# RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (26-30) Fresno Grizzlies (34-23)





RHP Alex Makarewich (0-1, 12.46 ERA) vs. RHP Bryan Perez (2-2, 4.89 ERA)

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** The Quakes continue a crucial six-game road trip today, with the second game of a six-game set against the Fresno Grizzlies (COL) at Chukchansi Park in Fresno. After this six-game set, the Quakes will return to LoanMart Field for the final three games of the first half, as part of a six-game series against the Inland Empire 66ers on Tuesday, June 18. Tickets are available at rcquakes.com.

VS THE GRIZZLIES: Today's game is the second of 12 against the Grizzlies in 2024 and the second of six at Chukchansi Park in Fresno. Last season, the Quakes went 5-7 against the Grizzlies, just 1-5 here in Fresno. The Quakes have won just four of 19 games in Fresno since the Grizzlies joined the Cal League in 2021.

**LAST GAME:** The Grizzlies took the lead for good in the sixth inning, as they rallied from a run down to defeat the Quakes by a final of 7-3 in Tuesday's series opener at Chukchansi Park, winning their fourth straight overall. Luis Mendez cracked his first homer of the year, a go-ahead two-run shot down the right-field line off reliever Carson Hobbs (0-1), as Fresno took a 5-3 lead. They added two more in the seventh against Christian Ruebeck, rounding out the scoring at 7-3. Grizzlies' reliever Welinton Herrera (7-2) tossed 2.1 innings of scoreless relief for the win. Rancho's Logan Wagner singled, homered (3) and walked twice in the loss. Rancho had just six hits on the night.

**ROSTER MOVE:** Left-hander Garrett McDaniels was placed on the Injured List on Tuesday. Taking his spot on the roster is right-handed reliever Pedro Santillan, who joins the club from the Arizona Complex League.

**SERIES WINS AND LOSSES:** Sunday's win gives the Quakes a split of the six-game set and keeps them from their third straight series loss overall, after suffering losses in five of six to Modesto followed by six straight at Lake Elsinore. The Quakes only lost one other six-game series prior to this tough stretch that has seen Rancho drop 16 of their last 20 games overall. The last series win for the Quakes was in Visalia, back in early-May, when they took four of six.

**APRIL 12:** On April 12, the Quakes started the day in second place in the South Division. With a win that night over Stockton, the Quakes moved into first and remained there until their May 31st game against the Storm went final. After making up a game last week, the Quakes entered this series against Fresno two games out, and are still two games out with eight to play after both the Quakes and Storm lost on Tuesday. Rancho's last eight games of the first half will be on the road at Fresno (5), then finishing at home with Inland Empire (3). The Storm are at home against Stockton (5) and then at Visalia (3) to end the half.

**UP NORTH:** With their fourth straight win last night, the Grizzlies pulled to within 3.5 games of first-place Modesto. who fell in Visalia on Tuesday night. Fresno will finish this series with Rancho and then continue their home stand with three against Stockton to finish the half. Modesto is in Visalia, before heading home to face San Jose for three. ALEX MAKAREWICH: Right-hander Alex Makarewich makes his third start overall, and first against Fresno after being added to the roster two weeks ago from the Arizona Complex League. In his last outing, he suffered the loss at LoanMart Field, after being charged with five runs on five hits over 2.1 innings against Visalia on June 5. In three games this year in the ACL, he went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA, allowing four earned runs on five hits over five innings. Makarewich was drafted by the Dodgers in the 13th round of the 2023 draft out of Northwestern State in Louisiana. BRYAN PEREZ: Right-hander Bryan Perez makes his tenth start of the year, his first against Rancho. In his last outing overall, he allowed three runs (two earned) on four hits with five walks over 3.2 innings in a loss at Modesto on June 5. Perez was signed by the Rockies in 2021 out of the Dominican Republic.
