his longest start since June 6. His previous three starts were all shortened. On June 19, he pitched two innings before play was suspended at Altoona for rain. On June 25 against Reading, he worked two outs into the second inning before being removed with a high pitch count (58). He started against the Baysox on July 1 and allowed one run over three innings before play was stopped for rain. He has made three starts against the RubberDucks dating back to last season, posting a 1.69 ERA (2 ER/10.2 IP). Last year, Choate spent most of the season with High-A Eugene, going 1-3 with a 2.90 ERA in 19 outings (18 starts). He was promoted to Double-A Richmond in August and made eight starts for the Flying Squirrels, posting a 1-4 record with a 5.82 ERA to close the season. Choate finished 2024 ranked first among qualified, full-season Giants minor-league pitchers in BAA (231) and WHIP (1.21) while ranking second in ERA (3.79). Choate was selected by the Giants in the ninth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Assumption University. FOR AKRON: Left-hander Adam Tulloch makes his first Double-A start. He was promoted to Double-A Akron on June 13 and has pitched five relief outings. He last pitched on Tuesday against the Flying Squirrels, working around two hits for a scoreless innings. He started the season with High-A Lake County and posted a 2.28 ERA in four outings. Tulloch was selected by the Guardians in the 15th round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Arizona State. He also spent a season at NCAA DII Wingate in 2019, a junior college season at the College of Central Florida in 2020 and a year at West Virginia University in 2021.

**DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND:** The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 45 stolen base attempts this season, which is tied for first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 32 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has the second-most runners caught stealing by a catcher in a single season in franchise history, trailing **Jackson Williams** (35 - 2013). For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 45 runners caught stealing for his career is fourth-most in franchise history, four behind **Brandon Martorano** (49).

**SUGEY SHOW:** At the plate. **Adrián Sugastey** is batting .311 (14-for-45) with two homers, a double, nine RBIs, six walks and four runs scored over his last 13 games since June 21. His eight-game hit streak was snapped on Friday night, which as the third-longest active streak in the league. For the season, Sugastey is second on the team with 31 RBIs and second with eight homers, which is a new career high.

TAKING THE JAIRO: Jairo Pomares hit his team-leading ninth homer of the season on Thursday night, a three-run blast in the sixth inning. It gave him the team lead in home runs (9) and RBIs (33) for the season. Pomares is now tied for 14th in franchise history with 21 career homers, including his team-leading 12 home runs in 2024.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?: Vaun Brown is batting .321 (9-for-28) over his last 10 games since June 27, raising his season average from .192 to .238. In that stretch, he has two doubles, six walks, three stolen bases and four runs scored. On Sunday afternoon in the finale in Bowie, he went 3-for-3 with a double and a walk, scoring twice.

**SAVING THE DAY:** Tyler Myrick recorded his sixth save of the season on Wednesday night in Akron. It was the 18th save of his Richmond career, moving him into seventh on the Flying Squirrels career saves list ahead of **Heath Hembree.** He is two saves behind **Cody Hall** for sixth on the all-time list.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked fifth in hits (79), sixth in OBP (.371) and tied for fifth in walks (45), **Turner Hill** is tied for second in triples (5). **Seth Lonsway** is tied for sixth in innings pitched (79.2), seventh in ERA (3.50) and 10th in strikeouts (74). **John Michael Bertrand** is first in innings pitched (90.2) and fifth in ERA (3.28). **Jack Choate** is ninth in strikeouts (77). **Joe Whitman** is eighth in strikeouts (78). **Tyler Myrick** is sixth in saves (6).

**TOP SKIPPER:** Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 233 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Diego Velasquez (No. 7), Joe Whitman (No. 8), Jack Choate (No. 24) and Sabin Ceballos (No. 29). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

# THIS DATE IN RICHMOND **BASEBALL HISTORY**

1954: The Richmond Virginians beat the Rochester Red Wings, 1-0, at Parker Field in 13 innings. Bob Habennicht pitched a complete game for the Vees, allowing nine hits, including only five after the fourth inning. Gary Blalock matched him, holding the Vees to six hits in the 12 innings before being replaced by a pinch-hitter. In the bottom of the 13th inning, Joe Lutz walked and Ken Wood attempted a sacrifice bunt, but the lead runner was thrown out at second. Eddie Kasko hit a ball to third and reached on a dropped throw to second, moving wood to third. Marty Tabacheck dropped a bunt down the third-base line, scoring Wood from third to win the game. **2012:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 12-3, on City Island. Richmond scored seven in the second inning. Juan Perez hit a two-run homer, Gary Brown added an RBI double and Tommy Joseph hit a grand slam in the frame. Daniel Mayora hit a three-run homer in the top of the ninth inning. Perez and Mayora each had three hits. Mike Kickham started on the mound and allowed one unearned run over 7.2 innings to pick up his seventh win of the season.
