NEWS AND NOTES	
HOME COOKIN: Last night's win over the Bats was the 44th home win of the season for Nashville. The Sounds remain tied with Low-A Hickory (TEX) and Double-A Tulsa (LAD) for the most home wins in the minors this year. With eight games remaining this season at First Horizon Park, the Sounds currently have their sixth-most wins at home for any season since 2005. Nashville set the franchise-record with 51 wins in 1980. WALKED IT OFF AGAIN: The Sounds walked off the Bats for the second time this week and was the seventh overall walk-off win of the season for Nashville. It was the second time this season that the Sounds have walked off twice in the same series with the first one coming on May 15 and 17 against the Iowa Cubs. The seven walk-off wins are tied for the seventh-most in the in a single-season since 2005 and are tied for seventh in Triple-A this year; Sugar Land leads all teams with 13 walk-offs. The Sounds have totaled 140 walk-off wins since 2005, the sixth-most in Triple-A over the span. ALL IT TAKES IS ONE: Friday's 5-4 win was the fourth consecutive one-run victory the Sounds, storming back with a five-run ninth inning. It was the second straight night the Sounds have erased a 4-run deficit to win a game, and the sixth time overall this season to match their largest comeback win. Friday was the third time this season Nashville has been in four or more one-run games in a single series (June 30-July	5 at Jacksonville, August 11-16 vs. Indianapolis). It's the first time the Sounds have won four consecutive one-run games since June 26-28, 2018 at Oklahoma City (5-4, 5-4 (7), 1-0 (7), 10-9). DIFFICULTY - HARD: Tyson Hardin recorded his sixth quality start of the season for the Sounds (7.0 IP, 3 H, ER, 7 K, BB) Friday night. It was Hardin's first quality start since July 17 vs. Norfolk (6.0 IP, 3 H, ER, 2 K, BB). He posted his second quality start of the season when going seven innings or more as the first one came on May 17 against the Iowa Cub in his Triple-A debut and was the fourth of his career when going 7+ innings. The Brewers no.7-rated prospect now has 13 quality starts since the start of his professional career in 2024 and ranks second among minor league pitchers in the Brewers' farm system over the span. His six quality starts are the second-most behind Coleman Crow (7) among Nashville pitchers this year. In the Brewers' farm system, Hardin leads all full-season minor league pitchers in strikeouts (139), ranks third in innings pitched (119.2), fourth in WHIP (1.37) and fifth in AVG (.268) this season. DON'T MURRAY BE HAPPY: Ethan Murray extended his on-base streak to a career-long 18 consecutive games as he went 1-for-4 on Friday night and scored one of the five runs in the bottom of the ninth inning. He set his previous career-high of 17 consecutive games with Low-A Carolina during the 2021 season. The 18
games is now the longest-active on-base streak on the team, surpassing Darrien Miller (17) and is tied for the fifth-longest streak on the team this season with Luis Matos and Eddys Leonard. He is hitting a .250 (16-for-64), adding five XBH, 13 RBI and 12 runs since the start of his streak on August 13. His 18-game on-base streak is tied for the 13th-longest active on-base streak in the International League. IN A PINCH: Jeferson Quero's pinch-hit RBI single with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning on Friday was just the third hit of the season for a Sounds' pinch-hitter and first pinch-hit RBI. It was the first hit for a pinch-hitter since Ethan Murray on June 23. Nashville is now 3-for-15 in pinch hit opportunities this season. BID YOU BADD00: Akil Baddoo hit his 11th homer of the season with a go-ahead three-run shot in the bottom of the seventh inning on Thursday night. It was his third home run in his last nine games since the start of the Jacksonville series last week. Six of Baddoo's 11 home runs this season have been go-ahead home runs, second-most on the club behind Brock Wilken (8). The 11 home runs on the season are the third-most on the team behind Brock Wilken and Jeferson Quero with 15 each. Baddoo is four homers away from tying his Triple-A career-high (15), a mark he sent last season with the Toledo Mud Hens.
