INDY BITS

ABOUT LAST NIGHT, G1: Jack Suwinski's three-run homer in the first inning of Game 1 sparked a flurry of six unanswered runs in the first two frames as the Indianapolis Indians captured this week's series over the Louisville Bats with a 6-4 win in the doubleheader opener on Saturday night at Victory Field. After a walk by Endy Rodríguez and single by Nick Yorke in the bottom of the first inning in Game 1, Suwinski connected off major league rehabber Rhett Lowder to give the Indians a 3-0 advantage. Following back-to-back singles by Liover Peguero and Brett Sullivan, Matt Fraizer plated the fourth run of the frame with a sacrifice fly to score Peguero. The Indians tacked on two insurance runs in the second inning when Tsung-Che Cheng bunted for a hit and Rodríguez launched a two-run blast to put Indy up 6-0. Indianapolis staved off a comeback as the Bats scored three runs in the fourth inning and a fourth run in the fifth.

G2: In Game 2, the Bats went up 2-0 on an Edwin Rios first-inning homer before Indy scored eight unanswered runs to take command. Cheng put the Indians on the board in the second inning with a bases-loaded walk. Yorke followed with a two-run, go-ahead single for a 3-2 advantage and Peguero tacked on an RBI single to extend the lead, 4-2. Indianapolis posted another four runs in the following frame. Cheng kicked off the scoring again with a sacrifice fly and Suwinski later hit a bases-clearing double to extend the lead, 8-2.

HOMER COOKIN': The Indians improved to 16-6 at Victory Field this season and 9-2 in the current 12-game homestand, capturing 14 of their last 16 games at the venue. They have outscored opponents 103-85 at home this season for a +18 run differential. In their past 16 games at home since April 16, they are outscoring their opponents 82-52 in this span for a +30 run differential. Additionally, Indy earned their 12th comeback win of the season in Game 2 yesterday.

QUÉ LO QUE: Endy Rodríguez launched the first home run of his rehab assignment in the second inning of Game 1 yesterday. He tagged a 2-1 cutter from Alan Busenitz 415 feet into right field to put the Indians up 6-0. He went 1-for-2 with the home run, two RBI, one walk and two runs at DH. He began his rehab assignment on Wednesday after being placed on the 10-day injured list on April 15 with a right-hand laceration, sustained when struck by a pitch in the dirt on April 14 vs. Washington.

CAPTAIN JACK: Jack Suwinski fueled the Indians offense in yesterday's doubleheader, going 2-for-7 with one double, one home run and six RBI. He smacked his fourth home run of the season in the first inning of Game 1 off major league rehabber Rhett Lowder. The three-run blast was hit 424 feet – the fourth-furthest blast by an Indian this season – with Suwinski owning the latter two of those four. In 18 games since debuting on April 25, he leads the team with 17 RBI and leads active players (min. 2G) in SLG (.527), OPS (.874), and home runs (4). His 31 total bases in this span are tied with Nick Yorke for the team lead among active players.

HARRI STYLES: Thomas Harrington earned his second win of the season in Game 1, tossing a season-high 5.2 innings of four-run ball with five hits, two walks and a season-high eight strikeouts. It marked his most punchouts since sitting down 10 on July 20, 2024, with Double-A Altoona at Somerset. He has thrown 5.0-plus innings in three of his last four starts.

MIKE DROP: Mike Burrows continued his dominant May, earning his second win of the season in Game 2 over 5.0 innings with two runs (one earned), four hits, one walk and five strikeouts. In four games (three starts) this month, he is 2-0 with a 1.02 ERA (2er/17.2ip), 11 hits, four walks and 28 strikeouts. Those 28 strikeouts in the month are the second most among all minor league pitchers behind Binghamton's Jonah Tong (29k).

TWO MORE BUCCOS ABOARD: In addition to Endy Rodríguez, the Indians roster also boasts two additional major league rehabbers in Dauri Moreta and Nick Gonzales. Gonzales was placed on the 10-day injured list on March 28 with a non-displaced left ankle fracture sustained after hitting a two-run home run in the sixth inning of Opening Day at Miami. He excelled in 94 games with Pittsburgh last season, hitting .270 (97-for-359) with 19 doubles, three triples, seven home runs and 49 RBI. Moreta was placed on the 60-day injured list on Feb. 16 after undergoing Tommy John surgery and being sidelined for the entire 2024 season. Nearly 14 months after his last professional appearance, the right-hander began a rehab assignment with High-A Bradenton on April 29 and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in two games. He has since allowed two runs in 4.0 innings (four appearances) with Indy.

TODAY'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians conclude their 12-game homestand and six-game series against the Louisville Bats at 1:35 PM. A win would mark Indy's first sweep since taking all six from St. Paul at Victory Field from Aug. 13-18, 2024. Taking the mound for the Indians is right-hander Bubba Chandler (more below) opposite Bats right-hander Aaron Wilkerson. Wilkerson did not factor into the decision in Tuesday's series opener, allowing just one run across 5.0 innings. In three career starts against Indy, he is 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (2er/16.2ip), eight hits, four walks and 14 strikeouts.

BUBBA ON THE BUMP: Bubba Chandler, the April IL Pitcher of the Month, is set to make his ninth start of the season. In 15 career starts with Indianapolis, Chandler is 6-1 with an impressive 1.87 ERA (15er/72.1ip) and 103 strikeouts. He has struck out eight-plus batters in seven of those starts and six-plus in 10. Chandler is 1-0 in four career starts opposite Louisville, posting a 1.00 ERA (2er/18.0ip), 10 hits, seven walks and 27 strikeouts, including 5.0 shutout innings with eight strikeouts on Tuesday.

ON THIS DATE IN 2005: Starting pitcher Zach Duke took a one-hit shutout into the ninth inning at Pawtucket's McCoy Stadium until back-to-back doubles ended his day. Duke's final line was still impressive, as he yielded only one earned run on three hits and one walk with five strikeouts over 8.1 innings pitched in a 3-1 triumph. The victory was Duke's seventh of a team-leading 12 wins on the season, and his 3.32 ERA at the time would drop to a team-best 2.92 mark by the end of the season.

In 15 career starts with Indianapolis, Chandler is 6-1 with a 1.87 ERA (15er/72.1ip) and 103 strikeouts. He has struck out eight-plus batters in seven of those starts and six-plus in 10.</p> <p>Last Outing: Chandler tossed 5.0 shutout innings in Tuesday's series opener vs. Louisville, allowing four hits, three walks and two hit batters with eight strikeouts.</p> <p>Against the Bats: Chandler is 1-0 in four career starts opposite Louisville, posting a 1.00 ERA (2er/18.0ip), 10 hits, seven walks and 27 strikeouts.</p> <p>IL Pitcher of the Month: Chandler was named the 2025 International League April Pitcher of the Month after he led all minor league pitchers with at least 20.0 innings in fewest hits allowed (seven) and batting average against (.106, 7-for-66). He is the first Indianapolis Indians pitcher to win a league monthly award since Zach Duke in May 2005. He went 1-0 with a 1.33 ERA (3er/20.1ip), 27 strikeouts and a 0.64 WHIP across five starts in the month.
