**Aviators vs. Express:** The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Athletics, will open a six-game road trip tonight against the Round Rock Express, Triple-A affiliate of the Texas Rangers, in Pacific Coast League action at Dell Diamond (13,500)...Las Vegas was 4-2 on the just completed six-game homestand vs. Sugar Land...the series against the Express will conclude on Sunday, April 27...following an off day on Monday, April 28, the Aviators will then host the Tacoma Rainiers, Triple-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, April 29 – May 4 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**Sugar Land defeats Las Vegas 8-4 in 11 innings in series finale (Sunday, April 20):** The Space Cowboys defeated the Aviators 8-4 in 11 innings in the finale of the six-game homestand before a crowd of 4,807 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**Las Vegas Offense:** The Aviators recorded 11 hits and stranded 14 runners on base. Second baseman **Logan Davidson** was 3-for-4, walk, double 2 RBI. First baseman **Nick Kurtz** was 2-for-5, SF, RBI and catcher **Willie MacIver** was 1-for-4, walk, solo home run.

**Sugar Land Offense:** The Space Cowboys recorded 10 hits and stranded nine runners on base. Sugar Land broke the 4-4 tie with four runs in the 11<sup>th</sup> inning, highlighted by a three-run home run by shortstop **Zack Short** (2-for-6, two runs scored). Catcher **Joe Hudson** was 2-for-4, HR, 2 RBI, two runs scored.

**Aviators Starting Pitcher:** Right-hander **Jason Alexander** pitched 4.0 innings in the no decision. He allowed 4 hits, 1 run, walked 1 and struck out 5 on 58 pitches (38 strikes).

**AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS** – Las Vegas opens a six-game road trip tonight in Round Rock, Texas against the Express, Triple-A affiliate of the Texas Rangers...the Aviators were 4-2 on the just completed six-game homestand against Sugar Land...Round Rock and Las Vegas will play each other a total of nine times in '25...following the road trip, the Aviators will then return home and host the Tacoma Rainiers, Triple-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, April 29 – May 4...the 2025 season will feature six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday and off days on Mondays (one exception, May 26 Memorial Day at Sugar Land)...the '25 campaign will feature 150 games for the fourth consecutive season (75-home- 75-away).

**2025 PCL PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Right-hander **J.T. Ginn** from March 34-30...defeated Reno on March 28 in the season opener at Las Vegas Ballpark...5.0 shutout innings, one hit, one walk, eight strikeouts on 69 pitches (44 strikes).

**2025 PCL PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Catcher **Daniel Susac** from April 14-20...in four games, batted .625 (10-for-16) with three doubles, two home runs and 6 RBI, including a season-best 4-for-4 performance with two doubles, 2 RBI and walk-off home run vs. Sugar Land on **Jackie Robinson Day** (April 15).

**42<sup>nd</sup> SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2024)** – The Aviators are playing in their 42<sup>nd</sup> season (43<sup>rd</sup> calendar season) in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League...**the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada's longest enduring professional sports franchise**...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher **Bruce Bochy** has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

**PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE:** The PCL is in its 122<sup>nd</sup> season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Comets, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

**INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE:** The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY IN 2025:** The Aviators will host the Iowa Cubs, Triple-A affiliate of the Chicago Cubs, and member of the International League in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, August 26-31 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2024 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 74-75 (.497) and finished in fourth place in the PCL West Division. The Tacoma Rainiers captured the West Division with an overall record of 82-68 (.547). Sugar Land Space Cowboys recorded the best record in the 30-team Triple-A (93-56, .624) and defeated the Reno Aces, 2-games-to-0, to capture the PCL Championship. Sugar Land then defeated the Omaha Storm Chasers, Triple-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals, 13-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 28 before a crowd of 8,007 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2023 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.503) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 88-62 (.587). Oklahoma City baseball club recorded the best record (90-58, .608) in the 10-team PCL and defeated the Round Rock Express, 2-games-to-0 to capture the PCL Championship. The Norfolk Tides defeated OKC, 7-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 30 before a sellout crowd of 8,556 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2022 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 85-63 (.574). The Aces captured the PCL championship and defeated the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, 6-2, on September 30 in the inaugural **Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend** at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the Triple-A National Championship and defeated Reno, 10-6, on October 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Bulls defeated the Nashville Sounds, Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, 13-0, to capture the IL championship on October 1 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS** – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563)... Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

**LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY:** Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH) announced on **October 10, 2017** its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on **Friday, February 23, 2018** before a crowd of several hundred people! The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall. Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites. The grand opening took place on **Tuesday, April 9, 2019** before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

**LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION HISTORY:** Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH), then-owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on **December 8, 2018** the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51<sup>st</sup>) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

#### **AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:**

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

#### **SOUTHERN NEVADA AVIATION HISTORY:**

**Nevada's High-Flying Aviators (from UNLV News)** - Nevada has a rich history in Aviation; with 500 miles between the state's two largest cities (Reno and Las Vegas), aviation was ideal for Nevada.

**Aviation History in Las Vegas (from Harry Reid Airport)** - Aviation grew exponentially throughout the 1900s, bringing more and more travelers to our city.

### **SEAPORT ENTERTAINMENT GROUP COMPLETES SEPARATION FROM HOWARD HUGHES HOLDINGS**

**NEW YORK, NY (AUGUST 1, 2024) – Seaport Entertainment Group Inc.** (NYSE American: SEG) (the "Seaport Entertainment Group" or "Company"), a newly formed company positioned at the intersection of entertainment and real estate, announced that it has completed its previously announced separation (the "Separation") from its predecessor **Howard Hughes Holdings Inc.** (NYSE: HHH) ("Howard Hughes") and is now an independent, standalone publicly traded company. The Company began its common stock trading (August 1) on the NYSE American LLC under the ticker symbol SEG.

Seaport Entertainment Group's portfolio is anchored by the historic Seaport neighborhood in Lower Manhattan, which includes 478,000 square feet of primarily retail, restaurant and entertainment offerings, the 3,500-person concert venue on The Rooftop at Pier 17, a mixed-use development site at 250 Water Street, and the Tin Building by Jean-Georges, an immersive culinary marketplace. The Company's portfolio also includes **Las Vegas Ballpark in downtown Summerlin, NV; the Las Vegas Aviators, the Triple-A Minor League Baseball Affiliate of the Athletics**; a 25% ownership interest in Jean-Georges Restaurants; and an interest in and to 80% of the air rights above the Fashion Show mall in Las Vegas.

**Aviators on Radio in 2025:** Russ Langer will broadcast the 150 games on **Raider Nation Radio 920 AM** (selected games on **Fox Sports 1340 AM** and **98.9 FM**) on [www.aviatorslv.com](http://www.aviatorslv.com). Langer is in his 25<sup>th</sup> season broadcasting baseball to the Las Vegas Valley and 38th year overall in the business....over his career, Langer has received numerous awards, including being named 1993 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues....in 1995 and 2016, he broadcast the Triple-A All-Star game; in 1999, he was named the New Mexico Sportscaster of the Year; and in 2002, he was named Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by Minor League News.com...Langer also is a 12-time recipient (13 overall and seven consecutive years from 2007-13) of the Nevada

Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2021, 2023), which is presented by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA)...Langer's inaugural season in Las Vegas was in 2000, the final year the franchise was known as the Stars...prior to arriving in Las Vegas, Langer called Pacific Coast League games for the Albuquerque Dukes (1996-99) and Phoenix Firebirds (1992-95)...began his broadcasting career with Single-A Springfield Cardinals in 1987 and 1989, sandwiched around a year in Vero Beach (1988)...moved up the ranks to Double-A, calling games for the Midland Angels in 1990 and '91 before advancing to Triple-A Phoenix...he realized his longtime goal of broadcasting Major League baseball when he worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons, followed by nine games for the Baltimore Orioles in 2006...has also broadcast selected spring training games for the Los Angeles Dodgers (2006-08), Toronto Blue Jays (2009-10) and Chicago White Sox (2012-20)...on April 6, 2023, marked his 3,000<sup>th</sup> broadcast for the Triple-A Las Vegas Stars/51<sup>s</sup>/Aviators franchise...served for 12 seasons (2012-23) as the radio play-by-play voice for the UNLV football team on the UNLV Sports Properties/ Learfield Network.
