Last Game: Thursday: Lake County 7, Dayton 6. Christian Knapczyk's two-run single with one out in the seventh inning broke a 5-5 tie. The Dragons trailed 7-5 going to the ninth inning and scored one run, leaving the tying run at third base. Ariel Almonte continued his hot hitting, collecting a double and triple. Cam Collier and Anthony Stephan each had two hits for Dayton as well.

Series Recap: Lake County has taken three one-run wins in the series so far, scoring in the late innings to win each games. Lake County scored three in the bottom of the ninth to defeat Dayton 3-2 in the opener on Tuesday. Dayton led 3-2 going to the bottom of the seventh on Wednesday before Lake County rallied to win. Dayton led 5-4 going to the bottom of the sixth on Thursday before Lake County came back to win.

Last Series Recap: The Dragons went 1-5 in the series vs. Lansing at Day Air Ballpark, winning the third game of the series on Thursday. The Dragons were outscored 33-18 in the six games, batting .235 as a team with five home runs and one stolen base. The team ERA in the series was 5.24 and Dayton committed three errors in the set.

Team and Player Notes:

- The Dragons have held a lead in 10 of the 14 losses they have suffered since the start of their 12-game homestand against West Michigan on May 27. Five of the 14 losses have been by one run. On the year, the Dragons have held a lead in 24 of their 42 losses.
- Ariel Almonte** has hit safely in nine straight games, going 14 for 35 (.400) with 3 HR, 4 2B, 1 3B, and 7 RBI. Since the start of the streak on June 3, Almonte leads the MWL in hits and extra base hits while ranking fourth in batting average and third in slugging percentage.
- Reliever **Easton Sikorski** has allowed just four earned runs in 32 innings, an ERA of 1.13. Among pitchers with at least 30 innings, Sikorski is first in the MWL in ERA and seventh in all Minor League Baseball.
- Among MWL pitchers with at least 40 innings pitched, Dragons starting pitcher **Luke Hayden** is fifth in ERA at 2.70.
- Leo Balcazar** over his last 17 games is 21 for 72 (.292) with 2 home runs and 8 RBI.
- Carlos Jorge** over his last 15 games is 17 for 57 (.298) with 2 home runs, 6 RBI, and 6 steals.
- Anthony Stephan** in six games since returning from the injured list is 5 for 14 (.357).

Prospecting: The Dragons roster features several players ranked among the Reds top-30 prospects based on the MLB Pipeline and Baseball America lists: Third baseman Cam Collier (#4 on MLB; #6 on BA); Starting pitcher Adam Serwinowski (#12 on MLB; #13 on BA); shortstop Leo Balcazar (#25 on MLB; #21 on BA); center fielder Carlos Jorge (#21 on MLB); catcher Connor Burns (#27 on BA); second baseman Peyton Stovall (#27 on MLB), and starting pitcher Luke Hayden (#30 on MLB).

- Cam Collier was 2024 Reds Minor League Position Player of the Year and the Midwest League's Full-Season All-Star Third Baseman...Nestor Lorant was the 2024 Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Year and the Florida State League Pitcher of the Year...First baseman John Michael Faile finished his college career ranked #1 in career home runs and RBI in NCAA Division II history.

Memorable Moments from 2025

May 9: Dragons pitcher Brian Edgington struck out 13 Great Lakes batters in five innings, one short of the club record of 14 set by Josh Hall in 2001 and Daniel Renken in 2011.

May 13: The Dragons trailed at Quad Cities 6-1 entering the eighth inning before battling back to win 11-9 in 12 innings. Dayton scored three in the eighth and two in the ninth to tie the score. Both runs in the ninth came on a two-out, two-run single by John Michael Faile. Dayton's Carlos Jorge blasted a tie-breaking two-run home run in the top of the 12th to give the Dragons an 11-9 lead and close out the scoring. The game marked just the third time since record-keeping of lead changes began in 2004 that the Dragons trailed by at least five runs in the eighth inning and battled back to win the game, and the first time since 2012. The Dragons have come back from deficits of at least five runs to win 27 times since 2004, but only three times when they trailed by five runs or more in the eighth inning or later. The 12-inning contest tied for the most innings played in a Dragons game since the rule putting a free runner on second base to begin each inning after the ninth was implemented in 2018. **Note:** Carlos Jorge's 12th inning two-run home run marked the second time in his Dragons career that Jorge hit a 12th inning, tie-breaking home run in a Dragons win. He did the same on September 2, 2023 at Great Lakes to break a 5-5 tie in a Dragons 7-6 win.

May 16: Catcher Connor Burns enjoyed the first two-homer game of his professional career, the first multi-home run game by a Dragons player since Cam Collier hit three on August 23, 2024.

Dragons Team Facts

The Dragons are celebrating their 25th Season in 2025. All 25 seasons have featured a partnership with the Cincinnati Reds. Over the Dragons history, 149 players have played for the Dayton club before reaching the Major Leagues.

The Dragons compete in the Midwest League (classified as High-A) and play a 132-game schedule (66 home games) from April 4-September 7. The MWL features 12 teams from Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, and Wisconsin. The Midwest League has been in operation since 1947 and has been known by its current name since 1956.

Three members of the Reds Hall-of-Fame have served as coaches for the Dragons including Ken Griffey Sr., Chris Sabo, and Tom Browning.

Every season in Dragons history has featured a future Major League player/s on the Dayton roster. Most recently: Rhett Lowder in 2024; Blake Dunn and Julian Aguiar in 2023; Elly De La Cruz, Rece Hinds, Noelvi Marte, Andrew Abbott, Connor Phillips, Evan Kravetz, Joe Boyle, and Julian Aguiar in 2022.

Attendance Leader: The Dragons finished third in all Minor League Baseball in 2024 in attendance average per game (8,012). They have ranked first in attendance at the Single-A level for each of their 24 seasons, and first among all teams below Triple-A for 18 straight seasons. The Dragons have ranked in the top-10 among all classes of the minor leagues for each of their 24 seasons.

Vince Harrison Jr. returns to the Dragons for his second season as manager after leading the team to a second half division title in 2024. Under Harrison's leadership in 2024, the Dragons full-season winning percentage of .561 ranked third best among the 24 years in Dragons franchise history. The Dragons finished with a winning record in both halves for the second time in franchise history. After going 34-32 in the first half, they went 40-26 in the second half to win the East Division title. Harrison enjoyed a nine-year professional career as a player, playing in the Rays, Mets, and Marlins systems as a third baseman. After his playing career ended following the 2011 season, he was hired as a coach by the Pirates. He joined the Diamondbacks organization as a hitting coach in 2014 and spent five years in that role before becoming a manager. He managed for three years in the Diamondbacks system before joining the Reds organization in 2023 as a coach with Louisville. Harrison played at Princeton High School in Cincinnati before starring in both baseball and football at the University of Kentucky. He was drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in 2001 and spent four years as a player in their farm system, reaching the Double-A level. Harrison's younger brother, Josh Harrison, spent 12 years as a player in the Major Leagues, collecting more than 1,000 career hits while playing in two MLB all-star games.

Historically Speaking

All-Time Best Dragons: The team named their 12 Greatest Dragons in franchise history as part of this season's celebration. Those players, listed alphabetically, are Homer Bailey, Jay Bruce, Zack Cozart, Johnny Cueto, Elly De La Cruz, Adam Dunn, Todd Frazier, Hunter Greene, Billy Hamilton, Austin Kearns, Joey Votto, and Jesse Winker.

The First Season: After a 48-year absence of professional baseball in Dayton, the Dragons came to life in 2000. The first home game was played on April 27, 2000, and featured a lineup that included future Reds stars Adam Dunn and Austin Kearns. The manager of the first Dayton team was Freddie Benavides, now the Reds bench coach.

Six Great Achievements in Dragons History:

- Austin Kearns hit home runs in eight consecutive games, July 17-24, 2000
- Billy Hamilton stole 103 bases for the Dragons in 2011, most for any player with a single team in Reds history (Major League or Minor League). Hamilton stole 155 the next season, splitting his season between two clubs, the highest total in baseball history.
- Donald Lutz hit for the cycle in reverse order (home run, triple, double, single), all within the first five innings, July 21, 2011.
- Jose Siri broke the Midwest League record for longest consecutive game hitting streak with 39 from June 22-August 3, 2017.
- Elly De La Cruz hit home runs from both sides of the plate twice within three days, July 7-9, 2022.
- Luis Mey threw a 103 mph fastball to break the Day Air Ballpark record on May 2, 2024.
