TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque claimed a series victory last night with a 3-1 triumph, the club's second-straight series win ... They look to win five of six in a set for the first time since Aug. 22-27, 2023 at Oklahoma City ... Peyton Battenfield and Christian Romero are the scheduled starters.

SERIES WINS: Albuquerque has won back-to-back series for the fourth time since Minor League baseball switched to a six-game format prior to the 2021 season (also: July 1-13, 2021 vs. El Paso, at Round Rock; June 28-July 9, 2023 vs. El Paso, at Oklahoma City; Aug. 15-27, 2023 vs. El Paso, at Oklahoma City).

ON THE ROAD: This marks the 13th time Albuquerque has won a minimum of four games in a road series. Eight of the occurrences involved the Isotopes sweeping a four-game set before the series format was altered.

BRICKTOWN: Dating back to July 5, 2023, the Isotopes have won 14 of their last 22 games in Oklahoma City. Have clinched a series victory in three of their last four trips to the Sooner State. Prior to last season, Albuquerque had only accomplished the feat three times at Bricktown Ballpark since 2009 (14 total sets).

ONE RUN: The Isotopes pitching staff limited their opponent to one run for the first time since Sept. 24, 2023, when they earned a 2-1 victory over Oklahoma City in the season finale. Albuquerque has yet to throw a shutout in 2024.

WINNING STREAK: The Isotopes look to win their fourth-straight for first time since winning seven-straight from Aug. 19-26, 2023.

DUBS: Albuquerque has won six of its last seven contests and eight of 10, the most wins in a 10 game stretch all season.

DINGERS: Albuquerque has belted a homer in 10-straight contests, a team-high for 2024 (previous: eight, May 7-15 ... During current stretch they've hit 20 homers).

BY WAY OF THE K: Albuquerque batters tied their season-worst with 16 strikeouts last night (also: April 6 at Oklahoma City, June 8 at Sacramento). Ryan Wroblewski fanned 11 hitters in his Triple-A debut, the most for an opposing starter since Jimmy Endsby on Sept. 2, 2022 at Sugar Land (11).

VS. OKLAHOMA CITY: All eight of Albuquerque's wins over Oklahoma City in 2024 have been decided by three runs or fewer.

FOUR OR FEWER: The Isotopes have won two-straight games scoring four runs or fewer after not having done so in the first 73 contests of the season.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk is 16-for-45 with four doubles, a triple, two homers and 10 RBI over his last 11 contests, with five multi-hit performances during the stretch. ... His 24 doubles are 4th-most in all of MiLB.

TG: Tanner Gordon delivered the seventh quality start of the season for Albuquerque last night, including his second-straight. It marks the sixth time in Gordon's professional career he has delivered a minimum of two quality starts in a row (last: June 18-24, 2023 with Double-A Mississippi).

MR. JONES: Greg Jones homered in his second-straight game yesterday, as he launched a pinch-hit clout Monday night against the Dodgers for his first Major League hit, prior to being optioned.

VANDY: Connor Kaiser went 2-for-4 with a double last night, and has recorded an extra-base hit in consecutive games for the second time in 2024 (also: May 7-9 at El Paso).

HIS NAME IS DREW: Drew Romo went deep last night for the first time since June 1 vs. Oklahoma City, a span of 44 at-bats. He has eight long balls this season, three against left-handed pitchers (two against Tyler Thomas in Salt Lake).

JC: Julio Carreras finished 0-for-4 yesterday, ending his season-best 11-game on base streak. Slashed .325/.364/.400 during the stretch that began June 4 at Sacramento. ... Swiped his 20th bag of the season Wednesday, establishing a new career high.

STOVIE: Hunter Stovall extended his hit streak to seven games. During stretch, he is 11-for-28 with four doubles, two homers and six RBI ... The third-longest active streak in the PCL.

CURTISS LOEW: John Curtiss has recorded three saves in his last five outings, after not registering any since Sept. 25, 2020 as a member of the American League champion Tampa Bay Rays.

SAVES: Albuquerque has recorded a save in three-straight contests for the first time since Sept. 12-14, 2023, at El Paso.

PCL LEADERBOARD: **Drew Romo** is 10th in average (.300) ... **Aaron Schunk** is 2nd in doubles (24) and T-6th in XBH (33) ... **Coco Montes** is 1st in average (.335), 2nd in hits (85), 3rd in OPS (.965), T-3rd in triples (6), 4th in OBP (.414), 5th in slugging (.551), T-7th in total bases (140), T-9th in XBH (31) and T-10th in RBI (47) ... **Julio Carreras** is 6th in SB (20).

TEAM STATS: Offensively in MiLB, the club is 1st in triples (35), slugging (.478) and total bases (1,245), 2nd in hits (720), average (.277), and OPS (.835) and 6th in runs (434).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
