**YESTERDAY:** The Flying Squirrels lost to the SeaWolves, 4-2. **Bo Davidson** opened the scoring with an RBI single in the bottom of the third inning. **Cesar Perdomo** struck out nine over six scoreless innings and allowed two hits. Erie broke the shutout with a solo homer by Bennett Lee to tie the game in the top of the eighth. Later in the inning, Justice Bigbie worked a go-ahead, bases-loaded walk and Peyton Graham hit an RBI infield single for a 3-1 Erie lead. Davidson scored from second on a wild pitch in the bottom of the eighth to pull within a run. Brett Callahan opened a 4-2 Erie lead with an RBI double in the top of the ninth. In the bottom of the ninth, Richmond picked up a pair of two-out singles but stranded them on base.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Flying Squirrels play the third of a six-game series against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. This is Erie's first-ever visit to CarMax Park. Richmond lost their season opener at Erie before winning the final two games of the three-game series from April 3-5. The Flying Squirrels returned to Erie and split a six-game series from May 12-17. The SeaWolves return to CarMax Park for a three-game series from July 17-19.

**STRONG START:** The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 35-16 start is the best in team history through 52 games, passing a 39-23 start in 2022. Richmond has won five series and split four so far this year. Seven-of-17 Richmond losses have been by one run.

**RELENTLESS:** In their 35 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 16 of them. In 11 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday against Akron, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double. On Friday, the Flying Squirrels tied their largest come-from-behind win in franchise history, overcoming a 6-0 deficit to win, 9-6, over Akron. On May 20 against Binghamton, **Ty Hanchey** hit a game-tying homer in the bottom of the ninth and Harber won the game with a walk-off single.

**THE FLYING SQUIRRELS** lead the Southwest Division by 6.5 games over Akron 16 games remaining in the Eastern League's first half. They have the best record in Double-A. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Richmond offense ranks fourth in doubles (116) and fifth in batting average (.283). Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average, doubles and triples (16) and ranks second in runs (328), hits (498) and total bases (802).

**THE SEAWOLVES** are in fourth place in the Southwest Division, 9.5 games behind Richmond. Erie split last week's six-game series against the Baysox at home. Erie's roster features two players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Tigers prospects, including SS John Peck (No. 15) and C Thayron Liranzo (No. 20). MLB.com's top-30 Tigers prospects list features four Erie players, including Liranzo (No. 5), Peck (No. 13), 3B/1B Isaac Pacheco (No. 18) and OF Brett Callahan (No. 28).

**FOR RICHMOND:** Left-hander **Greg Farone** makes his 11th Double-A start and his third against the SeaWolves. In his last start on Friday at Akron, Farone threw five scoreless innings, his first scoreless start at Double-A and his longest outing of the year. He last faced the SeaWolves on May 17 in Erie and allowed six runs (five earned) over four innings. Farone has allowed one run over his last two starts, spanning 9.1 innings. He was Richmond's Opening Day starter on April 4 at Erie in his Double-A debut and allowed one run over 4.2 innings. He had eight strikeouts, tying the franchise record for the most strikeouts on Opening Day. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene. He made 12 starts for San Jose, going 2-1 with a 3.73 ERA. At the time of his promotion in June, he ranked third in the California League in strikeouts (73). Farone closed the year with 11 starts at High-A, going 4-2 with a 4.25 ERA. Farone began his college career at Herkimer College in New York, where he led the team to the program's first NJCAA national title in 2022, going 7-0 with a 1.65 ERA and was named the NJCAA Division III Player of the Year and MVP of the World Series. He transferred to the University of Louisville for the 2023 season and pitched at the University of Alabama in 2024 before being selected by the Giants in the seventh round of that year's MLB Draft. **For more on Farone, see page two.**

**FOR ERIE:** Left-hander Carlos Peña makes his eighth Double-A start of the season and the ninth of his career against the Flying Squirrels. In his last start last Friday against the Baysox, he gave up seven runs over 1.2 innings in a loss. He pitched against the Flying Squirrels in Erie on May 17 and allowed four runs over two innings. In 2024, Peña went 1-1 with a 0.86 ERA (2 ER/21.0 IP) against Richmond in four starts. For his career, he is 2-2 with a 3.16 ERA (13 ER/37.0 IP) in eight starts against Richmond. Peña signed with the Tigers in 2019 and has spent parts of four seasons with the SeaWolves.

**SOARING TO THE SHOW:** **Jonah Cox** was called up to the San Francisco Giants directly from Richmond on Sunday and made his MLB debut that afternoon in Denver, less than a half hour from his hometown, against the Colorado Rockies. Cox entered as a pinch-runner in the eighth and scored a run before picking up a double in his first plate appearance in the ninth. Cox hit .400 over 44 games with the Flying Squirrels, which led the minor leagues. He was the second batter to hit .400 or better over the first two calendar months of an Eastern League season, joining Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (2018). Cox was second in the minors in OPS (1.097), fifth in SLG (.644) and tied for seventh in stolen bases (27). He led the Eastern League in batting average, OPS, SLG, stolen bases, OBP (.453), hits (64) and triples (5) at the time of his promotion. Cox was the sixth player called up directly from Richmond to make his MLB debut, joining **Darren Ford** (2010), **Matt Duffy** (2014), **Hunter Strickland** (2014), **Dan Slania** (2017) and **Miguel Gómez** (2017).

**PARKS & WRECK:** **Parks Harber** has homered seven times and picked up 25 RBIs in his last 23 games since May 7. He had seven RBIs over two games on May 13 and 14 at Erie, including two homers. He hit a solo home run on May 20 against Binghamton before driving a game-winning single in the bottom of the ninth, his second walk-off hit for the Flying Squirrels this year. Harber had 23 RBIs in the month of May, which was fourth-most in the Eastern League. On Tuesday night, he drove in three runs and hit a two-run homer.

**WHIT WON'T QUIT:** **Joe Whitman** was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Month for May on Thursday afternoon. In five May starts, he went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA (3 ER/28.0 IP) with 37 strikeouts and five walks. He had four consecutive starts to open the month and matched the longest scoreless streak in franchise history. Whitman was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on Tuesday.

**TOP SKIPPER:** Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 295 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

**PACKING THE HOUSE:** In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank second among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,056).

**IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS:** In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.400), first in OBP (.453), first in SLG (.644), first in OPS (1.097), first in triples (5), second in hits (64), second in stolen bases (27), tied for fourth in total bases (103), tied for fifth in RBIs (35), tied for ninth in extra-base hits (22). **Parks Harber** is eighth in batting average (.316), eighth in OPS (.951) and 10th in SLG (.564). **Scott Bandura** is fourth in batting average (.324) and second in OBP (.430). **Joe Whitman** is first in strikeouts (65), second in WHIP (0.97), tied for second in wins (5), fourth in BAA (.198), fifth in ERA (3.22) and ninth in innings pitched (50.1). **Matt Wilkinson** is first in WHIP (0.83), first in BAA (.154) and second in ERA (1.87). **Jack Choate** is tied for second in wins (5). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for first in saves (7). **Mitch White** is tied for fourth in saves (5). **Cesar Perdomo** is fifth in WHIP (1.14), tied for sixth in BAA (.207), tied for sixth in strikeouts (55) and 10th in ERA (3.86).

**PROSPECT WATCH:** Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 16), **Joe Whitman** (No. 18), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 29). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), Harber (No. 14) and INF **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20).

### THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

**1972:** The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 1-0, at Parker Field. With one out in the bottom of the ninth, Luis Alcaraz belted a walk-off, solo homer. **1977:** The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 3-1, at Parker Field. Toledo pitcher Cardell Camper threw a two-hitter, but one of the hits was a two-run homer by Dale Murphy in the fourth inning. Camper issued three straight walks in the seventh and Jerry Maddox brought in a third run with a sacrifice fly. **1978:** The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 3-2, at Parker Field. Hank Small won the game with a broken-bat single in the bottom of the 10th inning. Small also hit a two-run homer in the second inning for an early 2-0 Richmond lead. **1988:** The Richmond Braves beat the Omaha Royals, 1-0, at The Diamond. Tommy Greene started and allowed four hits over 7 2/3 scoreless innings. Alex Smith drove in the game's only run in the second inning. **2017:** The Richmond Flying Squirrels beat the Trenton Thunder, 5-4, in 12 innings at The Diamond. The winning run scored in the bottom of the 12th inning on a bunt by Rando Moreno that scored Brandon Bednar from third.
