Sunday: Loons 4, Lugnuts 2. **Shane Selman** led off with his team-leading eighth home run and later singled and scored on a wild pitch, but the Lugnuts managed little else in a series-concluding defeat at Dow Diamond. **James Outman** and **Justin Yurchak** each homered for the Loons.

What's New in 2021: Entering this season, the Lugnuts' stadium name changed from Cooley Law School Stadium to Jackson® Field™, Lansing moved up to the High-A Central and the ballclub accepted an invitation to affiliate with the Oakland A's, the Nuts' fourth MLB partner, following the Kansas City Royals (1996-98), Chicago Cubs (1999-2004) and Blue Jays (2005-2020).

LUG•NOTES: HEADLINES AND POINTS OF INTEREST

A Series Victory! The Lugnuts' series this season - split vs. Lake County, split at Dayton, split at Fort Wayne, series loss vs. Great Lakes, split vs. South Bend, split at West Michigan, split vs. Great Lakes, series loss at Cedar Rapids, split vs. Dayton... and series win at Great Lakes, clinching with four straight wins concluding Saturday, matching the Nuts' longest winning streak of the year.

Splitville: Speaking of that, it likely would not surprise you to learn that the Nuts have played exactly .500 ball against every team in the East: 9-9 vs. Great Lakes, 6-6 vs. Dayton, and 3-3 vs. Lake County, Fort Wayne and West Michigan, plus a 3-3 record against South Bend from the West. The only team with a winning record against the Lugnuts is the West Division's Cedar Rapids Kernels (4-2).

Halfway Home: 60 games down, 60 games to be played - the MLB All-Star Game arrives at a time when the High-A All-Star Break would normally be occurring. The Lugnuts have 30 more home games remaining in Michigan's state capital, beginning tonight.

Star of Stars: The MLB All-Star Game tonight will feature 2017 Lugnut **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.**, starting at 1st base for the American League (after he was the youngest player ever to lead Major League Baseball in All-Star voting, as elected by the fans). Fellow 2017 Lugnut **Bo Bichette** was named as an A.L. All-Star reserve at shortstop.

Alumni Report: Slugging 2019 Lugs outfielder **Griffin Conine**, traded to the Miami Marlins in 2020 by Toronto and currently playing for the Beloit Snappers, leads the minors with 21 homers. Conine also tops the High-A Central in total bases (127), slugging (.599), OPS (.990) and RBIs (54).

Roster Transaction: Infielder **Max Schuemann** (Portage Northern H.S. / Eastern Michigan University), who ranks first in Minor League Baseball with 34 stolen bases, was promoted today to Double-A Midland. Schuemann is tied for third in the Minors with 14 HBPs and was tied for third in the High-A Central with 43 runs scored.

Bruised: Lansing leads the High-A Central with 56 HBPs, no thanks to the Nuts' games against Great Lakes (53 HBPs). Loons pitchers hit two more Lugnuts on Sunday and have plunked 18 Lugnuts batters this season.

Call to Arms: The Lugnuts' pitching staff ranks second in the High-A Central with a 3.61 earned run average as well as second with a 1.27 WHIP, pitching the third most innings in the league (526 2/3), issuing the second fewest walks (195) and recording the fourth most strikeouts (596).

A Complete Effort: Right-hander **Jack Cushing's** seven-inning complete game in Game 2 of Friday night's doubleheader was the fourth complete game by a High-A Central pitcher this year. Cushing tossed one complete game while at Georgetown University, a nine-inning CG on April 13, 2019, at Villanova.

Heavy Workload: Lugs lefty **Dalton Sawyer**, who missed the 2018-2019 seasons due to Tommy John and so did not pitch in a game between the 2017-2018 offseason this year, is making up for lost time. Saturday marked his 23rd relief appearance of the season, tying for most in the circuit.

JULY 10, NOT TODAY, IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2015: Ryan McBroom collected hits in his first three at-bats, giving him nine straight at-bats with a hit, before it ended one AB shy of the MWL record on a sacrifice fly. The Lugnuts lost at Dayton, 4-3.

2018: The Lugnuts erased a 7-2 ninth-inning deficit at Burlington with five runs – but a power surge caused by a gathering storm shut off a first-base side light tower, causing a delay in the middle of the ninth. The Bees called for assistance but were told that the problem could not be fixed. Thus, they did not cover the field when the storm arrived with brief but heavy rain. 30 minutes later, the lights were fixed (by turning them off and then back on again) and the storm had passed, but the umpires ruled the game was over and the Lugnuts' rally was wiped away.

Root, Root, Root for the Home Team: July 4th's Lugnuts/Dragons series finale drew a season-high attendance of 10,109. That's a larger crowd than any of the Blue Jays' home games this season in Dunedin or Buffalo and it's higher than the average attendance in MLB for the Detroit Tigers (9,717), Baltimore Orioles (8,654), Pittsburgh Pirates (8,237), Tampa Bay Rays (6,783), Oakland Athletics (6,403), Miami Marlins (5,983) and Toronto/Buffalo/Dunedin Blue Jays (3,877). Only eight of the 119 other Minor League teams have drawn a larger crowd to a game this season: Albuquerque, Nashville, Charlotte, Fresno, Indianapolis, Round Rock, Durham and Las Vegas.

Major League Lugnuts: Three former Nuts have made their Major League debuts this season, bringing the total to 157 all-time – pitcher **Ty Tice** '18, outfielder **Josh Palacios** '16-'17, and pitcher **Taylor Saucedo** '16-'17. Tice and Palacios made their first MLB appearance in the same game for the Toronto Blue Jays on April 9th. It was the seventh time in team history that two Lugnuts made their MLB debut in the same game, with the first occurring on September 14, 1998: **Carlos Fables** and **Carlos Beltrán** for the Kansas City Royals. Saucedo most recently debuted, tossing a scoreless inning for the Blue Jays on June 17.

Record-Setting, For Better: On June 15, **Max Schuemann** broke **Samad Taylor**'s franchise single-game record of four steals in a game (set July 1, 2018) with five stolen bases against the Great Lakes Loons.

Record-Setting, For Worse: On June 20, **Stevie Emanuels** broke the franchise single game record, tied many times before, of three homers served up in a game, giving up four HRs to the Loons – two apiece by Deacon Liput and Andy Pages.

So Many Starters: The Lugnuts have used 14 different starting pitchers this season, namely **Brady Basso**, **Reid Birlingmair**, **Jeff Criswell**, **Jack Cushing**, **David Leal**, **Stevie Emanuels**, **Richard Guasch**, **Rafael Kelly**, **Bryce Nightengale**, **Colin Peluse**, **Leudeny Pineda**, **Seth Shuman**, **Shohei Tomioka** and **Brock Whittlesey**.

Roster Index: When he appears in his first Lugnuts game, **Marcos Brito** will become the 844th Lugnut all-time and the 40th player used this year. The 2021 Lugnuts have already surpassed the total number of players used in the 1999 and 2008 seasons (38 apiece). The franchise record for most players used in a single year is 54, set in 2017. Currently, about 18.6% of all Lugnuts are reaching the Major Leagues (157 of 844). If that percentage continues to hold true, at least seven of the 40 players to see time this year with the Nuts will reach MLB.

A Pleasant Peninsula Surrounds You: **Max Schuemann** (Portage Northern H.S.) is the first Lugnut to hail from Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti. Earlier this season, the Nuts featured two Michigan Wolverines in **Jeff Criswell** (injured) and **Jack Weisenburger** (promoted).

Finally: Pitchers **Jeff Criswell**, **Stevie Emanuels** and **Shohei Tomioka**, catchers **Jared McDonald**, **Drew Millas** and **William Simoneit**, first baseman **Patrick McColl**, and outfielder **Michael Guldberg** have all made their pro debut this season with the Lugnuts.

Front Office Connections: Lugnuts pitching coach **Don Schulze** was drafted 11th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 1980, 12 picks before Oakland Executive Vice President of Baseball Operations **Billy Beane** was drafted by the New York Mets. Lugnuts first baseman **Patrick McColl** set a new Harvard baseball single season record with 70 hits in 2019, breaking the previous record held by Athletics General Manager David Forst.

Clubhouse of Higher Learning: The Ivy League is well represented on the Lansing roster. First baseman **Patrick McColl** played for Harvard University, reliever **Michael Danielak** was drafted from Dartmouth College and catcher **William Simoneit** spent four years at Cornell University before grad-transferring to Wake Forest. Speaking of outstanding academic institutions, starter **Jack Cushing** spent four years at Georgetown University.

Power Five Baseball: The Lugnuts also represent the ACC (**Michael Guldberg**, Georgia Tech); Big 12 (**Brady Basso**, Oklahoma State); Big Ten (**Dalton Sawyer**, Minnesota); the SEC (**Cobie Vance**, Alabama); and the Pac-12 (**Stevie Emanuels**, Washington).

International Appeal: In addition to 17 different states (Arizona, California, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Nevada (Connor Hughes), North Carolina, Ohio (Scott Steinmann), Texas, Virginia, Washington) represented by Lugnuts players and coaching staff, seven nations are represented: USA, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Japan, South Africa (Anthony Phillips) and Venezuela (Javier Godard).

Representing His Country: 1B/3B **Jordan Diaz** played for Colombia in Olympic Baseball Qualifying play, blasting a game-tying home run in the 9th against Venezuela, but Colombia lost all three games in opening pool play and was eliminated. Team USA won the tournament, punching a ticket to Japan.

- Started Opening Day, May 4 vs. Lake County, and dazzled: 4 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 7 K, needing only 50 pitches (37 strikes)... both hits allowed were Bryan Lavastida singles... departed with Lugnuts leading, 7-0... Nuts went on to win, 8-1... catcher: Drew Millas.
- Started May 15 at Dayton, tossing two perfect innings on 29 pitches (21 strikes) with 2 K's... catcher: William Simoneit.
- Appeared in relief May 20 at Fort Wayne, as part of four-pitcher, 18 strikeout gem; followed Richard Guasch, who threw five scoreless innings with seven strikeouts; handled the 6th and 7th innings with 5 K's, allowing solo HR to Dwanya Williams-Sutton; Lugnuts won, 12-1... catcher: William Simoneit.
- Started vs. Great Lakes, May 27... tossed 2 2/3 innings, allowing three hits, two walks, one HBP, one run and striking out four in Lugnuts 10-1 loss to the Loons... Loons broke the game open with nine unearned runs in the sixth inning against Richard Guasch and Charles Hall, handing Lugnuts a 10-1 defeat... catcher: William Simoneit.
- Started June 2 vs. South Bend, charged with loss... allowed one unearned run (due to a Millas throwing error) in four innings on three hits, no walks, with three strikeouts... used 73 pitches, 47 strikes... Cubs added two runs in 7th, one in 8th against Michael Danieliak, beating Lugnuts, 4-1... catcher: Drew Millas.
- Scratched from his scheduled start on June 9 at West Michigan in favor of reliever Brock Whittlesey because of the threat of rain in forecast, but when rain never arrived, relieved Whittlesey (1.2 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 2 K) with two outs in the 2nd inning and tossed 4 1/3 innings, allowing one hit, one run and one walk with four strikeouts... received the victory as the Lugnuts cruised to an 8-1 win over the Whitecaps... only 'Caps run came when Rey Rivera led off the 5th with a single, moved to second and third on back-to-back Shuman wild pitches, and scored on a Trei Cruz groundout... catcher: Drew Millas.
- Started June 16 vs. Great Lakes, charged with the loss after allowing four runs (three earned) in five innings, striking out eight and walking none... gave up a James Outman triple and an Andy Pages two-run homer in the 3rd... allowed a Ryan January RBI double in the 4th... gave up an unearned run (due to Cobie Vance error) in the 5th... Lugnuts fell, 6-4.
- Started Game 2 of the doubleheader at Cedar Rapids, June 23... tossed five shutout innings, allowing two hits, striking out six, and received no-decision... relievers Dalton Sawyer and Charles Hall allowed an unearned run in the 6th and the Lugnuts lost, 1-0.
- Started June 30 vs. Dayton: 5 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 0 BB, 2 K in a no-decision... Dragons' only run came in the fourth inning on a Victor Ruiz sacrifice fly... Lugnuts won, 8-3, with a five-run sixth inning blowing open a 1-1 game... catcher: Drew Millas.



Professional Career Entering 2021: Drafted 194th overall in the 6th round from Georgia Southern in 2019, signed for \$235,000 (one round in front of Lugnuts teammate Millas)... one of 10 2019 draftees on the Lugnuts roster... made pro debut with Short-Season A NYPL Vermont Lake Monsters on June 29, 2019... of 14 runs allowed in 11 games in 2019, nine came in two poor outings; dominated otherwise, finishing with back-to-back five-inning scoreless performances.

Family Ties: Seth's father, Bart, was the starting shortstop on the 1979 NCAA Division-II National Champion Valdosta State Blazers, hitting .277 and striking out just eight times in 61 games... sister, Sloan, was a two-time national champion cheerleader at Valdosta State... brother, Scott, nine years older (first name: Rutherford), was drafted in the 19th round in 2009 by Tampa Bay from Auburn University and pitched in the Midwest League with the 2010 Bowling Green Hot Rods (3.01, 14 saves, 46 G, 71 2/3 IP, 38 BB, 111 K), rose as high as Double-A, and spent the 2019 season as a relief ace for independent Lancaster.

Glory Days on the Diamond: Coached by his father, Bart, at Valdosta High School... named Region 1-6A Pitcher of the Year as a senior after posting 1.53 ERA, with 80 strikeouts and 15 walks in 59 innings... tossed a no-hitter vs. Tift HS... 1st-team All-Region infielder, hitting .313 with 20 BB / 13 K.

Glory Days on the Gridiron: Starting quarterback at Valdosta H.S., named 2nd-Team All-State by the Georgia Sports Writers Association and Honorable Mention All-State by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution in 2015, breaking the school's single-season passing record with 3,194 yards... 25 touchdowns, 3 interceptions... Valdosta High School football is one of the nation's most storied programs, owning the most wins in USA history (929) in addition to six national championships and 24 state championships.

Saying No to the O's: Shuman was drafted in the 39th round from Valdosta HS in 2016 by the Baltimore Orioles, 11 picks ahead of the Toronto Blue Jays' selection of 2018 Lugnuts outfielder Chavez Young... Orioles drafted his high school teammate, DL Hall, 21st overall in 2017, signing him for \$3 million... Baltimore drafted a third Valdosta HS baseball player, outfielder Colby Thomas, in the 37th round in 2019, but Thomas turned down the Orioles to attend college (in his case, Mercer University).

Speaking of Valdosta: The only Valdosta Wildcat to make the Major Leagues to date is Buck Coats, who played for the Chicago Cubs (2006), Cincinnati Reds (2007) and Toronto Blue Jays (2008). Coats, coincidentally, played two full seasons with the Lugnuts, 2002 and 2003, totaling 265 games and 989 at-bats.

Transitioning from Football to Baseball in Statesboro: Wore No. 10 and played in four games as a freshman QB on Georgia Southern football team, taking 114 snaps, in 2016-2017, passing for 357 yards and a touchdown and rushing for 39 yards... considered a walk-on with Georgia Southern baseball due to football scholarship, and split his time between baseball and spring football... quickly impressed as an impact pitcher as a freshman, going 8-0, 3.34, 46 2/3 IP, 49 K, and received the honor of the start in Sun Belt Tournament Championship game vs. South Alabama (received no-decision)... left football team after freshman year to gain full baseball scholarship... named Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference in both 2018 and 2019 as sophomore and junior... named First-Team All-Sun Belt Conference in 2019 (3.83, 16 GS, 91 2/3 IP, 27 BB, 114 K)... earned nickname "The Franchise" at Georgia Southern because of his importance to the program during his three years.

Fly Eagles Fly: Georgia Southern University baseball has produced 17 Major Leaguers, led by Joey Hamilton, John Tudor, Scott Fletcher, Todd Greene, Sam Howard, longtime MiLB manager Marty Pevey, and longtime MiLB manager John Tamargo Sr., father of the former Lugnuts hitting coach and manager John Tamargo, Jr.

A Fun Georgia Southern Note: The Eagles' most notable game in team history might have been on March 15, 2008, when they hit 14 home runs in a 26-8 victory over Columbia. In the eighth inning alone, the Eagle crushed five homers, including three consecutive shots by pinch-hitters. "I thought we took some good swings, and certainly conditions with the wind were right for it today, as well," coach Rodney Hennon said afterward.
