TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: Once again the Saints got solid pitching to hang on to a 3-2 win to open the series in Louisville. The Bats took a 1-0 lead in the first inning off Caleb Boushley, who threw 4.1 innings, allowing two runs. Brooks Lee started the fourth with a double, his first extra base hit with the Saints, eventually coming around to score on a Michael Helman sacrifice fly. Trailing again 2-1 in the fifth inning, Lee delivered again with a two out single to drive in Yunior Severino, tying the game. Austin Martin came up clutch in the seventh inning to give the Saints the lead on an RBI single. The bullpen effort of Ronny Henriquez, Nick Wittgren and Kody Funderburk combined for 4.2 innings of shutout baseball to finish the win.

LOUISVILLE SLUGGERS: Since joining the International League, the Saints have hit well at Louisville, sporting a .250 batting average, their third-best of any road venue. Their .453 slugging percentage and .803 OPS are the best of any road venue they've played in and 0.40 home runs per plate appearance is the best of any ballpark the Saints have played in, including CHS Field (0.38 HR/PA).

THE ODDS NOT IN OUR FAVOR: Last night the Saints were able to win their fifth game of the season when scoring three runs. They also won their 28th game when the opponent collects 10 hits. However it was the first time in franchise history the club has won a game in which they scored only three runs and the opponent got 10-or-more hits.

GO, DIEGO, GO! Diego A. Castillo has surged again over his last nine games, hitting .423 (11-26) with three doubles and a home run. His 1.159 OPS in that span is the second-best on the team over the last 10 games, trailing only Yunior Severino's 1.236 clip. In five June games, Castillo is 8-for-17 (.471), with three multi-hit efforts.

NO WALKS FOR YOU! Over the last four games, the Saints have walked just five batters. The 213 walks issued by the Saints are the fewest in Triple-A, in addition to their 2.81 strikeouts per walk which also leads the circuit. The next closest is Durham at 2.59. Over the last four games, the Saints have struck out 42 batters to their five walks, a 8.4 K/BB ratio, the second-best in minor league baseball. Only Rocket City has a better ratio, at 8.67 (26 K/3 BB).

IT'S LITERALLY NIGHT AND DAY: Day games have been a challenge for the Saints this season. Below are their day/night splits for 2024:

RISP ASSESSMENT: Over the last three games, the Saints have had their chances with runners on base, but unable to cash in. The club has gone 5-for-35 (.143) over the last four games with runners in scoring position, leaving 39 men on over that span.

KEMP KRUSHING: Tony Kemp has turned it on over his last 15 games since May 22, hitting .327 (18-for-56). In that stretch he has hits in 10 of those 15 games, six multi-hit games and a pair of three-hit nights. In his last 59 plate appearances, Kemp has drawn three walks and struck out eight times, sporting a .360 on-base percentage and a .524 slugging percentage.

SUMMERTIME FEELING: Over the last three series, two players have stepped up their game at the plate: Yunior Severino and Michael Helman. **\$** In Severino's 16 games since May 21, he has hit .364 (20-for-55), with four home runs and a 1.075 OPS. His average exit velocity over that stretch is 92.2 mph, up from his season average of 89.3 mph.

\$ Michael Helman has turned it on again, hitting .333 (24-for-72) over the 19-game stretch. He's reached base in 16 of those 19 games.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins offense came up just short in a 5-4 loss to Colorado on Tuesday. The Rockies scored the first four runs of the game in the sixth inning, following 5.0 shutout innings from Louie Varland. Trailing 5-2 in the ninth, Carlos Santana hit a two out, two-run home run to close the gap to one. However, that is all the Twins would get in the loss.

LAST APPEARANCE: 6/6 v SYR...made third start of the season, starting game one of the doubleheader against Syracuse...retired first five batters before giving up a solo home run to Mike Brosseau...got a double play to eliminate a leadoff walk in the third...allowed a two-run home run to Luke Ritter in the fourth...primarily threw his cutter (30%/20 pitches)...did not factor into the decision in a 5-3 Saints win in seven innings.

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 5/29 @ ROC...made second start of the season and of the roadtrip, throwing 4.0 shutout innings, allowing two singles and striking out four...gave up singles in the second and fourth innings...got out of the fourth inning on a double play that came as a result of batter interference on a stolen base attempt after a strikeout...did not factor into the decision in a 5-0 Saints victory.

FROM THE TWINS TO THE TWINS: The last 2 seasons for Plutko have been spent in the KBO, where he has dominated for the LG Twins, going 26-8 between the 2022 and 2023 seasons. After signing for \$500,000 in 2022, he went 15-5 in his first season, re-signing for \$ 1.4 million in 2023. He followed that campaign with a season that saw him go 11-3, but did not make it to the championship series due to a hip injury.

REMEMBER THE PAC 12: Plutko finished his career as one of the best pitchers in program history at UCLA, where he finished his three-year stint there with second-most wins (29), starts (52) and IP (351.1) in school history. His career ERA of 2.25 and 272 career strikeouts both rank 7th on UCLA's all-time lists. His sister, Sara, was a three-year soccer letterwinner at University of Oregon and his wife, Allison, was a four-year gymnast at UCLA and was on same team as gold medalist Carly Patterson.

LEAVE A MESSAGE AFTER THE TONE: When he was promoted to Triple-A Columbus (Cleveland organization) in September, 2021 he missed the phone call from Cleveland's Director of Player Personnel Carter Hawkins because he was at a friend's wedding. They had just got done saying, "I Do" and got done taking the bridal party photos. Got a call from Cleveland and he put it straight to voice mail. When the call came again his wife Allison prodded him to answer because it could be important, so he did.

NOT PERFECT, BUT STILL PRETTY GOOD: On June 2, 2018, Plutko was spinning a gem with Columbus, not allowing a baserunner until the ninth inning at Syracuse when he issued a one-out walk. He followed that with a fly out and a strikeout to finish off the no-hitter. It was just the ninth complete-game no-hitter in the IL since 2005. It continued a stellar stretch for Plutko, who took a no-hitter into the sixth just two starts prior with Cleveland against the Chicago Cubs

- 2022-23 Pitched in the Korean Baseball Organization (KBO) for two seasons, combining for a 26-8 record and a 2.40 ERA in 49 starts with the LG Twins, striking out 250 in 285.1 innings, walking 69 batters...left Korea following the 2023 season, and before the championship series, due to a hip injury
- 2021 Spent the season with the Baltimore Orioles, making 37 relief appearances and one spot start, finished the season 1-2 with a 6.71 ERA, walking 27 and striking out 44 in 56.1 innings...had a 1.20 ERA in April, allowing two earned runs in 15.0 innings...allowed a run in his final six outings...was designated for assignment or release by Baltimore on August 15, 2021
