COUNT ON COWLES: Ben Cowles hit his first Double-A home run in the ninth inning of Wednesday's loss. The homer marked Cowles' Eastern League leading 11th extra-base hit of the season. Cowles also now leads the Eastern League with 36 TB and .451 OBP. He also ranks among the leaders with a .356 AVG (3rd), .610 SLG (4th) and 1.061 OPS (3rd). Having played in all 17 games for the Patriots prior to yesterday, Cowles has hit safely in 14 and reached base in 16.

WEEKEND WARRIORS: The Patriots have had two road trips this season. In both road trips, they've lost the first three games of their series, Tuesday through Thursday in New Hampshire and Reading. Somerset is now 1-8 in the first three games of their two six-game series this season. In their three weekends this season (Friday through Sunday), the Patriots are 6-3.

WHERE ARE THE PATRIOTS? Over their last two games, the Somerset Patriots have scored three runs and are 0-for-20 with RISP, with 2 CS and 3 GIDP, in addition to having 25 runners left on base. In spite of this, Somerset still leads the league in home runs with 22 and is tied for third in the league in runs with 86.

TOP OF THE HEAP: Spencer Jones (3-for-5, 2 RBI, R, HR, K) smashed his second home run of the season in the fourth inning of Tuesday's game to give the Patriots a 3-1 lead. The homer signaled Jones' second straight game with a home run, marking the second time in his career that Jones has homered in back-to-back games (July 18-19, 2023 with High-A Hudson Valley). Jones put together his third straight multi-hit game and his second straight three-hit game. It's the third time in Jones' career that he has eclipsed three hits in back-to-back games and the first time since May 13-14, 2023 with High-A Hudson Valley. Over his last three games, Jones is now 8-for-13 (.615 AVG) with 3 RBI, 5 R, 2 HR and 3 SB.

AGUST IN APRIL: Agustin Ramirez enters today leading all Double-A batters with 7 home runs, which all came in his first nine games. Ramirez also ranks among the Eastern League leaders with 15 RBI (T-3rd), 11 BB (T-3rd) and a .557 SLG (7th).

HE WENT TO JARED: Outfielder Jared Wegner enters today on an Eastern-League best nine-game active hitting streak. During the streak, which began with Wegner hitting his first two Double-A home runs on back-to-back days 4/12-13, he is 10-for-33 (.303 AVG) with 7 RBI and 6 R. Only Marcelo Mayer of Portland (10) has had a longer hitting streak this season.

The Reading Fightin' Phils enter their fourth series of the season seeking their first series win. After losing their first two series of the season (Bowie, Portland), Reading split its most recent six-game set in Binghamton. Reading's roster features six of the Phillies' top-30 prospects, led by No. 10 prospect Gabriel Rincones Jr., as well as Carlos De La Cruz (No. 13), Christian McGowan (No. 16), Caleb Ricketts (No. 21), Robert Moore (No. 26) and Jose Rodriguez (No. 28). Infielder Carson Taylor, who was selected by the Phillies from the Dodgers in the minor league phase of the Rule-5 Draft, leads the team with 4 HR and 14 RBI, while Rincones leads the team with a .571 SLG, .971 OPS and 10 R. Three starts into his season, Phillies 15th round pick (2021) RHP Matt Osterberg leads the team with a 1.98 ERA (3 ER in 13.2 IP). Current Patriots pitching coach Brett DeGagne was Osterberg's pitching coach at St. Cloud State University during his freshman year in 2018.

2024 SOMERSET PATRIOTS COACHING STAFF

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (2nd year)

Raul Dominguez enters his second consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 10th overall as a manager and 18th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2023, Dominguez became the third manager in Somerset Patriots Double-A franchise history and in 2024 he will become the first to serve as manager for more than one season. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015.

KEVIN MARTIR: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Kevin Martir begins his first season in Somerset and fourth in the Yankees organization, after serving in the same position for High-A Hudson Valley in 2023 and Single-A Tampa for two seasons in 2021-22. He joined the Yankees organization in 2020 and had been scheduled to serve as hitting coach for former Rookie-Advanced level Pulaski, prior to the cancellation of the minor league season. Martir began his coaching career in 2019 as a development coach for the GCL Phillies East. Martir starred at catcher during his playing career at the University of Maryland (2013-15), where he was a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award in 2015. Martir was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He played two professional seasons for the Astros with Rookie-Advanced Greeneville in 2015 and Short-Season Class-A Tri-City in 2016. A native of Brooklyn, New York, Martir graduated from the Grand Street Campus in 2012, after transferring from Xaverian High School in Brooklyn prior to his senior year.

BRETT DeGAGNE: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Brett DeGagne begins his first season with Somerset and fourth year in the Yankees organization. After making his organizational coaching debut as the Single-A Tampa Tarpons' pitching coach in 2021, DeGagne most recently served as the FCL Yankees pitching coach in 2022 and 2023. In 2023, his staff led the Florida Complex League in strikeouts (587) and finished fourth in ERA (4.47). DeGagne was initially tabbed to be the DSL Yankees pitching coach in 2020, before the cancellation of the minor league season. DeGagne played college ball at the University of North Dakota from 2012-2016. He moved on to grad school at St. Cloud State University, where DeGagne also began his baseball coaching career. He served as the Huskies' pitching coach during the 2017-2018 seasons. He gained additional coaching experience in 2018 as the pitching coach for the Bismarck Larks of the Northwoods League. One year prior to joining the Yankees, in 2019 DeGagne took over as pitching coach for North lowa Area Community College.

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (3rd year)

Aaron Bossi returns for his third consecutive season as the Patriots' defensive coach. Under Bossi's leadership in each of the past two seasons, infielders Jesus Bastidas (2B, 2022) and T.J. Rumfield (1B, 2023) were each awarded Rawlings Minor League Gold Gloves for their work in the field. Bossi has also overseen Somerset's baserunning program each of the last two seasons, leading the team to an Eastern League-best 205 stolen bases in 2022 and a Double-A-best 256 stolen bases in 2023. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021. Prior to his coaching experience with the Yankees, he spent 2017-2019 assisting rehabbing players at the organization's minor league complex in Tampa. The St. Louis, Missouri native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

2023: Spent the entire 2023 season with Double-A Somerset, pitching to season-long career-highs in GS (23), IP (127.0) and K (126). During back-to-back starts on 6/8 @HFD and 6/14 vs. ALT, Abeyta set and matched his now career-high of 6.2 IP. On 6/8, he struck out a career-high 11 batters @ HFD. He started Game 1 of the 2023 Eastern League Division Series for Somerset in Binghamton.

2022: Spent all of 2022 with High-A Hudson Valley, tying for second on the team with 20 GS, ranking third on the team with 104.2 IP and fourth on the team with 88 K. Over his final 12 games of the season (nine starts) dating back to 6/28, he went 5-2 with a 2.93 ERA (58.1 IP, 53 H, 44 K, 30 BB).

2021: Split his professional debut season between Single-A Tampa and the FCL Yankees, combining to go 5-3 with a 5.37 ERA (55.1 IP, 43 H, 71 K, 35 BB, 4 HR) in 17 games (10 starts)... Was named the Low-A Southeast League Pitcher of the Week on 9/5/21, after tossing six scoreless innings in his start on 9/3 at Bradenton (W, 6.0 IP, H, BB, 9 K). Across three starts from 8/20 - 9/3, Abeyta went 2-0 with a 0.57 ERA (15.2 IP, 4 H, 20 K, 6 BB, 0 HR). Following the season, he played for Surprise in the Arizona Fall League and went 1-1 with a 10.13 ERA (10.2 IP, 12 ER) in eight appearances.

College: Coming out of high school as a catcher, Abeyta transitioned to pitching upon beginning his college career at Modesto Junior College (CA) in 2018. Working as the team's closer during his freshman season, he went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA and five saves over 16 appearances (16.2 IP, 15 H, 22 K, 14 BB). During his second season as a pitcher, he went 5-4 over 17 games (10 GS) with one save and a 4.55 ERA (65.1 IP, 70 H, 60 K, 27 BB). Following two seasons at Modesto, Abeyta transferred to the University of Nevada in 2020, leading the Wolfpack with two saves, closing out both of the team's wins in the COVID-19 shortened season.

Personal Notes: Lettered in both baseball and basketball at Ceres High School (CA) and was named an All-League performer at catcher and was Team MVP, batting .354.

Career Notes: Signed with the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on June 20, 2020, following the COVID-19 shortened college season and MLB Draft.
