LAST TIME OUT

For the first time in a week, the Emeralds begin a gameday no longer in first place after dropping their third straight game (a season-high) on Wednesday night, falling to the Frogs by a final of 9-4. Everett jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first and never looked back, scoring in six of eight innings to ultimately cruise to the victory after hanging on for an 8-6 victory the night prior. Julio Rodriguez and Austin Shenton each belted homers for Everett while the Emeralds were only able to muster five hits over the games first eight innings. The Emeralds did, however, see the return of Ismael Munguia who had missed the previous two weeks having been with the Nicaraguan National Team at the Olympic Qualifying Tournament in Florida. Every at-bat of Munguia's was productive one Wednesday night, going 2-for-2 with a walk, a sac fly, and two runs scored. With the loss, the Emeralds are now 0.5 games behind the AquaSox in the High-A West standings.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

RHP Travis Perry will look to stop the slide for the Emeralds as he makes just his second start of the season tonight. Perry has slid into the rotation spot previously occupied by RHP Kai-Wei Teng who is currently serving a 10-game suspension. The New Jersey native put forth a solid start his last time out despite not having his best stuff, firing 4.0 IP with 5 H, 2 R, 1 ER, 1 BB and 2 K. For the third consecutive day, the Emeralds will be facing off against one of the Seattle Mariners' top 30 prospects in RHP Levi Stoudt, the 13th ranked prospect in the Mariners system. Stoudt is coming off his best performance of the season (6/2 vs. HIL) where he fired 5.0 IP with 5 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 3 BB and a career-high 10 K. For the second consecutive day, the Emeralds will get another big bat back in the lineup as OF Diego Rincones is scheduled to be in the lineup for the first time since rejoining the team after playing for the Venezuelan National Team at the Olympic Qualifying Tournament in Florida.

QUICK HITS

Olympic Additions

The Emeralds saw three players return to the roster - RHP Jasier Herrera, OF Ismael Munguia, and OF Diego Rincones - after each recently competed in the Olympic Qualifying Tournament held in Florida:

- Herrera (Columbia): 1 APP (vs. Venezuela) | 2.0 IP, 1 H, 1 BB, 0 R, 0 K

- Munguia (Nicaragua): 3 games | 6-for-12 (.500), 1 2B, 2 R. Led team in AVG.

- Rincones (Venezuela): 5 games | 4-for-19 (.211), 1 2B, 1 HR, 2 R | Hit walk-off HR vs. Columbia in bottom of 9th.

Munguia departed the team as the team's RBI leader at the time (14) and, in his final at-bat before leaving, delivered a walk-off hit to defeat the Spokane Indians on May 27. Rincones left the Ems as one of the best statistical sluggers in the High-A West, ranking 2nd in slugging (.630), 2nd in OPS (1.042), T-3rd in batting average (.333), T-3rd in HR (4), and T-5th in OBP% (.413). Herrera, who started the season with the Emeralds, had been promoted to Triple-A Sacramento days prior to his departure to join the Colombian National Team.

Full Arsenal For The Frogs

While Eugene has been no stranger to seeing top talent from the Giants farm system, including boasting three first rounders to start the season (C Patrick Bailey, OF Hunter Bishop, and INF Will Wilson), the AquaSox boast one of the most robust collections of raw talent on one roster in all of Minor League Baseball, carrying an eye-popping 13 of the Seattle Mariners' top 30 prospects, per MLB.com:

Strikeout Savants

Through 32 games, the Eugene pitching staff leads the High-A West in strikeouts (378). Their 378 collective strikeouts are 25 more than the next closest team (Everett - 353). But it doesn't stop there... the Emeralds don't just lead the High-A West, they lead all of High-A, too, with the Cedar Rapids Kernels the next closest at 356. Across all of Minor League Baseball, Eugene's 378 K's rank 5th. Coincidentally, the San Jose Giants (San Francisco - Low A) lead all of Minor League Baseball with 408 K's.

Kilian Killed It

RHP Caleb Kilian was promoted to Double-A Richmond on the end of May after dominating the High-A West in his four starts as an Emerald. The highlight came last Saturday when Kilian fired 6.2 perfect innings against the Dust Devils before allowing the first base runner of the day on a two-out double. Unphased, Kilian retired the next batter to cap a career-high 7.0 inning performance while tallying a career-high ten strikeouts in the process. After his near-perfect start, Kilian leaves the Northwest currently ranked at or near the top of virtually every notable statistical category in the High-A West:

Marte was one of a number of notable departures from the Emeralds, and his numbers in Eugene certainly speak for themselves. Upon his departure to join Double-A Richmond, Marte found himself tied for the league lead in saves (3) after working himself in-and-out of a jam by striking out the

side last Thursday. The starter-turned-reliever has excelled in his newfound role coming out of the bullpen, starting the season with five straight scoreless outings with 14 K's scattered over 6.1 innings of work. The right-hander has yet to allow a walk this season and has only seen three hits come against him.

Good runner in game action. Also took the mound, works from a balanced, smooth delivery. Shows a loose arm action, stays compact and releases from a three-quarter arm slot. Looks polished for his age, and not a lot of effort to his delivery. Fastball touched 84 mph and shows life. Throws a sharp 11-5 curveball, and spots it down in the zone. High upside pitcher with more velocity on the way. Very good student." Signed with the Giants for \$125,000. After a rocky first appearance of the season (5/5 at SPO), Perry has fired 18.0 IP with 9 H, 3 R, 2 ER, 4 BB and 21 K since.

opponents' batting average. That potential appeased the Mariners, who took him in the third round of the 2019 Draft, making him one of four college pitchers Seattle selected in the Top 100 picks. Shortly after the Draft, the righty experienced elbow fatigue, which eventually led to Tommy John surgery. After undergoing the procedure right after he signed, Stoudt recovered incredibly well, pitching in the Mariners' fall developmental league, where his fastball was as high as 97 mph with a ton of ride up in the zone. Though it doesn't have a ton of movement, he's located it well in short stints. The changeup is the pitch that has Mariners scouts drooling, particularly with the depth and fade Stoudt delivers it with, as well as his ability to land it for strikes. His curveball and slider have a ton of potential, too. Following his performance in Arizona last fall, if Stoudt continues to recover positively, he could be stretched out further to a full season in the Minors. His upside has back-end starter ceiling potential.

PITCHES: Fastball, Curveball, Slider, Changeup

Notes: #13 prospect in Seattle Mariners system per MLB.com. A quick ascent at Lehigh University to the conference's all-freshman team showed Stoudt had early potential. He followed it up with a stellar sophomore campaign, not allowing a single homer over his first two seasons, and he capped it as the ace of the staff while leading the team in innings, complete games and
