2021 MLB Pipeline Hitting Prospect of the Year

In the inaugural season of Hudson Valley's affiliation with the New York Yankees, **Anthony Volpe** was named *MLB Pipeline* Hitting Prospect of the Year after a monster season with the Renegades and the Low-A Tampa Tarpons.

The 20-year-old hit .286/.391/.581 in 55 games with Hudson Valley, while clubbing 17 doubles and 15 home runs. Including his time in Tampa, Volpe collected 121 hits, 35 doubles, 6 triples, 27 HRs, 86 RBIs, and was 33-for-42 on stolen base attempts.

"He stays on the ball for a really long time, but his attacking ability is great," said Hudson Valley manager Dan Fiorito to Sam Dykstra of MLB.com. "He finds a way to get the ball in the air and drive line drives to all fields. He has a great ability to keep the ball off the ground."

The Yankees drafted Volpe with the 30th pick in the 1st round of the 2019 MLB Draft out of the Delbarton School in New Jersey. He was originally committed to play alongside high school teammate Jack Leiter at Vanderbilt, but opted to sign and begin his professional career.

1998 & 2019 Bob Freitas Award



The Hudson Valley Renegades have been honored by *Baseball America* with the Bob Freitas Award two times in their history -- in 1998 and again in 2019. The prestigious award has been presented every year since 1989, and recognizes the top overall operation at each classification of the minor leagues. The Renegades received the honor both times as the best Short Season-A organization.

"The Freitas Award is the gold standard in the industry, and we are humbled and honored that *Baseball America* has chosen to recognize the Renegades as this year's recipient" said Jeff Goldklang, President of the Goldklang

Group, after receiving the 2019 award. "Steve Gliner and our staff work tirelessly to provide a first-class fan experience on a nightly basis, and this award is a testament to the success of that effort."

The award is named after Bob Freitas, a longtime ambassador of minor league baseball who helped teams and minor league owners around the country.

"We are proud of what we accomplished this year" said Steve Gliner, President and General Manager of the Renegades. "We polled our fans on what areas of our operation were most important to them, and responded by tailoring our operation specifically to those desires. Coupled with another talented roster from our long-time and wonderful parent club, the Tampa Bay Rays, a night at the ballpark in 2019 was always a heart-racing experience!"

66 YEARS (...AND COUNTING) OF RENEGADES BASEBALL

The New York-Penn League franchise that eventually became the Hudson Valley Renegades is one of the oldest franchises in the South Atlantic League, with its first season of play coming in 1958. The Renegades franchise has relocated three times before settling into a permanent home in the Hudson Valley in 1994. They have been affiliated with nine MLB franchises and have operated as both an unaffiliated team within the structure of organized baseball (1990-91), and as a co-op franchise, accepting players from multiple MLB affiliates (1978-80, 96) in its past.

The Disability Dream and Do (D3) sports camps were created by Dave Clark, the only pitcher in professional sports history to pitch on crutches, and Doug Cornfield, a former NCAA medal winning runner at Georgia, who himself had a child born with no arms. These camps are presented completely free to campers through generous donations and sponsorships.

These camps allow professional players to interact with children with special needs in various drills and compete in sports with no limitations. In 2016, Dave Stevens, who was born without legs but played college football and minor league baseball, came on board as the D3 Day camps expanded to other cities in the US. Dave, Dave and Doug now put on camps all over the country and share their amazing stories as well as inspire others to look past a disability and turn it into an ability.

The Renegades have been proud to host D3 Day camps since 2017. D3 Day at Heritage Financial Park in 2023 is scheduled for Saturday, June 17.
