FIRST HALF CHAMPS!: With the win over Hill City on June 7, the FredNats secured the Carolina League North's first-half title, the only first-half championship in Fredericksburg history. The title is the first for the franchise since the Potomac Nationals' 2018 win.

PALMETTO POWER: The FredNats are making their first journey to South Carolina this season, with a two-week trip to Columbia and Myrtle Beach. This season, the FredNats are now 6-1 against teams from South Carolina, sweeping Augusta on opening weekend, and going 3-1 to start the week against Columbia.

THE PITCHING: The FredNats currently hold the second-best ERA in all of Single-A as a team at 3.87. Each of the top four teams in the Single-A ERA rankings come from the Carolina League, led by Kannapolis. The FredNats are also in a three-way tie for the most shutouts at the level, with eight this season.

STARTER LENGTH: Starter length has been a key indicator of the FredNats' success this season. Over the last 10 games, FredNat starters have thrown four or more innings six times, with the FredNats 5-1 in those games.

A VERY HAPPY FOURTH: Always one of the most important days on the Minor League Baseball calendar, the FredNats have been top performers on the Fourth of July. After beating Delmarva last season on the holiday, the FredNats are now 4-1 on the Fourth since relocation, having won each of the last four years on July 4.

FUTURE IS BRIGHT: Both Washington Nationals representatives at the 2026 MLB Future Game are alumni of the 2026 FredNats. 2025 no. 1 overall Eli Willits highlights the National League roster, spending the end of 2025 with the FredNats and starting 2026 in Fredericksburg before being called up to High-A Wilmington on June 8, the day after the FredNats secured the first-half championship. He's joined on the roster by RHP Miguel Sime Jr., also a member of the 2025 draft class. Sime was called up to High-A after leading all of Minor League Baseball with an 18.5 K/9 in Fredericksburg.

ABOUT COLUMBIA: A member of the Carolina League since 2021, the Columbia Fireflies, Single-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals, previous spent time in the Single-A South Atlantic League. Relocated from Savannah, GA in 2015, the franchise was previously affiliated with the New York Mets.

A RECORD BREAKING SEASON: Clinching a title on June 7 with a win against Hill City, the FredNats followed their title by winning their 46th game of the first half the following Wednesday, besting the 1982 Alexandria Dukes' 45-20 first half to break the franchise record.

ANOTHER RECORD FALLS: The FredNats broke another record last Thursday, as the fastest team in franchise history to 50 wins. The previous record (as far back as game-by-game data exists to 2004), was set by 2013 Potomac, who needed 80 games. The record since relocation belonged to the 2024 team, who needed 85 games, with current FredNats Austin Amaral and Travis Sthele winning games 49 and 50.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: The FredNats have been the top team at home in the Carolina League this year, holding a 28-11 record in FXBG. The FredNats also got off to one of their best starts overall and at home this season, beginning the year 12-1 at home.

ABOUT LAST YEAR: The FredNats finished last season at 65-64 overall, winning the North division's second-half title to advance to the playoffs for the second straight year. The FredNats' season ended in a 2-0 series loss to Hill City in the Division Series.

FREDNATS BASEBALL NETWORK IS BACK: Once again, all 132 FredNat games this season will be broadcast live on the FredNats Baseball Network, with Luke West Poley and Adam Gotkin beginning their first seasons calling the action in Fredericksburg. Home games are broadcast on MiLB.tv and the Bally Sports Live App to go along with the audio-only stream at frednats.com/broadcast or the MiLB App. For road games, the radio broadcast is available at the same link. In addition, all FredNats games preceded by a 20 minute pregame show and postgame coverage following each night of action.

A LASTING LEGACY: The Fredericksburg Nationals adopt the franchise history of their predecessors in the Carolina League dating back to 1978...the Alexandria Dukes (1978, 1980-83) and Alexandria Mariners (1979) played at Four Mile Run Park in Alexandria, Virginia...the Prince William Pirates (1984-1986), Prince William Yankees (1987-1988), Prince William Cannons (1989-1998), Potomac Cannons (1999-2004) and Potomac Nationals (2005-2019) played at G. Richard Pfitzner Stadium in Woodbridge, Virginia...the franchise has won six Carolina League championships, as the Dukes in 1982, as the Yankees in 1989, and as the Potomac Nationals in 2008, 2010 and 2014. The franchise won its first league title as the Fredericksburg Nationals in 2024, defeating the Kannapolis Cannon Ballers and winning the title at Virginia Credit Union Stadium. The franchise has appeared in the Carolina League playoffs in three out of the last four seasons, and are playoff bound again in 2026 after the team's first-half division title.

Chris O'Neill - MANAGER

1st Season | Previously: Hitting Coach/Recruiting Coordinator, Virginia Commonwealth University

O'Neill, 36, joins the Nationals organization after two seasons (2024-25) as a hitting coach/recruiting coordinator at Virginia Commonwealth University. Prior to that, he served as an assistant coach and assistant recruiting coordinator at George Washington from 2022-24.

O'Neill is credited with helping fuel major offensive surges at both VCU and George Washington, as both schools set offensive records and contended for Atlantic 10 championships under his watch. O'Neill spent the 2021 season as the director of operations at Duke University and prior to that, he served as an assistant coach at Bucknell University (2020), Marshall University (2018-19) and the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore (2017).

This season will be O'Neill's first time managing since he led the Grand Lake Mariners (Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League) in the summers of 2016 and 2017. A Pennsylvania native, he received his Bachelor's degree in Education from King's College in 2012. O'Neill and his wife Kate have two boys, Easton and Callum.



Luke Dziados - PITCHING COACH

1st Season | Previously: Pitching Trainer - Driveline Baseball (Tampa, Fla.)

Dziados (D-Zay-Dis), 27, comes to the Nationals organization after spending the last two years as a pitching trainer at Driveline Baseball in Tampa, Fla. He capped his college pitching career at Villanova University in 2023 after pitching at Binghamton University from 2018-20. Dziados earned his Bachelor's degree from Binghamton in 2021 and also earned a Graduate Certificate in Leadership from Villanova in 2023.



Jake Scheiner - HITTING COACH

Scheiner, 30, played seven seasons (2017-23) in the Phillies and Mariners organizations. He appeared in 658 Minor League games before signing in 2024 with Hiroshima Toyo Carp of Nippon Professional Baseball in Japan. A native of San Mateo, Calif., Scheiner was drafted in the fourth round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft by the Phillies out of the University of Houston.



Luis Villanueva - ASSISTANT PITCHING COACH

Villanueva, 24, was a performance coach at LAVR Performance where he designed and led throwing programs to improve overall pitching performance for more than 50 athletes prior to joining Washington's coaching ranks. Villanueva attended and played baseball for both Kansas Wesleyan University and MidAmerica Nazarene University.



Anthony Ray - DEFENSIVE COACH

FredNats Career:

Dylan Crews came to Fredericksburg as the number two overall pick in the 2023 MLB draft. After winning the College World Series, Crews reported to the FredNats after just one game in the Florida Complex League. He immediately lit the Carolina League on fire, hitting .355 with five home runs in just 14 games. Crews was so good, that he skipped High-A entirely, and finished the 2023 season with the Double-A Harrisburg Senators.

Current Success:

Crews, now in his third season in the Majors, is finally starting to have some regular success. After playing over a month with the Triple-A Rochester Red Wings, Crews was brought back to the MLB squad and has played some of the best ball of his major league career. In his last 10 games, Crews is hitting .300 with 9 runs scores as an every day player.

- Austin Bergevine Amaral...returns for his fourth stint in Fredericksburg after beginning the year with Double-A Harrisburg. Previously pitched for the FredNats in various stints from 2023-2025.
- Assigned to Fredericksburg from High-A Wilmington on June 1, carrying a 5.91 ERA with 14 K/14 BB in 10.2 IP across eight relief appearances for the Blue Rocks.
- Selected in the 16th round, 465th overall by Washington in the 2023 MLB Draft from Stetson University, the alma mater of multi-time Cy Young winners Jacob DeGrom and Corey Kluber.
- Pitched in the Arizona Fall League in 2025 for Scottsdale, holding a 6.75 ERA in nine appearances.
- Pitched a dominant 2025 across three levels, including a 4.05 ERA in 11 appearances with Fredericksburg, a 1.96 ERA in 23 appearances often as a closer for Wilmington, and a 2.40 ERA in 10 appearances for Harrisburg.
- Began career as a starter for the FredNats post-draft in 2023, holding a 3.38 ERA in 8.0 IP. Moved to the bullpen in 2024, with a 4.03 ERA across three levels, mostly in Fredericksburg.
- Pitched three collegiate seasons at Stetson, beginning as a reliever before moving into the rotation. ERA 3.30 or lower each season, holding a career 3.15 ERA in 142.2 IP collegiately for the Hatters.
- Pitched during three summers for the North Shore Navigators (NECBL), Hyannis Harbor Hawks (Cape Cod League) and Trenton Thunder (MLB Draft League) while in college.
- Enters Fredericksburg posting the highest K/9 of his career for a full season so far in 2026.
