<p><b>Getting the Nod:</b> Hyun-il Choi gets the ball in game one of the 2022 season for manager Austin Chubb. Choi joins (from 2007 to 2019) Clayton Kershaw, Justin Miller, JonMichael Redding, Josh Wall, Red Patterson, Jarret Martin, Angel Sanchez, Jonathan Martinez, Brock Stewart, Michael Boyle, Leo Crawford, Max Gamboa, and Stephen Kolek as Great Lakes Loons Opening Day starting pitchers. Choi was named 2021 Branch Rickey Minor League Pitcher of the Year for the Dodgers' organization.</p> <p><b>Long Time, No See:</b> The Loons' Opening Day roster features 31 players - 30 active, one on the injured list. Of those, 21 played at least one game with the Loons last season. Here are some other notes and notables for the initial squad:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Seven players are 2021 Dodgers draftees</li> <li>12 originate from outside the United States (6 Dominican Republic, 3 Venezuela, Colombia, Curacao, South Korea)</li> <li>Five players have spent time with an organization other than the Dodgers</li> <li>Five appear on the MLB.com and Baseball America list of top 30 Dodgers prospects (see below)</li> <li>Leonel Valera, the Loons' career leader in games played at shortstop, returns for a third season</li> </ul> <p><b>Chubb on Top:</b> Austin Chubb returns to the dugout as the Loons' manager for a second season. Chubb is the first and only Great Lakes manager who was also a player, and is now just the third to manage more than one season in Midland.</p> <p><b>What's Old is New Again:</b> After a brief hiatus, the Loons are once again playing in the Midwest League. Last year, it was referred to as the High-A Central due to MLB not owning the rights to the historical names of the leagues. The Midwest League began as the Illinois State League (1947-1948) and then became the Mississippi-Ohio Valley League (1949-1955). In 1956, the MS-OH Valley League was renamed the Midwest League.</p>	<p><b>Andy Pages:</b> OF Andy Pages was named High-A Central Player of the Year and Prospect of the Year while completing the greatest single season in Loons franchise history.</p> <p>Single-Season Franchise Ranks: 1st - HRs (31), OPS (.933), HBP (19), wRC (106) 2nd - Runs (96), RBI (88), OBP (.394), SLG (.539)</p> <p><b>Going, Going, Gone!</b> The Loons finished first in the HAC, third in MiLB (excluding Triple-A), and ninth overall with 187 home runs. Despite a shortened 2021 season, the Loons broke the franchise record for home runs in a single season previously held by the 2010 team with 127 (0.91/gm). Last years team averaged 1.55 HR per game. Andy Pages (31) and Ryan Ward (27) were the 1st set of Loons teammates to both hit 20+ HRs in the same season. Brandon Lewis also hit 20 HRs.</p> <p><b>Protected Pitchers:</b> Loons starting pitchers logged just 347.0 innings (~2.2/start). That was the fewest amount of innings from a starting rotation in all of Minor League Baseball. (next: Clearwater: 389.1).</p> <p><b>Pour It On:</b> On September 7th, the Loons scored 18 runs for just the third time in franchise history and the first time since the 2009 season.</p> <p><b>No-Hitter:</b> Clayton Beeter (2.0 IP), Bobby Miller (5.0), Jacob Cantleberry (1.0), and Cameron Gibbens (1.0) combined for the Loons' first no-hitter in franchise history in a 14-0 win over Lake County on July 23rd.</p> <p><b>Feeling Grand:</b> The Loons hit 6 grand slams. The previous season-high was 4 from the 2010 and 2019 teams. Leonel Valera connected on his 2nd and 3rd career Loons grand slams.</p> <p><b>Back, Back, Back:</b> On August 29, Eddys Leonard became the third player in franchise history to hit 3 home runs in the same game joining 2017 Loon Cody Thomas and 2019 Loon Niko Hulsizer.</p> <p><b>Vargas Breaks Decade-Long Record:</b> Miguel Vargas re-wrote the Loons' record book with the longest hitting streak in franchise history and professional baseball last year by registering a hit in 26 straight games from May 12-June 10. During that time, Vargas hit a HAC-best .372 (next closest: .333). He had 42 hits (26 1Bs, 9 2Bs, 1 3B, 6 HRs) and an OPS of 1.038 during the streak. Vargas was promoted to Double-A Tulsa June 16th.</p>

### MANAGER

#### **Austin Chubb**

The Los Angeles Dodgers announced Austin Chubb will return as manager of the Great Lakes Loons in 2022. Last year, he became the Loons' ninth manager since the team's inaugural 2007 season, and this year becomes just the third to manage more than one season in Midland. In his first season at the helm of the Loons, Chubb led the team to a 63-57 record and amassed the best run differential in the High-A Central Eastern Division. Chubb is the only Loon to play for and now manage the club, with a brief stint as a player in 2015. Chubb, 32, enters his sixth season coaching in the Dodgers' organization. Los Angeles tabbed Chubb to manage the A-affiliate Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in 2020, before the season was cancelled. Chubb proved himself as a promising manager when he led the Dodgers' former Rookie-Advanced affiliate Ogden Raptors to a franchise-best 54-22 record in 2019, earning the Pioneer League Manager of the Year. Prior to Ogden, Chubb spent two seasons managing the Dodgers' Dominican Summer League club from 2016-2018. Before joining the Dodgers as a player, Chubb's road to Midland began when he was selected by the Washington Nationals in the 21st round of the 2012 draft after a collegiate career at Florida Southern. In 2012, Chubb served as a catcher for the rookie-level Gulf Coast League Nationals before joining the Auburn Doubledays in the New York-Penn League. Chubb would finish his Nationals journey after a 2014 season for the now-defunct Hagerstown Suns. Los Angeles signed Chubb to a minor league contract before 2015. A 2015 minor-league season saw Chubb appear in three different Dodger-affiliate jerseys, including Great Lakes, Oklahoma City, and Rancho Cucamonga. A native of Lake Mary, Fla., the right-handed catcher spent the most time with the Quakes, helping Rancho Cucamonga secure the 2015 California League Championship. Entering the 2022 season, Chubb has logged over seven years as either a player or coach within the Dodgers organization.

### PITCHING COACH

#### **David Anderson**

David Anderson continues his rise through the ranks of the Dodgers organization as the pitching coach for the Loons in 2022. Anderson, 27, joined the L.A. system as a development coach in 2020, and was assigned as the pitching coach for the organization's Arizona Complex League team last season. He led his staff to the fourth-lowest ERA in the ACL at 4.06, the third-most strikeouts (617 in 488.0 innings pitched), and the second-best walks and hits per innings pitched. Anderson, a 2015 graduate of Muhlenberg College, got his start in coaching at his alma mater, serving as pitching coach for the NCAA Division III school in Allentown, Pa., for two years immediately after his graduation. After that, he became a volunteer assistant for Cornell in 2017 before landing at Atlanta's Emory University, serving as the school's pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. While in the college ranks, Anderson also got head coaching experience in summer collegiate ball as manager of the Watertown (N.Y.) Rapids of the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League in 2018, leading the team to a 26-21 record in its inaugural season. He then went on to manage the now-defunct Fayetteville (N.C.) SwampDogs of the Coastal Plain League in 2019. Anderson, a native of Syracuse, N.Y., tossed four seasons at Muhlenberg. As a junior in 2014, he posted a 3.14 ERA over 63.0 innings, all as a starter. He walked just seven batters that season while striking out 28. He served as team captain as a senior, and led the team that year in innings pitched and strikeouts. After college, Anderson tested the waters in independent baseball. He appeared 16 times for the Newburgh Newts of the North Country Baseball League, with a stellar 2.38 ERA and seven saves. He then threw to a 2.67 ERA with the Bridgeport Bluefish of the Atlantic League, an MLB Partner League.

### HITTING COACH

#### **Dylan Nasiatka**

Dylan Nasiatka moves up to his third team in as many years in the Dodgers' organization, serving as the Loons' hitting coach in 2022. Nasiatka, 32, spent last year as the hitting coach of the Low-A Rancho Cucamonga Quakes, where he led the team to a league-high 6.75 runs per game. His hitters also paced the league in doubles, home runs, total bases, slugging percentage and OPS. The Bakersfield, Calif., native joined the Dodgers system prior to the 2020 season, for which he was assigned to be the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors. Nasiatka earned a bachelor's degree from Cal State Bakersfield in kinesiology & exercise science in 2014, and achieved his master's degree in exercise science from California University of Pennsylvania the next year. Before joining the Dodgers' organization, Nasiatka worked as an assistant coach at Bakersfield College, a two-year school in his hometown, for seven seasons. Nasiatka played collegiate ball for three different schools, starting at Bakersfield College before moving to Hofstra and eventually South Carolina-Beaufort. He was a versatile player, with reps at catcher and on the infield. Nasiatka set a Bakersfield College record with a .473 batting average as a redshirt sophomore in 2010, belting 17 doubles, two home runs, and driving in 33 runs in 41 games. He was named a Junior College All-American by the American Baseball Coaches Association that season. In his lone season at Hofstra, he continued to rake, hitting .303 with 19 RBIs in 45 games, mostly as a designated hitter. He found more success at USCB, hitting .335 with 18 extra-base hits and 29 RBIs over 53 games.

### BENCH COACH

#### **Elian Herrera**

Former Great Lake Loon and Los Angeles Dodger Elian Herrera returns to the Great Lakes Loons 2021 field staff in his second season as bench coach. Herrera, a four-year big leaguer, begins his fourth season as a coach within the Dodgers' organization. The second baseman played over 20 games with the Loons in a span of two separate seasons. Herrera was a member of the inaugural 2007 Great Lakes Loons, along with nine other future Major Leaguers. Herrera would return to the Loons for a portion of the start of the 2009 season. From 2012-2018, Herrera played in 324 games at the AAA level, holding a .310 batting average in nearly 1200 plate appearances. Herrera made his major league debut on May 15, 2012 at Dodger Stadium, in a game where Kirk Gibson managed the Arizona Diamondbacks vs Don Mattingly's Dodgers. Three other former Loons appeared in the 5-1 loss for the Dodgers: Javy Guerrero (RHP, '09), Dee Strange-Gordon (SS, '09), and Scott Van Slyke (OF, '07) Before joining the Loons staff last season, Herrera was the bench coach for the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in 2019, helping lead the team to the playoffs after an 81-57 finish in the regular season, good for first in the South division of the California League.

### ASSISTANT PITCHING COACH

#### **Richard De Los Santos**

Richard De Los Santos joins the Dodgers' organization for the first time as assistant pitching coach for the Loons in 2022. The 37-year-old had a nine-year minor league career as a right-handed pitcher, mostly in the Tampa Bay system. De Los Santos pitched in 36 games over three seasons for Triple-A Durham, racking up 99 strikeouts in 169 1-3 innings at MiLB's highest level. Over the course of his nine seasons in affiliated baseball, the Dominican Republic native struck out over 400 batters. De Los Santos played a portion of the 2005 season for the Southwest Michigan Devil Rays in Battle Creek, who would be purchased in 2006 by the Michigan Baseball Foundation and become the Loons in 2007.

Prospecting: MLB.com, #28. Baseball America, #30. Future Dodgers, #25.

**Stuff:** Low 90s fastball. Low 80s slider and changeup that tunnel well off one another. Curveball is lowest use. Slider has a little more sweep this year than in the past. He's getting down the mound quicker and with more explosiveness this year thanks to a more efficient lower half. Discussed as one of the quickest workers and as having the best command in the Dodgers system. Choi: "I feel like I have not good enough but pretty good command and control. But I throw like 91, 92, sometimes 88, 89. I want to consistently throw 92, 93. Touch 96."

**2021:** Honored as the Dodgers' Branch Rickey Minor League Pitcher of the Year after pitching in Low-A Rancho Cucamonga and High-A Great Lakes. Finished with 65.1 innings and a 3.17 ERA in RC and 41 innings and a 4.17 ERA in GL. He finished with just 18 walks and a combined 0.96 WHIP in 106.1 IP.

**2019:** Appeared in 14 games with the AZL Dodgers-Mota club. Recorded a league-best 71 strikeouts and 11 walks in 65.0 IP with a 2.63 ERA and 1.05 WHIP

**Success in KR:** The Dodgers were the organization that signed the two most successful Korean pitchers in MLB history with Chan Ho Park in 1994 and Hyun-Jin Ryu in 2012. The Dodgers got Choi for \$300,000 before he likely could have been a 1st round pick in the Korean Baseball Organization.

**The Decision:** “All the best players play in MLB and all the best players have been in the minor-league system. So that was my dream. If I go [and play professionally in] Korea, it’s really hard to go to MLB. You have to be the best player in the KBO for, like, eight years and then go to MLB. That’s too hard for me. Then the Dodgers wanted to get me – so why not? I was, ‘Yeah, I’ll take it.’”
