TODAY'S GAMES: Sugar Land finishes off what has turned into a five-game series against the Express on Sunday afternoon. By virtue of winning three of the first four games, Round Rock has secured a series victory over the Space Cowboys.

ABOUT SATURDAY NIGHT: The Space Cowboys were held to just two hits in a 4-0 loss in game one of their doubleheader against Round Rock. In game two, Sam Huff hit a two-run homer in the first inning to give the Express a 2-0 lead. Sugar Land responded with two of their own in the bottom of the first on an RBI single by Bligh Madris and an RBI knock by Corey Lee. Elier Hernandez broke the tie in the seventh with a solo home run to center.

HOST WITH THE MOST: On 3/27, the Space Cowboys hosted the Houston Astros in an exhibition game at Constellation Field. Over 7,700 fans attend the game, the largest crowd since Sugar Land became the Astros' Triple-A affiliate in 2021. Houston topped the Space Cowboys 3-1 and then defeated Sugar Land 5-1 on Tuesday night in an exhibition game at Minute Maid Park.

ROSTER MOVES: LHP Parker Mushinski was sent to Sugar Land on Saturday to begin a Major League Rehab assignment. Mushinski pitched in Game 1 of the doubleheader on Saturday and had two runners he left on base score after he departed following 0.2 innings.

ON THE MEND: After being assigned to the Space Cowboys on Major League rehab, LHP Blake Taylor has appeared in three games for Sugar Land. Across 2.1 innings, he's allowed two hits and struck out two without allowing a run.

HOME GROWN TALENT: Sugar Land's roster has 11 players drafted by the Astros, four international signings and two players signed as non-drafted free agents in the five-round 2020 MLB Draft.

PROSPECTING: The Space Cowboys boast seven of the Astros Top 30 Prospects according to MLB Pipeline. They include C Corey Lee (#7), OF Pedro León, OF Justin Dirden (#9), RHP Misael Tamarez (#13), INF Joe Perez (#16), RHP Forrest Whitley (#21), RHP Shawn Dubin (#25).

MUST BE THE MURRAY: In his debut with the Space Cowboys on 4/1, RHP Jayden Murray threw 5.0 innings and allowed just one run on five hits. Murray started his night by retiring the first seven batter he saw and faced the minimum through the first three innings. He picked up his first Triple-A win in a 7-3 Space Cowboys victory.

MATIJEVIC MASHING: JJ Matijevic homered twice for the Space Cowboys in their 4/5 contest against Round Rock, part of a four-hit day with 11 total bases for Matijevic. His first home run came in the first inning on Wednesday morning before the game was suspended, and his next homer came on Thursday evening in the third when the game was resumed. It was the ninth multi-homer game of Matijevic's career.

GOT 'EM: C Corey Lee threw out Elier Hernandez in the sixth inning of Game 1 on Saturday night, Lee's third caught stealing of the year in five total attempts. In 2022 with Sugar Land, Lee was tied for fifth in the Pacific Coast League in caught stealing, throwing out 17 of 62 attempted base stealers (27.4%)

GRAE ALL DAY: Grae Kessinger continues to get on base at a great clip for the Space Cowboys, reaching in six of his first seven games with Sugar Land. The former second round pick out of Ole Miss started the year with a five game hitting streak before going 0-for-3 in Game One of the Space Cowboys doubleheader on Saturday.

FORREST RANGER: RHP Forrest Whitley made his debut for the Space Cowboys on Thursday evening out of the bullpen, spinning 4.0 innings and allowing just one run. Whitley started his evening by retiring the first 10 batters that he faced.

PEREZ POWER: Joe Perez launched his first home run of 2023 on 4/1 @ El Paso, a 424 foot three-run blast to center. The 2nd round pick in 2017 has now hit two home runs at the Triple-A level, resulting in seven RBI, after Perez hit a grand slam on 9/25/22 vs. Albuquerque. Dating back to his time in Double-A Corpus, each of Perez' last four home runs have been multi-run homers, with his last solo blast coming on 8/30/22 @ SA.

ONE TO FORGET: Sugar Land allowed nine runs in the bottom of the eighth inning on Opening Night as El Paso sent 12 men to the plate.

BIG HIT WANTED: Through their first seven games, the Space Cowboys are hitting .224 (19-85) with runners in scoring position. That's the second lowest mark in the Pacific Coast League, with only Round Rock (.200) registering a lower average with RISP.

RUNS LIKE A DEER-DEN: OF Justin Dirden made a strong case to claim a spot on the Astros' Opening Day roster after an impressive Spring Training, hitting .324 with 4 doubles, 2 home runs, 4 RBI and 9 runs scored in 19 games... In just 32 games with the Space Cowboys in 2022, Dirden registered 28 RBI and delivered 12 extra-base hits... The former SEMO Redhawk was named a Texas League Postseason All-Star and Astros MLB Postseason All-Star after leading the Astros' organization in RBI (101) across two levels.

SUGAR LAND TO THE SHOW: The Astros Opening Day roster featured 10 players that spent time in Sugar Land in 2021 and 2022, including reigning ALCS and World Series MVP Jeremy Peña, RHP Bryan Abreu, RHP Ronel Blanco, RHP Hunter Brown, RHP Seth Martinez, C Yainer Diaz, C Cesar Salazar, INF David Hensley, OF Corey Julks and OF Jake Meyers.

SOME PEOPLE CALL THEM: Opening Day of 2022 was the first-ever game for the Astros' Triple-A affiliate under the Sugar Land Space Cowboys brand. The Astros re-branded their Triple A affiliate on Jan. 29, 2022, following the purchase of the Sugar Land franchise in 2021. Sugar Land had played under the "Skeeters" brand for the first 10 years of its existence. They spent 2012-20 as members of the independent Atlantic League and rose to the Triple A level for the 2021 season.

WHERE TO FIND US: Once again in 2023, all 150 Space Cowboys games can be heard on ESPN 92.5 FM (Gow Media). An audio streaming link is also available at slspacecowboys.com. All Space Cowboys games can be seen on MiLB.TV. Garrett Greene begins his first year as the 'Voice of the Space Cowboys' and will be on the call for all game, home and away. He'll be joined by longtime Houston area broadcaster Gerald Sanchez for home games.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey returns for his fourth season as the manager of the Astros' Triple-A affiliate and his third with Sugar Land. Storey joined the Astros organization as a coach in 2016 and has managed with Single-A Quad Cities (2018) and Triple-A Round Rock (2019), along with two seasons in Sugar Land. Storey appeared in nine seasons at the professional level as a right-handed pitcher, including stints at the Major League level with the Astros (2012) and Blue Jay (2013). He appeared in four collegiate seasons at Florida Atlantic and was selected by the Oakland Athletics in the 31st round of the 2008 MLB Draft.

THAT FRAME WAS ON FIRE: The Space Cowboys set a franchise record by scoring 17 runs in the sixth inning of the second game on August 19, 2022 against the Oklahoma City Dodgers. It was the most runs scored in an inning in Space Cowboys history and the 21 runs scored in the contest are the third highest in franchise history, trailing only a 24-run effort on June 10, 2021, in El Paso & 23 runs on August 23, 2022 in Las Vegas. Here are more details regarding the historic inning:

- Per Minor League Baseball, the 17 runs scored were the most scored in a single inning since they officially archived stats with Stat Search since 2005. The only other Minor League Baseball team to score more runs in an inning were the Dominican Summer League Yankees, who did so on two occasions (7/27/2017, 7/19/2019)
- The inning featured 108 total pitches and lasted 58 minutes. Korey Lee, Alex De Goti, Scott Manea, David Hensley and Yainer Diaz each made five plate appearances in the inning.
- Yainer Diaz experienced all three "True Outcomes" in the inning, homering, walking and striking out through his three plate appearances.
- Per MLB.com, the Minor League Baseball record for runs scored in an inning is 18, set by the Waco Cubs vs. the Beaumont Exporters in 1930.
- The Space Cowboys collected a franchise record 10 hits in the inning, while also drawing a franchise record nine walks in the single frame. A total of 23 players came to bat in the inning, with eight of the nine players in the lineup reaching twice in the inning.

TO INFINITY AND BEYOND: Key elements of the Space Cowboys brand include the Mission Patch, Horizon Gradient and Primary Space Cowboys Logo.

- **Primary Logo:** The primary logo features the Space Cowboy donning a traditional cowboy hat, a bandanna and a blast shield over his face that is peppered with space dust and has a starburst at the eye.
- **Horizon Gradient:** Inspired by a shot of the horizon of the earth from space, the color palette and gradient feature light blue, navy, orange, gray and black notes that are prominent in the franchise's logo and uniforms. The colors represent the ever-expanding Sugar Land community and an exciting new chapter on the horizon.
- **Mission Patch:** This patch will be featured on all three uniforms and serves as an alternate logo. It intertwines elements from the Texas state flag, with a rocket superimposed over the front ready to launch.

READY TO RIDE: The Space Cowboys brand pays respect to elements that are key to the identity of Greater Houston. The NASA Johnson Space Center is located in Houston and the Cowboys element is a nod to the rugged, Western roots that are embedded in Houston as Texas' largest city.

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through its first nine seasons, Sugar Land played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in '16 and '18 and appeared in the postseason in five of nine seasons. Sugar Land still holds Atlantic League single-season records for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from its '13 season. Sugar Land was managed by former Major Leaguers Gary Gaetti (2012-17) and Pete Incaviglia (2018-20). As an independent team, Sugar Land went 601-502. Notable people to appear for Sugar Land include: LHP Scott Kazmir, RHP Roger Clemens, IF Rafael Palmeiro, Tracy McGrady, IF James Loney, C Derek Norris, OF Willy Taveras and RHP Felipe Paulino.

REST OF THE CREW: Joining manager Mickey Storey on the Space Cowboys coaching staff are pitching coach Erick Abreu, hitting coach Aaron Westlake and development coach Wladimir Sutil. Abreu returns for his third season in Sugar Land as the pitching coach for the Astros' Triple-A affiliate. He's previously worked as the pitching coach for Astros affiliates at the Single A, Short-Season, Appalachian League, Gulf Coast League and Dominican Summer League levels, joining the organization as a coach in 2014. Westlake spent 2022 as the hitting coach in Double-A Corpus Christi and worked as a development coach for the Florida Gulf Coast League Astros in 2021. Sutil enters his second season on the Space Cowboys staff after serving as the manager for the Astros' Florida Complex League team in 2021. He's worked as a manager for Astros affiliates at the Short-Season and Gulf Coast League levels, joining the organization as a coach in 2014.

CATCHING PROSPECTING EYES: Dubin is currently ranked as the #9 prospect in the Astros system according to MLB Pipeline and rated as the #25 prospect in Houston's system by Baseball America.

HONORS: Named the Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for September 5 through 11 in 2022... Was recognized as the Carlina League Pitcher of the Week on September 2, 2019 and also recognized as the Midwest League Pitcher of the Week on April 21, 2019.

RANKKKKKINGS: Led Triple-A in 2022 with a 12.34 strikeouts per 9.0 ratio, the best among pitchers that threw at least 55.0 innings.

IN FAMILIAR TERRITORY: In 2022, appeared in 23 games, 12 starts, with the Space Cowboys, going 3-5, 4.78 ERA in 58.1 IP.

TAXI!: Was on the taxi squad and traveled with the Astros during the 2020 postseason in which the Astros reached the ALCS.

GETTING ON THE ROSTER: On November 19, 2021, Dubin was added to the Astros 40-man roster.

TO THE STROS: Selected in the 13th round of the 2018 draft by the Astros out of Georgetown (KY).

LONG AND WINDING ROAD: Started collegiate career at Jamestown Community College in the fall of 2013 as a backup shortstop... Took a year-long break from baseball in 2014... Returned to baseball in 2015 at Erie Community College... Transferred to D-1 University of Buffalo for 2016 and 2017... After Buffalo's baseball program dissolved, transferred to Georgetown College in 2018... Set the school record with 128 strikeouts while going 9-1 with a 2.09 ERA... Was named a NAIA First Team All-American, third player in Georgetown College history to earn the honor.

NEW TO THIS: Garcia is making just the 17th start of his professional career in his 243rd overall appearance... Garcia had made 126 appearances in the Minors and 72 appearances in the Major Leagues before making his first career start on 7/10/22 @ Omaha.

AGAINST ROUND ROCK: After spending his entire career in the Tigers' organization, Garcia is facing the Express for the first time

IN SPRING: Made 5 appearances for the Astros, one start... Went 1-0, 1.64 ERA... In 11.0 IP, allowed two runs on six hits with five walks and eight strikeouts... Made his only start of Spring Training on 3/15 @ Atlanta, earned the win while throwing 3.0 shutout innings.

Final outing on 3/21 vs. MIA, when Garcia threw 4.0 innings of relief and allowed one run on four hits with two walks and three strikeouts.

WELCOME TO HOUSTON: Garcia signed with the Astros as a free agent on 2/7/23... Elected free agency from the Tigers on 11/11/22.

DON'T I KNOW YOU?: In 2021 with the Tigers, Garcia earned a save on April 14 at Minute Maid Park. The right-hander entered the game in the ninth inning with the bases loaded, no one out and the tying run at first. The rigthy allowed just one runner to score as he secured the save, the first Tigers' pitcher to inherit three base runners and earn a save in the same game since Francisco Rodriguez in April of 2017.

ROOKIE IMPRESSIONS: After debuting in 2019 with Detroit, Garcia spent all of 2020 with the Tigers, making 26 appearances. He recorded four saves and did allow an inherited runner to score, the first Tigers rookie to recorded more than two saves in a season since 2003. He earned his first Major League save on 9/6/20 @ Minnesota.

MISSED TIME: Did not pitch in the 2018 and didn't debut until May of 2019 while recovering from right elbow surgery.

NO RUNS FOR YOU: Pitched across four levels in 2017 and put together a 24.2 scoreless innings streak from April 29 through July 2... During that stretch, went 2-0 with 8 saves and 41 strikeouts

ROCK YOU LIKE A HURRICANE: Drafted in the 6th round of the 2016 draft by the Detroit Tigers out of the University of Miami. While at Miami, converted 43 saves, the most in school history and tied for the most in ACC history. In 2016, was named the NCBWA Stopper of the Year after going 2-0 with 18 saves and a 1.89 ERA in 35 appearances.
