**SUNDAY:** The Flying Squirrels were handed their first loss of the season, falling, 11-6, to the Bowie Baysox at Prince George's Stadium. After Richmond recovered from an early four-run deficit to take the lead, Bowie posted six runs in the eighth to put the game away. Hudson Haskin hit a solo homer in the fourth inning to extend Bowie's early lead to 4-0. Richmond broke onto the scoreboard in the fifth with RBI singles by **Mike Gigliotti** and **Brett Auerbach** and plated a third run on a double-play groundout. **Sean Roby** tied the game with a solo homer to lead off the sixth inning. Bowie moved back in front with a two-run homer by Haskin in the bottom of the sixth, but **Diego Rincones** knocked a two-run single in the top of the seventh to give the Flying Squirrels a 6-5 lead. Haskin capped the scoring in the eighth with a two-run homer, his third home run of the game.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Flying Squirrels play their home opener against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. This game marks the first time the Flying Squirrels have hosted the Curve in their home opener since 2014, a 2-1 win. The two teams also faced off in the Flying Squirrels' home opener in 2012, a 7-3 Richmond win, and in 2014, a 6-1 Altoona win. This series is the only trip to Richmond for the Curve this year. The Flying Squirrels will play 12 games in Altoona, including six-game series from May 17-22 and July 12-17. The Flying Squirrels and Curve will play 18 games against each other this season.

**THE FLYING SQUIRRELS** are back in action after posting a 57-56 record in 2021, the first winning season for the franchise since 2015. That mark placed the team fourth in the Double-A Northeast Southwest Division standings, 13 games behind first-place Akron for the year. This year marks the Flying Squirrels' 12th season. This year, they are tied for first place in Southwest Division, even with Erie and Harrisburg. Last weekend, they won two games in a three-game set at Bowie to begin the season.

**THE CURVE** went 58-59 last season, finishing one game behind the Flying Squirrels in fifth place in the Southwest Division and 14 games behind first-place Akron. The Curve opened the season at home last weekend against the Senators and dropped two of three games. Altoona is currently tied for first in the Eastern League with five home runs. The Altoona roster features 11 of MLB.com's Top-30 Pirates prospects, including INF Nick Gonzalez (1), RHP Quinn Priester (4 - on IL), SS Liover Peguero (6), OF Matt Frazier (10), RHP Mike Burrows (11), RHP Carmen Mlodzinski (14), RHP Kyle Nicolas (19), 3B Jared Triolo (20), INF Tucupita Marcano (25), RHP Tahnaj Thomas (29) and OF Jack Suwinski (30). Altoona roster also includes RHP Colin Selby, a native of Chesapeake and a former DIII All-American at Randolph-Macon College in Ashland.

**FOR RICHMOND:** Right-hander **Tristan Beck** makes his first start of the season and his second-straight home-opening start for the Richmond Flying Squirrels. Last year, he started on Opening Day at The Diamond against the Yard Goats on May 4 and allowed three runs (two earned) in a loss. He made three more starts for Richmond before going on the injured list with a back strain on June 9. Beck began a rehab assignment in the Arizona Complex League in August and made two relief appearances for Low-A San Jose. Beck was selected in the fourth round of the 2018 MLB Draft out of Stanford by the Atlanta Braves. He was traded to the Giants on July 31, 2019 along with RHP Dan Winkler in exchange for RHP Mark Melancon. In his college career, he was Stanford's Opening Day starting pitcher as a freshman in 2016 and as a junior in 2018. Beck was rated by *Baseball America* as the No. 30 Giants prospect entering the 2022 season. **For more on Beck, see page two.**

**FOR ALTOONA:** Right-hander Kyle Nicolas takes the mound for his Pirates organization debut. He was picked up by Pittsburgh on November 29, 2021 in a trade along with right-hander Zach Thompson and outfielder Connor Scott in exchange for catcher Jacob Stallings. Nicolas was the 61st overall pick in the 2020 MLB Draft out of Ball State. He made his professional debut last season for High-A Beloit, going 3-2 with a 5.28 ERA in 13 outings. Nicolas was promoted to Double-A Pensacola on July 21 and went 3-2 with a 2.52 ERA in eight starts, striking out 50 in 39.1 innings. He was rated by *Baseball America* as the No. 29 Pirates prospect entering the 2022 season and ranked No. 19 by MLB.com.

**PACKING THE HOUSE:** The Flying Squirrels have sold out all 12 of their home openers, including tonight. In 2018 and 2019, they set the record for the largest crowds in the franchise's history with 9,845 fans after seeing 9,560 at each of the first eight openers. In 2021, capacities at The Diamond were limited due to the COVID-19 pandemic and social distancing protocols, but the Flying Squirrels sold all 2,943 tickets available for the game.

**HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE:** Through 11 seasons, the Flying Squirrels have gone 8-3 in their home openers. From 2015-2019, the Flying Squirrels won five straight home openers prior to last season's 6-3 loss to the Yard Goats.

**THE GRAVEYARD:** Flying Squirrels pitchers have only surrendered two home runs in their previous 11 home openers. In 2018, Reading's Austin Bossart brought in the Fightin' Phils' only run of the game with a solo home run in the eighth inning. In 2021, Hartford's Elehuris Montero hit a three-run homer in the third inning against **Tristan Beck** to put the Yard Goats in the lead.

**HOMETOWN HOMERS:** In the franchise's previous 11 home openers, Richmond hitters have gone deep five times. **Conor Gillaspie** and **Jackson Williams** both homered in the Flying Squirrels' first home game against the Reading Phillies on April 15, 2010, the only home opener in which the team has hit multiple home runs. **Wes Hodges** went deep in the 2012 home opener against Altoona and **Chris Shaw** homered against the Yard Goats on Opening Day in 2017. The most recent home run by a Flying Squirrels player in a home opener was hit by pitcher **Jordan Johnson**, who hit a solo homer in the fifth inning while also pitching 6.0 scoreless innings against Reading.

**GETTING ON:** The Flying Squirrels' offense is currently ranked first in the Eastern League with a .398 on-base percentage. **Mike Gigliotti** is leading the league with a .677 OBP and **Will Wilson** is ninth with a .563 OBP for the season. Wilson is tied for third in the league with four walks.

**THE DENNIS PELFREY ERA:** On March 3, **Dennis Pelfrey** was named the new manager for the Richmond Flying Squirrels. Last year in his first season as a manager in affiliated baseball, he led the Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Pelfrey, 44, played six professional seasons in independent baseball from 1999-2004. He began his coaching career at South Grand Prairie High School in Texas in 2006, a position he held through 2015. He continued that role as he began his professional coaching career in 2011 with the Gary SouthShore RailCats, where he spent four seasons. Pelfrey landed his first managerial job in 2015 with the Florence Freedom of the independent Frontier League, a role he held for five seasons through 2019. He was hired by the Giants entering the 2020 season to manage High-A San Jose before the season was canceled due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic. Under his direction last year, the Emeralds went 69-50 before topping Spokane in the High-A West Championship Series.

**WHATS OLD IS NEW AGAIN:** This year, Minor League Baseball's 11 leagues returned to their historical names after using regional names for the 2021 season. With the restructuring of the player development system prior to last season, the former Eastern League was referred to as the Double-A Northeast. This year, the circuit was renamed back to the Eastern League, which dates back to 1923. However, the league's divisions will continue with the new names adopted last year. The Flying Squirrels play in the Southeast Division, which was previously called the Western Division. The former Eastern Division was renamed the Northeast Division last year.

**REWRITING THE RULES:** New experimental rules are in effect during the Flying Squirrels' season. With runners on base, pitchers will risk automatic baserunner advancement if a third pick-off attempt or step-off within the same plate appearance is made without recording an out. The size of the bases has increased from 15 inches square to 18 inches square in an attempt to reduce injuries. Defensively, teams must have a minimum of four players on the infield and two infielders complete on either side of second base.

**SQUIRRELS AROUND THE WORLD:** The Flying Squirrels' Opening Day roster features players from four different countries, including 25 players who were born in the United States, spanning 14 states. Eight players are from California, three are from Washington, two are from Florida and North Carolina and one each hail from Alabama, Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, Georgia, Illinois, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Rhode Island and Texas. **Kai-Wei Teng** will become the second player born in Taiwan to play for the Flying Squirrels. **Franklin Labour** is a native of the Dominican Republic and **Diego Rincones** was born in Venezuela.

**FAMILIAR FACES:** This year's Opening Day roster includes 12 returning players from last year's squad, including pitchers **Tristan Beck**, **R.J. Dabovich**, **Matt Frazier**, **Frank Rubio**, **Patrick Ruotolo** and **Ryan Walker**, catcher **Brandon Martorano**, infielders **Shane Matheny**, **Frankie Tostado** and **Will Wilson** and outfielders **Jacob Heyward** and **Diego Rincones**.

**PROSPECT WATCH:** The Flying Squirrels have seven players ranked in *Baseball America's* Top-40 Giants prospects, including **Will Wilson** (14), **R.J. Dabovich** (17), **Tristan Beck** (30), **Tyler Fitzgerald** (34), **Diego Rincones** (36) and **Kai-Wei Teng** (40). **Franklin Labour** is rated by *Baseball America* as having the "Best Outfield Arm." MLB.com's Top-30 Giants prospect list includes **Dabovich** (17), **Wilson** (22) and **Brett Auerbach** (28).
