EL PASO CHIHUAHUAS (0-0) AT ALBUQUERQUE ISOTOPES (0-0)

Friday, March 29, 2024 • 6:35 p.m. (MT) • RGCU Field • Albuquerque, NM Game #1, Home Game #1

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes open the 2024 season against the El Paso Chihuahuas, the first time Albuquerque and El Paso will square off to begin a campaign. The Chihuahuas are the 11th club the Isotopes have played to begin a season ... March 29 is also the earliest game played in Isotopes history, surpassing the previous mark set last year on March 31 at Round Rock.

TONIGHT'S STARTERS: Noah Davis is expected to take the hill for the Isotopes while Nolan Watson is slated to start for the Chihuahuas ... Davis becomes the third Albuquerque hurler to make two Opening Night starts after getting the Opening Night nod in 2023 (also: RHP Stephen Fife (2013 vs lowa, 2014 at Tacoma; RHP Jeff Hoffman (2017 and 2019 vs. Salt Lake).

OPENING NIGHT: Albuquerque hosts Opening Night at RGCU Field at Isotopes Park for the 10th time overall (6-3) and first since 2021 when Sugar Land defeated the Isotopes, 9-4 ... Allsince 2021 When Sugar Land defeated the Isotopes, 9-4 ... Alli-time, Albuquerque is 11-9 in the season opener after beating Round Rock, 9-4, to begin 2023, the club's first Opening day win since 2017 (vs. Salt Lake, 7-4) ... Overall, they have lost seven of their last nine openers since winning 10 of their first 11 in franchise history.

HOME OPENERS: All-time, the Isotopes are 14-6 in home openers after claiming a 7-5 win over Salt Lake in 2023, ending a three-game home opening skid.

TRIPLE-A DEBUT: Outfielder Jordan Beck and first baseman Grant Lavigne are the only two members of the Opening Day roster scheduled to make their Triple-A debut. Beck enters the season as Colorado's fourth-best prospect (according to MLB. com) while Lavigne was a 2018 first-round pick.

PROSPECTS: Four players on MLB.com's top 30 Rockies prospects list will start the season with Albuquerque: Beck, Drew Romo (No. 9), Hunter Goodman (No. 12) and Greg Jones (No.

MLB EXPERIENCE: The Opening Day roster features 16 players who have seen time in the Major Leagues. Right-handed reliever John Curtiss has registered the most MLB service time (three years and 137 days)

RUN IT BACK: Second-year manager Pedro Lopez welcomes a record-setting 21 returning players back to Albuquerque, including 20 that played on the 2023 squad.

WHAT'S MY AGE AGAIN?: Ty Blach and Matt Koch will share the role of elder statesmen at the outset, as both are 33-years-

2023 ATTENDANCE: Albuquerque led the Pacific Coast League in total attendance in 2023 (521,521) for the first time in club history while also pacing the circuit in average attendance (7,048) for the second time (2022).

RADIO WAVES: Due to the NCAA Tournament, this weekend's otopes games will air on KKOB 96.3 FM/770 AM.

IN MEMORIAM: The Isotopes will fly the American flag at half-staff and hold a moment of silence in honor of the following people who have passed away: Justin Hare, Cliff Tanner, Ron Jaynes, Venzor Pedro and Lou Golson.

EL PASO TIES: Ryan Carpenter pitched for the Isotopes in 2016 and 2017. He was chosen as the club's Pitcher of the Year in 2017 while registering 10 wins and 161 strikeouts, the secondmost punchouts in a campaign in club history.

PITCHING COACH: Chris Michalak is the first Isotopes pitching coach to serve back-to-back years in the role since Brandon Emanuel from 2018-19.

2024 FIRST-HALF SCHEDULE: The Isotopes will face six teams over the 75 games in the first half, which ends June 23, with 45 contests against Oklahoma City (24) and El Paso (21) ... Of the 21 games against the Chihuahuas this season, nine contests will be played at RGCU Field at Isotopes Park

THREE GAME SETS: This is one of two three-game series the Isotopes will play this year (also: July 19-21 at Sacramento).

VS. EL PASO: In 2023, the Isotopes beat the Chihuahuas 18 times in 24 contests—the most wins by an Albuquerque club over an opponent in one season in franchise history, including two winning streaks of five-plus wins (longest: six, June 29-Aug. 15) Over the 12 games at Isotopes Park last season, Albuquerque

OPENING DAY LINEUP 2023: Infeilders Coco Montes and Aaron Schunk along with starter Noah Davis are the lone holdovers from last year's Opening Day Lineup.

BEHIND THE DISH: Drew Romo will become the 15th Isotopes player to serve as catcher on Opening Day.

WINS IN A SEASON: Albuquerque's 68 wins in 2023 were its most since 2017, when the team finished 68-73.

BAGS ON THE YEAR: For the 2023 season, the team stole 173 bases, the second-most in team history (most: 178, 2003).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
