Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Logan Allen** to the mound tonight, looking for his second consecutive victory (first at Huntington Park since 2019 IL Playoffs). Omaha will counter with RHP **Eddie Butler**. The Clippers are 29-34 (.460) against right handers this year. Butler has pitched against the Clippers three times in his career, all in May of this season (4.0IP, 1H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 2K).

vs. the Storm Chasers

After a series opening shutout on 5/11, the Clippers dropped four of the next five against Omaha in the season's first matchup (avoided 5G losing streak thanks to a 7-run 8th on 5/14, turning 7-3 deficit into 10-7 win, capped by **Ryan Lavarney**'s go-ahead, grand slam). Columbus returns just 1HR (**Gabriel Arias**) and 5RBI (Arias has four, **Nolan Jones** has one) from that first series.

Look Out

The Clippers are coming off back to back shutouts for the second time this year (all other IL staffs have three instances of consecutive shutouts combined). However, after blanking Indianapolis from 7/6-7/7, the Clippers allowed 62 runs in the next 6G and 147 runs in the 19G between shutout streaks (7.7 per game). Additionally, the Clippers allowed 10.5 hits per game between shutout streaks.

Almost

Richie Palacios went 3x7 in his first 2G since leaving the Eastern League as its 5th most productive hitter (.299). Palacios narrowly missed out on becoming the third straight RubberDuck promoted while hitting over .300 (**Oscar Gonzalez** was hitting .330 and **Alex Call** was at .310). The other Akron starter sent to Columbus this year, **Trenton Brooks**, was hitting only .268, but had a .438OBP.

Three Left Turns

Gabriel Arias has scored in only eight of his last 23G, totaling nine runs (only multi-run game came on 7/14 at St. Paul, 16G since), following a streak of 22 runs in 15 of 18G (6/12-7/4). Still, beginning with a 3-run game on 6/12 at Iowa, Arias has scored 31 runs in his last 41G, 2nd in the IL in that time (hitting .338, 53x157, since 6/12). On the season, Arias is tied for 7th in the IL in runs (44).

Double Drought

Nolan Jones ended his double drought at 13G Thursday (tied for longest of the year, 5/6-5/22; leads IL with 21 doubles). Since reaching a season high of .241 on 7/4, Jones is hitting just .169 (13x77) in 23G (two doubles). While his batting average has fallen 22 points in those 23G, his slugging has fallen by just 13 (.431 to .418) thanks to 5HR (hit .321 with .617SLG in 24G from 6/8-7/4).

Still Reaching

Despite the recent struggles swinging the bat, **Nolan Jones** has still managed to reach base in 17 straight (.338OBP since 7/13, has seven hitless games), good for the team long this year. **Gabriel Arias** extended his on base streak to 13G on Sunday (.446OBP since 7/18), while watching his team high 9G hit streak snapped on Thursday (.417, 15x36 from 7/18-7/28; .404, 21x52 in last 13G).

Mr. Consistent

After hitting .316 (24x76) in June, **Connor Marabell**'s average sat at .264 heading into July. Throughout July his average fluctuated between .257-.267 (between .262-.267 since 7/9). He has hit safely in each of his last 11 starts (12x43, last multi-hit game came on 7/9 vs. Indianapolis, two doubles) and all of his 3RBI since 7/3 have come on 2HR (only 3RBI of previous 22 via HR, 3-run shot 6/12 at Iowa).

D-Fence

The Clipper defense is in the midst of its best effort of the season, committing just a single error in the last 9G (**Nolan Jones**, 7/28 at Nashville, snapped personal streak of 26 errorless games). Columbus had made 22E in 26G prior to the current run, dropping to 11th in the IL in fielding, but they now place 6th. The current streak of four errorless games is one off the season high (5/11-5/15 vs. Omaha).

Group Effort

The bullpen provided 6.0IP of scoreless work completing Saturday's suspended game (added 2.0IP in the regularly scheduled game), marking the 11th game this season with at least 5.0IP and 0ER (only 6G in all of 2019; no other IL team has more than 6G this year). Despite that success, the bullpen ranks 13th in the IL with a 4.88ERA (14G with at least 5ER; 2nd most in the IL, trailing Charlotte's 20G).

This Date in Clipper History

8/3/1996

The Clippers pounded out 18 hits in an 11-0 victory over Richmond. **Brian Boehringer** dominated on the mound, scattering 4 hits in 8.0 innings to get his 10th win of the season. Boehringer led the Governors' Cup Champion Clippers in wins (11), ERA (4.00), innings (153.0) and strikeouts (132) in 1996, but missed the IL playoffs due to his promotion to New York, helping the Yankees win their 23rd World Series.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (983 to 943).

Homers, Homers and More Homers

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.28 per game, putting them three off of the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). On the mound they are allowing 1.47 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 33, even with the shortened season.

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 14-42 (.250) in games in which they trail, ranking 11th.

Not Close

The Clippers have suffered the most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (25; six in 10G from 7/8-7/19) and rank tied for last in wins by at least that many (11, Norfolk). That poor ratio has led to a -83 run differential (had a -50 differential over 10G from 7/8-7/19), a figure that places them 12th in the IL (Charlotte, -84; Norfolk, -89).

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; current 4G losing streak in extra-innings following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.49 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.84ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Under Control

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is not threatening for a fourth, as they are currently 75K off the lead. To begin the season, they were averaging as many as 10 per game through the first 38G, but that has cooled considerably in recent weeks (8.17K per game since 7/6). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G).

Night and Day

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is over 100 points higher (.500, 20-20) than when they make a mistake in the field (.389, 14-22). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 90 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .982.

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 51% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 22 times (on pace for 37HR).

Good Baseball

Andres Gimenez advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 7/25 vs. Iowa and the runner came around to score in the win (4-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

No Difference

Through the first half of the season, in which the IL played with 18-inch bases (shortening the distance between bases by a whopping 4.5 inches), the Clippers saw a combined average of 1.71 stolen base attempts in their games (averaged 1.73 attempts per game over five seasons from 2015-19). However, since going back to normal bases, steal attempts are down to 1.44 per game.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 64-88 (.421), 34-42 with Columbus (.447).

Dubious Distinction:

Coming into tonight's start, Allen has the worst regular season ERA in franchise history (8.53, was 10.42 prior to 7/16 start) among all pitchers with at least 50.0IP (**Nerio Rodriguez** had an 8.36ERA over 51.2IP in 2004). However, Allen was great in the 2019 IL Playoffs, winning both his starts with a 2.38ERA (11.1IP, 3ER; including playoffs, 7.51ERA in a Columbus uniform).

Flirting With Disaster:

Over his last 3GS, Allen has a 3.06ERA (14.2IP, 5ER), but has allowed more baserunners than he has IP in each (15H, 7BB, 1HB). He stranded eight runners in his last start, 7/28 at Nashville, on the way to a scoreless outing (missed a scoreless outing on 7/22 vs. Iowa due to a borderline ball call, extending final inning long enough for 2ER). On the year, Allen's 2.05WHIP ranks last among 86 IL pitchers with at least 34.0IP.

In the Show:

After a promising start to the season (3ER in 10.0IP), Allen was chased before the end of the 3rd inning in each of his next three starts with Cleveland (13ER in 5.2IP). Through his first 57BF, Allen was a member of the No Homers Club, giving up a longball to only **Whit Merrifield** on 4/5 (there's allowed to be one). Following that opening stretch, he allowed 6HR over 12TBF from 4/23-4/28. Allen was recalled for a second stint at the end of June and was run in the 4th inning in each of two starts (7ER in 7.0IP). He also surrendered a homer in each, including a grand slam to Tampa Bay's **Brandon Lowe** on 7/5.

Actively Injured:

Though he missed nearly three weeks between starts on 5/19 at Toledo on 6/12 at Iowa due to left elbow soreness, Allen was not placed on the DL. He remained on the newly expanded active roster the entire time, as the Clippers have yet to DL anyone this season (**Ernie Clement**, **Scott Moss**, twice, and **Andres Gimenez** have each missed more than a week at a time).

Young Vet:

Allen was the youngest member of the opening day Columbus rotation, but had as many Major League starts in April (5) as the rest of the original rotation had at Triple-A coming into the season (**Kirk McCarty** and **Jean Carlos Mejia** had never pitched above High-A, while **Scott Moss**, 4GS, and **Eli Morgan**, 1GS, rounded out the rotation). Mejia and Morgan are currently with Cleveland, while Moss has missed the majority of the season with injuries.
