CUNNINGHAM MAKING HISTORY: TinCaps outfielder **Jake Cunningham** tied a franchise record, hitting three home runs. Cunningham is the 4th player in Fort Wayne franchise history to hit three long balls in a contest, being the first to do so since **Robert Hassell III** did so in 2021. Hassell's was the first by a TinCap since **Jonathan Galvez** hit three on July 22, 2010, vs. Peoria. The only Wizard to accomplish the feat was **Jon Benick** (July 3, 2002, vs. Quad Cities). Cunningham had as many home runs on Friday as he did in 76 games in High-A Aberdeen in 2025 and is now second in the Midwest League this season with 13. The 23-year-old began the scoring with a three-run home run in the first, then followed it up with a two-run blast in the third, and capped it off with a solo home run in the fifth. The total distance of the three home runs was 1,184 feet, 22.4% of a mile.

CUNNINGHAM CLOBBERING: Fort Wayne slugger **Jake Cunningham** drove in a career-high 6 runs off his three long balls on Friday night. His 13 home runs are the most on the team and rank second in the Midwest League. Among hitters with as many plate appearances in the league dating back to May 26, Cunningham leads the pack in home runs (6) and is slashing .294/.400/.853 with a 1.253 OPS. The former 5th round pick of the Orioles has all 3 multi-homer games for a TinCap this season, with two of them coming against Lake County. The only other of his playing career was in college with UNC Charlotte on May 15, 2022, at Florida Atlantic.

TOUGH BREAK: Cunningham's three-home run performance was one of two in the Midwest League Friday night. Beloit's **Carlos Sanchez** powered the fourth three-home run game in franchise history and second this season, driving in four runs. Despite the historical performances, both Fort Wayne and Beloit dropped their contests. **It is the first-ever recorded time in affiliated baseball that two players on the same day have hit 3+ home runs and their team lost.** Minor League data dates back to 2005, with MLB data dating back to 1901. The feat of a player hitting 3+ home runs and their team still losing has happened 82 times in MiLB since 2005, and six times in the Midwest League. Both performances last night were the first since the league moved to High-A. No MiLB player since at least 2005 has hit 4 HR in a game and the team still lost; it has happened twice in MLB history.

JD JUST DOING IT: TinCap infielder **Justin DeCriscio** finished Friday night going 3-for-5 at the plate, his third multi-hit showing in High-A in his 19 games played. DeCriscio played hero Tuesday night with his walk-off single to complete the 6-5 comeback. The 2025 10th-round pick of the Padres slashed .311/.363/.544 with a .907 OPS in 28 games with Single-A Lake Elsinore to begin 2026 and had a hit in 19 of his final 22 games with the Storm, leading up to his promotion. DeCriscio has eight hits in his last four games, which includes a three-hit performance in last Sunday's series finale at South Bend.

KT WANTS TO RULE THE WORLD: Fort Wayne outfielder **Kavares Tears** clobbered his fifth home run of the season on Thursday, his second in as many games. The 454-foot shot to center field is the longest recorded home run hit by a TinCap this season. The former fourth-round pick of the Padres has three long balls against Lake County this season, with the first coming on April 14, his first at the High-A level. Tears later added a triple in the ninth frame, and now has 4 extra-base hits in his last 4 games. The 23-year-old also has a hit in six of his last eight games and has driven in 15 runs in his last 13.

FOURTH OF JULY FIREWORKS: The City of Fort Wayne announced Thursday that the top of the Harrison Square parking garage that's attached to Parkview Field in downtown Fort Wayne will be the location for this year's Fourth of July fireworks show on Saturday, July 4. The fireworks show is scheduled to begin at 10 p.m., with ticketed fans being able to watch the display. Tickets will be sold even after the end of the game for fans hoping to watch the fireworks display. The top six highest single-game attendances in franchise history are all on the Fourth of July, and the 250th anniversary of American Independence is on the brink of breaking the TinCaps' single-game attendance record of 9,508.

This Day in Baseball
1992 - **Eddie Murray** of the Mets becomes the all-time leader in RBI by a switch-hitter. He passes Mickey Mantle with his 1,510th RBI.

2006 - **Jason Schmidt** matches a 102-year-old Giants franchise record with 16 strikeouts, fanning his final three batters to escape a 9th-inning jam and preserve a 2-1 victory over the Florida Marlins.

2017 - **Scotter Gennett** of the Reds has a night for the ages as he homers four times and drives in ten runs in a 13-1 drubbing of the Cardinals. The usually light-hitting infielder goes 5-for-5 after entering the game with three homers on the year and having just come out of a 0-for-19 slump the day before.

WALK IT OFF: Fort Wayne now has three walk-off wins in 2026 following **Justin DeCriscio's** game-winning RBI single in the 9th inning Tuesday night. It's the second straight series with a walk-off win for the 'Caps, as Jack Costello blasted a game-winning three-run homer on May 22 in the 9th against Dayton. Rosman Verdugo delivered the first walk-off victory on a base hit against Lansing on April 9. It was also the team's first win at home in 2026 and Verdugo's first hit of the campaign. Fort Wayne had 4 walk-off victories in 2025, three of which were by Brandon Butterworth, including the last coming on July 30 against Great Lakes.

MAKE WAY FOR THE KING: TinCap catcher **Lamar King Jr.** collected his fifth hit of the series in Thursday night's loss. The 22-year-old has a hit in eight of the nine games he has faced Lake County this season, going 14-for-33 (.424). King Jr. launched his first High-A home run against the Captains at Classic Auto Group Park on April 16, toward the beginning of his season-long 27-game on-base streak. It was the longest stretch for a TinCap since Tirso Ornelas did so in 2018. Across the stretch, King Jr. slashed .326/.418/.463 with a .881 OPS, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 HR, 12 RBI, 13 BB, and 6 SB.

COSTELLO CRUSHING: TinCap first baseman **Jack Costello** collected his second triple of the season Friday night and has a hit in 5 of his last 7 games. Costello began the series with a two-run home run and sacrifice fly on Tuesday before driving in his fourth run of the slate on Wednesday. Costello's walk-off home run against Dayton on May 22 was the first walk-off blast for Fort Wayne since Joshua Mears did so on June 21, 2024, against Wisconsin. The 25-year-old leads the Midwest League with 9 doubles dating back to May 9.

DUGIE KEEPS CLIMBING: Fort Wayne third baseman **Rosman Verdugo** hit his eighth home run of the season Thursday, May 28. Verdugo now has 22 across his TinCaps career, passing Fernando Tatis Jr. for seventh in career home runs. Verdugo is the 10th player in Fort Wayne franchise history to hit the 20-career home run mark. After leading the 'Caps with 13 home runs in 2025, 7 of Verdugo's 8 home runs in 2026 have come on the road. The 21-year-old has reached base safely in his last 18 games and has a hit in 8 of his last 9.

FLIPPING THE SCRIPT: The 'Caps' walk-off win on Tuesday marked their first Tuesday win of the 2026 season. Before last night, Fort Wayne was 0-7 this season on Tuesdays and 1-8 in series openers. Opponents had out-scored Fort Wayne 49-17 in Tuesday contests before the win.

DIALING UP THE LONG BALL: Fort Wayne clubbed out a Midwest League-leading 10 home runs as a team in the last series against Lake County the week of April 14-19. Five of the round-trippers came in the Thursday night win, marking the 3rd time in the TinCaps era (2009-present) Fort Wayne has clubbed 5 in a game. All three games have been managed by Jonathan Mathews, with the other two being in the 2023 season. The first in the 'Caps era came on June 29, 2023, at Classic Auto Group Park. On the weekend, Fort Wayne had both an eight-run third on that Saturday and a six-run seventh on Sunday.

SWIPING HOME: **Zach Evans'** straight steal of home in the fifth inning Friday, May 15, was the **first TinCaps straight steal of home in Parkview Field history.** It is the third straight steal of home in franchise history, with data dating back to 2005.

The other two instances:

- May 25, 2017: Fernando Tatis Jr. @ Bowling Green vs. RHP Pete Bayer (Top 5, 1 out, Before First Pitch)
- April 16, 2013: Corey Adamson @ South Bend vs. LHP Cody Wheeler (Top 5, 1 out, Before First Pitch)

In the expansion era (1961-present), only two MLB games have ever ended 1-0 with the lone run being a straight-steal of home. Reds' Chico Ruiz on Sept. 21, 1964 vs. the Phillies and the Royals' Amos Otis on July 31, 1972 vs. the California Angels (off Nolan Ryan).

APRIL PLAYER OF THE MONTH: On Tuesday, Minor League Baseball announced Fort Wayne TinCaps outfielder **Alex McCoy** as its Midwest League Player of the Month for April. In 22 games, the No. 20 Padres prospect batted .354/.386/.683 and led the league in hits (29), doubles (10), and slugging percentage (.683). He finished second in average (.354), total bases (56), and OPS (1.069) and was fifth in home runs (five). McCoy earned nine multi-hit games, including three with multiple extra-base hits. McCoy is the sixth TinCap player to win Player of the Month since the Midwest League began issuing the award in 2013. It is the second consecutive season a TinCap has earned April's nod, with baseball's No. 4 prospect, shortstop Leo De Vries, winning the award in 2025. Others include current Cleveland Guardians left-handed pitcher Joey Cantillo (June 2019), DH Hudson Potts (August 2017), C Austin Allen (April 2016), and OF Nick Shultz (August 2014).

CAPS IN THE TOP 30: Fort Wayne has 8 of the Padres' Top 30 prospects according to MLB Pipeline's latest rankings. **LHP Kash Mayfield** leads the crop as the No. 4 prospect, along with **RHP Tucker Musgrove (No. 9)**, as the top arms. **C/1B Lamar King Jr. (No. 14)**, **OF Alex McCoy (No. 19)**, and **OF Kavares Tears (No. 26)** are the three position players. Carson Montgomery (No. 30) is the newcomer to the list, with **RHP Kannon Kemp (No. 17)** and **Jaxon Dalena (No.**

- **FROM:** Centerville, IA
- **COLLEGE:** Indian Hills Community College (Iowa) and the University of New Orleans
- **PLAYING CAREER:** Drafted in the 42nd Round of the 1994 MLB Draft by the Colorado Rockies, played one season
- **COACHING CAREER:** Mathews returns to Fort Wayne for his third stint with the organization and second as the team's manager. Began coaching career at the University of Iowa and then in the Minnesota Twins' organization after his playing career. Became the hitting coach for the High-A Fort Myers Miracle in 1997, before managing the rookie-level Elizabethton Twins in 1998 and '99. Returned to alma mater, coaching at Indian Hills and taught economics from 1999-2012 before returning to professional baseball. Mathews coached in the Baltimore Orioles' farm system in 2013, and Arizona Diamondbacks' system from 2014-2016 before joining the Padres organization in 2017 as their major-league outfield coach. He first spent time in Fort Wayne as the TinCaps hitting coach from 2018-2021 before assuming the same role with Triple-A El Paso in 2022. He took over as the Fort Wayne manager in 2023, leading the TinCaps to a second-half east division title and first playoff appearance since 2017. He has spent the last two years as a minor league hitting coordinator.

Pitching Coach

Age: 41

- **FROM:** Maracay, Venezuela
- **SIGNED:** July 19, 2000 (Florida Marlins) as international free agent
- **CAREER:** Made 25 big league appearances, including eight starts across four seasons from 2005 to 2009. He also played 10 seasons in the minor leagues, accruing 1,112 innings pitched and a 3.91 ERA. He ended his playing career in 2017 after multiple seasons away from the states in Venezuela, Mexico, and Italy.
- **COACHING:** Became a pitching coach in the Pittsburgh Pirates organization in 2018, acting as a pitching coach in the DSL before going stateside in 2021. He then joined the Padres organization in 2023 and spent 2025 as the pitching coach for Single-A Lake Elsinore.
- **RELATIONSHIP:** Older brother of Seattle Mariners reliever Eduard Bazardo, who made nine appearances in the playoffs in 2025.

- **CAREER:** Mendez played in the minors for nine seasons all of which in the Rangers organization totaling 506 games in the minor leagues. Retired from playing after winter league stint in 2018-19.

He returns for his second season as the TinCaps bench coach.

About Parkview Field

- **BACKGROUND:** In 2007, the Fort Wayne City Council approved the Harrison Square Project to build a new ballpark downtown as well as other amenities.
- **DEBUT:** Opening Day for Parkview Field took place on April 16, 2009. The TinCaps played in front of a sold-out crowd and beat the Dayton Dragons 7-0.
- **CAPACITY:** 8,100
- **RECORD CROWD:** 9,508 (July 4, 2019)
- **DIMENSIONS:** 336 feet to the left-field foul pole... 377 feet to left-center field... 400 feet to straight-away centerfield... 383 feet to right-center field... and 318 feet to the right-field foul pole.
- **WALLS:** Range from 10 feet tall, from center to right-center field, up to 15 feet tall in the outfield corners as well as a small section of left-center field.
- **MORE THAN BASEBALL:** Parkview Field hosts hundreds of special events yearly, including concerts such as Florida Georgia Line, Dierks Bentley, Zac Brown Band, and Nelly.
